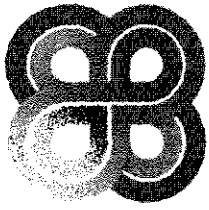

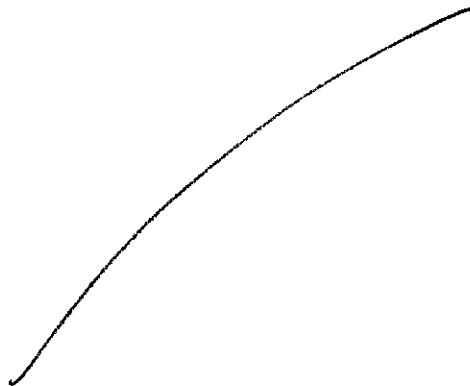

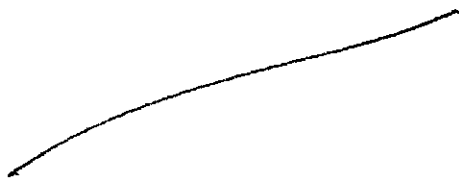

I refer to your application for Premises Licence for the above named premises. In accordance to the drawing submitted to us in relation to the application, the Public Safety Team make a revised Representation to the Licensing Authority on the grounds of Public Safety.

Providing you are willing to accept the following proposed licence conditions the Public Safety Team would withdraw the Representation:-

Licence Conditions

- The maximum number of persons permitted in the Ground Floor Bar area shall not exceed **60** including staff.
- Any locks or flush latches on exit doors shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars whilst the public are on the premises.
- Any socket outlets (or other power supplies used for DJ equipment, band equipment and other portable equipment) that are accessible to performers or staff shall be suitably protected by a residual current device (RCD having a rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps).

In order for the Public Safety Team to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you to **confirm in writing or via Email** that you accept the above licence conditions.

We will require these conditions to appear on the licence schedule should the licence be granted.

