The application is for the review of a premises licence held by Enfield High Street (AG221) Ltd, Mr Mukesh Aggarwal. The premises are known as The Cock Tavern, 125 Kilburn High Road, NW6 6JH.

The Cock Tavern is failing to promote two of the licensing objectives, namely the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety.

The venue currently holds a premises licence to provide regulated entertainment (live music/recorded music/dancing) 2000 - 0200 Monday - Saturday and 1400-0100 on Sunday, supply of alcohol from 0900-0230 Monday-Saturday and 1000-0100 Sundays. The opening hours are 0700-0300 Monday-Saturday and 0900-0130 Sunday.

In December 2015, police discovered that the venue were using unlicensed door supervisors during a licensing visit. During the visit the DPS, Mr. Rogerio Mendes was very negative towards police officers presence and he refused to accept that he required licensed door supervisors. It is actually a condition of his licence that door supervisors are employed after 8pm on any day the premises are open for the sale of alcohol after midnight. It is also a mandatory condition that any person(s) performing a security function must be licensed by the SIA. Mr. Mendes said that the unlicensed person working the door was his 'friend' and that his 'friend could do a better job' than a licensed door supervisor. The venue received a written warning from police about the matter. This warning letter is attached.

Following this, last month, a door supervisor assaulted a customer by headbutting or biting him on the face causing serious injury. Police were called by the victim and the door supervisor was arrested. He was later charged with assault by beating and bailed to attend court. This door supervisor was not displaying an SIA licence and was unable to produce one upon request to the arresting officer. However, it is believed that he does hold an SIA licence, as this was later produced to me by the venue, in the form a photocopy of his SIA licence. When asked how he found this particular door supervisor, Mr. Mendes explained that he was a recommendation and that he knows him from 'around the area'. Mr. Mendes stated that he pays this individual, 'cash in hand' and was unable to produce any paperwork or contract with this individual, who Mr. Mendes claims, works freelance and not for any security company. Mr. Mendes was unable to produce any documentary evidence which shows sufficient checks and balances were implemented prior to hiring this individual. In my opinion the management have acted recklessly, which has resulted in a member of public of the public receiving a serious injury.

Further, whilst officers from the CID department investigated that assault they requested CCTV footage from the pub. When viewed it played perfectly up until the time of the assault where there is a footage blackout for around eight (8) minutes. Coincidentally, during these eight minutes it is believed that the assault occurred. Mr. Mendes was unable to account for the CCTV blackout and suggested there must have been a 'fault' with the system. He said that he is getting his engineer to check the CCTV. I requested a copy of the engineers report, however, to date, I have received no such report. There is no evidence to suggest this, but I suspect that footage may have been altered.

Police have no confidence in Mr. Mendes remaining as the DPS for this venue. On a previous occasion Mr. Mendes has been extremely un-cooperative towards police assisting him in upholding the licensing objectives. He has employed unlicensed door supervisors and used his 'friends' to act as security staff. When challenged by police, he could not see the issue with such practices. There have also been late night incidents relating to drunkenness. Allowing Mr. Mendes to continue as DPS would be detrimental to the licensing objectives. As such, police suggest that Mr. Mendes is **removed** as the DPS and a new appointment is made.

To assist the new DPS control the venue more successfully and to protect both members of staff and the public who patronise the venue, police consider that the following changes would be necessary and appropriate in order to uphold the licensing objectives:

Police **suggest** the following conditions be **removed** from the current premises licence:

1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition.
2. All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 31 days and be made available to police and licensing officers if required. *Reason: New updated CCTV condition to added.*

3. A minimum of 2 door supervisors in a ratio of at least 1 supervisor to every 50 customers shall be employed from 20:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight. *Reason: Door supervisor condition re-worded below.*

4. The licensee or his/her deputy shall be a member of, and actively participate in the local pubwatch scheme. *Reason: Outdated condition and no such pubwatch scheme available in Brent at present. This condition would therefore be unenforceable.*

5. The Portman Group proof of age scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted. *Reason: Outdated condition. Re-worded below.*

Police **suggest** that the following conditions be **added** to the current premises licence:

Door Supervisors/Staff

Police suggest that the venue continues to employ door supervisors, however given the issues in respect of the previous security staff used at the venue; police recommend that the current door team are no longer use. This is in order to protect the public from harm and that a new door security team are employed. Police recommend that on this occasion that the new door supervisors are selected from the 'SIA's register of approved contractors'. This list can be found at; <http://www.sia.homeoffice.gov.uk/Pages/acs-roac.aspx> To reflect this, current condition number five (5) to be re-worded to:

1. A minimum of 2 door supervisors in a ratio of at least 1 supervisor to every 50 customers shall be employed from a company shown on the SIA's register of approved contractors, from 20:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight.

2. A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be recorded. The name of the door supervisor's SIA approved contractor must also be recorded. The book must be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority upon request.

3. All door supervisors shall be clearly visible and wear yellow or orange high visibility vests, jackets or armbands so as they are clearly identifiable and visible to guests, staff and on CCTV.

4. All door supervisors shall be provided with a radio which allows communication between all members of the door supervisor team and the duty manager or DPS.

CCTV

5. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.

7. CCTV cameras shall be installed to cover the main entrance of the premises from both inside and outside.

8. The license holder, DPS or a nominated duty manager must inspect and test that the CCTV is operational and working correctly on a weekly basis. A signed and dated recorded of the CCTV examination and any findings shall be kept on the premises and made available to the police and licensing authority upon request.

