

Forward Plan Ref:

1.0 Summary

- 1.1 This report informs Members on progress of the review of the Wembley Stadium Protective Parking Scheme (PPS).
- 1.2 The report also informs Members on the various issues raised by residents and businesses regarding the scheme within or outside the Wembley Stadium protective parking area which are highlighted in paragraph 5.0
- 1.3 That the committee notes the Wembley events calendar for 2008/2009 season at appendix B.

2.0 Recommendations

- 2.1 That Committee notes the results of the parking surveys carried out in selected areas of the protective parking scheme as detailed in Appendix C
- 2.2 That Committee notes the concerns raised by the residents/businesses of the area to date. Detailed in paragraph 5.0
- 2.3 That Committee notes a previous. Petition received from the residents of Dunster Drive, Kingsbury, and NW9 in May 2007 objecting to the parking bays during the Wembley Stadium event days. As detailed in paragraph 5.7 Area 24 Appendix A.

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- 2.4 That the Committee agrees that the boundary of the PPS area to remain unchanged.
- 2.5 That the committee considers the following options with respect to the changes on the operational times recommended:

a) Continue with the same restrictions of 8.0am to midnight for the 08/09 season. Paragraph 4.1

b) Reduce the operational times of the PPS restrictions from 8.0am to 10.0am to midnight. Paragraph 4.1

Should the Committee approves one of the above options, it is essential that restrictions of 8.0am to midnight and bus lanes restrictions of 7.0am to Midnight to remain on primary and strategic routes within the PPS scheme.

- 2.6 That the Committee agrees to offer 20 permits to all places of worship within the PPS area.
- 2.7 That the Committee agrees to provide and issue temporary daily permits to those holding weddings and major parties.
- 2.8 That the Committee agrees to offer 20 permits to schools within the PPS area without off street parking facilities.
- 2.9 That the Committee agrees Allotment holders; can also apply to obtain permits which will also be area specific.
- 2.10 That the Committee approves to offer an additional visitor's permit to each household at a charge of £ 10.00 within the PPS scheme.

3.0 Background

- 3.1 The Event Day Zone, within which the Protective Parking Scheme operates, is divided into 33 areas (Appendix A) this was done to manage the initial preliminary public consultation. The scheme implementation has also been progressed on the basis of individual areas. The carriageway lining works ('parking bays') are now complete.
 - 3.2 On the 28 October 2004 Highways Committee noted the results of the public consultation carried out in summer 2004 on the Wembley Stadium 'Protective Parking Scheme' (PPS), and resolved to advance the scheme to detailed design, statutory consultation and implementation in areas where majority support had been identified.

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The Summer 2004 consultation included public exhibitions of the Protective Parking Scheme design proposals, which incorporated signs, as well as road markings ('signs and lines' scheme), to denote parking places where only residents and their visitors, as well as businesses, would be permitted to park with 'Event Day' parking permits.

In designing the scheme officers had been mindful that a wide usage of road markings and traffic signs would have a detrimental visual impact on the local environment, particularly as the PPS would only operate for up to 37 days a year. However, it was also the view of officers that a robust parking scheme design was necessary, and one that should be easily recognisable and understood by visitors; hence a scheme combining road markings and strategically located signs indicating permit holder only parking, was designed for consultation. Yellow lines were omitted from the scheme, other than where necessary to maintain access and road safety, to minimise the visual impact of the PPS. As the scheme design represented a departure from 'conventional' parking control scheme designs (such as Controlled Parking Zones), approval was sought, and obtained, from the Department for Transport (DfT) to relax the regulations which cover the usage of signs and lines for parking control schemes.

4.0 Investigations

Parking surveys have been carried out between August 07 to November 2007 during the Wembley events. Surveys have been carried out for areas 7,8, 12, 14,16, 17, 22, 23, 24, 25, 27,29, 30, 32 and 33 (Appendix A) of the Wembley Stadium Protective Parking scheme(see tables on Appendix C.

4.1 Zone Timing

The existing scheme has been designed to be consistent in hours of operation for the season so as to provide clarity to motorists at the same time as catering for all the variations in times and durations of the various events scheduled at Wembley. Currently the scheme commences at 8.00am in order to ensure that the road network is kept clear for the day's event. Even short term parking has the effect of attracting others to park without an awareness of the event timings. It is essential to keep the end of restrictions to 12 midnight due to the event days waiting restrictions being required on strategic routes which need to be clear for at least 2 hours after the conclusion of the event.

This option recommends that we continue with the current scheme for 2008 / 2009. This will also give us a full year experience of a scheduled programme, including concerts, international football, rugby and other

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similar events planned by Wembley National Stadium Limited in a normal year. The impact of events during a football World Cup or the Olympics will require further consideration on scheme timings.

There are no cost implications for maintaining the current hours of operation other than normal maintenance expenditure.

