Police Objection to the Temporary Event Notice for Sal's Bar 249 Neasden Lane, NW10 1QG

I certify that I have considered the notice shown above and I wish to make representations that the use of the premises for the temporary event would undermine the crime prevention initiative, for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

A Temporary Event Notice has been given under section 100 Licensing Act 2003 by Mr. Tim Sheahan

For extension of Business hours on the 17/12/2016 - 18/12/2016 between 02.00 hours and 05.00 hours at Sal's bar 249 Neasden Lane NW10 1QG

Police are formally making representations to the notice under section 104 Licensing Act 2003. The Police objection is primarily concerned with the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives.

Mr Sheahan has made an application to extend his trading hours at Sal's Bar Neasden, the bar currently has a licence which allows it to open until 02.30am on Friday and Saturday nights, and the application is to extend this until 05.00am.

Mr Sheahan took over the running of the premises earlier this year after the previous owner decided to sell due to the increased problems the area and pub was experiencing. The pub is located in Neasden shopping center which is one of Brent's highest hotspot locations for Anti-Social Behaviour.

Earlier this year the premises had an issue with local travelers that took over the premises and started to threaten the owner, this resulted in disorder and threats being made at the location, police work tirelessly with the owner to resolve these problems which eventually saw them selling up after numerous threats being made.

Mr. Sheahan is also the Premises Licence Holder for another nearby Pub, namely Greene's Bar, 362 -364 Neasden Lane North.

This premises has recently applied for several TEN's most of which were rejected by police due to numerous reasons, namely Late TEN's with not enough information to make a decision on, wrong information where the applicant had applied for several nights for different events, although rejected Mr Sheahan decided to flout the law and stay open until the early hours of the morning, and trade without a licence, (contrary to section 136 - Unauthorized licensable activity) when questioned about this he stated he took a chance and hoped he would stay under the radar.

This happened on two of the rejected TEN nights, and the premise was put on an action plan, which is still currently in place.

Mr Sheahan has stated that as he now can't have anymore TEN's at Greene due to reaching his yearly limit, and he is now applying to have them at Sal's Bar, he is fully aware of the local issues in the location and seems to be dismissive of these and is putting profit before upholding the licence objectives.

When Mr Sheahan first took over Sal's bar he was informed that a new DPS would need to be put in place before the premises could open for the sale of alcohol or any regulated entertainment, Mr Sheahan dismissed this and continued opening and was forced to close by Brent Police licensing team, he has consistently shown a lack of concern for the licensing objectives and in his words has tried to take short cuts and stay under the radar, which clearly is not acceptable.

He has also indicated that he is planning on purchasing another venue in Neasden, namely Charlies wine bar, this premises has recently been the subject of a licensing review, and is now closed, the concern is that the clientele from this bar will now start using Sal's Bar as they are directly across the road from one another.

Mr Sheahan has proved unreliable in the past, and was removed as the DPS from Greenes bar after a review of it's licence, it was found that the premises was staying open into the early hours of the morning way beyond it's opening times.

The current licence allows Sal's bar to open daily from 11.00am this could see people going into the premises at this time and not coming out until the next morning a 05.00am, the pub is a small venue, and is situated below residential flats, allowing the premise to stay open until 05.00 with regulated entertainment would make it more of a night club than a pub.

This premise is situated in what is classed as a town centre but is only a few meters away from residential housing, the area has been the subject of numerous police operation over the last year to reduce street drinking and ASB, I feel any further premise being allowed to open until the early hours of the morning will increase the risk of disorder and ASB in the area due to the drunkenness of people that potentially have been drinking for up to 16 hours.

Police object to this Notice as I feel the applicant has proved himself unreliable in the past, and has not considered the possible impact on the local community and is putting his profits first.

I have spoken to Mr Sheahen several times regarding this notification and suggested a more manageable closing time of 3am; however he was unwilling to compromise and stated that he wanted to open until 5am

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises?
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage,
- or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to¿ (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner:
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability). Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age

verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either?

The responsible person must ensure that;

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available Minimum Price of Alcohol
- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.





Police Objection to the Temporary Event Notice for Sal's Bar 249 Neasden Lane, NW10 1QG

I certify that I have considered the notice shown above and I wish to make representations that the use of the premises for the temporary event would undermine the crime prevention initiative, for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

A Temporary Event Notice has been given under section 100 Licensing Act 2003 by Mr. Tim Sheahan

For extension of Business hours on the 31/12/2016 - 01/01/2017 between 02.00 hours and 05.00 hours at Sal's bar 249 Neasden Lane NW10 1QG

Police are formally making representations to the notice under section 104 Licensing Act 2003. The Police objection is primarily concerned with the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives.