Drugs/Weapons

The following is necessary after a female was found by the current DPS coming out of the toilet with a syringe, disorder in the toilets and a haul of knives found hidden in the cistern by a plumber. Informative: Police would suggest that the management considers that all toilet cisterns are secured and fully enclosed so as to prevent members of the public using the cisterns to conceal drugs, weapons or other prohibited items inside them.

9. Notices clearly explaining the licensee's drugs policy shall be displayed at the entrance, in all toilets

and at suitable places throughout the premises.

10. Toilets shall be checked every two (2) hours for the use of drugs and other illegal activities.

11. A toilet checklist shall be displayed on the wall in all toilets. Staff shall use these checklists to record their name and certify the time of the check. Checklists are to be replaced daily and all old checklists must be retained and made available for inspection by the police and authorised officers from Brent council.

General

15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Reduction of permitted hours

Police feel that the committee should consider a reduction of permitted hours in order to prevent any further late night incident. In particular drunkenness (as outlined below in the evidence). The venue is a pub not a nightclub, and police feel that this particular venue could be better controlled with reduced hours where already drunk persons would then not be able to walk in off the street and demand service as has done in the past which have then led on to incidents as outlined below.

Police **suggest** the following hours are applied:

All permitted regulated Entertainment:

Monday - Saturday 20:00 - 00:30

Sunday 14:00 - 00:30

Supply of Alcohol:

Monday - Saturday 09:00 - 00:30

Sunday 10:00 - 00:30

The Opening Hours of the Premises:

Monday - Saturday 07:00 - 01:00

Sunday 09:00 - 01:00

The above hours allow customers half an hour of drinking up time.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

Wednesday 18th March 2015 at 0042 - Crime report number 1906346/15 refers. Group of drunken males smashed the pub up. Police were called and one male was arrested for criminal damage.

Saturday 3rd October 2015 at 0120 - Crime report number 1913029/15 refers. A drunk male walks into the pub and asks to be served. He is told that last orders had already gone. The male then smashed glasses behind the bar and at customers. Police were called but the male had left prior to them arriving. When officers investigated the matter, Mr. Rafal informed police that the CCTV only records for 24 hours only - The current condition states that it must record for 31 days.

12/12/2015 at 12.30am: Licensing visit by Brent police licensing unit - The premises was very busy, Karaoke was taking place. There were no door supervisors on, one male with ponytail acting as a door supervisor. This male is NOT a holder of an SIA badge holder breaching licensing condition. The DPS Rogerio Mendes spoken to, he was very negative towards police presence during the visit and refused to accept that he required door supervisors. He said that his 'friend could do a better job'. Police explained that he has a mandatory condition on the premises licence which states that all security officers must be licensed with the SIA and the reasoning for it. Further, he was informed that as there was no door supervisors his authority was not valid and he must stop selling alcohol. He was not happy at all. There were approximately four males sitting on the decking when we arrived, who appeared to know the 'friend' and DPS. When they discovered we were police they disappeared very quickly. Mr. Mendes was a much different person to what police experienced during a day visit back in October 2015, almost hostile attitude towards licensing police officers presence and dismissive of advice given. Mr. Mendes will be attending Brent civic centre to discuss the matter further and receive a warning letter.

19/12/2015 - Following the meeting with licensing officers a warning letter was sent by PC 365QK Sullivan from Brent police licensing unit pointing out breaches of door supervisor condition amongst other conditions.

Saturday 19th March 2016 at 1.00am - Crime report 1906706/16 refers to a grievous bodily harm (GBH). The pub's door supervisor ejected a male from the premises. Once ejected the male asked the door supervisor for his belongings back, however, his request was refused. The victim alleges that the door supervisor then bit his nose causing it to bleed out. Police were called the door supervisor was arrested for assault. He was not displaying an SIA licence and was unable to produce his licence to the police officer when it was requested. The door supervisor denied biting the victim, but admitted that he had headbutted him in the face. The following day the door supervisor was charged at Wembley police station with assault by beating and bailed to court. Worryingly, when DS Smith from Wembley CID went to view CCTV, the cameras appear to work perfectly up until around the time when the assault occurs, then the cameras black out for around eight minutes and do not show the assault. There is no evidence to suggest this, but in my opinion and in the opinion of the police officer investigating the case, we believe that the cameras may have been tampered with so the assault is not shown. I attach a copy of email from DC Enright in response to me asking for his opinion on the CCTV outage.

31/03/2016 - Meeting held at Brent civic centre. Present was PC 782QK Whitcomb, PC 368QK Sullivan, Mr. Rogerio Mendes (DPS), Mr. Raphael (Bar manager) and Mr. Mukesh Aggarwal (Licence holder - Via Conference call). The meeting was opened with Mr. Mendes being asked for his account of the events which occurred at his pub on the 19th March 2016. Mr. Mendes explained that he was working during the evening of the incident but he left early during the evening handing responsibility to his bar manager, Mr. Rafal took over from him, so he was not present when the incident occurred. However, his door supervisors came on duty at 8.00pm, one of which was the suspect, Mr. J***** Y****. The victim of the assault was refused service after he dropped a glass on the floor. He became angry and Mr. Y**** ejected him from the pub. A while later the victim returned and Mr. Y**** has got into an altercation with him about not allowing him back in to collect his belongings, where he has then allegedly headbutted or bitten the victim on his nose causing bleeding. The officers' report states that they went to view CCTV which was working correctly up until the incident occurs. The footage goes blank at the crucial point of the assault. Mr. Mendes was unable to account for why this happened and suggested a fault with the CCTV. He was unable to provide us with a copy because apparently 'all CCTV up until 19th March no

longer exists' because of this 'fault'. During the meeting Mr. Mendes disclosed that recently during a repair of one of his customer toilets, a plumber discovered a stash of flick knives hidden inside a cistern. Asked whether he contacted the police, he said, 'No, I just threw them all in the bin'. He also stated that recently a female came out of the toilets with a used syringe and handed it to staff claiming she had just found it, however, Mr. Mendes believes she was using drugs in his toilets.

