The ALG Leaders' Committee, at their meeting on 7th February 2006, agreed the text of a resolution to be recommended to London local authorities. This would amend the previous 'Gold' resolution agreed by the Brent Executive on 8th March 2004. The purpose of the amended resolution is to broaden the powers of the 'Gold' Chief Executive so as to enable him or her to act on behalf of all the London local authorities in responding to an emergency in London, not just an event classified by the Minister as a catastrophic incident.
