6. **Disciplinary and Dismissal Procedures for the Chief Executive, Monitoring Officer and Section 151/Chief Finance Officer**

<p style="text-align: center;">Calculation of Council Tax Base 2016/17</p>	

1. Summary

- 1.1 This report sets out council tax base calculations to be used for 2016/17. The level of council tax base set is used in the calculation of the council tax for 2016/17. Regulations require that the council tax base is set by 31st January prior to the start of the financial year.

2. Recommendations

2.1 To agree that:

- (i) The collection rate for the council tax for 2016/17 is set at 97.50%.
- (ii) In accordance with the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base) Regulations 1992, the amount calculated by the council as its council tax base for 2016/17 is set at 89,254.

3. DETAIL

3.1. Background

- 3.1.1. The calculation of the tax base is one of the main stages in the process of setting the council tax, which is scheduled for the Council Meeting on 22nd February 2016.
- 3.1.2. Under regulations issued in 1992, the calculation must be carried out by 31st January prior to the start of the financial year
- 3.1.3. The calculation is initially based on the council tax base return submitted to the Department of Communities and Local Government in October 2015, which is used in Government grant calculations. For 2016/17 the tax base used in grant calculations is 89,543 Band D equivalent properties. This is after

taking account of the level of Council Tax Support under the Council's current scheme.

- 3.1.4. This figure assumes 100% collection of council tax. In practice, actual amounts collected will vary principally due to non-collection of council tax and changes in the numbers of properties in the borough. The council tax base set by the council takes account of what is expected to be collected eventually, not just by the end of the financial year in question.
- 3.1.5. Any adjustment to the tax base figure will have an effect on the precept payable to the GLA (i.e. if the tax base figure increases, then the precept from the GLA would increase accordingly – currently the GLA precept accounts for 21.79% of the total council tax bills in Brent).

3.2. Council Tax Collection Rate

- 3.2.1 Between 2001/02 and 2012/13 the council's collection rate was set at 97.5% as an assessment of the amount to be collected for the relevant year. For 2013/14 this was reduced to 96% to take account of the anticipated impact of households formerly receiving council tax benefit who now have to pay at least part of their council tax bill. In practice the effect of this has been less than anticipated, and an assumption of 97.5% eventual collection is recommended for 2016/17. 96.50% had been assumed for 2015/16, but analysis of collection to date for 2013/14 and 2014/15 indicates that 97.5% will eventually be achievable (96.8% of the debit for 2013/14 has been collected to date, but collection of arrears will continue for several years, albeit at declining levels).
- 3.2.2 In-year collection levels have improved in recent years from 93.2% in 2006/07 to 95.9% in 2012/13 (arrears collection will continue for several years after the end of the financial year). For 2013/14, it had been anticipated that the introduction of Council Tax Support would have a significant impact on collection levels, but in fact the final collection figure was 95.7%. This was maintained in 2014/15 (95.6%) There was an increase in the collection level for full ratepayers, with a higher than expected level from those formally on Council Tax Benefit now having to pay a portion of their Council Tax bill. Therefore there is scope to increase the eventual collection assumption. It is possible that collecting arrears on former CTB cases may still be difficult, but it is recommended that the 96.5% collection assumption for 2015/16 be increased to 97.50% for 2016/17. This has the effect of increasing the Council Tax income assumption feeding in to the overall budget for the Council.
- 3.2.3 If an over-optimistic assumption of the achievable collection rate is made, at some later stage a deficit in the Collection Fund will have to be declared, resulting in the need to increase the level of Council Tax in that year. Alternatively if the assumed collection rate is exceeded, a surplus could be declared later on. For 2016/17 it is considered realistic to assume an overall eventual collection level of 97.5%, as outlined above.

3.2.4. There are currently a number of sizeable new housing developments taking place which will result in a significant number of new properties coming in to rating. Some of these are for student accommodation which is exempt from Council Tax, but a reasonable estimate is that there will be an additional 2,000 properties over the next year. This can be added to the tax base calculation for 2016/17, as council tax will be due on these properties.

