Report Title: Waste Contract Performance

This report provides an update on the performance of the Council's Waste Services Contract with Veolia, specifically with respect to recycling, street cleansing, missed collections and complaints.

1. Waste & Recycling

A recycling rate of 28.2% was achieved in 2008/09. This was a 5.9 percentage point increase on the previous year. There has been further improvement in 2009/10 with an average rate of 33.5% after 2 months.

Dry Recycling

The amount of 'dry' material collected for recycling increased by 1892 tonnes in 2008/09. This is a measure of the effectiveness of the compulsory recycling initiative. 2009/10 figures show a further 511 tonne increase in April and May.

The amount of waste collected for composting increased by 3575 tonnes in 2008/09. A further 613 tonne increase has been achieved in April and May.

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
2. Collections

Levels of missed collections have remained relatively stable in the last two quarters and are much improved on the mid-point of 2008/09. The trend in missed refuse collections is upwards, however, and this will be addressed with the contractor.




















3. Street Cleansing.


The upgraded cleansing specification delivered a step change in cleansing performance in Year 2 of the new contract. An average of 16% ensured the LAA target of 19% was achieved.

No data has yet been received for 2009/10, although a new system has been adopted for removing weeds and this is expected to deliver a much improved Tranche 2 score.

Our fly-tip performance for 2008/09, as calculated by DEFRA's Flycapture reporting system, was "Effective" (grade 2).








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4. Complaints

Levels of complaints in 2008/09 settled in Quarter 4 due to better management of the demands of compulsory recycling.

The recycling service still attracted the most complaints. Refuse and street cleansing complaints were much reduced on the previous year.







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
