I certify that I have considered the notice shown above and I wish to make **representations** that the use of the premises for the temporary event would undermine the crime prevention initiative, for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

A Temporary Event Notice has been given under section 100 Licensing Act 2003 by Mr Mark Davidson, received in this office on Friday 14th March 2014.

Police are formally objecting to the notice under section 104 Licensing Act 2003. The Police objection is primarily concerned with the crime and disorder and public nuisance objectives:

The notice tendered is for 5th April 2014 from 0001 hours to 0700 hours and 6th April 2014 from 0001 hours to 0700 hours and is described as 'Feel good Fridays late night' for 499 persons.

This premise has come to notice in recent weeks with a high volume of complaints from local residents. The complaints are in relation to noise nuisance from the visitors to the premise especially at dispersal. Brent Police have made contact with both residents and the applicant. On 14th March a meeting was held with Mr & Mrs Davidson and an action plan was compiled. In view of the closeness of this event

and the timings Police are of the opinion the action plan has not had sufficient time to bed in.

There is no indication in the application of any alternative measures to the action plan to reduce the problems made by the customers at the time of writing.

I certify that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance. On behalf of Safer Streets the (Environmental Health) I wish to **make representations** to the T.E.N.

On the following grounds:

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise.
- Noise generated by patrons in external areas of the premises e.g. beer garden.
- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter.
- Noise from patrons exiting the premises.

Conditions

- 1) No noise or vibration from the playing of live or recorded music shall be detectable at any neighbouring noise sensitive premises.
- 2) The external areas will be used for **smoking only**. No amplification shall be played in external area. Licensed door supervisors are to actively monitor the smoking areas to control the number of patrons using the area and ensure any noise from them do not cause disturbance to local residents.
- 3) Signage is to be displayed requesting patrons to be respectful to local residents, and keep voices to a minimum before entering and leaving the premises.
- 4) All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed activities. Where a door is used for patrons to enter or leave the premises the door will be managed by door supervisors and staff told to ensure that it is not propped open.

I certify that I have considered the notice shown above and **I wish to make representations** that the use of the premises for the temporary event would undermine the crime prevention initiative, for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

A Temporary Event Notice has been given under section 100 Licensing Act 2003 by Tavi Thevarajah.

Police are formally making representations to the notice under section 104 Licensing Act 2003. The Police objection is primarily concerned with the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives.

The application is for sale of alcohol, provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment on the premises on Sunday 6th April from 0301 - 0600hrs and Monday 7th April from 0001 to 0300hrs.

The current operator and notice giver Mr Tavi Thevarajah is the designated premises supervisor for the venue.

On 2nd March 2014 at around 0330 hours five emergency calls were made to Police relating to a large fight and serious disturbance at the Carlton Lounge (Cads 1578,1590,1600,1583,1606 refer). Two allegations of assault were made to police that involve continuing investigations. Officers who attended the scene reported there were drunkenness and young persons involved.

I spoke to Mr Thevarajah on 8th March to ascertain what had happened. He informed me there had been a 18th birthday party at the venue. I requested a copy of the CCTV footage in accordance with the premises licence for the venue, in writing. I did not hear from Mt Thevarajah so on 14th March I repeated the CCTV request over the telephone. He said he was visiting Carlton Lounge that evening and would have the footage for me. As I writ this letter I have still not received the footage or any explanation for Mr Thevarajah but he has attended the civic centre to deliver the TEN. I would like to examine the footage speak to the DPS and risk assess where that party went so badly wrong leading to serious disorder and crime.

Without further details it is impossible at this stage to manage the risks associated with another birthday party. Due to the above information I fear that if this event is allowed to go ahead that there will be an increased risk of public nuisance and crime at the location and that the applicant has not supplied sufficient information at this time to reduce that risk.

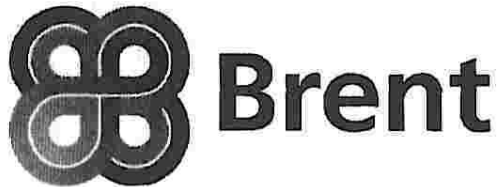



**Police Objection to the Temporary Event Notice for Carlton Lounge, 232-234
Kingsbury Road, NW9 0BH**

I certify that I have considered the notice shown above and **I wish to make representations** that the use of the premises for the temporary event would undermine the crime prevention initiative, for the reasons indicated below.

Licensing Constable 157QK

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

A Temporary Event Notice has been given under section 100 Licensing Act 2003 by Tavi Thevarajah.

Police are formally making representations to the notice under section 104 Licensing Act 2003. The Police objection is primarily concerned with the crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives.

The application is for sale of alcohol, provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment on the premises on Sunday 26th May from 0001 - 0600hrs for a birthday party that is occupying the function room, front bar and shisha lounge.

The current operator and notice giver Mr Tavi Thevarajah is the designated premises supervisor for the venue.

On 2nd March 2014 at around 0330 hours five emergency calls were made to Police relating to a large fight and serious disturbance at the Carlton Lounge (Cads 1578,1590,1600,1583,1606 refer). Two allegations of assault were made to police that involve continuing investigations. Officers who attended the scene reported there were drunkenness and young persons involved.

I spoke to Mr Thevarajah on 8th March to ascertain what had happened. He informed me there had been a 18th birthday party at the venue. I requested a copy of the CCTV footage in accordance with the premises licence for the venue, in writing. I did not hear from Mt Thevarajah so on 14th March I repeated the CCTV request over the telephone. He said he was visiting Carlton Lounge that evening and would have the footage for me. As I write this letter I have still not received the footage or any explanation for Mr Thevarajah but he has attended the civic centre to deliver the TEN. I would like to examine the footage speak to the DPS and risk assess why that party went so badly wrong leading to serious disorder and crime.

Without further details it is impossible at this stage to manage the risks associated with another birthday party. I would like to see the booking contract and details of the party organiser. Due to the above information I fear that if this event is allowed to go ahead that there will be an increased risk of public nuisance and crime at the location and that the applicant has not supplied sufficient information at this time to reduce that risk.
