Paragraph Nos: 8.1 – 8.4

8.1 Where responsible authorities and interested parties do not raise any relevant representations regarding the application made to the council, the council will grant the licence or certificate subject only to the conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule or club operating schedule and any mandatory conditions prescribed in the Act itself.

8.2 Where responsible authorities and interested parties raise relevant representations, the council may, if it is satisfied at a hearing or otherwise, impose conditions where considered necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

8.3 Any conditions attached by the council or submitted by the applicant must focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at licensed premises, on those attending the premises and residents and persons working in the area.

8.4 Any conditions attached to licences will be tailored to the individual needs, style and characteristics of the particular premises and events concerned and will be drawn from a 'model pool of conditions' (where appropriate) to the particular premises.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and **I wish to make representations** that the likely effect of the approval of the Temporary Event Notice is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives with regards to the prevention of public nuisance.

Case history

There is a history of complaints received by the team in relation to playing of loud music on site causing disturbance to local residents.

Recommendation

I recommend the following conditions to be attached to the TENs approval

Prevention of Nuisance

Condition: No noise or vibration from the playing of live or recorded music shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.

Condition: All doors and windows shall remain closed during any licensable activity and where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door shall be lobbied. This lobbied door shall be fitted with an active cut-off device which cuts off power to the music system if both doors are propped open at the same time.

Condition: The external areas will be used for smoking only. Licensed door supervisors are to actively monitor the smoking areas to control the number of patrons using the area and ensure any noise from them do not cause disturbance to local residents.
