#### 1. MINUTES

RESOLVED -

That the decisions of the meeting of the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee meeting held on 18 January 2011 be approved as a correct record.

### 2. ABSENCE OF MEMBERS

Apologies for absence were received form Councillor Hugh Rayner, Roy Beddard (Welsh Harp Conservation Group), Molly Savage (Local Agenda 21) and an apology for lateness from Lesley Williams (London Borough of Brent).

3. DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL AND PREJUDICIAL INTERESTS

No interests were declared.

### 4. MATTERS ARISING (IF ANY)

Clive Cohen, representing the London Wildlife Trust, Barnet Group informed the committee that some insecticides carry a bee risk warning while neonicotinoids had been banned in France and Germany were still permitted in the United Kingdom for unknown reasons. Mr Cohen suggested that it should be the Borough's responsibility to communicate the effects, to land owners, of the use of insecticides Jenny Warren, London Borough of Barnet, Green Spaces Manager informed the Committee that it was not the Council's priority to perform this function. Jenny Warren noted that there was no guidance from DEFRA and stated that the Council action plan outlined the stem injection process which provides treatment for insecticides.

### RESOLVED -

### 5. WELSH HARP MANAGEMENT PLAN (BRENT)

The London Borough of Barnet's Green Spaces Manager introduced this report in the absence of Lesley Williams (London Borough of Brent). The committee were informed that the Parks Warden Service across Brent had received a reduction in the number of full time posts including the deletion of static Wardens. However it was noted that the number of mobile Wardens had increased which will provide a more flexible approach.

RESOLVED – That the report be noted.

### 6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Councillor Julie Johnson informed the Committee of the successful clean-up day.
The Councillor noted that all of Barnet's Committee Members attended the clean-up day and were well supported by the Green Spaces Team, McDonald's and some local residents. Councillor Julie Johnson thanked everyone who had been involved in the day which involved the removal of seventy bags of waste. It was suggested that local allotment owners be engaged in order to help in any future clean-up days.

Councillor Roxanne Mashari thanked Councillor Julie Johnson for organising the clean-up day and requested that the next one might take place on a weekend.

- Harry Mackie from the Welsh Harp Environmental Education Centre informed the Committee that the centre was no longer closing as it had secured funding for the next 2 years. Mr Mackie also noted that the centre is booked up by Schools for the next 2 years.
- Chairman Councillor John Hart noted that the Bird Hide looked good and offered his thanks to those who carried out this work in its restoration.

- Councillor Julie Johnson noted the poor condition of the bank at the former youth sailing base site. She reminded Members of the removal of the jetty which provided a shelter for birds. Councillor Johnson believed that there had been no consultation for the removal and said the area was now in a poor condition. The Committee suggested that Barratt Homes to attend the next meeting to inform the committee of the work being conducted youth sailing base site.
- The Committee were also informed of the Dollis Valley Green Walk (DVGW)
  Project. The London Borough of Barnet won the Mayor's priority parks project and
  was awarded £400,000. Treatment to invasive species and maintenance work to
  the brook will be carried out. The committee suggested that an environmental
  impact survey be conducted.
- The Chairman Councillor John Hart welcomed Mr Derek Chung to the meeting. Mr Chung prior to the meeting made a written declaration to become a Committee Member on the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee representing the West Hendon Residents Association and Friends of York Park. The Committee Members unanimously agreed to appoint Mr Chung as a Committee representative.
- Paul Frost, Democratic Services Officer, reminded Committee Members of the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee membership review which was conducted earlier in the year. The Committee agreed to remove the following organisations from the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee:

## Report from the Director of Environment and Neighbourhoods

### Welsh Harp Management Plan

### 1.0 Summary

1.1 This report presents progress on the Brent Reservoir / Welsh Harp Management Plan. The Management Plan is jointly managed by the three main local land-holding organisations: Brent Council, British Waterways, and the London Borough of Barnet.

