1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 Following the report to the Executive on 10 February 2003 this report requests approval to invite tenders in respect of the procurement of frozen meals for the Meals on Wheels, Day Centre and Luncheon Club Meals. It also provides information on the progress in formulating proposals for the future provision of the entire service.
- 1.2 Appendix 2 contains information on the value of the contract and is not for publication. This part of the report is not for publication as it contains the following categories of exempt information as specified in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972, namely

"The amount of any expenditure proposed to be incurred by the authority under any particular contract for the acquisition of property or the supply of goods or services".

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 The Executive to give approval to the pre-tender considerations and evaluation criteria as set out in paragraph 6.4 of the report.
- 2.2 The Executive to give approval to officers to invite tenders and evaluate in accordance with the approved evaluation criteria referred to in 2.1 above.
- 2.3 The Executive to note the process to be employed to formulate proposals on options for the future delivery of the entire service.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The Council's Contract Standing Orders state that contracts for supplies and services exceeding £500k or works contracts exceeding £1 million shall be referred to the Executive for approval to invite tenders and in respect of other matters identified in Standing Order 89.
- 3.2 The estimated value of this supplies contract is in excess of £500k over the lifetime of the contract.
- 3.3 It is anticipated that the cost of this contract will be funded from existing resources.

4. STAFFING IMPLICATIONS

4.1 This is a contract for the supply of frozen meals and therefore has no staffing implications for the Council.

5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The estimated value of this contract is higher than the EU threshold for Supplies. The tendering of this is therefore governed in full by the European Public Procurement Regulations as well as the Council's own Standing Orders in respect of High Value Contracts and Financial Regulations.
- 5.2 Once the tendering process is undertaken officers will report back to the Executive in accordance with Contract Standing Orders, explaining the process undertaken in tendering the contract and recommending award.

6. DETAIL

6.1 Following the agreement by the Executive that all meals for Meals on Wheels, Day Centres and Luncheon Clubs should be purchased as frozen complete meals, regenerated in the Meals Service Kitchens and delivered hot, interim arrangements for their supply were made with the suppliers nominated in the report. This arrangement commenced on 1 May 2003 and will result in savings of £187,000 in the financial year 2003/4 after taking into account redundancy costs. At that time it was envisaged that this would be a short term arrangement whilst proposals for the longer term provision of the entire service were formulated. It is now apparent that more in depth analysis, research and consultation needs to be carried out to evaluate the wide range of options available for the longer term so that realistic and acceptable proposals can be formulated. A consultant has been engaged to carry out this work commencing in May 2003 with a view to reporting proposals for the whole service back to the Executive in September 2003. If the recommendation is to change the way the service is provided and a tendering process is necessary to implement the recommendation this is likely to take a further year. It is therefore necessary to undertake a tendering process now to formalise the interim purchasing arrangements for the frozen meals to ensure the procurement is in line with the Council's Contract Standing Orders and the European Public Procurement Regulations. The contract planned to commence in February 2004 will contain a clause allowing the Council to terminate upon notice to enable any new arrangements arising out of the investigation into alternative options to commence as soon as the further tendering process is completed.

- 6.2 This report therefore seeks approval from the executive for the tendering of the supply of frozen meals and for the procurement process to be undertaken.
- 6.3 As part of the tender evaluation process tenderers will be asked to submit sample meals which will be evaluated by a panel of service user representatives. This element of the evaluation will carry a high weighting to ensure that meals are acceptable to service users. In addition officers will visit tenderers production units to check food hygiene and health and safety standards are being met and maintained.
- 6.4 In accordance with Contract Standing Orders 88 and 89, pre-tender considerations have been set out below for the approval of the Executive.