Officers have studied the different parking schemes that exist at football grounds such as Emirates and White Hart Lane. Officers have also contacted engineers at Haringey Council with regards to the proposals for Tottenham F.C in respect of residents parking and visitors/spectators to the football stadium. Football matches generally start at 3pm at weekends, however, televised matches can vary between 12.45pm start and 5.15pm finish times. Midweek games commence at 7.45pm or 8.00pm.

The new and much larger scheme for the 60,000 seat capacity Emirates Stadium includes an extensive network of CPZs (including 7 new CPZs to cover the original match day controls) combined with a series of road closures have been put in place. A new parking permit has been introduced to allow access to residents whose homes were inside the road closure cordon. The normal CPZ hours Monday to Friday are from 8.30 am to 6.30 pm and 8.30 am to 1.30 pm on Saturdays. Additional match day controls are from 6.30 pm to 8.30 pm Monday to Friday, 1.30 pm to 4.30 pm on Saturdays and from 12.00 noon to 4.30 pm on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Essentially during a week day match the area is restricted from 8.30am to 8.30 pm. On Saturday's from 8.30 am to 4.30 pm and on Sundays and bank Holidays from 12.00 noon to 4.30 pm.

The restrictions proposed at White Hart Lane (Tottenham) a 35,000 seat capacity stadium are from 5.00pm to 8.30pm Monday to Friday, and 12.00 noon to 4.00pm (possibly up to 6.00 pm for some games) on Saturday, Sundays and Bank Holidays. Once the game is underway the controls lapse.

These controls may be quite sufficient for the above Stadiums that have very little "authorised" coach/car parking provision on site, and so there is not the need to protect the traffic routes/corridors or any access or egress from industrial estates at Wembley.

By comparison Wembley has a third and two third respectively larger crowd movements and car parks accommodating 2900 car spaces or coach equivalent.

In conclusion it is therefore essential that the roads surrounding the stadium are kept clear of parking on event days to facilitate both vehicles and pedestrian movements for up to 2 hours post event. The duration of the PPS could be reduced from an 8.00 to 10.00 am start, however it would be required to extend to midnight for every event other than football and certainly

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to 8.30pm for afternoon football matches. The operation of "event Day" restrictions, for simplicity, incorporates both restrictions for the protection of residential area, and restrictions for the movement of traffic on the principal and strategic road network. It is also essential to keep the restrictions of 8am to midnight for the primary routes, bus lanes etc.

The earliest such changes can be made to the current scheme are set out in the table below;

The cost of changing the 2500 event day and 400 other associated signs for later start time of Monday – Sunday 10.00am to Midnight, is estimated at approximately £25,000. This cost associated with the changes will have to come from the parking revenue budget.

5.0 Issues raised during the Wembley events and at the PCG meetings are as follows:

5.1 Personal Family Events:

Funerals,

Arrangements for funerals are already in place in controlled parking zones and the Wembley PPS to allow parking at places of worship and to accommodate the funeral arrangements at the resident's homes. These arrangements will be better communicated to residents and to local religious leaders and funeral parlours. In the event of funerals residents and local religious leader will be given concessions for the duration of the services. These concessions will permit vehicles to park in area specific in the near vicinity of the services. Officers will contact all funeral parlours and places of worship where information can be provided to clarify the Council's practise for funerals. Upon requests residents can contact the parking shops to obtain temporary permits for their visitors. These permits will be issued on area specific and for the day of these gatherings.

Weddings/Parties;

Upon requests residents can contact the parking shops to obtain temporary permits for their visitors. These permits will be issued on area specific and for the day of these gatherings. There will be a charge of £10.00 per permit.

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Places of Worship;

All places of worship; within the boundary of the control will be contacted to inform them that upon requests they are entitled to obtain up to a maximum of 20 visitors permit for the day of services on area specific taking into account existing parking control provisions. There will be a charge of £10.00 per permits.

Allotment holders; can also apply to obtain one permit which will also be area specific at a charge of $\pounds 10.00$.

Schools

Schools within the PPS area without parking facilities within the schools (for example Wykeham Primary School) will be issued up to 20 permits for their staff particularly during week day events. There will be a charge of $\pounds 10.00$ per permit.

5.2 Charge for visitor permits or extra permits

Issuing one additional visitor's permits for \pounds 1.00 per day has been discussed at various PPS meetings and strongly rejected in principle by officers. The main problem is the probability of these permits being sold to visitors to Wembley and there are no easy ways of controlling such activity. However issuing extra permits are being recommended in this report.

5.3 The boundary of the Wembley Stadium Protective parking Zone to remain unchanged during the 2008/2009 season. It was observed that during parking surveys there are some displaced parking occurs outside the boundary of the PPS in particular to the north of the area 24 (Appendix A). However, this not to the level that could warrant an extension to the boundary of PPS. Transportation unit will continue carry out parking surveys during Wembley events and monitor the possibility of displaced parking.

