Dear Mr. Rankmore,


Following our telephone conversation yesterday, I am informing you that last Tuesday I delivered to Mr. Ifan Malik written evidence that the overwhelming majority of Aylestone Avenue residents who had responded to a questionnaire three days earlier disagreed with the scheme put forward by Brent Council for a 20 mph zone in Aylestone Avenue and a number of neighbouring streets. I then received a notice from Brent Council that work to install so-called traffic calming humps in Aylestone Avenue would begin on May 22nd.

As a direct consequence, I am now delivering by hand to your office (copy to Mr. Peter Boddy) this petition signed by 77 residents/electors with regard to the proposed Aylestone Avenue 20 mph zone.

In the light of this petition, and of recently announced government policies, we expect the installation of humps in Aylestone Avenue scheduled to start on May 22nd to be cancelled pending further consultation and discussion of possible alternatives.

Having spoken to Councillor Carol Shaw, and as suggested to her by Dan Brown, lead member, I was assured that this matter would be deferred until the July 23rd meeting of the Highways and Transportation Committee as for the case of Mount Pleasant Road.