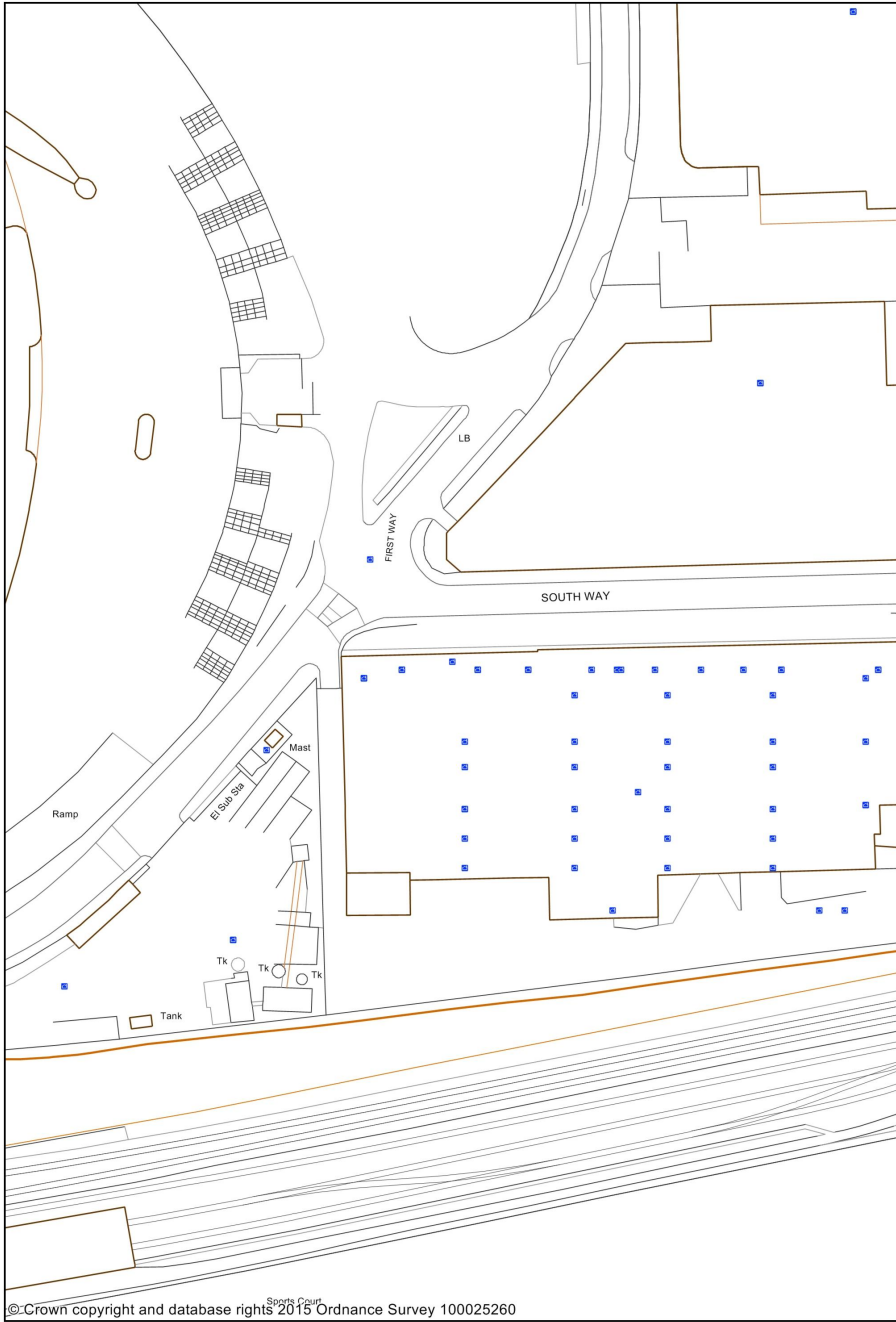

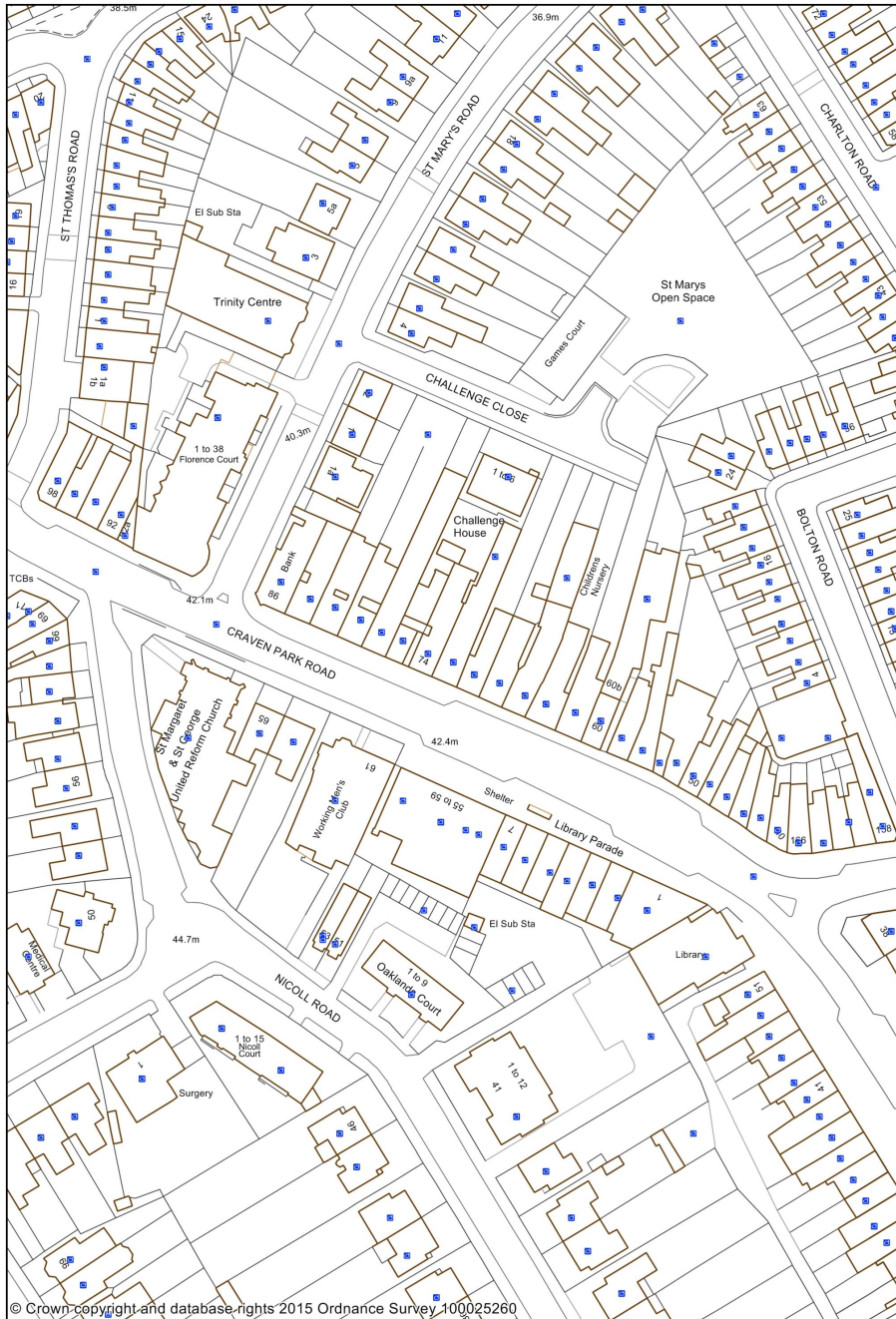

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and **I wish to make representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Council's Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

I am of the opinion that the risk to the Council's objectives can be mitigated by removing the requested variations or attaching conditions to the Licence as shown below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

This application has been made for both Off and On sales of alcohol. The premise is a Fish and Chips bar with internal dining for approximately 35 persons. Police agree that authority for sales of alcohol to be consumed 'On' the premises with a fish and chips meal is feasible but believe off sales will not uphold the licensing objectives. I am unaware of any other fast food facility that allows off sales of alcohol, however I am aware of Fish and Chip restaurants where alcohol can be served with ordered food.

This area of Wembley has a consistent problem with street drinkers and more recently with homeless persons rough sleeping. There are numerous rough sleeping areas behind businesses in the vicinity of this premise, Police feel the rough sleepers will purchase fast food and a can of beer and consume it in these areas. Police can

provide photographs of makeshift beds, mattresses and vast amounts of disused rubbish including fast food packaging and alcohol cans generated by these rough sleepers.

At a meeting with the applicant during this application process, he seemed unaware of what a controlled drinking zone was. After my explanation he said 'I will put up a sign telling them not to drink in the street'. This is not practicable when the homeless customers have no where else to drink.

The operating schedule indicates there would be an up to date refusal register and incident book on the premises, Police consider staff could not be as diligent around sales of alcohol when staff are cooking and serving food in a hot and potential dangerous environment.

On major event days at Wembley Stadium this area is exceptional busy with pedestrian footfall, the food and refreshment businesses are very busy. There is no indication in the operating schedule how the applicant would control off sales of alcohol consumption in the street as visitors to the area would only have access to the street to eat and drink the purchased food.

If the applicant agrees that by permitting '**On' sales only** at the venue Police would require the following points be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item. Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) should be similarly displayed. This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below.

1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council upon request.

