Please state the ground(s) for review (please read guidance note 1)

Sudbury A-Z Newsagents currently has a Premise Licence to sell alcohol between the hours of 08.00 and 23.00 hours Monday to Saturday and 10.00 and 22.30 hours on Sunday. The Licence allows for alcohol to be consumed off the premises, and should not be sold in open containers. A recent review of the licence was held at the end of 2014 after the shop was found to be selling alcohol to local street drinkers and complaints from local residents of Anti-Social Behaviour; this resulted in the sub-committee adding numerous conditions to the licence.

The Premises Licence holder (PLH) and Designated Premises supervisor (DPS) are one and the same, a Mr Liaqat Ali Nutt.

Sudbury A-Z Newsagents and Mr Nutt are failing to promote two of the licensing conditions, namely the prevention of crime and disorder, and the prevention of public nuisance.

Police have no faith in the ability of the management to operate the premises responsibly and therefore wish to bring the matter before the sub-committee for consideration.

On the 23/07/2015 police officers conducted a licensing visit at the premises and found numerous breaches, this along with the recent review on the shops licence lead police to believe that there is no other option but for the Committee to consider that the Licence be revoked.

In August 2014 uniformed police officers witnessed street drinkers buying alcohol from the shop, Mr Nutt was warned about selling to people under the influence of alcohol but appeared to continue selling to the group who had congregated outside the front of the premises to consume their alcohol.

The shops licence at this time was a converted licence with no conditions; this allowed them to

sell high strength beers at low prices, which seemed to attract the local street drinkers. Having considered the application the committee decided that numerous conditions should be added to the licence.

It was determined that the conditions asked to be included by the police and agreed by the PLH holder be added, namely.

CCTV shall be installed to home office guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested

A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked

Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.

Anti-robbery time delay safe shall be installed and used

A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times

A sign stating 'No proof of age - No sale' shall be displayed at point of sale

A challenge 21 policy shall be adopted and adhered to

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visits by a relevant authority or emergency service

Written staff training shall be given regularly and signed records for inspection by local authority enforcement officers and police shall be made available on demand

There shall be no sale of single cans of alcohol at any time

All high strength beers, lagers, ciders above 6.0% ABV currently on the premises to be removed by midnight on 8 December 2014.

Police reserve the right to give evidence on any further incidents which may take place at, or in the vicinity of the premises, between the service of this application and the hearing and/or during the time allowed for any appeal proceedings.

On the 23/07/2015 Brent Police Licensing officers conducted a Licensing visit at Sudbury A-Z Newsagents 711 Harrow Road, on entering the premises they spoke to a male who gave his name as Mr Liaqat Ali Nutt he informed the officers that he was the Premises Licence holder (PLH) and Designated Premises supervisor (DPS) for the shop.

Officers first asked him if he had his Personal Licence to hand so they could examine it, he was unable to produce this, stating he did not know where it was.

Mr Nutt was then asked if he had the shops Premises Licence to show officers, he handed them the part A and B of the licence which were stapled together and bound in a plastic folder, on further examination it became clear that the part A was the old licence dated 15/02 2013 which had no conditions attached to it in Annexe 2, and that the part B was the up to date licence dated 03/12/2014.

Officers asked Mr Nutt why he had the old part A of his licence attached to the new part B at which point he became very nervous, and was unable to explain this, it was put to him that he had done it to deceive officers into believing he had no conditions on his licence, again he was unable to explain, but he then produced a folder from under the counter which had an up to date part A of the licence and handed it to officers.

The current licence has thirteen conditions attached as outlined above; officers then went through these in turn with Mr Nutt.

I asked Mr Nutt if he was aware of all the conditions on his licence, to which he stated that he was.

1. CCTV shall be installed to home office guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.

Mr Nutt was asked if the CCTV was working and a recording was being kept for 31 days, he stated that it was working correctly and being kept for 31 days, he was asked if he could show the officers the CCTV system and rewind it back an hour to show it working correctly, he stated that he didn't know how to work it.

2. - A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises, there is a camera suitably placed covering the entrance to the shop

Condition 3 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked

I then examined the shops fridge where I found several high strength beers on sale, namely Guinness Foreign Extra Stout (Bottles) 7.5% AVB, Desperados (Bottles) 5.9% AVB, Guinness Foreign Extra 7.5% AVB, Dragon Stout 7.5% AVB Perla 6.0% AVB (Cans) Zubr 6.0% AVB (Cans) Zywiec 5.6% AVB (Cans) and Kasztelan 5.7% AVB (Cans).

Mr Nutt was asked if he was aware that he could not sell alcohol above 5.5%, he replied 'yes nothing above 5.5%' he was then shown the beers describe above and did not respond, he was asked to remove these immediately.

At this point a customer came into the shop and selected a single bottle of Budweiser from the fridge, Mr Butt served the male, he placed the bottle into a small black plastic bag at which point the customer asked Mr Nutt to open it, to which he picked up a bottle opener from under the counter and removed the top, the male then left the shop with the open bottle of Budweiser, I asked Mr Nutt why he had just opened the bottle of alcohol, to which he replied

'they get angry if you don't do it, I then pointed out condition 12 of his licence regarding the sale of single cans of alcohol, to which he seemed confused.