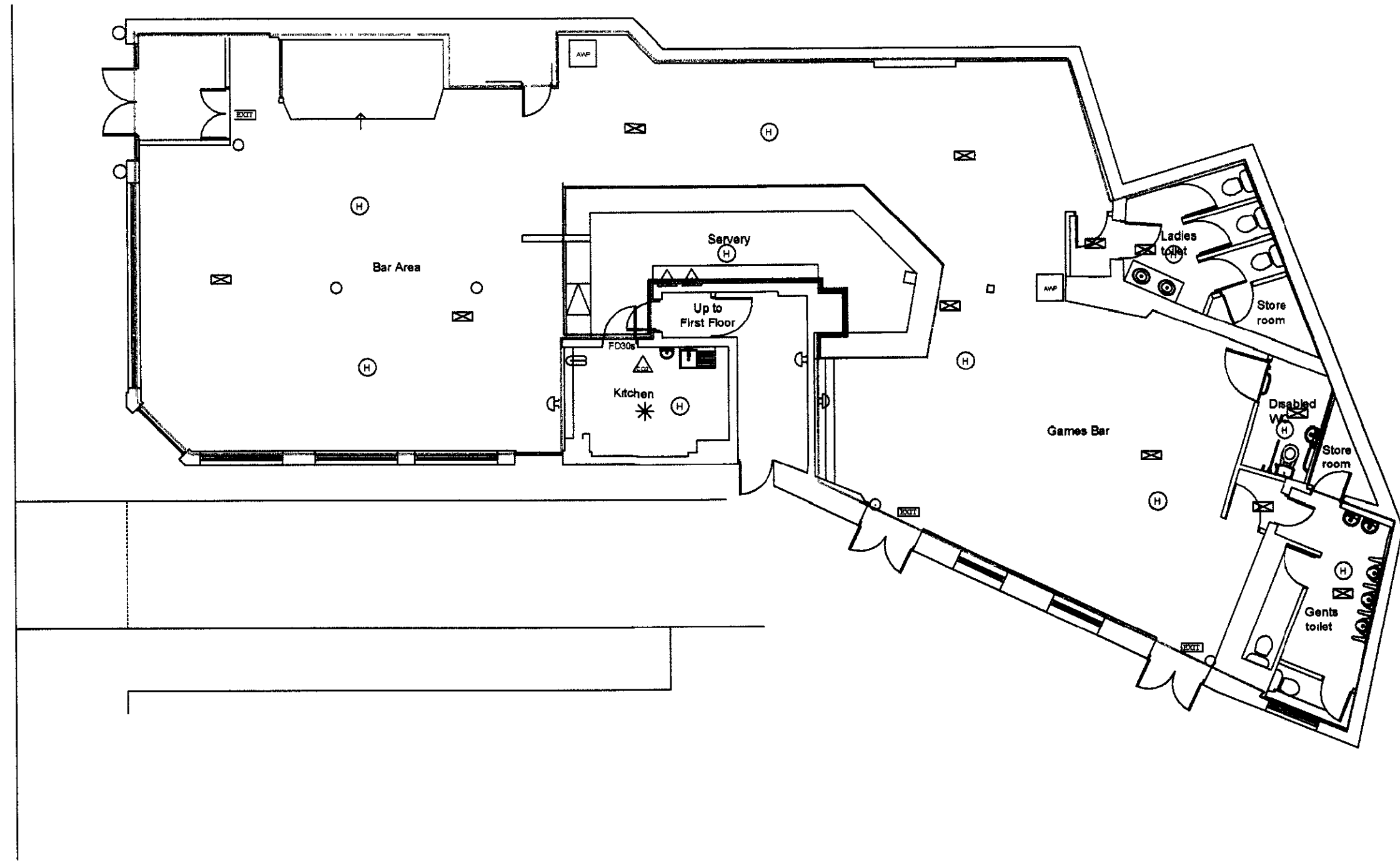

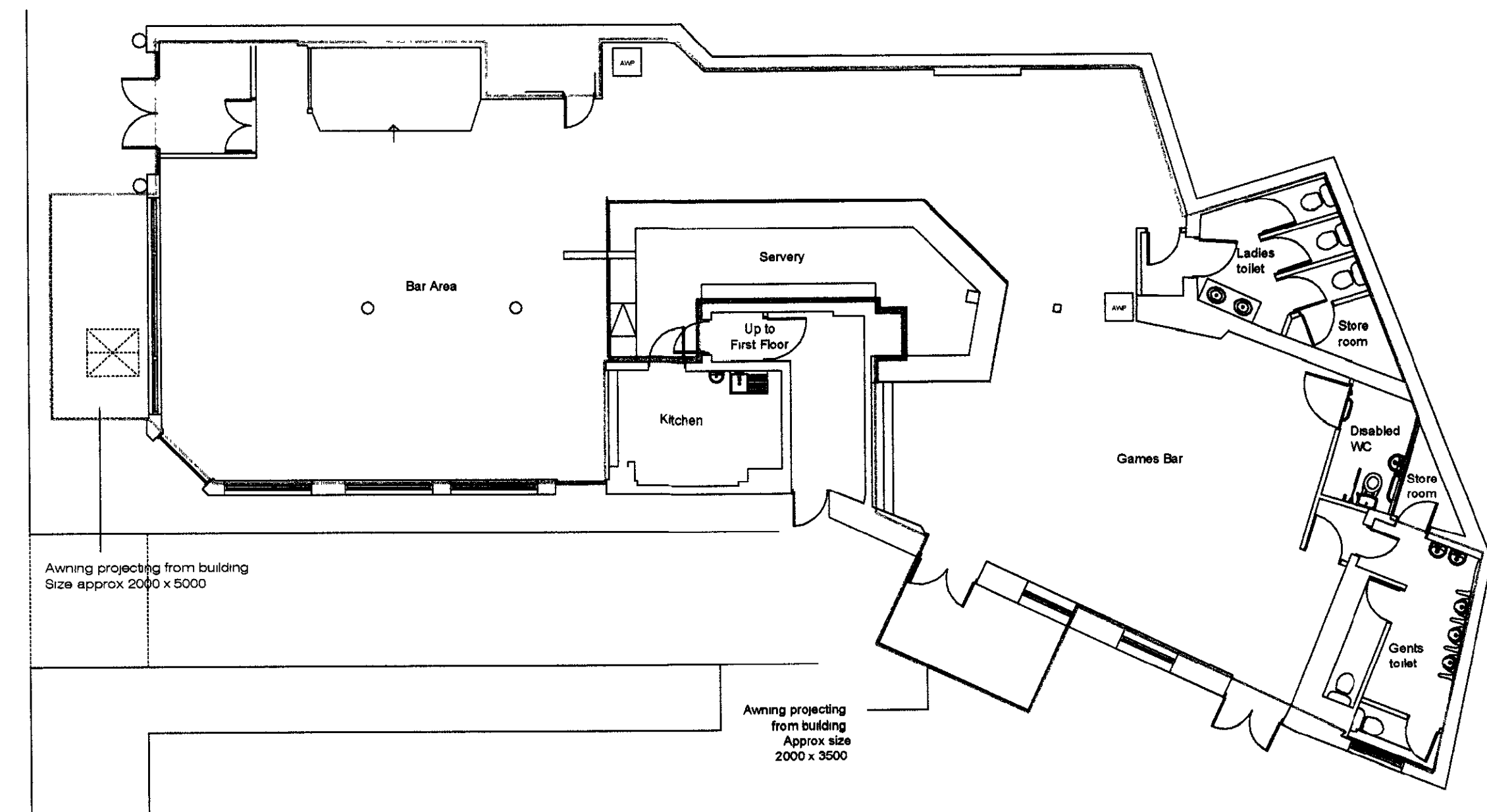



Whilst dealing with him police were then made aware that another person (SUSP2) had headbutted the window of the door to the venue and left prior to police arrival. This happened before SUSP1 went and smashed up the toilets.

The window to the door is estimated to be quite expensive as the whole door will need replacing (£200-400) although we suspect a single pane of glass could be replaced instead of the door. The damage in the toilet consists of a broken mirror, hand dryer knocked off the wall, toilet roll holder damage and a missing toilet seat. Approximately under £500.

Clarifications & Update Since Submitting the Review

I submit the below to clarify some of the points in the submitted signed review application in respect of the Cock Tavern Public House, 125 Kilburn High Road, NW6 6JH:

1. Page seven (7) of the review, incident dated Wednesday 18th March 2015. Line two (2) reads 'males smashed the pub up'. This should read, 'males smashed the pub toilets up'. This was mistakenly omitted by a typing error. One male was arrested for criminal damage and later charged with the offence.

2. The incident dated Saturday 3rd October 2015. Crime number is shown as 1913029/15. This is a typing error. Crime number 1922996/15 is the correct report. This report refers to a criminal damage. A television was damaged by a glass thrown by the suspect. The report was later closed due to insufficient evidence. Officers were told CCTV is only kept for 24 hours. No arrests were made in relation to this incident.

3.

A) Page seven (7) paragraph five (5) refers to an assault on Saturday 19th March 2016. I would like to clarify the following relevant points in relation to **crime report 1906706/16:**