2. CCTV cameras shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.
3. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.
4. A sign stating "No proof of age – No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.
5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - All crimes reported to the venue
 - All ejections of patrons
 - Any complaints received
 - Any faults in the CCTV system
 - Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
6. Customers will not take open drink containers of alcohol outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
7. Customers carrying open or sealed alcohol drinking vessels shall not be admitted to the premises.
8. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
9. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for the consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
10. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.
11. Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading/bar area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.
12. Customers should not be allowed to sit, stand or be served from the bar area.
13. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6% ABV shall be stocked.
14. Alcoholic beverages shall be decanted in to a suitable drinking vessel
15. Major Event Days at Wembley Stadium:
 - Customers shall not be allowed to congregate outside the premises.
 - No drinks shall be served in glass containers.

- The DPS or deputy shall work in partnership with the Police and if necessary comply with any direction given by a senior Police Officer on duty at the event.
- No alcohol or “alcopop” type drinks shall be displayed or sold in glass containers with the exception of wines and spirits.
- Door Supervisor to be employed 3 hours before designated kick off to prevent persons leaving with opened alcoholic drinking vessels.
- Stop selling alcohol 1 hour before the designated kick off time, sales can resume 15 minutes after the actual kick off.

As Director of Public Health for London Borough of Brent (a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2004) I wish to make representation against the application in respect to the Wembley Bay Fish and Chips premise.

The representation is made under/relates to the following licensing objectives

1) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The Wembley Bay Fish and Chip shop is located within an area of Wembley Central, which has a high level of alcohol related crime.

Safer Stats Data suggests that Wembley Central is ranked the worst of the 21 wards in Brent in respect of alcohol related treatments by the London Ambulance Service.

Data also suggests that out of the 21 wards in Brent that the area has the 2nd worst record of alcohol related violence against British Transport Police and 8th worst out of the 21 wards for alcohol related violence against Transport for London Staff.

2) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Safer stats data shows that the Wembley Bay Fish and Chip premises are located in a hotspot for street drinking, violent crime and anti-social behaviour which are Public Health concerns.

The control of accessibility of alcohol to young people and street drinkers are a key element of local strategies to improve health, reduce harm and to improve community safety through reduced crime, violent crime and antisocial behaviour.

Based on the information provided above we would like to see the following:

Sales of alcohol only to be provided with sit down meals that are consumed on the premises and not with takeaway meals.

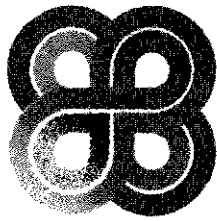

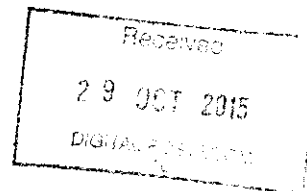

- (d) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:-
- (i) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
- drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (ii) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (iii) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (iv) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
- the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(v) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

(f) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

(g) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

(h) The responsible person shall ensure that-

(i) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- beer or cider: half pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(ii) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make **representations** that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Crime and Disorder Licensing Objective for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence to specify an individual as designated premises supervisor under section 37 of the Act.

Police are formally objecting to the variation.

The Police objections are concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder.

The proposed DPS Ms Jurgita Janauskiene is currently on bail appearing at North West London Magistrates court on 10th December 2015. Ms Janauskiene was arrested on 6th November 2015 for offences including threats to kill and assault on Police. In addition to this Ms Janauskiene was issued with a fixed penalty noticed on 1st May 2014 for being drunk and disorderly.

Ms Janauskiene is applying to become the designated premises for Greenes Bar. This venue had the premises licence reviewed by Brent Police earlier this year due to numerous breaches and poor management allowing the licensing objectives to be undermined. One of the requirements of the licensing committee was for the

designated premises supervisor to be removed and replaced by a strong character who could uphold the licensing objectives.

The role of the designated premises supervisor is to be the premises licence holders eyes and ears, the single point of management focus, and the key liaison with the responsible authorities. The licensing Act states it is essential that the appointed DPS has effective management control and capable of working in a relationship of partnership with statutory agencies. I do not believe that is practicable in the current situation. Ms Janusauskiene is not a fit and proper person for this role.