By this time another male had come into the shop and introduced himself as a member of staff, he gave his name as Mr Khalid Mahmood and stated that he had worked at the shop for many years; he took over behind the counter so that Mr Nutt could speak with me without being interrupted by serving customers.

We then looked at condition number 4. Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.

Mr Nutt pointed behind the counter to where the spirits were stocked and said 'yes look a pull down shutter with a lock on it' this appeared to be in order, I then checked the fridge where the alcohol was kept and found that it had a plastic pull down roller shutter with no locking mechanism on it, I pointed this out to Mr Nutt, he replied 'she said that this is ok as it locks' I asked him who she was, he said 'the lady' I said that this did not meet the condition of his licence as anyone could just lift it up, and there was no lock on it.

We then looked at condition 5 - Anti-robbery time delay safe shall be installed and used I asked Mr Nutt if he had a time delay safe, he said 'yes' and walked to the rear of the shop and into the stock room where he showed me a key safe that was on the floor, I said 'does it have a time delay' he said 'no just a key' I pointed out that this was yet another breach as the condition clearly states that it must be a time delay safe.

Condition 6 - states A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times

I asked Mr Nutt to come outside with me, once outside I asked him if he could tell me what Mr Mahmood was doing inside the shop at this moment, he stated that he could not see inside the shop due to all the posters that were covering the windows, I showed him the condition stating a clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times and he agreed that this was being breached, and stated that he would removed all the posters.

Condition 7 - A sign stating 'No proof of age - No sale' shall be displayed at point of sale

I asked Mr Nutt to show me the sign with this wording, he pointed to a sign for proof of age for the sale of cigarettes, I pointed out that the wording needed to replicate the exact words in the licence, and is in reference to the sale of alcohol and not cigarettes, Mr Nutt stated that he did not have a sign.

At this point another member of the public entered the shop and selected a single can of Beer, I observed him then walk up to the counter pay for the can of beer and walk out of the shop, I asked Mr Mahmood, who had just served the male if he was aware of the licence condition not to sell single cans of beer, he replied yes but they cause trouble if you don't sell to them.

Condition 9 - A challenge 21 policy shall be adopted and adhered to, this was being adhered to.

Condition 10 - An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visits by a relevant authority or emergency service

I asked Mr Nutt if he had an Incident log book, he handed me a refusal book that had last been

used on the 17/02/2015, I explained that this was no sufficient as there was no where to record all the other conditions that are required within this condition, again he agreed and stated that he would get an Incident book.

Condition 11 - Written staff training shall be given regularly and signed records for inspection by local authority enforcement officers and police shall be made available on demand
Mr Butt produced a training folder containing a sheet signed by staff.

Condition 12 states - There shall be no sale of single cans of alcohol at any time
This was clearly breached twice during the time officers were conducting the licensing visit, Mr Nutt was warned that this must stop.

Condition 13 - All high strength beers, lagers, ciders above 6.0% ABV currently on the premises to be removed by midnight on 8 December 2014.
Again this condition is being breached due to the amount of high strength beers found to be still on sale in the shop.

Before leaving the shop I asked Mr Nutt if he could give me a copy of the CCTV for the time I had been on the premises, he said that he did not know how to work it and was unable to copy it from the system, he assured me that he would have a friend copy the footage on to disk and ready for my collection by the following week.

After several calls from me requesting the CCTV, Mr Nutt finally admitted to me on the 04/08/2015 that he was unable to get a copy of the CCTV as the screen was blank and it appeared that the system was not working correctly.

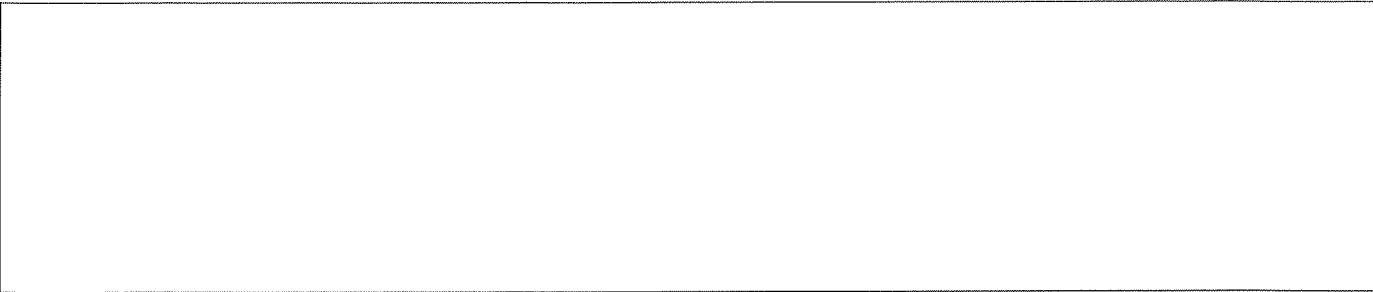
Also after assuring me that he would remove all the posters from the front of the shop windows to allow a clear and unobstructed view into the premises, I was surprised to see as I passed the premises on the 04/08/2015 that no attempt had been made to remove any of the posters and the windows are exactly the same as on the day of my visit.