Victim Injury: When writing the review there was some confusion around whether the injury caused to the victim by the door supervisor was by biting or a headbutt and there still is. The victim claims he was bitten, the door supervisor claims that he headbutted the victim in self defence. The report was classified as a GBH (serious injury) crime. However, after further reading of the report since the submission of the review and in order of transparency and fairness to the licence holder, the injury has been described as a, 'Cut to nose- Small cut to nose that has bleed' by the initial investigating officer. So to clarify, The suspect was arrested for actual bodily harm (ABH) and the crime report was initially recorded as such. However, it was upgraded to an GBH by the central crime management team. The door supervisor was charged with assault by beating, which is a lesser offence of GBH and ABH. However, the injury sustained is still nasty never the less. I have contacted the victim of this assault and he has kindly given me his permission for a photograph of the injury to be included in this application.

CCTV: As stated in the review application, it is again important to point out that there is absolutely NO evidence to suggest that the CCTV was altered or tampered with in any way by the Cock Tavern pub staff and/or management team. However, I did request a CCTV engineers report from Mr. Mendes to back up his claim that the break in footage was due to a fault. At the time of writing this update, I have still not been supplied such a report from Mr. Mendes or anyone

else. I have also asked for the officer who investigated this case, DC Enright for his opinion, and again I point out, this is simply his own professional opinion. I attach this email as a supporting document. Finally, I have referred to the outage of footage as a 'black out'. For clarity, in the report DC Smith actually refers to this as a 'break' in the footage not a black out.

