# **Report Title: Clarendon Gardens & Manor Drive**

Forward Plan Ref: E&C- 05/06 - 050

# 1.0 Summary

1.1 This report informs Members of the recent public consultation results for the proposed traffic management and Road Safety scheme for the Clarendon Gardens and Manor Drive area and seeks approval to proceed to statutory consultation and implementation.

## 2.0 Recommendations

- 2.1 That Committee notes the outcome of the results of the public consultation of the proposals to implement traffic calming measures in the Clarendon Gardens area and Manor Drive area.
- 2.2 That Committee notes the issues raised by the residents association and Ward councillors and the actions taken by the Officers to resolve them.
- 2.3 That Committee approves the revised scheme design based on the public consultation and exhibition comments.
- 2.4 That Committee notes and approves the additional speed reducing measures for Llanover Road, Pembroke Road and Castleton Avenue.

- 2.5 That Committee approves the introduction of the gated closure in Clarendon Gardens on an experimental basis.
- 2.6 That Committee instructs officers to monitor the traffic impact of the proposals and bring back a further report after the experimental period.
- 2.7 That Committee authorises the Director of Transportation to proceed with any necessary statutory consultation, to consider any objections or representations and either to refer objections or comments back to this Committee where he thinks appropriate, or to implement the orders for the schemes proposed in the report if there are no objections or representations, or he considers the objections or representation are groundless.
- 2.8 That Committee approves the amendments to existing loading and unloading restrictions to extend to cover the PM peak hours outside the shops in East Lane adjacent to Harrowdene Road.

## 3.0 Detail

- 3.1 This scheme has been approved by Transport for London (TfL) as part of 20mph zone schemes under Borough Spending Plan submission in 2005/2006, to carry out a traffic study and public consultation in 2005/2006 financial year. Tfl has also given approval in principle, further funding of 230K for implementing a 20mph zone to this area as part of the Council's BSP submission in July 2005 for the year 2006/2007 financial year.
- This report informs Members about traffic management proposals to improve road safety in Clarendon Gardens and Manor Drive area, Wembley. Highways Committee on 25<sup>th</sup> Jan 2006 authorized the Transportation Service Unit to consult local residents/ businesses of the proposed scheme. As part of the public consultation, 1448 Questionnaires were sent to local residents/businesses and public exhibitions of the proposals were held on 22 and 25 Feb 2006 (**Appendix A** Consultation documents).
- 3.3 The proposal for Clarendon Gardens (Zone 1 and Zone 2) comprised Junction improvement / Entry treatment, raised tables, yellow box markings, and waiting restrictions.

The proposal for Manor Drive (Zone 3) comprised entry treatments, waiting restrictions and the introduction of one way working, in Manor Drive southbound, from its junction with Wembley Park Drive to the junction with The Gables. The reminder of Manor Drive will be two-way working as existing.

Extensive pre-consultation with Ward Councillors and resident's representatives took place, and they wished to see a scheme with less physical measures (ie speed cushions) that were indicated on the initial draft proposals. The scheme that was consulted with residents is, in the officers view, the minimal scheme in order to achieve a 20mph zone in Zone 1. However it will be necessary to consult with TfL with regard to the Council's preferred scheme, as it may be the case that some supplementary measures are required in order for the funding to be confirmed. Were this to be the case, then officers will identify the supplementary measures required and carry out

further consultation with the Ward Councillors, residents' representatives and residents themselves

3.4 The consultation also considered the junction of Harrowdene Road and East Lane. It is proposed that existing waiting restrictions outside the shopping parade are amended to extend the existing loading restrictions to cover the PM peak hours, thus improving traffic flow through this area.

## Clarendon Gardens - Zone 1 & Zone 2

3.5 Zone 1 and Zone 2 comprised **1110** (875 & 235) addresses. **146** (104 & 42) responses were received (13.15%).

Of these responses, **73**(42 &31) people supported the proposed experimental gated closure in Clarendon Gardens area and **63** (52 & 11) people were not in favour of the gated closure.

Of the above responses, **113** (78 & 35) people supported the proposed Junction improvements / Entry treatments and raised tables and **27**(21 & 6) people were not in favour of Junction improvements / Entry treatments and raised tables.

Since the speeding and volume is the issue in Zone 1 area it can mitigate by introduction of physical measures, where as in Zone 2 speeding is not a issue as the roads were narrow and persisting problem can be overcome by gated-closure alone. Therefore Zone 1 will only be considered as a part of 20mph zone proposals.