Mr Nutt has shown a lack of Management in the running of his business, the above evidence shows he has no understanding of what is required of him as the PLH and DPS, he clearly has no regard to the Licensing objectives.

It is clear that Mr Nutt has not taken on board the seriousness of the Committees findings in the recent hearing and has hardly adhered to any of the conditions placed on his licence by them after being reviewed for his previous mismanagement of the premises.

It is clear he is not in control of what is going on and sees profit before the concerns of the Committee and the local residents;

It is clear that Mr Nutt is not able to abide by the conditions implemented by the committee and consideration could be given to removing him as the DPS and suspending the licence, but my feeling is that he will still be working in the shop on a day to day basis, and will continue to undermine the licensing objectives, this leads me to feel that there is no other alternative but to ask that the Committee consider revoking the licence.

On Friday 22nd August 2015 I was on duty in plain clothes, on mobile patrol in an unmarked police vehicle, in company with PC782QK Paul Whitcomb, at about 18.50 hours we were travelling along the Harrow Road Sudbury when my attention was drawn to two males outside Sudbury A-Z Newsagents 711 Harrow Road HA0 2LL, we were in slow moving traffic and I could clearly see that both males were drinking alcohol from open cans, we pulled over and stopped our vehicle and observed the males for a few minutes, one of the males was sitting directly outside the shop on a low rise wall, and had several empty beer cans around him, the other male was standing up pacing around, I got out of our vehicle and walked past the males as I passed the male sitting on the wall I could see he was swaying around and appeared drunk, I saw him finish the can of beer and throw it on the floor next to where he was sitting he then stood up and started staggering towards the shop, he then entered Sudbury A-Z Newsagents, I could clearly see he was having trouble walking due to being drunk, less than a minute later the male exited the shop now carrying a white plastic bag which contained cans of beer, he staggered back to the wall and sat down again and then took out one of the beers from the bag, opened it and started drinking from it, at this point I entered the shop and spoke to a male behind the counter, I now know the male to be Mr Haresh GUSHANI, I identified myself to him by showing him my warrant card, and then asked him if he had just sold alcohol to the male sitting outside on the wall he looked out at the male and said 'who him no he didn't buy his beer here' there was only one person outside sitting on the wall, I then informed him that I had seen the male entering the shop and then leaving with the beers, GUSHANI then said 'yes ok I served him' I then went outside and spoke to the male sitting on the wall, a male I now know to be Mr Robert MIGUS Whilst speaking to him I could see that his eyes were watery his speech was slurred and his breath smelt strongly of alcohol, he was drunk, I asked him where he had purchased his beers from, he pointed to Sudbury A-Z and said 'from there' I then asked where he had bought the beers he was drinking earlier from, and pointed to the empty cans next to him, he said 'yes from there' I then ask Mr MIGUS if I could take some pictures of him with the beer, he said 'yes' I exhibit these pictures as MJS/01,02, I then went back into the shop and informed Mr GUSHANI that I would need to speak with him about this matter, and asked if someone else could manage the till area as I did not want us to be distracted whilst I spoke to him, he called another male from the rear of the shop who took over the till area, myself and Mr GUSHANI then when to the rear of the shop, at 19.00 hours I explained that I was going to caution him and that he was not under arrest, and that he was free to leave at any time, I asked him if he wanted a solicitor present, he said 'no' at 19.01 hours I cautioned Mr GUSHANI, he made no reply to caution, I then explained to him what the caution meant and he stated that he understood, I then went on to ask him the following questions.

- Q 'What do you do in the shop'
- R 'I work here'
- Q 'Did you sell the male sitting outside on the wall the alcohol he is drinking'
- R 'Yes I did'
- Q 'Why did you sell the male the alcohol he is clearly drunk'

I recorded the questions and answers he gave me in an EAB, at this point we were joined by a male who gave his name as Mr lalit THATHOLA who stated he was a friend of Mr GUSHANI, and he lived nearby, he went on to say that he was from the same country as Mr GUSHANI.

Mr GUSHANI explained to Mr THATHOLA what was happening, and I asked Mr THATHOLA if he could read back to Mr GUSHANI what had been said and written down in his language and confirm he agreed that this was correct, I did this just to confirm that he fully understood what was said, and that there could be no misunderstanding as he stated that English was his second language, I was confident that he had understood what had been said of him due to his replies. Mr THATHOLA agreed and interpreted it to him and asked him if he agreed that it was correct, Mr GUSHANI said yes he understood and yes that is what was said, I then asked him to sign my notes as a true account of what had been said, which he did.

Mr GUSHANI then produced documents that proved his details, I then informed him that I was unable to deal with the matter today and that I would contact him within the next couple of weeks to inform him of how I would be dealing with the matter, he said ok and sorry for causing a problem, I reminded him of the licensing objectives and the fact that what he had done by selling to a drunk male constituted to an offence.