5.4 Electronic signage.

There are approximately 470 entry "Event Today "sign plates. The costs of changing these signs and replace them with electronic signs including special posts and electrical connections are estimated at £1.5m.

It was requested by some Members that more VMS are required to give better indications of the events; Feasibilities will be carried out to place two additional signs in areas such as Park Lane and Wembley High Road. The cost for the installation of these signs is estimated at £20,000.00

5.5 Road Closures

The Traffic Order dealing with Road Closures specific to Wembley Event Days permits the closure of South Way at anytime on a Wembley Event Day whilst other road closures are restricted to any length of time between 10 a.m.

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and midnight as decided by officers in the Wembley Control Room on the day according to the circumstances. All these closures are put in place to remove vehicle / pedestrian conflict. Generally, and depending on crowd movements on the day, South Way is closed 5 hours before an event until 2 hours after the end of an event and other roads are closed 2 hours before an event until the start of an event and again just before the end of an event for up to 1 hour.

However, it is possible to envisage future mid-day or earlier starts to Wembley events which would require road closures before 10am It is therefore recommended that permitted road closure times be extended from 10.00 .a.m. to midnight on a Wembley event day to 8.00 a.m to midnight."

The parking surveys carried out indicate that the majority of the streets continue to have more parking spaces available than the number of vehicles parked. In view of these findings officers propose to continue monitoring the parking bays and where possible try to increase the parking capacity. In general the parking bays are being used effectively.

5.6 Parking enforcement

Penalty Charge Notices (PCN's) report is provided by Street Care showing the numbers of PCN's issued during the Wembley Stadium events between 24th March to 21st November 2007.

<u>Note</u>: No PCNs were issued on the 17th March, only Warning Notices.

The above report suggests that there is good level of compliance in relation to more than 1.7m spectators to Wembley events and the number of PCN issued. The scheme is working well as the majority of the penalty tickets were issued to non- permit holders and for other contraventions such as parking illegally on yellow lines or causing an obstruction.

5.7 Other Issues raised by the residents/businesses

A petition submitted to the July 2007 Committee by the residents of Dunster Drive, Kingsbury requesting that Brent Council not to implement the compulsory use of the parking bays in Dunster Drive, on Wembley Stadium event days. The petition also suggest that if the rule is enforced, this will restrict the parking and subsequently, even though having a required permit a number of residents will be forced to look elsewhere for free bays in other roads, but on the stroke of midnight, on event days, they will be able to resume their normal parking practise, which is acceptable on non event days. The survey results in appendix C suggest that the road is not yet experiencing a shortage of spaces and officers will continue to monitor this road. A Ward Councillor of this area is requesting for a re- consultation to be carried out to determine if residents would wish to remain in the zone. It was also suggested that the restrictions for this area to remain only during FA Cup final and England international days only. Other request is made to remove the parking bays from St Andrews Road, Wells Drive and Leith Close to meet the conservation area standard. In view of the recommendations made by officers in this report and in particular for the reduction of operational times it is recommended that to monitor area 24 (appendix A) with regards to the parking issues. It is recommended that when funding becomes available a re consultation with area 24 be carried out.

5.8 The pay and display parking within the PPS in which some would fall within the existing CPZ Zones such as W Zone are either maximum 2 hours or maximum for 4 hours stay.

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The original idea was to change the 4 hours stay to a maximum of 2 hours during the Wembley events. This was problematical as all Pay and Display machines required new programmes to be installed. It was however, observed during the events that visitors would not risk of parking for 4 hours on Pay and display parking as the duration of events would normally be more than 4 hours. It is therefore recommended that the Committee agrees not to change the duration of the Pay and Display Machines from maximum 4 hours stay to 2 hours.

6.0 Comments from Police and other emergency services.

Transportation unit services have received comments from Met Police regarding the positive impact that the PPS had on reduced amount of traffic reduction in and around the Stadium during Wembley events.

The feedbacks from other emergency services indicate that the response time to incidents has been improved since the introduction of PPS.

7.0 Traffic Management implication during Wembley events

The purpose of the traffic management schemes on event days is to facilitate, as far as is practically possible, the safe and convenient movement of visitors to and from the stadium whilst mitigating the impact on the Highway Network.

At the present time there are several traffic management schemes that are implemented on a major event day which can be attributed to either the arrival or dispersal of stadium visitors.

ARRIVAL SCHEMES

South Way Closure – South Way is closed approximately 5 to 6 hours before the start of an event. This closure serves two purposed it protect the pedestrians that are walking towards the Stadium from Wembley Central and Wembley Stadium Stations and it restricts vehicle access to the Highway immediately adjacent to the southern flank of the Stadium building. This closure remains in place until the dispersal period has been completed. Vehicles that have been accredited for the Red car park are permitted to use south way until the pedestrian flows at the western end become significant.