Comments received from the public consultations also indicate residents favouring additional speed reduction measures to Llanover Road, Pembroke Road and Castleton Avenue respectively. It is also of the opinion of the officers of the Transportation Service Unit that providing some additional speed cushions on these roads will greatly improve the self-enforcement of the 20mph limits within these streets.

# Manor Drive - Zone 3

Zone 3 comprised **338** addresses of which **55** responses were received (16.27%).

Of these responses above, **32** people supported the proposed Junction improvements / Entry treatments and **15** people were not in favour.

Of the responses above, **32** people also supported the proposed Experimental one way system in Manor Drive and 20 residents were not in Favour.

# 4.0 Financial Implications

4.1 All costs associated with this proposals will be financed by Transport for London (TfL) through the Borough Spending Plan (BSP) from the 20mph

Zones.

- 4.2 A funding allocation of £10,000 is already approved by Transport for London (TfL) to carry out this traffic study within the programme of 20mph zones and is included in the Borough Spending Plan (BSP) submission for 2005/2006.
- 4.3 A further allocation of £230,000 has also been approved in principle by TfL to carry out the detail design and implementation of this scheme in the year 2006/2007 via the BSP submission for 2006/2007.
- 4.4 The estimated cost of implementing these proposals is within the £230,000 allocation and this also includes staffing costs.
- 4.5 The making of the experimental proposals permanent could be carried out from the funding approved for 2006/2007.

# 5.0 Legal Implications

- The proposed physical traffic calming measures such as road humps, entry treatments, gated closures and waiting restrictions will require the making of Traffic Regulation Orders (TRO) under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The procedures to be adopted for making the actual order are set out in the associated Statutory Traffic Regulations.
- 5.2 The physical traffic calming measures proposed are made under sections 90 A to F of the Highways Act 1980 and will require the council to undertake prescribed consultation, consider objections and place statutory notices.
- 5.3 Members are requested to authorise the Director of Transportation to consider and reject objections or representations if the Director of Transportation believes this to be appropriate prior to the implementation of the various proposals following the public and statutory consultation process. As a result, a further study/progress report need not be brought forward before this committee prior to implementation, except those of the experimental traffic measures that require making permanent following the six months of the experimental operation.

# 6.0 Environmental Implications

- 6.1 The introduction of the study proposals will help to improve road safety for all road users in this area, particularly pedestrians and other vulnerable road users.
- The introduction of the proposed scheme, will reduce the volume of the through traffic in these residential areas and would mitigate the environmental impact of the traffic flow.

# 7.0 Staffing / Accommodation Implications

7.1 The Council's Transportation Service Unit will deal with all issues related to the proposals detailed in this report.

# PROPOSED TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PROPOSALS PUBLIC CONSULTATION FEBRUARY 2006

Following a number of concerns received from residents regarding the excessive speeds and volume of traffic in the roads around Clarendon Gardens, Brent Council have carried out a traffic study, investigated the concerns and identified traffic proposals to improve road safety in the area. The proposals will be funded by Transport for London through the Council's annual Borough Spending Plan, which aims to achieve the targets set in the Mayor's Transport Strategy for London. If residents are in agreement with the proposals a scheme could be implemented by the spring of 2006 to coincide with the re-opening of Wembley Stadium.

#### KEY PROBLEMS

The key problems identified in the area are excessive traffic volumes, speeding vehicles and congestion caused by parking along the narrow roads. These can lead to difficulties for vulnerable road users such as children and elderly people resulting in traffic accidents along these residential

### **GENERAL PROPOSALS**

Following a number of consultative meetings with Local residents' representatives, Ward Councillors and the Police, Brent Council intends to introduce Traffic Calming measures around the area highlighted by the traffic study. These proposals are shown on the plan overleaf.

### SPECIFIC PROPOSALS

As each of the three zones has specific concerns, the Council is proposing the following measures:

- \* ZONE 1 Gated Closure at the eastern exit of Clarendon Gardens and Castleton Avenue junction, junction improvements with Entry Tables and Yellow box markings at the junctions with East Lane
- \* ZONE 2 Junction improvements at the eastern end of Clarendon Gardens and a Gated Closure at the Castleton Avenue junction
- \* ZONE 3 A one way operation in Manor Drive with junction improvements and Entry tables at its northern end

The proposals aim to lower vehicle speeds which:

- > Will make walking and cycling easier and safer within the zone
- > Improves the Safety of vulnerable road users such as children and the elderly
- > Reduces speed leading to a reduction in personal injury accidents
- > The Gated closure will also stop all extraneous traffic from the area

Through traffic can be discouraged as a consequence of introducing these traffic calming measures. The police strongly support the proposals which incorporate speed reduction features.