He assured me that he would not sell alcohol to any person that appeared drunk, I then left the premises.

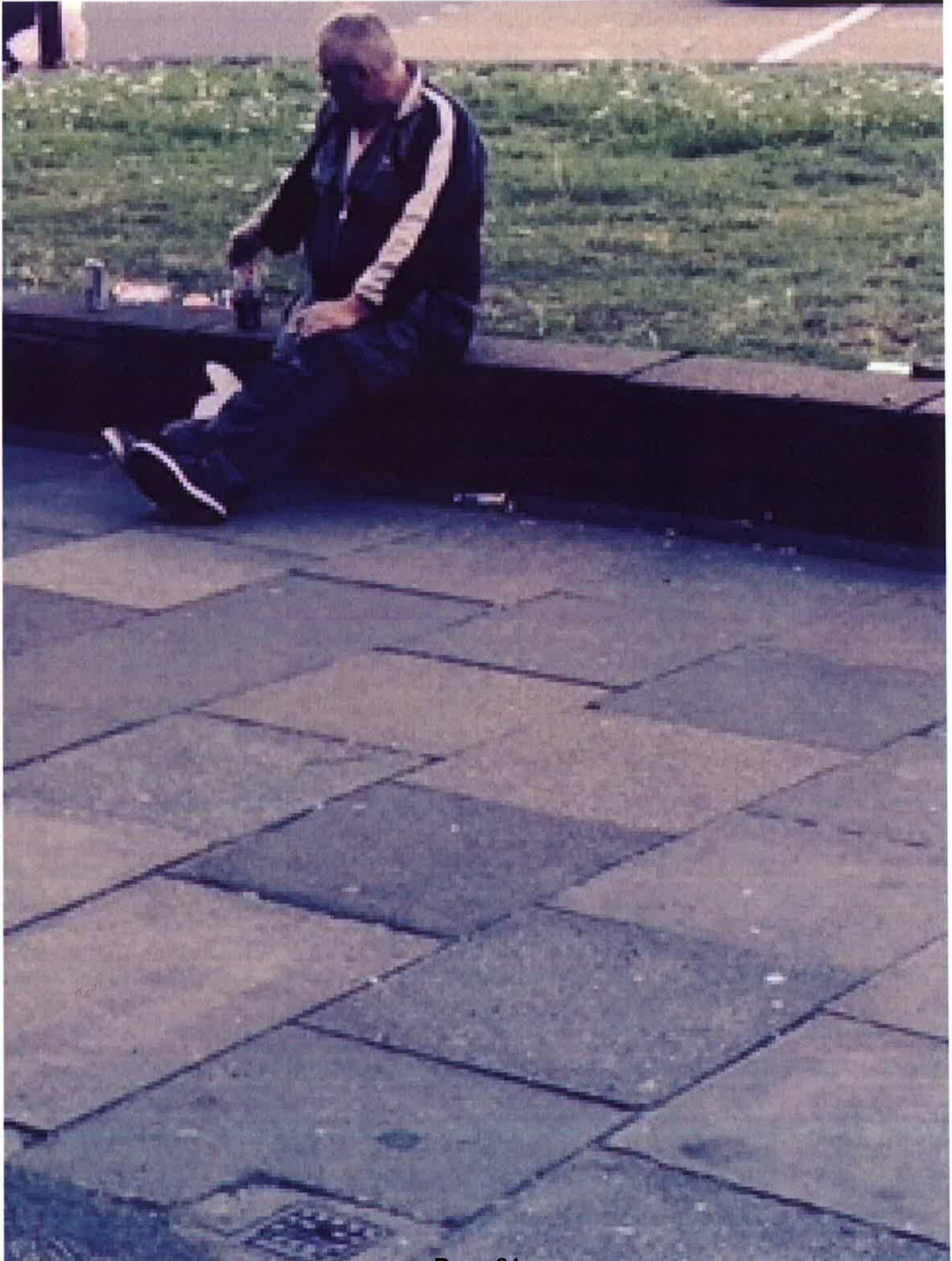

I am employed by the London Borough of Brent as a Licensing Officer. My duties include enforcing The Licensing Act 2003. A visit was conducted on 5th August 2015 13:25hrs to Sudbury A-Z Newsagents 711 Harrow Road Wembley HA0 2LL. On entering the premise I noted that there was several posters on the windows however the main door was fairly clear. I introduced myself to the member of staff behind the counter. I asked the staff member if he was the manager. He replied no the manager is not here he is coming. At that moment, he left the shop unattended for a few minutes before returning with another gentleman called Mr Khalid Mahmood. This member of staff who I now know to be Mr Hareh Gushani showed me his personal licence. Mr Gushani gave his address as shown on the personal licence 711 Harrow Road Wembley HA0 2LL. When asked if he lived at the address provided he said no. He was asked where he lived and was unable to supply an address. I asked Mr Khalid if he was the manager and he said no, he is just a friend. Mr Gushani was advised that if he does not live at this address then he should not be using this as his mailing address and certainly not for his personal licence. He was asked again where he lived. Mr Gushani had to consult with Mr Mahmood on what was being asked of him as Mr Gushani could not under clear English. Mr Mahmood wrote on a piece of paper the address of Mr Gushaini as 2 Dawn Walk. Mr Gushani was unable to give us any further information about his address and said he had to call his daughter. I never received the full address of where Mr Gushani resides. Mr Gushani became very agitated when he was asked question. He was asked what the age verification policy was that had been adopted on the premise. He was unable to response. He said that he needed to drink water. He started saying that he gets nervous when the police or anyone comes in to ask question. He said that his blood pressure is getting high. I did not witness Mr Gushani do a blood pressure check at anytime whilst I was present in the shop. Mr Gushani became more agitated during the visit. As Mr Gushaini was struggling to understand the questions asked without Mr Mahmood translating, I asked him how it was possible for him to have completed the personal licence holders course. He said that it was taught in Punjabi language. He then asked if I speak Hindi to which I replied no and that he can not expect all of his customers to be able to speak it also.

Mr Gushani increasingly became uncomfortable with the visit. He then took an energy drink from the fridge cabinet and went outside to sit on the wall. Whilst outside, I asked him where he had got Mr Mahmood from and asked if he worked at the premise. He said he is a friend and works at Lincoln Harford Solicitors at 713 Harrow Road. Whilst outside Mr Gushani said that he speak medium English not much English. He was asked if they sold plastic cups. He said they don't sell plastic cups they give them away if customers ask for them with a beer or drink. There is no charge for a cup. When entering the shop again Mr Mahmood was also asked if they sold cups. He looked behind the counter and said they are finished. I asked Mr Mahmood if he had a bottle opener. He once again looked behind the counter and said there was one there but it was now gone.

There was no incident book found on request. I asked to see staff training records. Mr Mahmood said that he did not know where it was and that he had seen it there in the premise before. After a short while he produced a record of staff training. Mr Mahmood and Mr Gushani were both on the list of staff who had been trained. Following on from my visit above, I do not feel that Mr Gushani is suitable to be responsible for the sales of Alcohol in the absence of Mr Nutt. If Mr Nutt can not provide suitably trained staff to manage the shop in his absence then in my opinion alcohol should not be on sale on the premise.