SIA: I have submitted a report to the SIA about the door supervisor's actions on 19th March 2016. I received a response back (attached) which confirms that he had his SIA licence revoked back on 03/02/2016 for 'criminality'. The email suggested that he had returned his SIA licence to the SIA. However, during a telephone conversation with the SIA, they have confirmed that he has NOT returned his licence and that they had only written to him requesting it back. To date, he has still not sent it back. Therefore it is possible that this particular door supervisor had handed The Cock Tavern his SIA licence and had not informed the venue that it had already been revoked. However, the SIA advised me that they encourage all licensees to use the public SIA website and check SIA operative licence numbers before employing them. This way, licensees can confirm whether or not an operative has a valid licence.

4. Contact from Mr. Rogerio Mendes (Current DPS)

Since this review was submitted Mr. Mendes has engaged with police about rectifying the issues outlined in this application. So far, the contact from Mr Mendes and the response to this review by the venue has been positive. On the 4th May 2016 I received the documents from Mr. Mendes sent via special delivery post:

Copy of new security agreement - Mr. Mendes has informed me that he has already employed a new door team. Door supervisors are now supplied by Alliance Risk Management Solutions Ltd of 2 Eaton Gate, London SW1W 9BJ. This change took place on the 7th April 2016. I have been supplied with an invoice and a contract between the Cock Tavern and the new security team. Mr Mendes has informed me that he has taken advice from the SIA about this change. I have contacted the SIA and they have confirmed that they have been supporting Mr. Mendes with practical advice and have advised him to check all his door supervisors licences and cross reference licence numbers on the public SIA website to exclude any officer with a revoked licence.

CCTV Invoices - Mr. Mendes has produced two invoices to me. The first indicates that on the 11th April 2016 a new (or used - The invoice is not clear) CCTV system was installed over a three and half day period. The second invoice shows that the CCTV system will be checked and maintained by a CCTV engineer three times per year. The work is shown being carried out by an 'A L Martins'.

However, In regards to any CCTV fault on the previous system, I have not been supplied with any evidence showing that there were any faults with the previous system.

Vary DPS Consent Form I have been supplied with a Vary DPS consent form. The form indicates that Mr. Rafal Gajdosz will take over as DPS from Mr. Mendes. I have also been supplied with a photocopy of Mr. Gajdosz's passport and his personal licence. I have checked with Brent council's licensing office and to date they have not received a vary DPS application form. I spoken with Mr. Mendes via telephone and he has told me that the consent form was sent to police for our information. He went on to say that the premises licence holder Mr. Aggarwal is handling the application and forwarding this to Brent council.

I am writing this letter in response to my visit to The Cock Tavern, 125 Kilburn High Road, NW6 6JH on Saturday 12 December 2015, at approx 12.30 am, when the venue was open to the public and alcohol was being sold.

On approaching the premises I saw a male at the entrance acting as a door supervisor, he was spoken to and stated that he did not hold an SIA accredited badge. There were also a number of people at the front of the premises sitting at tables on the decking area consuming alcohol. I then spoke to Mr Mendes and explained to him that there was a condition on the licence which reads, A minimum of 2 door supervisors in a ratio of at least 1 supervisor to every 50 customers shall be employed from 20.00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale alcohol past midnight. Mr Mendes stated that he was planning to open until 01.00 am.

The licence also has a condition which reads, the use of the outside fronting on to the main road shall cease at 23.00 hours and customers shall be required to be inside the premises after this time, this was clearly being breached, as there were numerous customers out the front of the premises consuming alcohol.

It was also identified that pint glasses, and glass bottles was being used by patrons of the pub, contrary to the licence having a condition that reads, All alcohol and soft drinks shall be served in plastic or toughened glasses.

I must point out that these breaches amount to an offence under section 136 Licensing Act 2003, namely conducting licensable activities without authority, which carries a fine of up to £20,000 and/or up to 6 months imprisonment.

However, I have taken into account that after a meeting with the DPS, Mr. Mendes he has already started taking measures to rectify the breaches found, namely he has employed an SIA company to take over the security of the pub, and is working on dealing with the other breaches identified. As such, please accept this letter as a **formal 'warning**. If you have any further queries, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

Officer: Esther Chan – Licensing Inspector

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to review the premises licence under section 51 of the Act. The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

As a result of the review application made by the Licensing Police, I conducted a visit on Monday 18th April 2016 at approximately 12:25hrs in the presence of the DPS, Mr Rogerio Mendes and Assistant Manager, Rafal Gojdosz. At the time of the visit, the following breaches were identified:

Condition 4 on the Premise Licence:- A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises. ***The Premise Licence was only displayed at the bar and not at the entrance.***

Condition 8 on the Premise Licence:- Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages (including free drinking water) shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided. ***It was confirmed by Mr Mendes that food is provided to customers from 10am to 10pm.***

Condition 14 on the Premise Licence:- No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 23:30 hours. ***It was confirmed by Mr Mendes that the last entry and re-entry time is 12 midnight.***

Summary

As a result of the breaches identified at the time of my visit, the Licensing Authority would support this review application and feel that the conditions proposed by the Licensing Police are fair and proportionate.

Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) —duty^{ll} is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) —permitted price^{ll} is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) —relevant person¹¹ means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) —relevant person¹¹ means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) —value added tax¹¹ means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day¹¹) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day¹¹) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition.
2. All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
3. A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.
4. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
5. A minimum of 2 door supervisors in a ratio of at least 1 supervisor to every 50 customers shall be employed from 20:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past midnight.
6. Customers shall not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
7. The use of the outside table fronting on to the main road shall cease at 23:00 hours and

customers shall be required to be inside the premises after this time.

8. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages (including free drinking water) shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.

9. No children shall be permitted on the premises.

10. The licensee or his/her deputy shall be a member of, and actively participate in the local pubwatch scheme.

11. Promotions that promote irresponsible drinking shall not be permitted.

12. The Portman Group proof of age scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted.

13. All alcohol and soft drinks shall be served in plastic or toughened glasses.

14. No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 23:30 hours.

15. The total number of people permitted on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 220.

16. When prior notice has been given the licensee shall allow free and unimpeded access to police officers with drug sampling equipment and/or 'sniffer' dogs, to test customers prior to entry, for drug use and possession.

Details of Further Evidence - Cock Tavern, 125 Kilburn High Road, NW6 6JH

Since the submission of the original review application, TWO further incidents have come to the attention of police which I request is included as supplementary evidence for the review hearing.

1. **Crime Report 1913301/16** refers to an actual bodily harm (ABH) which occurred on the 30th May 2016 at 12.05am. A female customer was waiting to be served at the bar when an unknown male has walked behind her and hit her around the head. No injury was sustained although the victim complained of a 'sore head'. Police were not called at the time and the victim reported to Paddington police station the following morning. The crime report was initially classified as a common assault, upgraded to actual bodily harm by the central crime management team, but the officer in charge of the investigation has confirmed, common assault. This is an ongoing police investigation. I have attached a copy of the redacted crime report.

2. Also on the 30th May, Mr. Martin Wood, who is Brent councils' environmental health officer wrote to me and stated that he had obtained evidence of statutory noise from loud amplified music at the premises. A noise abatement notice was written up on the 31st May 2016 and was to be delivered to Mr. Mendes by the council on Tuesday. I have attached a copy of Mr. Woods' email. I have wrote back to him requesting a statement to include with this application, however, he is currently on annual leave until 6th June 2016.

This typed statement is my original notes of evidence commenced at 04:50 hours at Wembley Police Station as soon as practicable after the events and booking into custody. Notes were made alone.

On Friday 18th March 2016 at approximately 00:50 hours I was on patrol in the Wembley area. I was on duty in full uniform posted as driver in a marked police patrol vehicle call sign QK25N, my operator was PC MORGAN 258QK. We received a call via our personal radios to attend THE COCK TAVERN public house located at 125 KILBURN HIGH ROAD, NW6 where a male was alleging he had been bitten by a bouncer working at the premises (CAD 404) refers.

We arrived on scene at 01:09 hours and as we pulled up near to the venue a male made himself known to us stating he had called Police. I now know this male to be [redacted] noticed the male had a bloody right nostril and a cut around the tip of his nose. Mr [redacted] said he had been bitten on his nose by the bouncer from THE COCK TAVERN, he said he had done nothing wrong and the bouncer bit him. I asked Mr [redacted] describe the member of door staff that had bitten him and he said he's a big black guy dressed all in black with long dreadlocks in a ponytail. PC MORGAN remained with Mr [redacted] just outside the venue and I walked inside to locate the other party involved. As I walked into the venue there was no one by the door, as I opened the door to enter an IC3 male approached the door. He was dressed in black had a large build and long dreadlocks in a ponytail. I asked if he worked the door at the venue and he said yes. I asked the males name, I now know this male to Mr [redacted]. I asked Mr [redacted] if they had problems with any patrons tonight. As I asked the question Mr [redacted] looked outside and could see Mr [redacted] stood with PC MORGAN. Mr [redacted] was quiet for a moment and I explained I needed him to tell me what had happened. Mr [redacted] said words to the effect of "he was inside, the bar staff wanted him removed so I told him to leave. He wasn't happy but left without a fuss. Once outside he walked off but then suddenly he came back and this time he was in my face. Kept asking for his gear I didn't know what he was on about so I told him to go home. He wouldn't go and just kept getting in my face so I nudded him." I asked Mr [redacted] to confirm his headbutt had caused the injury to Mr [redacted] nose and he said yes.

Continuation of Statement of **Tejpal Johal**

I explained to Mr [redacted] that due to Mr [redacted] having made an allegation to Police and being clearly injured officers would need to arrest Mr [redacted]. Mr [redacted] just nodded. I asked Mr [redacted] for his SIA identification card and he looked blankly at me before giving his pockets a cursory tap in search of his ID. Nothing was on display on his arm or clothing as is required. I asked Mr [redacted] if he definitely had SIA ID and he said yes but he wasn't sure where he had put it.

I went outside and informed PC MORGAN that Mr [redacted] had told me he had headbutted Mr [redacted] and so needed to be arrested for ABH. I informed our control an adult male was being arrested and we required cell space and transport. QK21N kindly offered to transport for us. After a few minutes QK21N arrived, PC MORGAN had arrested Mr [redacted] and was escorting him to Wembley custody in the rear of QK21N.

I drove Mr [redacted] home and took a victim statement from him. I also took two photographs of Mr [redacted] injuries that I exhibit as follows:

- TSJ/2 - close up pic of nose injury to Mr [redacted] ref serial no. MPSZ07724680.