I visited Greenes Bar to meet Ms Janusauskiene during the evening of 30th October 2015. The premises were open to the public and alcohol was being sold. Neither Ms Janusauskiene nor Mr Sheahan was at the venue or in the residence above. A friend had been left in charge of the bar, he gave his details as Sean Morriarty. He smelt of intoxicating liquor, he was not the holder of a personal licence. There was no written authority on the premises to allow him to sell alcohol.

As such I am satisfied that the designation of Ms Janusauskiene as the premises supervisor at this time would undermine the licensing objectives.

Further I reserve the right to bring further evidence to the hearing should any arise between now and then.

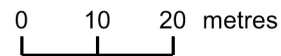

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

Police require the following points be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence;

Staff Training

The sale of alcohol to drunken people and children is a major cause of concern to police and highlighted in the Governments Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy. Those

who sell alcohol should be fully aware of the legislation and issues around alcohol and should be fully trained to a national standard.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item. Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) should be similarly displayed. This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

High Strength Alcoholic Drinks

Street drinkers and drunkenness is a major cause for concern in Brent. Brent Borough is a controlled drinking zone. If the premise does not stock this high strength, cheap beers, lagers and ciders (above 6.0% ABV) then the problem will be lessened or displaced.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below.

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council upon request.

CCTV cameras shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.

The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises.

A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold.

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.

Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers and managers will undergo training of Licensing Act 2003 legislation. This will be documented and signed for by the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.

Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind screens or blinds so as to stop access to the alcohol by customers or staff.

The area for the display of alcohol for sale shall be no more than 10% of the trading area.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- All crimes reported to the venue
- All ejections of patrons
- Any complaints received
- Any faults in the CCTV system
- Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

On **event days** at Wembley Stadium the following shall apply:

- Customers shall not be allowed to congregate outside the premises.
- The DPS or deputy shall work in partnership with the Police and if necessary comply with any direction given by a senior Police Officer on duty at the event.
- No alcohol or "alcopop" type drinks shall be displayed or sold in glass containers with the exception of wines and spirits.
- No more than 4 cans of alcohol shall be sold per customer.
- Alcoholic beverages shall not be sold or supplied one (1) hour before the designated kick off or start time of the event and will not resume until fifteen (15) minutes after the game or event has started.



An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a premises licence under section 19 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item.

Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) should be similarly displayed.

This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

High Strength Alcoholic Drinks

Street drinkers and drunkenness is a major cause for concern in Brent. Brent Borough is a controlled drinking zone. It is proven that high strength but cheap lagers, beers and cider contribute to the problem. If the premise does not stock these cheap high strength drinks (above 6.0% ABV) then the problem will be lessened or displaced. All Off Licenses in the area will be required to stop stocking these High strength drinks as they vary or come to review.

Security Measures

The following measures are proven to improve the security of your shop premises.

The floor area in front of the counter must be kept clear of any objects that could be used as a step to attack staff. Behind the counter the floor area should be raised 15 centimetres.

The premises must be protected by a monitored Intruder Alarm system.

The till/s should be secured from being lifted or moved. There shall be a door where access to the till area begins.

The window of the premises shall be kept clear of signage and advertising.

Spirits, Champagne and other similar valued goods should be displayed behind the counter. All alcohol within the shop should be displayed within the direct sight of the till operator and not obscured by other shelving etc.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below.

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council

CCTV cameras shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked.

A sign stating "No proof of age – No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.

A "Challenge 21" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- all crimes reported to the venue
- all ejections of patrons
- any complaints received
- any faults in the CCTV system
- any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

The following crime prevention measures be implemented:

- A time delay safe with deposit slot and anti fishing mechanisms must be used in line with a cash minimization policy.
- Regular robbery awareness and cash minimization training given to all staff

A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

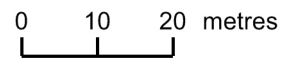