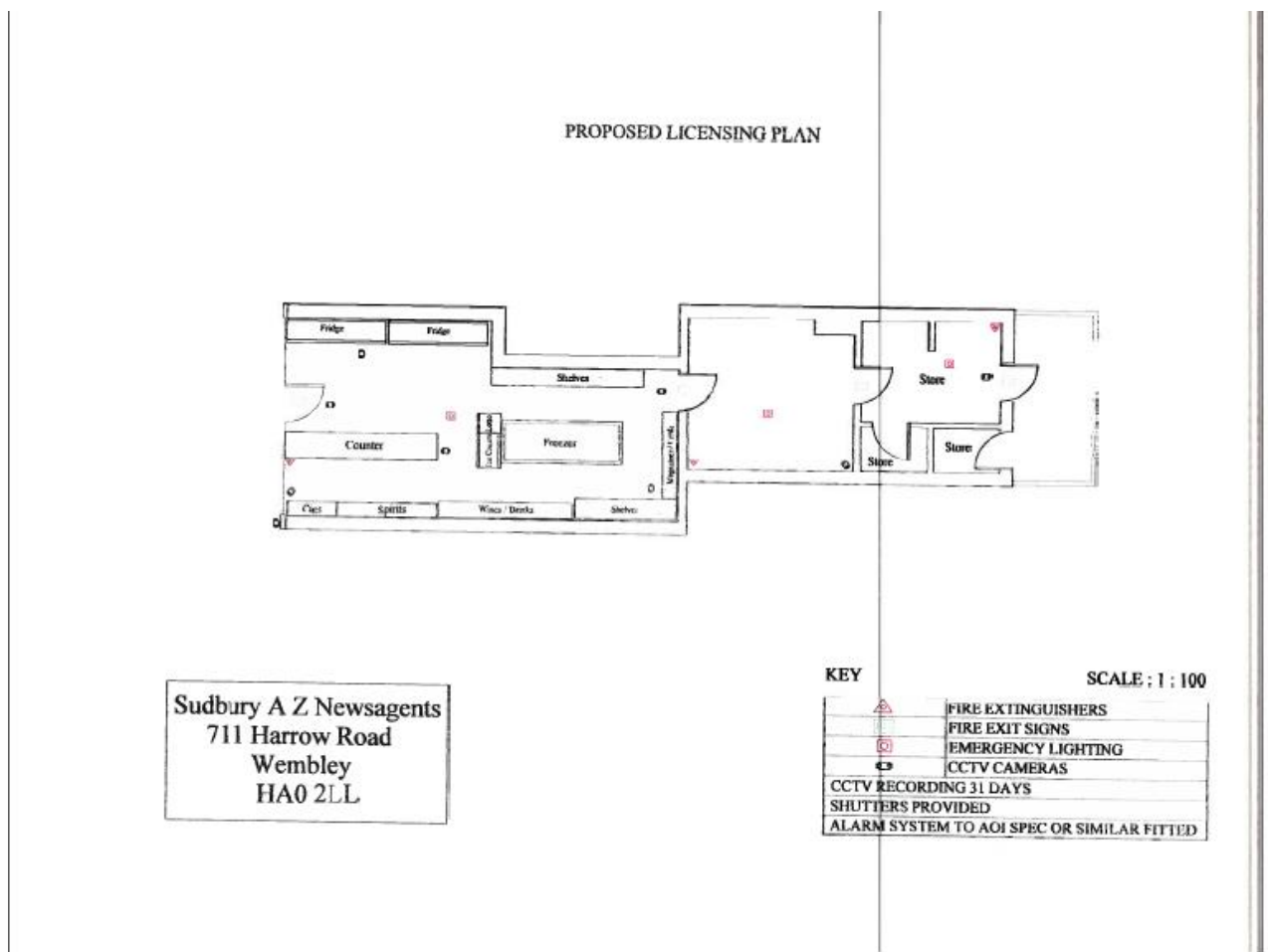

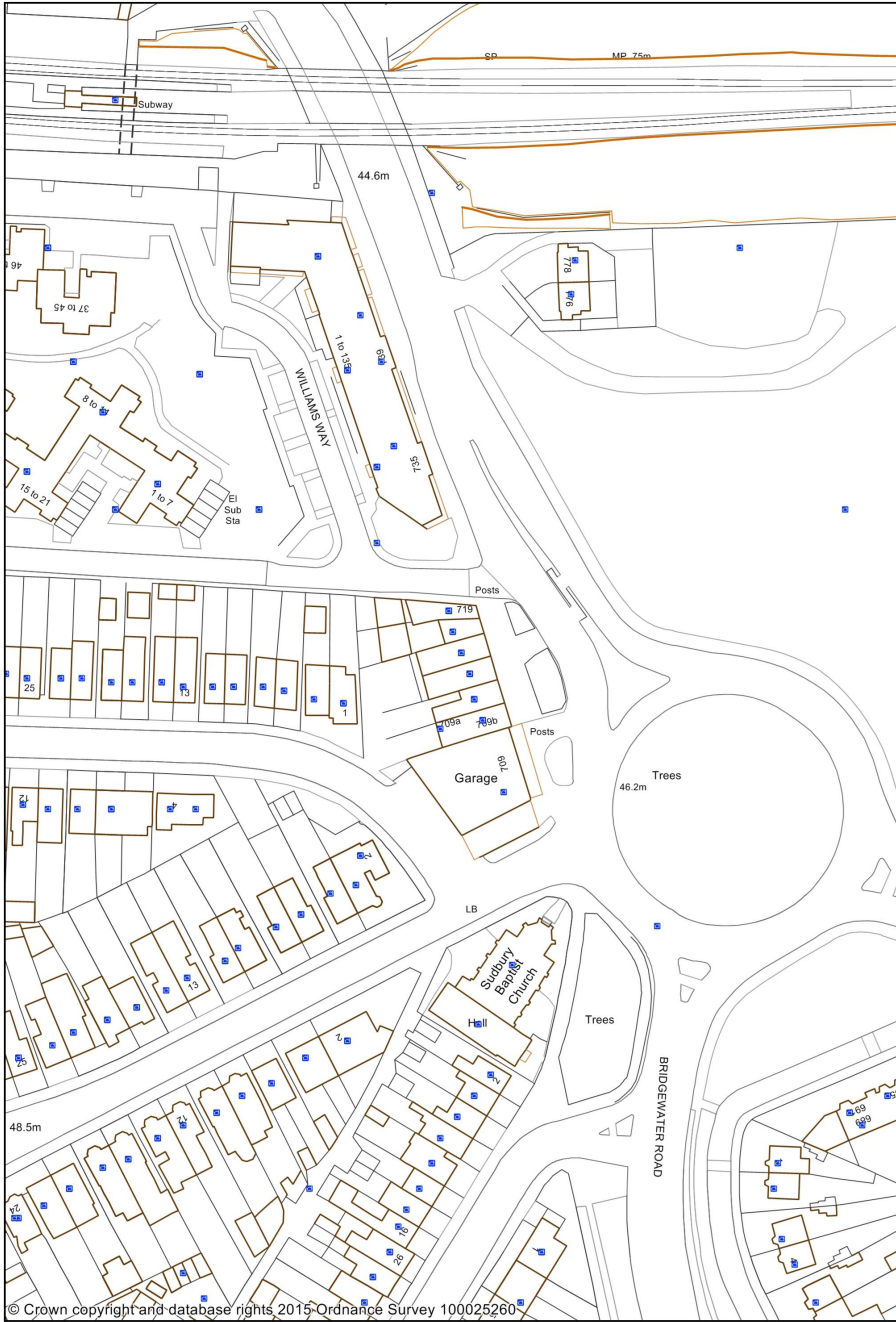

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a premises licence under section 34 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

High Strength Alcoholic Drinks

Street drinkers and drunkenness is a major cause for concern in Brent. Brent Borough is a controlled drinking zone. It is proven that high strength but cheap lagers, beers and cider contribute to the problem. If the premise does not stock these cheap high strength drinks (above 6.0% ABV) then the problem will be lessened or displaced. All Off Licenses in the area will be required to stop stocking these High strength drinks as they vary or come to review.