Fulton Road Closure – When the pedestrian flow from Wembley Park becomes significant it is necessary to closed Fulton road to traffic to prevent vehicle / pedestrian conflicts. Typically Fulton road will be closed approximately 2hours before the event starts (at the time the turnstiles open) and will remain closed for between 1 to $1^{1}/_{2}$ hours.

Conference Centre Roundabout – A coning scheme is put in place to segregate the traffic for the Red Car Park from the main flow through the triangle and to protect any car queuing for the car park.

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Great Central Way Tidal Flow- On non event days Great Central Way operates as a single lane in each direction with the centre hatched lane unavailable to traffic. For Stadium arrivals the centre lane is made available to westbound traffic. This effectively gives a two lane approach to the entrance for the Green car park along the entire length of Great Central Way and South Way, whilst maintaining one lane eastbound.

DISPERSAL SCHEMES

Great Central Way Tidal Flow – For dispersal the tidal flow on Great Central Way is reversed giving two eastbound traffic lanes and one westbound traffic lane.

Fulton Road Closure – Typically Fulton Road is closed for approximately an hour after an event to permit the dispersal of pedestrians to Wembley Park Station.

Engineers Way Closure – 14,000 visitors disperse from the Stadium at ground level therefore it in necessary to close Engineers Way between Empire Way and Rutherford Way to prevent vehicle / pedestrian conflicts. Typically Engineers Way is closed for approximately 1 hour after the event.

Engineers Way / First Way – A closure it put in place at this junction which prevents the left turn from First Way into Engineers Way. The main purpose of this scheme is to encourage traffic to use the dispersal route through the Industrial Estate one way system.

Wembley Triangle – In order to protect the flow of pedestrians that are walking back to Wembley Central Station and the High Road it is necessary to close Wembley Triangle. The closure extends from the Conference Centre Roundabout through to the Harrow Road. The closure is manned at the Conference Centre Roundabout and local traffic going to Mostyn Avenue, Linden Avenue and Dennis Avenue. Typically the closure lasts for about 1 hour 15 mins.

London Road / Station Grove – A new over bridge had been built at Wembley Central Station which is accessed from London Road and Station Grove. When the over bridge is in use (usually on dispersal from sporting events) the London Road is shut between High Road Wembley and Rupert Avenue to protect the pedestrian queue into the station. Additionally traffic management is used in Station Grove to protect the queue of passengers at that location.

The schemes are subject to constant revision. As new developments are approved and constructed on the land surrounding Wembley National Stadium, it is likely that car parking sites will change and the schemes will have to be adapted and revised. Revision to the scheme will also occur in light of actual experience of Major Events.

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On non event days the SAC operates as a single lane in each direction with the centre hatched lane unavailable to traffic. On Major Event days the centre lane facility enables a tidal flow system to be put in place for either the arrival or dispersal of traffic to / from the main car parking area.

Former Environmental Areas and Traffic Stewards

Traffic Stewards have been in place to patrol the former environmental areas nearest to the Stadium (Barn Hill, Manor Drive, Tokyington North and Tokyington South) for the four hours prior to the event start time. In 2008 it is proposed to reduce this service to two stewards, one for Barn Hill and Manor Drive and one for Tokyington North and South. The additional event day signage that is used in these areas will remain the same.

8.0 Financial Implications

8.1 Details of the £2.5 million (plus interest) Section 106 funding for the off-site parking and traffic management schemes have been reported previously to Members. This includes funding the original consultation, the signs and the lines the permits and the administration of these works.

The funding to meet the costs of administering the scheme, the traffic management and parking scheme including permit issuing where appropriate will come form the permit charges and the parking enforcement revenue associated with the Wembley Protective Parking Scheme. This allocation is now exhausted for the implementation of the scheme. Any other costs associated with the changes to the scheme will have to come from the revenue budget from the parking account available to Transportation unit .

9.0 Legal Implications

9.1 To ensure that the Wembley Event Scheme is legally enforceable, Traffic Management Orders will need to be made under sections 6, 35 45, 46 and 49 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The procedure for making the orders is contained in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) Regulations 1996. The validity of the Orders or any of its provisions can be challenged in the High Court if the Act or the procedures in the regulations have not been complied with.

10.0 Diversity Implications

10.1 All public consultation material distributed included a section written in the most common languages used in the Borough with an explanation of how more information about proposals could be obtained

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11.0 Staffing/Accommodation Implications (if appropriate)

11.1 The Transportation Service Unit will be undertaking the scheme design, statutory consultation and implementation work on all the event day parking schemes.

12.0 Environmental Implications

12.1 There are no changes to the Environmental Implications reported to the previous meeting of this Committee.