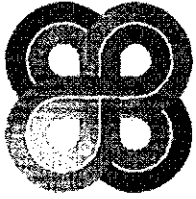

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

1. A CCTV recording system shall be installed that is compliant with, and capable of, capturing an image of evidential standard.
2. All CCTV recordings shall be maintained for a minimum of thirty-one (31) days with date & time-stamping. Cameras shall be installed so as to cover both internal and external areas of the premises. At least one camera shall cover ingress/egress points and at least one other camera shall cover the alcohol display area.
3. Notices shall be displayed advising that CCTV is in operation.
4. Staff shall be fully trained in the operation of the CCTV system and there shall be at least one member of staff on duty during trading hours who is able to provide copies of CCTV recordings to the Police and authorised officers of the Local Authority. Such copies shall, in any event, be provided within three (3) days.
5. When CCTV is not operating, no supply of alcohol shall be made on the premises. If a fault develops with the CCTV system, the duration and nature shall be recorded in a log to be made available for inspection by Police and authorised officers of the Local Authority upon demand.
6. All staff shall be instructed to record in an incident book/register all incidents of crime and disorder occurring at the premises, and details of any occasion when the police are called. These records shall include the time and date of any incident and the identities of staff members involved. The incident book/register shall be made available for inspection by Police and authorised officers of the Local Authority upon demand.
7. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or consumed in the licensed premises.

Protection of Children from Harm

8. The "Challenge 25"/"Think 25" proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises. All customers who appear under the age of 25 will be challenged to prove that they are over 18 when attempting to purchase alcohol. Acceptable forms of ID include a photo driving licence, passport, or home office approved identity card bearing the holographic 'PASS' mark. If the

person seeking alcohol is unable to produce an acceptable form of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol shall be made to or for that person.

9. All staff shall be trained in the law about the sale of alcohol. Such training will include challenging every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age and to refuse service where individuals cannot produce acceptable means of identification, acceptable forms of ID and using the refusal register. Such training (including any refresher training) will be logged and provided not less than every six months. The training log will be made available for inspection by Police and authorised persons.

10. A refusals log must be kept at the premises and made immediately available on request to the police or an authorised person. The refusals log shall be inspected on a monthly basis by the DPS and noted in the log, and a record made in the log of any actions that appear to be needed to protect young people from harm. The log must record all refused sales of alcohol and include the following:
 - a) the identity of the member of staff who refused the sale;
 - b) the date and time of the refusal;
 - c) the alcohol requested and reason for refusal;
 - d) description of the person refused alcohol.

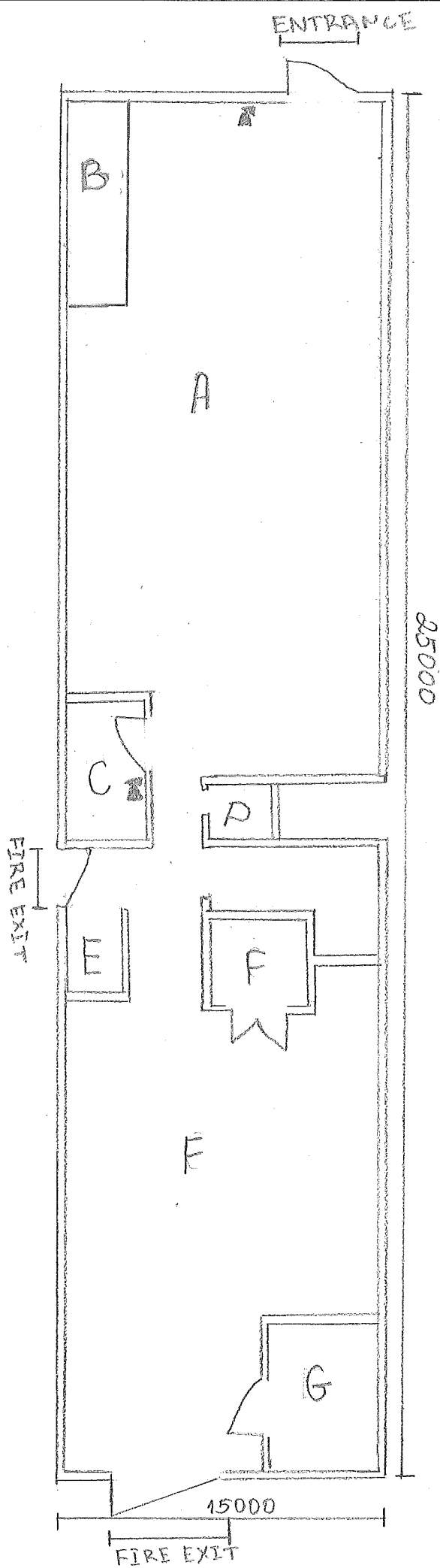

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Act 2003 Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder, and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Police require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence.

Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated.

Closed circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations on the premises and in accordance with advice from the Police.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item.

Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S) if required should be similarly displayed.

This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

A Summary of the Premises Licence will be displayed at each public entrance to the premises.

The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below:

CCTV

- 1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
2. A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the whole of the restaurant on level 3.

General

3. A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol
4. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

- 5 An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system

- 6 A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.

- 7 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

8. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked.

9. Outside of the hours authorized for the sale of alcohol, **all** alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind a lockable door to prevent access, a screen will cover all alcohol behind the counter area.

I have spoken to the applicant and discussed the Supply of Alcohol times, as he has asked for 06.00 hours until 24.00 hours, he stated that he does not sell alcohol that early in the morning and had no intention of doing so, we agreed that the Supply of alcohol times will be **09.00** hours until **23.00** hours Monday to Sunday and outside of the authorized supply of Alcohol hours, the alcohol will be behind a lockable door.