3.3 Setting the Council Tax Base

3.3.1 The tax base for 2016/17 is as follows:

Band D equivalent properties on the return to the DCLG (attached as Appendix A =89,543) + allowance for 2,000 new properties = 91,543

Multiplied by:

The estimated rate of collection (97.5%)

3.3.2. This produces the following calculation:

$$91,543 \times 97.5\% = 89,254$$

4 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The proposed council tax base for 2016/17 of 89,254 represents an increase of 6,455 over the figure for 2015/16. This will form part of the overall calculation of the Council's budget. The increase is due to a combination of factors: a significant reduction in the total claimed for Council Tax Support (which pushes up the taxbase figure) new properties coming in to rating (including the allowance for 2,000 additional properties in the next year), and the increase in the collection level assumption of 1.0%. It is unlikely that there will be a similarly large increase in subsequent years. The increase in the assumed collection percentage will be a one-off, and it is unlikely that CTS will fall much further.

5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1. The Council Tax Base is the equivalent number of Band D dwellings (after taking account of discounts and exemptions) which would raise the same amount of tax as the actual number of liable dwellings in the borough, with their actual spread of bands. The Band D equivalent total is then multiplied by the estimated collection rate for the year, to give the Council Tax Base figure. In the Council Tax calculation process to be undertaken at Full Council on 22nd February 2016 this figure will be used to calculate the amount of tax to be levied for a Band D dwelling. The Council Tax level for each valuation band is then calculated by a fixed ratio which each band bears to the Band D figure. The Council's Constitution currently requires that the calculation of the Council Tax Base be carried out by the General Purposes Committee.

5.2 Section 11A of the 1992 Local Government Act enables the Secretary of State to designate by regulations:

- (i) Categories of properties in respect of which the discount available in respect of empty properties may be reduced to a percentage of at least 10% (section 11A(3)); and
- (ii) Categories of properties in respect of which the discount may be reduced to any percentage or eliminated entirely (section 11A(4)).

In the Council Tax (Prescribed Classes of Dwellings) (England) Regulations 2003 the Secretary of State has designated furnished dwellings which are not the sole or main residence of an individual for the purposes of section 11A(3) (except caravan pitches and boat moorings) and unfurnished unoccupied properties for the purposes of section 11A(4).

Sections 11 and 12 of the Local Government Finance Act 2012 give billing authorities the discretion to vary the discounts applicable to specific classes of empty properties, second homes and long term empty properties from 1 April 2013.

Review of Polling Places

1.0 Summary

- 1.1 It is customary in advance of major elections to carry out a review of the polling places used at the previous election and to determine the availability of places for the forthcoming election. This report sets out the outcome of that review and makes recommendations for the elections in May 2016. Only a small number of changes are being proposed where circumstances require consideration of alternative premises. No alterations to polling district boundaries are proposed.

2.0 Recommendations

- 2.1 That in view of the restrictions required by the Winston Churchill Lycée, the polling place for NBA4 polling district in Barnhill ward be temporary portacabins situated in Greenhill Way.
- 2.2 That in the absence of viable alternatives, the use of Ark Franklyn Academy be agreed in principle as the polling place for HQP3 and HQP5 polling districts in Queen's Park ward and further discussions be held with the Head.
- 2.3 That in view of the unavailability of St Joseph's RC School, Church End and Roundwood Unity Centre be the polling place for CHA3 polling district.
- 2.4 That the polling place for voters in CDU2 polling district in Dudden Hill ward be portacabins situated in Mulgrave Road in preference to the site of Christ Temple on Clifford Way.

- 2.5 That the new Willesden Green Library be the polling place for electors in HBP1 polling district in Brondesbury Park ward.
- 2.6 That the polling places approved at this meeting be adopted for the Greater London Mayoral and Assembly elections.
- 2.7 That in the event of any venue becoming unavailable before the May 2016 elections, authority be delegated to the Democratic Services Manager to make alternative arrangements for polling places for these elections in consultation with the leaders of the political groups of the Council.

3.0 Detail

- 3.1 The last major review of the borough's polling districts and polling places was carried out in autumn 2013 and reported to members in January 2014. My report to Committee in January 2015 proposed further changes to venues for polling stations in 12 polling districts for reasons of availability and increased efficiency. This report is proposing only a small number of changes where a venue has become or is likely to be unavailable.
- 3.2 Polling districts, polling places and polling stations may be defined as follows:

A **polling district** is a geographical sub-division of an electoral area, ie a UK parliamentary constituency, a European Parliamentary electoral region, a ward or an electoral division.

