REPORT TITLE : TFL CAPITAL APPROVED PROGRAMME 2004/05

### 1.0 SUMMARY

1.1 TfL have confirmed our allocation for 2004/05, on 25<sup>th</sup> November 2003, approving our programme and allocating £5.129M plus other funds through sub-regional partnerships. This report aims to inform members of the programme and funding received.

### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 The Committee note the approved allocation
- 2.2 The Committee instructs the Director of Transportation subject to compliance with the Council's standing orders and financial regulations, and regular reports back to this committee on progress, to prioritise the schemes set out in this report and ensure their delivery..

### 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 TfL have allocated the amount of £5.129M to Brent against specific approved programmes, as agreed by TfL in a letter sent to Brent on 25<sup>th</sup> November 2003. The total bid submitted to TfL was approximately £11.5m. Other funds will also be allocated to Brent indirectly from TfL through sub-regional partnerships such as West London Transportation Strategy (WLTS) and Park Royal Partnership (PRP).
- 3.2 The Transportation Unit is required to implement and deliver the programme as presented in Appendix A, utilising existing and other resources as required.

### 4.0 STAFFING IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The TfL Capital Approved programme will be implemented by the Transportation Unit, using existing resources. Other resources may be appointed as and when required to ensure the smooth delivery of the programme on time.

### 5.0 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The approved programme aims to reduce accidents, improve safety, encourage modal shift and provide a safer environment for all road users. It is believed that the programme will have a positive impact on Brent's environment and will result in improvements in both safety and sustainability.

### 6.0 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 This committee has responsibility for scheme approval and management. It is proposed to instruct the Director of Transportation to prioritse schemes and ensure delivery.
- 6.2 Some of the schemes are will require the letting of High Value Contracts as defined in Standing orders and will require the specific approval of the Executive
- 6.3 However, all specific legal implications, relating to individual schemes will be reported as part of the implementation programme to this Committee and the Executive in due course.

### 7.0 DETAIL

- 7.1 Brent Council has presented its Borough Spending Plan (BSP) which represents our bidding document to TfL for approval and funding, on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2003.
- 7.2 TfL wrote to Brent Council on 25<sup>th</sup> November 2003 confirming that our annual allocation for £2004/05 is £5.129M plus other money to be allocated to us indirectly through sub-regional partnerships. The funds are intended to be utilised to help implementing a specific programme which was originally prepared to support the Mayor's Transport Strategy on safety, sustainability and improvement to the transport system, in line with Brent Council's strategies on these transport areas.
- 7.3 This allocation is slightly below that for 2003/04, which was exceptionally higher than any other London boroughs. The 04/05 allocation, however, represents one of the top 5 allocations in London. The strength of quality of Brent's submission and the positive co-ordination with TfL and delivery of the programme within the Transportation Unit were the main reasons for the high allocation.
- 7.4 The approved programme is detailed under transport areas and schemes to include:
