Hi there

I have just been informed of the new venture but not clear on how the nuisance, litter, noise or general traffic will be handled. We are ratepayers and a good employer.

We are already of the opinion that the road outside our building is already too littered – often with food waste (chicken bones, chips, regular litter etc) And we are worried about the rats. We see vomit every week on our driveway and this will make it worse for our staff entering and leaving our building. I see or hear no plans for the impact of yet more litter. We see the rats occasionally already – It will only get worse if there are no better facilities for cleaning and reducing pavement detritus especially food waste.

We are a tenant and employer of 34 people to protect in our in our building so our point of view should be taken into consideration.

The owners of Grill For You have already taken it upon themselves without our permission to get on our flat roof and erect an enormous extractor chimney a few weeks ago – 12m above our building. They say they have planning permission but would not show us. Nor did they show sense and responsibility for the workers on the roof and certainly did not care for our building or staff under our skylights who would suffer the calamity of an accidental fall through our skylights – as much as I tried to implore this point with Grill for you – they accused me of being interfering. Personally I fear their standards are way below required.

They need to be forced to keep the area clean and tidy. What will you do to ensure this for our staff and local community?

The original premises licence was applied for on the 26th October 2010 and was granted on 15th December 2010, Ms van Boekel was the licence holder and Mr Jaghtar Viridi(the freeholder) was the DPS. On the 2nd May 2012 Mr Viridi submitted a letter withdrawing from the position of DPS and Ms van Boekel applied. On the 15th May 2012 I objected to this and this went before the licensing committee on 30th January 2013, the application was refused.

Since the premises has opened it has been the source of crime and disorder and complaints to the Metropolitan Police Service and the London Borough of Brent. There have been several instances of violent criminal behaviour where the premises licence holder is either the suspect or the victim, I also believe she received a Conditional Discharge in November 2012 for 'Assault Police' following an incident at the premises. It is my opinion that the licensing objectives being breached are Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Public Nuisance and that the Premises Licence should be removed.

In addition there have been complaints from the public about this premises. A full resume of the crimes and Criminal Intelligence reports have been added on additional sheets, they describe in chronological order the events and subsequent reports about the venue.

Both Police and Local Authority Officers from Safer Streets have offered advice and support on numerous occasions (information contained in supporting document). Although Ms van Boekel appears to take on board advice in the first instance, this is clearly not implemented and the management of the premises is not sufficient. In addition I have been informed that several local RSL's have now removed all their clients from this premise due to the behaviour taking place within.

I reserve the right to produce evidence which amplifies the grounds for review which may take place at, or in the vicinity of the premises, between the service of this application and the hearing and / or during the time allowed for any appeal proceedings.

The Wembley Inn is a large hotel situated on the corner of Wembley high Road and Ealing Road, Wembley. It has been the subject of complaints and crimes since it opened.

Ms van Boekel has been advised by Safer Streets officers and Brent Police licensing officers and reponse officers on numerous occasions. The advice has been about what legislation she is actually breaching and why and also what action to take to put things right and prevent further problems.

On **30th January 2013**, Brent Council's Alcohol and Entertainment Licensing Sub-Committee met to hear an application for the above premises. The Committee having considered the relevant representations that the application by Hermien Van Boekel to vary the designated premises supervisor for the premises licence for 'Wembley Inn' (1 Ealing Road, Wembley, HA0 4AA) pursuant to the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 be refused.

Reasons

The Alcohol and Entertainment Licensing Sub-Committee (B) noted that the applicant had confirmed in writing that they would not be attending the hearing and had also verbally stated that they would be changing the application for the variation of the designated premises supervisor although this had not been received in writing. In view of this, the sub-committee felt that it was appropriate to consider the application in their absence.

Upon considering the evidence, the sub-committee noted that the applicant had been convicted of a relevant offence that had not been 'spent', whilst there was also sufficient evidence presented in the police's representation to indicate that she would fail to meet the standards required of the fit and proper person test. In view of the above, the application was accordingly refused.

Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

(a) No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when no designated premises supervisor has been specified in the licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his or her licence has been suspended.

(b) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

(c) All persons present on the premises who are required to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Admission of children must be restricted according to film classification.

(d) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(e) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

(f) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

(g) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(h) The responsible person shall ensure that-

(i) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- beer or cider: half pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(ii) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.

2 Door supervisors of a sufficient number and gender mix, shall be employed from 20:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight to non-residents.

3 A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

4 Customers shall not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.

5 The total number of people permitted in the first floor bar area shall not exceed 28.

6 A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

7 The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

8 Signs alerting customers to theft shall be displayed.

9 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

10 On major event days at Wembley Stadium the following shall apply:

- Customers shall not be allowed to congregate outside the premises.
- No glass bottles shall be handed over the bar but decanted into plastic vessels.
- The DPS shall work in partnership with the Police and if necessary comply with any direction given by the most senior Police Officer on duty at the event.

11 Nudity, striptease and other entertainment of an adult nature shall not be permitted on the premises.

12 The locks and flush latches on the exit doors and gates shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars and pads whilst the public are on the premises.

13 A residual current device (RCD), having a rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps, shall be provided to any socket or power supplies to be used for temporary stage, band or disco equipment, likely to be accessible to performers, staff or public.
