The SHOP has benefited from a premises licence since December 2006 firstly as an off licence and then on 27th February 2007 to supply alcohol to be consumed on the premises. This premises licence allows the licence holder to open to the public at 1000 hours daily and close to the public at midnight daily. The licensible activites permitted are supply of alcohol and late night refreshment only. The premises are not licensed for any entertainment. Since the current premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor began operating The SHOP on 24th June 2011, he has constantly allowed unauthorised licensable activities. These unauthorised activities have caused distress and anguish for local residents resulting in a negative

Police and the licensing authority have offered advice and support on numerous occasions (information contained in supporting document). Although Mr Allen appears to take the advice on board in the first instance, this is clearly not implemented long term.

the DPS. I spoke to Mr Allen about the forthcoming Notting Hill Carnival and advised him that customers would not be allowed to congregate outside the premises and that glass drinking vessels were not permitted. I gave Mr Allen my contact details. Mr Allen did not appear confident in his knowledge of the premises licence conditions and I intended visiting him soon after to reinforce licensing legislation.

I made enquiries with the Licensing Authority and researched the initial premises licence application and discovered the external decking area on the front forecourt is not defined as the premises on the plans submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority. Therefore licensable activities can not take place on the external front decking.

On 19th August 2011 I was on duty in plain clothes, at 2100 hours I visited The SHOP. Mr Allen was present in the bar. The external tables on the decking outside the front were in use by several customers drinking alcohol. I spoke to Mr Allen about my findings in relation to external decking area and told him from that point on he could not allow licensable activities out there. I also explained the procedure of applying to vary the premises licence to include the decking area for licensable activities. I re-iterated to Mr Allen the premises were also not licensed for entertainment. I examined the CCTV system, it was working adequately. I spoke to Mr Allen about Notting Hill Carnival weekend and he informed me he would be using plastic vessels throughout and he would have two door supervisors on both Sunday and Monday.

Mr Allen had submitted a Temporary Event Notice for the Sunday from midnight, allowing the bar to remain open to the public until 0200 hours on the Monday morning. The Monday would be the regular closing time of midnight. I reminded Mr Allen not to allow his customers to congregate outside and obstruct the public highway.

I was concerned about the sincerity of Mr Allen's response to me and not convinced he had taken my advise seriously, because at 2130 hours (15 minutes after I had left the bar) when I walked passed The SHOP again, there was still people drinking on the decking area drinking alcohol and Mr Allen just appeared to be socialising and not moving his customers inside.

On Sunday 28th and Monday 29th August 2011 I was on duty in plain clothes in company with PS 10QK Adrian Adolphus, we were on foot patrol conducting licensing visits during the Notting Hill Carnival. One of the licensed premises in the Brent carnival footprint is The SHOP, 75 Chamberlayne Road. At 2100 hours on Sunday 28th I saw the footpath outside the premises was totally obstructed by persons dancing to loud music emanating from The SHOP. At 2045 hours on Monday 29th August there were approximately 15 customers in the external decking area drinking alcohol. I spoke to the

door supervisor and Mr Allen I advised him very strongly that the decking area was not covered on the plans for licensable activity and to get the customers inside the venue. I was aware that another licensing enforcement patrol also working the Carnival footprint had visited The SHOP within the previous hour and told Mr Allen the same. I waited nearby for the customers to go in to the building. I was later informed that a licensing enforcement officer had returned to The SHOP at 2130 hours and Mr Allen was back out on the decking with customers drinking alcohol.

On 22nd October 2011 I was on duty in plain clothes although wearing overt body armour in company with PS 10QK Adolphus. At 0045hrs we visited The SHOP. Mr Luke Allen was inside but I did not speak to him. There were five customers standing on the decking area outside the front of the venue. There were no chairs or tables on the decking. The customers were smoking and one male was drinking from a glass bottle of beer. There was a male member of staff outside the front of the venue sweeping the pavement. I spoke to him and he informed me that the bar was closing up for the night. He also informed me that the venue had been visited by the Environmental Health team earlier in the night due to complaints of noise.