### 2.0 Recommendations

2.1 Members are asked to note the Report.

### 3.0 Detail

### Welsh Harp / Brent Reservoir Management Plan

3.1 The Welsh Harp / Brent Reservoir Management Plan is available on the internet at the Brent Council website www.Brent.gov.uk/parks

### **Management works**

3.2 Water weed issues: The Welsh Harp Sailing Association have been leading on the problem of excessive water weed on the Reservoir.

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### 3.3 Parks Warden Service

The Parks Warden service was reduced as part of the recent reorganisation of Brent Council. Currently there are a maximum of two mobile wardens on duty at any one time. It is anticipated using up to three agency staff to increase coverage from August to October. The grounds maintenance team visits the Welsh Harp at regular intervals.

### **Heritage Lottery Award**

3.4 Maintenance of the Heritage Lottery Fund award project continues.

### **Biodiversity Action Plan**

3.5 The Welsh Harp is an important area for several habitats and species; and this is recognised by the Site of Special Scientific Interest and Local Nature Reserve status. Despite the annual work to control tree growth in the marshland edge of the Brent Reservoir, scrub appears to be increasing in the marshland and as belts on the acid grassland at Neasden Recreation Ground. Japanese Knotweed is also encroaching into both habitats. While the conservation and restoration of these habitats has been identified in the Biodiversity Action Plan, the most effective action within the resources available is needed to conserve and restore habitat. The Sports and Parks Service are investigating if additional cutting and use of machinery are possible; and the possibility of grant funding for the acid grassland. As noted above, the Welsh Harp Sailing Association are leading on removing excess plant growth from the open water of the reservoir; but long term solutions may need to involve a catchment management approach to reduce nutrient levels in the river and at some stage, removal of alluvium from the reservoir. ### **Events / Other**

- 3.6 Brent Council Sports Service and Welsh Harp Environmental Education Centre: The Healthy Walks Programme continues to March 2012. Walks meet at the Welsh Harp Open Space car park, Birchen Grove, every Thursday (except on Bank / Public Holidays) from 10am-11am. The walks are 'low to moderate' in pace. - 3.7 Capital Ring: Stocks of the leaflets are available from Barnet, and Brent Councils.

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### 4.0 Financial Implications

- 4.1 None specific, but some of the priorities identified in the Management Plan will require additional resources and decisions by, as appropriate, Brent Council, Barnet Council or British Waterways, if they are to be implemented in the future. For Brent Council Parks Service, the Management Plan is implemented and improvements programmed via the Brent Parks Service Parks Strategy, and Service Plan; both of which derive from the Council's Corporate Strategy. Thus implementation is partially dependent upon revenue and capital budgets for grounds maintenance and for parks management. The Parks Service pursues other sources of finance and opportunities for partnership working that may become available.
- 4.2 Financial implications of restructuring proposals are detailed in other Council reports.

### 5.0 Legal Implications

- 5.1 Under the the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 as amended by the Countryside and Rights of Way (CROW) Act 2000 and the Natural Environment and Rural Communities (NERC) Act 2006,land owners or occupiers are required to give notice to and consult with Natural England for any operation in an area of land that is of special interest by reason of any of its flora, fauna, or geological or physiographical features (this requirement applies to operations within a SSSI, and to operations outside the SSSI that may affect the features of interest); and Natural England will issue consent, issue consent with conditions or refuse consent. CROW (and section 28G of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981) places a duty on all public bodies to take reasonable steps, consistent with the proper exercise of the authority's functions, to further the conservation and enhancement of the site.
- 5.2 It is good practice for land owners or occupiers to produce
  Management Plans for the SSSI, which when approved by Natural
  England, enable the carrying out of the works specified in the
  Management Plan. This can reduce the administrative work inherent in
  obtaining consent for individual items of management work.
- 5.3 The Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006 requires that from 1 October 2006 all public authorities in England and Wales have a general duty to have regard to the conservation of biodiversity so far as is consistent with the proper exercise of their functions.

### 6.0 Diversity Implications

6.1 The proposals in this report have been subject to screening and officers believe that there are no diversity implications.

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### 7.0 Staffing/Accommodation Implications

7.1 None specific.

### 8.0 Environmental Implications

8.1 The Welsh Harp Management Plan co-ordinates environmental works in the Reservoir area.