Police acknowledge the applicants request to list several beers above 5.5% ABV that they would like to sell in the shop. Police deem condition number 6 of the current

premises licence could not be fulfilled by the premises licence holder in its existing state.

Police suggest condition 6 be replaced by the following condition:

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked with the exception of

Guinness Foreign Extra Stout (Dublin) 7.5% ABV

Imported Guinness (Nigeria) 7.5% ABV

Dragon Stout 7.5% ABV

Brothers Pear Cider 7% ABV.

Security Measures

The following measures are proven to improve the security of your shop premises.

The floor area in front of the counter must be kept clear of any objects that could be used as a step to attack staff. Behind the counter the floor area should be raised 15 centimetres.

The premises must be protected by a monitored Intruder Alarm system.

The till/s should be secured from being lifted or moved. There shall be a door where access to the till area begins.

The window of the premises shall be kept clear of signage and advertising.

Spirits, Champagne and other similar valued goods should be displayed behind the counter. All alcohol within the shop should be displayed within the direct sight of the till operator and not obscured by other shelving etc.

Police have visited the premises during this consultation period and had discovered the condition 7 of the current premises licence is not being complied with. 'Raid Control' crime prevention measures are still current and relevant, however to make the implementation more simple Police request this condition to be removed and replaced with

The following crime prevention measures be implemented:

A time delay safe with deposit slot and anti fishing mechanisms must be used in line with a cash minimization policy.