Friday 2nd December 2012 I was on duty in company with PS 10QK Adolphus in an unmarked Police vehicle at 2340 hours we were travelling south along Chamberlayne Road when we stopped the vehicle near to The SHOP. I could hear muffled lively music with strong base sounds coming from the premises.

On 3rd February 2012 I was on duty in company with PS 10QK Adolphus in an unmarked Police vehicle. We were parked Station Approach at the junction with Chamberlayne Road between 0050 hours and 0100 hours I witnessed the following at The SHOP. Music was loud and muffled but with a deep base, the music was clearly audible when the front door of the venue was opened. I could see Mr Allen walking around within the Bar. I could see eight customers and two members of staff behind the bar and another who appeared to be collecting glasses. Some of the customers were enjoying dancing to the music at the front of the venue, in front of the window. One male customer came outside to have a cigarette on the decking area.

I am conscious that local residents have made complaints to responsible authorities of the council in regard to public nuisance at this venue since it was opened by Mr Allen. I am aware Mr Allen has been informed of these complaints and was due to attend a residents meeting in respect to the nuisance issues but Mr Allen cancelled at the last minute. Mr Allen appears to have total disrespect to both residents and responsible authority requests. After numerous attempts to advise Mr Allen he continues

is not promoting the licensing objectives of public safety and public nuisance.



I am employed by the London Borough of Brent as a Licensing Officer. My duties include enforcing the Licensing Act 2003. On the 6th September 2011 I carried out a post carnival visit after the carnival update was sent out by my colleague Susana Figueiredo. Susana had asked me to advise Mr Luke Allen who is the Licensee of The Shop 75 Chamberlayne Road London NW10 3ND on the issues which were found. As stated in the update there were issues regarding, persons spilling onto the road, obstructing the footpath, persons that seemed intoxicated, alcohol outside the premise, noise nuisances and Health & Safety issues. Luke Allen does not have facility on his license for alcohol to be consumed outside of the premise. During the visit I reiterated what Susana had already explained to Luke Allen over the carnival days. I advised Luke Allen to, on event nights when there is a Temporary Events Notice in place to have the DJ decks at the back of the premises in a more suitable location. I also advised him not to have anyone standing outside at the front of the premise until he had varied the license accordingly. On 17th November 2011 I visited Luke Allen to discuss complaints regarding issues of noise. He is aware that they do not have a licence to play music and that they are to close at 00:00 as stated on the licence which is displayed at the entrance of the premise. I advised Luke Allen to address the noise issues with all staff members. On 8th December 2011 I visited Luke Allen regarding more complaints about noise disturbance. On 16th December 2011 at approximately 00:30, whilst out on visits, my colleague Susana Figueiredo and I went past the premise of Luke Allen and noted that there were approximately 17 people standing outside of The Shop. The Customers directly outside of the premise were smoking and drinking. On 7th February 2012 I visited The Shop to request a meeting with Luke Allen, the residents within the vicinity and myself to discuss and address the issues raised. This meeting was to take place on February 16th 2012 at The Shop premise at 10:30am. A letter was sent out on 10th February confirming this meeting. This was cancelled by Luke Allen on 14th February 2012 as his business partner was unavailable on this day. Another meeting was not rescheduled due to availability of all parties involved. As agreed by residents, Luke Allen was sent a copy of the log of events when residents had been disturbed. This was sent on 12th March 2012.