Mr Sheahan has made an application to extend his trading hours at Sal's Bar Neasden, the bar currently has a licence which allows it to open until 02.30am on Friday and Saturday nights, and the application is to extend this until 05.00am.

Mr Sheahan took over the running of the premises earlier this year after the previous owner decided to sell due to the increased problems the area and pub was experiencing. The pub is located in Neasden shopping center which is one of Brent's highest hotspot locations for Anti-Social Behaviour.

Earlier this year the premises had an issue with local travelers that took over the premises and started to threaten the owner, this resulted in disorder and threats being made at the location, police work tirelessly with the owner to resolve these problems which eventually saw them selling up after numerous threats being made.

Mr. Sheahan is also the Premises Licence Holder for another nearby Pub, namely Greene's Bar, 362 -364 Neasden Lane North.

This premises has recently applied for several TEN's most of which were rejected by police due to numerous reasons, namely Late TEN's with not enough information to make a decision on, wrong information where the applicant had applied for several nights for different events, although rejected Mr Sheahan decided to flout the law and stay open until the early hours of the morning, and trade without a licence, (contrary to section 136 - Unauthorized licensable activity) when questioned about this he stated he took a chance and hoped he would stay under the radar.

This happened on two of the rejected TEN nights, and the premise was put on an action plan, which is still currently in place.

Mr Sheahan has stated that as he now can't have anymore TEN's at Greene due to reaching his yearly limit, and he is now applying to have them at Sal's Bar, he is fully aware of the local issues in the location and seems to be dismissive of these and is putting profit before upholding the licence objectives.

When Mr Sheahan first took over Sal's bar he was informed that a new DPS would need to be put in place before the premises could open for the sale of alcohol or any regulated entertainment, Mr Sheahan dismissed this and continued opening and was forced to close by Brent Police licensing team, he has consistently shown a lack of concern for the licensing objectives and in his words has tried to take short cuts and stay under the radar, which clearly is not acceptable.

He has also indicated that he is planning on purchasing another venue in Neasden, namely Charlies wine bar, this premises has recently been the subject of a licensing review, and is now closed, the concern is that the clientele from this bar will now start using Sal's Bar as they are directly across the road from one another.

Mr Sheahan has proved unreliable in the past, and was removed as the DPS from Greenes bar after a review of it's licence, it was found that the premises was staying open into the early hours of the morning way beyond it's opening times.

The current licence allows Sal's bar to open daily from 11.00am this could see people going into the premises at this time and not coming out until the next morning a 05.00am, the pub is a small venue, and is situated below residential flats, allowing the premise to stay open until 05.00 with regulated entertainment would make it more of a night club than a pub.

This premise is situated in what is classed as a town centre but is only a few meters away from residential housing, the area has been the subject of numerous police operation over the last year to reduce street drinking and ASB, I feel any further premise being allowed to open until the early hours of the morning will increase the risk of disorder and ASB in the area due to the drunkenness of people that potentially have been drinking for up to 16 hours.

Police object to this Notice as I feel the applicant has proved himself unreliable in the past, and has not considered the possible impact on the local community and is putting his profits first.

I have spoken to Mr Sheahen several times regarding this notification and suggested a more manageable closing time of 3am; however he was unwilling to compromise and stated that he wanted to open until 5am

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age

verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either?
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Embedded Conditions

Mandatory cont:

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that ¿

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures;
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available Minimum Price of Alcohol
- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 12.
- (a) —dutyll is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) —permitted pricell is the price found by applying the formula.

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

where ¿

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence;
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) —valued added taxll means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value

Added Tax Act 1994.

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first dayll) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second dayll) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax. (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

Film Classification When required

- (i) The admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the designated film classification body unless section (ii) applies.
- (ii) Where the licensing authority notifies the holder of the licence that this subsection applies the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.

In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

- 1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition.
- 2. All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
- 3. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 4. Outside drinking shall be in designated areas only and there shall be signs stating For Customers Only and No Glasses Beyond This Point.
- 5. Door supervisors of a sufficient number and gender mix, shall be employed from 20:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past 01:00 hours the following morning.
- 6. Toilets shall be checked at regular intervals for the use of drugs and other illegal activities.