A **polling place** is a geographical area in which a polling station is located. However, as there is no legal definition of what a polling place is, the geographical area could be defined as tightly as a particular building or as widely as the entire polling district. In Brent, the polling place has been customarily defined as the premises inside which voting takes place.

A **polling station** is the actual area where the process of voting takes place and must be located within the polling place designated for the polling district.

- 3.3 A copy of the proposals in this report have been circulated to members for comments. Responses where received have been incorporated into this report and any further comments received after publication will be reported to the meeting.
- 3.4 Since the 2015 General Election there has been a neighbourhood plan referendum in September and a by election in Kensal Green ward in December. In both cases, the previously used polling stations were retained with one exception. Furness School was unavailable for the by election and was replaced by the Designworks in Park Parade. While the venue was satisfactory, there was a small number of complaints at the change. This

report is proposing that Furness School be the chosen polling place for voters in polling district CKG4.

3.5 Subject to changes described in more detail below, this report proposes that polling stations used at the General Election in May 2015 be retained for the forthcoming Greater London Mayoral and Assembly elections in May 2016. A full list of polling stations for each polling district is attached at Appendix 1.

3.6 **Barnhill Ward: Polling district NBA4 - Huts near the former Town Hall site**

The former Brent Town Hall was long used as a polling place for electors in polling district NBA4 in Barnhill ward. During construction of the Winston Churchill Lycée on the site, the polling place has been two portacabins situated on Greenhill Way. Officers have held discussions on site with staff at the Lycée who are willing for us to use part of the site as a polling place. However they are unwilling for people to gain access to the site without first being checked in by a member of their security staff.

There is potential for objections to be raised by voters and for queues to build up, particularly in the early evening when the majority of voters turn up to vote.

Members for Barnhill ward have asked that if portacabins are required that they be situated alongside the Lycée on Kings Drive. While it is acknowledged that this would be preferable to the existing location on Greenhill Way close to the corner of Kings Drive, there are practical objections. The slope of Kings Drive makes it extremely difficult to construct a ramp to enable wheelchair access. In addition the level of traffic on Kings Drive causes considerable difficulty in delivering and collecting the portacabins. While on site, they do remain a potential hazard to traffic as they occupy more of the road than parked vehicles.

In view of the circumstances described above, this report recommends that the polling place continue to be portacabins situated close to the corner of Greenhill Way and Kings Drive.

3.7 **Queen's Park Ward: Polling Districts HQP3 and HQP5 - Ark Franklyn School (formerly Kensal Rise Primary)**

The Head Teacher has stated that she does not wish the school to be used as a polling station on the grounds of inconvenience for the running of the school.

While the Returning Officer has the power to use any buildings maintained at public expense, including academy schools, consideration has been given to alternative venues. The loss of the school will however be significant in that, since Moberly Sports and Education Centre in Kilburn Lane became unavailable, the Ark Franklyn school serves 2 polling districts.

The alternatives that have been investigated are:

- Kensal Rise Methodist Church on Chamberlayne Road. This venue is situated in an adjacent district (HQP1) and will confuse HQP1 voters many of whom will have to walk past it to their station at Manor School.
- There is a similar objection to the hall at the Church of the Transfiguration at the corner of Chamberlayne Road and Wrentham Avenue
- Co-use of Manor School with HQP1. However this will mean that there will be five polling stations in the school serving three polling districts.

In the circumstances, Ark Franklyn school is the only really suitable venue for electors in this area that has been identified. Further discussion will be held with the Head Teacher and the outcome reported to the meeting.

3.8 Harlesden Ward: CHA3 - St Joseph's School

Following the fire in 2015, the school has operated in temporary accommodation and will remain there for 2 years. It will not be available as a polling place during that time.

Officers have considered alternative locations including Leopold School, which already serves polling district CHA2, but there is no direct walking/driving route between the two sites; and the Restoration Revival Fellowship Apostolic Church which is directly opposite an existing polling place; and Church End and Roundwood Unity Centre which currently serves polling district CHA1.

In view of its proximity, it is recommended that Church End and Roundwood Unity Centre on Church Road be the polling place for polling district CHA3 until St Joseph's School once more becomes available. Although electors in CHA3 will have to cross a busy road, there are pelican crossings allowing safe access. The venue is considered to have sufficient space for the additional polling station.