I am employed by the London Borough of Brent as a Licensing Officer within the Safer Streets Department. My duties include enforcing the Licensing Act 2003. On Sunday 28th August 2011 at approximately 23.00hrs I visited The Shop, 75 Chamberlayne Road, NW10. On arrival there were people stood on the private forecourt, on the pavement and in the road, some of which were drinking alcohol. It is not certain whether the alcohol had been bought in The Shop but it would suggest to me that it had because it was in plastic cups. There were also a number of Red Stripe (beer) bottles being drunk which are also sold on the premise. The crowd were blocking the footpath making it difficult for anyone to walk by. There was loud music playing which was very audible from the street. This was due to the sound system being set up at the front of the premise. I spoke to the owner and Designated Premises Supervisor who I now know to be Luke Allen. I asked

him why there were so many people out on the street and he replied by saying that they were waiting to go into the premise. He also stated that some of the people were not his customers and were just hanging around. I explained to Mr Allen that the reason why people were hanging around was because they were enjoying the music that was audible outside. At this point I pointed to a female that was dancing on the pavement. The SIA staff did not seem to know what they were doing at the door. There was no queuing system and when asked how they knew how many people were inside they replied by saying that they had a door clicker. It then became apparent that they only had one door clicker because they had leant the other one to a neighbouring premise. This therefore enabled them to click their customers in but not click them out. Myself and my colleague Sergeant Stuart Jenkins entered the premise. It was very overcrowded in the first half of the bar and impossible to walk through. The back of the bar was empty but this was because the sound system had been put at the front of the premise. On this occasion the premise was operating under a Temporary Events Notice which meant that none of the licensed conditions applied. This meant that people were allowed to drink outside in the private area, recorded music could take place in the form of a DJ and the premise could remain open later than usual. I asked Mr Luke Allen to remove everyone from outside the premise and to ensure the door remained closed so as not to allow music to be audible outside. There was a lot of confusion about who should be doing what and the premise did not seem to be managed well. Myself and my colleague then left the premise. On Monday 29th August 2011 at approximately 20.00hrs I visited The Shop again with Sergeant Stuart Jenkins during my Notting Hill Carnival duties. The premise was now operating under their normal licensed conditions which prevented any alcohol from being consumed outside the premise. On arrival there were persons in the private area drinking alcohol, I spoke to Mr Luke Allen and told him that he was not to allow the consumption of alcohol outside his premise as he was now operating under his normal licence. I told him that I had explained this to him the day before and that it seemed that he was purposely not listening and doing what he so wished as opposed to what his licence stated he should do. I also spoke to the SIA staff and told them not allow anyone to come outside with alcohol. Myself and my colleague left the premise. At approximately 21.30hrs as I was driving past The Shop again I noticed that Mr Allen was sitting with his back to me in the private area with a group of approximately 5 other males. One of the SIA staff were also sat at the table. One of the males was holding a bottle of Red Stripe and the others had plastic cups in their hand filled with drink. I cannot say if this drink was alcohol. As Mr Allen saw us approaching he kept his back to us and one by one each of the males stood up, hid the drink inside their jackets and moved into the premise. Mr Allen was then left sat on his own outside. I approached Mr Allen to ask why he was allowing people to drink outside his premise when I had told him twice previously that he was not entitled to do this. that no one was drinking alcohol outside. I told him that I saw the bottle of Red Stripe to which he had no reply and told him that it looked very suspicious when everyone in the group got up, hid their drinks and went inside just as we arrived. Mr Allen could not give me a reason why this happened. I told Mr Allen that I would be reporting him to the Licensing Sergeant Adrian Adolphus because he was not managing his premise in a way that meets the four Licensing objectives and that he wasn't abiding by the conditions of his licence. I then left the premise with my colleague.

Since their opening in July 2011, The Shop have proved to be extremely bad neighbours. Our main complaint is that we have been regularly subjected to noise nuisance, resulting in a state of sleep deprivation and a clear degradation of our quality of life.

Added to that, The Shop have demonstrated on several occasions that they either do not care about or are unable to control the behaviour of their staff and customers.

Please find below more details grouped according to the objectives of this review.

PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- There have been several occurrences of The Shop's customers getting to a rather advanced stage of drunkenness and then wandering outside shouting and sometimes breaking glasses and bottles.
- We also witnessed in the night of 04/05 February 2012 customers starting a snowball fight at around 00:30 in front of The Shop and along the street.
 Snowballs were thrown at people, parked cars and scooters, and over the road.
 While it may sound like fun, it was clearly out of control and could have ended up badly.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- We rather frequently can see customers stagger out of The Shop and then directly cross the road instead of walking down the street to use the pedestrian crossing.
 We don't know whether The Shop could do anything about it (apart from making sure customers do not get drunk...), but this is obviously dangerous for both the customers and the traffic.
- There have been many occurrences of The Shop's customers outside occupying the whole width of the pavement, forcing us and other pedestrians to walk on the road and thus putting us in danger.
- There have been several occurrences of broken glass left on the pavement in front of The Shop and also in front of our property, as well as along the side of the road. It also appears that some customers and/or staff take a habit of smoking and drinking in front of our doorstep as we are often polluted with cigarette butts and traces of glasses (or sometimes even empty glasses).

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Noise nuisance from The Shop started as early as the evening of their opening day and quite often extends beyond their licence opening times.

It consists of:

- loud music with deep bass propagating through the party wall,
- the use of microphones when The Shop organizes parties with DJ,
- occasionally very loud customers, mainly when The Shop hosts private parties.

We contacted The Shop's manager (Luke Allen) directly on multiple occasions to let him know about the nuisance. Every time he was friendly, apologized and promised to improve the situation, but the nuisance just kept going on.

After several weeks of efforts trying to manage the issue with The Shop directly, we resorted to contacting Brent Council: the Environmental Health department, the Brent Noise Team and the Health, Safety and Licensing department.

The Licensing Enforcement Officer got in touch with The Shop several times to warn them about the situation but unfortunately without success.

More recently the Licensing Enforcement Officer tried to arrange a meeting between the residents of 77 Chamberlayne Road (i.e. us and miss Janet MacDonald) and The Shop's DPS (Luke Allen) so that the problem could be discussed; a date was agreed and we made arrangements with our works to be able to attend but the DPS cancelled on a short notice and no alternative date was set.

Please find below a log of some of the disturbances we have been through.

This log has been sent to the Licensing Enforcement Officer and we believe has also been passed on to the Police.

Notes:

- We only started logging things in September 2011 when we finally realised that trying to solve the issue by talking to The Shop's manager was pointless.
- There are a number of occasions where, although annoyed, we were far too tired to check things out and take notes.
- "until after" indicates the last time we took note of the clock; quite often things continued for some time but we just tried to get asleep despite it.
- * 10-11/09/2011: Until after 01:30.
- * 17-18/09/2011: Until 00:20.
- * 22-23/09/2011: Until 00:20 (Note: we went downstairs to chat with the manager).
- * 04-05/10/2011: Until after 01:00 (Note: we sent a text to the manager about the music at around 23:36 to which he replied at 01:18 apologizing; we also called the Brent Noise Team but they wouldn't be able to help).
- * 06-07/10/2011: Between 22:00 and 23:00 (Note: we sent a text to the manager).
- * 07-08/10/2011: Until after 03:00 (Note: we sent a text to the manager; he replied the next day apologizing, saying he wasn't in at the time and that he had had "a massive go" at the shift manager; we also called the Brent Noise Team but they were closed at that time).
- * 14-15/10/2011: Until after 03:45 (Note: we sent a text to the manager as early as at 21:00 as the music was already annoying at that time).
- * 15-16/10/2011: Until after 00:30 (Note: we called the Brent Noise Team but no follow-up).