Regular robbery awareness and cash minimization training given to all staff

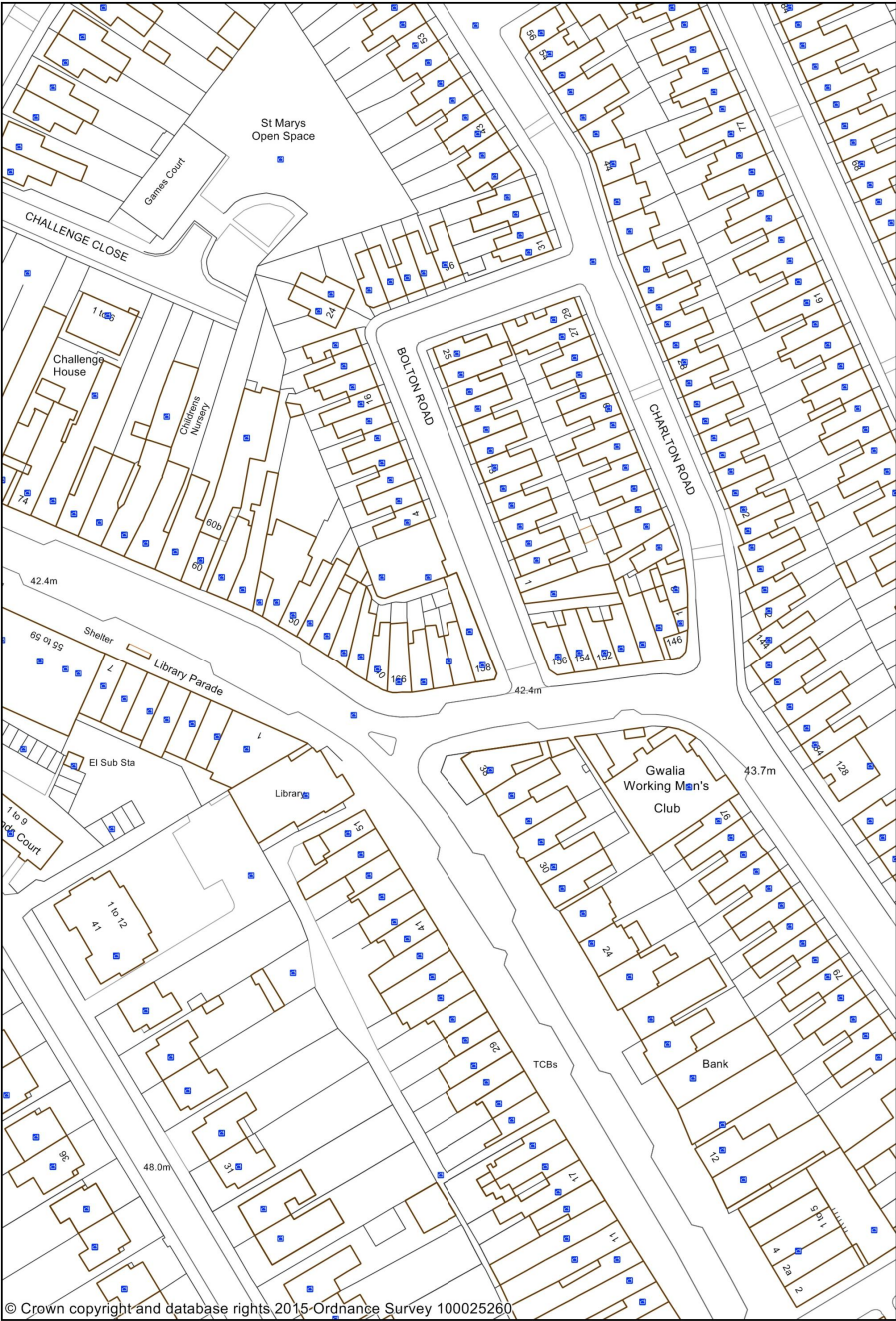



Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Applies to all premises licences and club premises certificates which permit the sale or supply of alcohol **ON or OFF** the premises
– In effect

Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) —dutyll is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

Applies to all premises licences and club premises certificates which permit the sale or supply of alcohol **ON or OFF** the premises – **In effect**