3.9 Dudden Hill Ward: CDU2 Hut outside Christ Temple, Clifford Way

Although the owners of this site were willing to allow a temporary hut to be placed on their premises, there were protracted negotiations and high charges for use of the site based on the length of time the hut was situated there. Given that there are inherent problems with temporary huts, making them unpopular with both voters and polling station staff, there has been an investigation of alternative locations. Two have been identified, one of which is placing a hut on a different site. Those options are:

- A temporary cabin on Mulgrave Road; or
- Use the existing polling place at Northview School (polling district CDU3) on the other side of Dudden Hill Lane.

The school has sufficient capacity to allow another polling station serving around 1100 electors to be situated there. There is a potential objection in the need for electors to cross Dudden Hill Lane and the limited number of crossing points. On balance Northview School is recommended in preference to the options of a temporary hut at either Mulgrave Road or the existing place on Clifford Way.

One councillor has questioned the use of Northview Primary School given its location at the end of a cul de sac and consequent remoteness for some electors. She also cites the generally turnout in the polling district served by the school and the lack of pedestrian crossings on Dudden Hill Lane.

Given the undesirability of discouraging electors from participating in the election, this report recommends that the polling place for CDU2 polling district be a portacabin situated on Mulgrave Road.

3.10 Brondesbury Park Ward: HBP1 George Furness House

The polling place in this district has traditionally been the Willesden Green Library. While the site was being re-developed, it was replaced by a community room in the nearby George Furness House. Now that the library is fully re-opened it is recommended that it once again be the designated polling place. A site visit has identified a suitable room for use as a polling station.

3.11 Consultation with Members

All members were invited via the weekly information bulletin to comment on the draft of this report. To date 4 responses have been received:

1. A comment about the location of the polling station at the old Brent Town Hall (now Winston Churchill Lycée) which is described in more detail at paragraph 3.6 above.
2. A response to the proposals for polling district CDU2 as set out in paragraph 3.9 above.
3. A recommendation that electors in polling district HBP1 in Brondesbury Park ward resume voting at Willesden Green Library instead of the replacement premises at George Furness House. This proposal has been accepted and Willesden Green Library is included in the list of proposed polling places at appendix 1.
4. The submission relating to Brondesbury Park ward also considered that the Refectory was not large enough to accommodate 2 polling stations.

This location was used for the first time in 2015 after the North West London Jewish School expressed security concerns about its premises being used for elections. Officers have carried out site visits and consider that the premises are suitable. There was no negative feedback received following the General Election in 2015 either from electors, polling station staff or inspectors to contradict this view. It is therefore recommended to members that The Refectory be retained for electors in HBP4 polling district.

5. The final submission referred to the distance from the polling station for electors living in student nursing accommodation in Northwick Park. It was suggested that they be allowed to use a polling place in a neighbouring polling district.

Members may recall that there was some years ago a polling district consisting solely of the university campus and the hospital accommodation and that the polling place was a social club on the site of the hospital. As turnout at elections in that polling district was regularly less than 10%, the decision was taken to merge that polling district with its neighbour.

As there can only be one polling place in a polling district, the proposal could only be implemented by amending polling district boundaries, so as to move the campus and hospital accommodation into the alternative polling district, and subsequently re-publishing the entire electoral register.

4.0 Financial Implications

- 4.1 The cost of the elections in May 2016 is borne by the Greater London Authority. The total cost for hire of premises for the General Election in 2015 (excluding the costs for Hampstead and Kilburn constituency which were met by Camden Council) was £45,604.09 at an average cost per venue of £584.00. The average cost of a temporary hut was £1586.00.
- 4.2 No net reduction of polling stations arises from the recommendations in this report.

5.0 Legal Implications

- 5.1 The Representation of the People Act 1983 requires the council to divide every parliamentary constituency or part thereof within its area into polling districts and that these be kept under review. The council must also ensure that all electors are given such facilities for voting as may be reasonable in the circumstances.

6.0 Diversity Implications

- 6.1 The purpose of the review is to ensure that no elector is discouraged from voting because of any inconvenience placed in his or her way by the choice of polling station location in their area. The accessibility of premises for all electors is taken into consideration as a matter of normal procedure.