- * 20-21/10/2011: Until 00:55 (Note: we called the Brent Noise Team but they were closed early).
- * 21-22/10/2011: Until 00:30 (Note: we were woken up at 23:35 by stupidly loud music; we called the Brent Noise Team, but unfortunately they visited at 00:40 when the music had gone but the bar was still open and about to close).
- * 29-30/10/2011: From 22:00 to midnight.
- * 02-03/11/2011: Until after 00:20.
- * 04-05/11/2011: Until after midnight (and particularly between 23:45 and 00:05).
- * 05-06/11/2011: Between 23:00 and midnight (Note: we sent a text to the manager).
- * 11-12/11/2011: Until 01:30 (Note: we called the Brent Noise Team but they were closed early).
- * 12-13/11/2011: Bar still open at 01:00 (Note: we were not disturbed as we were out until 01:00 and there was no loud music when we came back; just recording it as the bar being open beyond official hours).
- * 23-24/11/2011:
- Repeated bouts of loud music from 22:50 to 00:10.
- Bar still open with customers inside and in the street consuming alcohol at 00:20.
- * 25-26/11/2011:
- We passed in front of The Shop at 23:45, loud music.
- We passed again at 00:15, bar still open with customers inside and in the street consuming alcohol.
- Still music and people talking loudly at 01:10.
- * 30/11/2011-01/12/2011:
- Loud music + shouting + use of a microphone from before 21:00 until 22:30.
- * 02-03/12/2011:
- 22:45: Music with bass getting louder.
- 22:55: We called the Brent Noise Team but asked not to be called back as we were trying to sleep (so we don't know if anybody visited The Shop).
- Still music past 01:00.
- * 03-04/12/2011:
- Music with bass the whole evening with regular bouts at very high volume.
- Last bout with customers in from 00:00 to 00:10.
- Staff still playing loud music until around 01:40 when they closed.

Note: We called the Brent Noise Team at 00:55 but they wouldn't take any more complaints...

- * 06-07/12/2011:
- Outrageously loud music + people shouting.
- 23:20: We called the Brent Noise Team.
- 00:10: Music stopped.
- 00:20: We called the Brent Noise Team again to let them know the music had stopped.
- 01:00: Music again until beyond past 02:00.

* 07-08/12/2011:

- 23:10: Music + people laughing very loudly on the terrace.
- 23:50: Music gets louder until midnight + people shouting outside.
- 00:40: Still people outside drinking; some loud and drunk people; broken glasses.

* 09-10/12/2011:

- Loud music with deep bass from 22:30 until 00:10.
- 00:10: Music volume down but bar still open.
- 01:05: Music gets louder.
- 02:00: Music still on.

* 10-11/12/2011:

- 00:25: We passed in front of The Shop, bar still open with customers inside and outside.
- 00:50: Music on.

* 17-18/12/2011:

- 00:35: We passed in front of The Shop, front door open and a few people inside seated around the bar.

* 06-07/01/2012:

- 23:00: Loud music with bass; it also sounded like a microphone was being used.
- 23:30-23:50: Louder bouts.
- 00:10: Music still on and loud; we called the Brent Noise Team but we were told that the team wasn't taking any more calls and our complaint couldn't even be logged.
- 00:15: Music stopped, but bar still open and terrace packed and noisy.
- 00:35: Terrace being cleaned, a lot of noisy people on the pavement in front of our building.
- 00:45: Music again (less loud) until beyond 01:00.

* 07-08/01/2012:

- Relatively loud music from before 21:00.
- Heavy bass from around 22:30.
- 23:15: We took the garbage out and The Shop's music could be heard from the building's entrance even with the door closed.
- 00:30: Bar still open.- 01:10: Bar seemingly closed to customers but music on.

* 14-15/01/2012:

- 23:20: Music with banging bass.
- 23:35: Called the Brent Noise Team (reference number: 6621808).
- 00:18: The Brent Noise Team called on mobile but we missed the call, so we called them back at 00:20 to let them know the music had stopped.

* 20-21/01/2012:

- 23:45: Woken up by loud music.
- 00:15: Music gets even louder.
- No idea when the music stopped; we were so tired that we managed to get asleep with ear plugs.

* 21-22/01/2012:

- 23:40: Music gets louder with deep bass.
- Music stopped at about midnight.

* 25-26/01/2012:

- 23:40: Music gets louder with deep bass.