(b) —permitted price is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) —value added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

8 Customers shall be served through the night hatch and not allowed entry into the premises (save in exceptional circumstances) between 23:00 hours and 06:00 hours daily. For the avoidance of doubt, management, staff members and associates shall be permitted access to the premises.

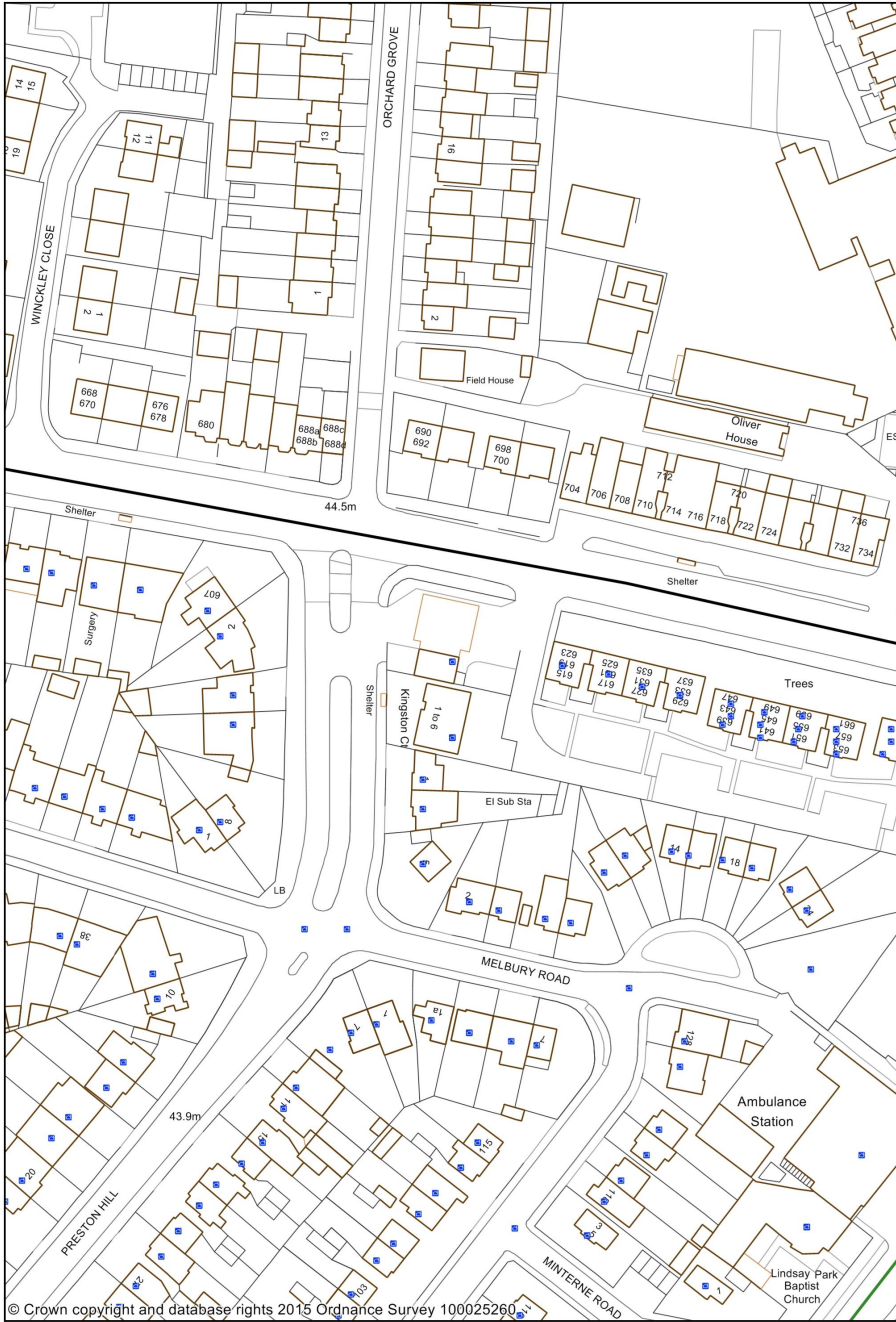