- 00:15: Music volume goes down.
- 00:30: Bar apparently still open and still some music.
- 00:50: Still music with bass.

* 27-28/01/2012:

- 21:20: We took the garbage outside. The Shop's music and bass could be heard from the corridor even with the front door closed.
- Loud music all night long (and loud people) until midnight.
- Bar then still open with (relatively loud) customers until 00:30.

* 28-29/01/2012:

- 22:00: Customers shouting repeatedly. After that, music gets louder.
- 22:15: Bass get louder.
- 22:30-22:45: More shouting and very loud singing. Looking at their Twitter page, it's a private party.
- 22:45: We called the Brent Noise. The agent said there was some delay due to workload.
- 22:45: Music and singing/shouting get even louder.
- 00:20: The Brent Noise Team called; we told them the music was lower than before but the bar should be closed by now; she replied they were on their way.
- 00:25: The music stopped and it looks like the bar is finally closing. We called the Brent Noise Team to let them know so that they can inform their agents who were on their way.
- 00:40: Two agents from the Brent Noise Team arrived; we told them the bar stopped the music about 5 minutes after their call and that we had called their central number to inform them; they said that they passed in front of The Shop and could see people leaving; they recorded our statement that the music stopped at 00:25.

* 03-04/02/2012:

- Loud bass until 00:05.
- 00:30: Bar still open and people still drinking at terrace.
- 00:35: Some music again.
- 00:55: More music with deep bass.

* 04-05/02/2012:

- Music as early as 19:30.
- From 21:45: Bass get much louder.
- 22:30: We called the Brent Noise Team but due to "the sheer volume of demand" they have closed their line.
- 00:00: Music stops.
- 00:15: Still people drinking and smoking at terrace.
- 00:20: Loud music again briefly.
- 00:30: Still some customers at terrace, shouting until 00:45 and starting a snowball fight in front of the bar.

* 07-08/02/2012:

- 23:00: Music with bass.
- 00:10: Music gets pretty loud. It seems to be the staff.
- 00:20: Bass get more insisting.
- 00:30: Music stops.

* 11-12/02/2012:

- From 20:35: Music with loud bass.
- No idea when music stopped as we managed to get asleep with ear plugs.

- * 17/02/2012-24/02/2012: We were away so can't tell about that period.
- * 25-26/02/2012:
- Some bouts of loud music from 21:50.
- 23:20: Bass make it hard to get asleep.
- * 29/02/2012-01//03/2012:
- The Shop organized a "Leap Year Show" party with DJ.
- 20:40: Music with bass + use of a microphone.
- 21:40: Music gets louder + still microphone.
- 22:15: Music pretty loud and very annoying
- 22:30: Noise level goes down, apparently no more music.
- 23:10: A bit of music relatively briefly.
- * 01-02/03/2012:
- 22:00: Music with bass.
- 23:00: Volume down a bit.
- 23:40-23:50: Bout of music with loud bass.
- 00:05: Music stops.
- 00:15: Bar still open with customers at terrace.
- * 02-03/03/2012:
- Music with bass until 22:45.
- After that still music at lower volume.
- 23:45: Bass make it hard to get asleep.
- * 03-04/03/2012:
- 22:00: Back home, music with bass (not extremely loud but annoying).
- 22:40: Bass get louder.
- 23:35: Bass get even louder.
- * The Shop have been quieter since the Met Police have applied for the licence review; this confirms our previous experiences that only pressure from officials has an effect on them...

CONCLUSION

The Shop seem to base their business model along the lines of a night club. However, such an approach has absolutely no place in a residential area.

They have also proved many times that they do not care about the neighbourhood. The rare occasions when they have shown some restraint were due to pressure from the borough or the police rather than real goodwill, and even then it never lasted for very long.

We therefore ask that their licence be amended to include an explicit ban on music, microphones and any other sources of potentially excessive noise, as well as a clear obligation to control the behaviour of their staff and customers.