There is an issue in the area with street drinking, and to allow a shop to sell alcohol from this time of the morning will only fuel the problem, the rear of the premises is in a poor state and it is clear that the area is used by street drinkers.

Police Representation to the application for a new Premises Licence for Blooms, 268 Preston Road, Wembley HA3 OPY.

Dear Mr Rizan Jaildeen

I recently visited your shop as part of the consultation process in relation to your application for a new premise Licence, during my visit we spoke about several concerns I had, the first being the times you have applied for the sale of alcohol. You stated that you wanted to open from 06:00 hour, to 24:00 Hours Monday to Sunday, and also sell alcohol from these times, I informed you that I had concerns about these times due to a street drinking problem in the area which had been brought to my attention by the Local Safer Neighbourhoods Team, you stated that you did not sell alcohol until the afternoon and was happy to amend your hours for the sale of alcohol to suit your business; we discussed and agreed that this would be from 09:00 hours until 23:00 hours Monday to Friday.

You said that you would be opening the shop from 06:00 to 24:00 hours Monday to Sunday, and we spoke about how you would prevent the exposure of alcohol outside of the licensable hours to sell alcohol, it was agreed that all the alcohol would be locked behind a lockable door at the entrance to the alcohol aisle, to prevent anyone entering the aisle during these times, and that all other alcohol behind the counter would be covered.

We also discussed the need for a Personal Licence holder to be present on the Premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol, this was due to the issues associated with the area around street drinkers, you stated that this was not an issue as it was only you and other family members that would be working in the shop and all held a Personal Licence.

All the above was put in my first representation letter that I sent to you on the 5/5/2016.

On the 18/05/2016 I received an e-mail from your agent Mr Suresh Kanapathi, which stated that you have now changed your mind on what we had agreed and that you have asked that the condition regarding having a Personal Licence holder to be present on the Premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol, be removed as you are a family business and that you will train everyone regarding the sale of alcohol.

I feel that this would not be sufficient due to the problems related to the location with street drinkers, and the fact that you are currently selling high strength alcohol for £1 a can, and when asked why you stated that you were in competition with other local shops and had to sell it cheaper.

During the visit I inspected the side and rear of your premises, where I saw a large quantity of empty cans of alcohol, this shows a serious street drinking problem which I would suggest you have not tackled, and I fear having untrained staff, or staff trained by unqualified trainers will not fully cover the training needed to comply with the licensing objectives.

You have also now stated that you are not willing to cover the alcohol behind the Counter as there are other items there that you will be selling, I must remind you that Exposing alcohol for unauthorised sale is an offence under 137 of the licensing act 2003.

You have also said that you do not want any lockable grills or door to prevent Access to the alcohol, and will cover it instead. I still feel that the alcohol should not be accessible during the hours outside of the licensable hours to sell alcohol..

Please see the attached photos I took during my visit of the outside side and rear of your shop, along with the statement from the Safer Neighbourhoods officer that is responsible for the area in which your shop is located.

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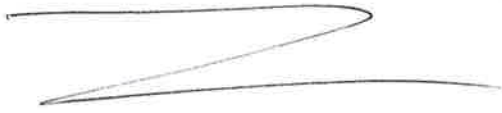

This statement is in regards to ASB behavior and street drinking and other alcohol related incidents in PRESTON ROAD area near to junction with UXENDON CRESCENT in WEMBLEY.
I am PCSO 7194QK George POPA and I am part of PRESTON SNT team from Brent Borough, and I am based at WEMBLEY POLICE STATION. Part of my duties is to patrol and deal with issues and incidents in my ward and a big part of my routine is taken by dealing with alcohol related incidents and Anti Social behavior in PRESTON ROAD by the parade of shops near PRESTON ROAD station, near to the junction with UXENDON CRESCENT. This particular area is part of BARNHILL WARD but borders my ward, and is very often frequented by homeless people who squat in garages and back of the shops and also consume large amounts of alcohol and loiter at this location in front of betting shops and off license shops. During the last year as well as moving these people on numerous times I have also dealt personally with several more serious incidents, such as alcohol related ABH where one of the drunk homeless male was punched in the nose, also with a eviction of several alcoholics homeless males who broke in, and started to live in a garage behind PRESTON ROAD accessed from UXENDON CRESCENT and also with theft offences where again people under the influence of alcohol at location have been involved. I personally saw the people that are creating this trouble going into the nearby shops and off license shops buying alcohol in huge quantities. The shops make it all too easy for this alcohol addicted individuals to get their fix and then become drunk which leads then to commit ASB and other crimes. I have also noticed that the ASB is more aggressive and more violent late in the evening when these individuals have easy and unrestricted access to cheap strong alcohol from the off license premises nearby.
It is really difficult especially for the local residents that live nearby and use the local shops as they are the most that suffer. Also other business are complaining about the above situation and received many verbal complaints where locals want the police to deal more robustly with people consuming alcohol in this area and irresponsible business who supply this alcohol as they are really the fuel that keep the issue ongoing.
I attached below some CRIMINTS from the past to give you a bit of more insight in the issue.

On 24/01/2015 police were called to outside PADDY POWER, PRESTON ROAD, and WEMBLEY in regards to a MALE stating he had been punched by his friend.

Preston SNT officers attended and found the victim, [redacted] with a bleeding nose.

Approximatley 15 minutes prior to the assault [redacted] had been seen by officers staning outside the newsagents two shops north of PADDY POWER with several other ROMANIAN males. There were no issues, and although they were quiet the group had clearly been drinking alcohol.

[redacted] said that one of his friends had punched him on the nose. It was bleeding however it stopped after applying a compression to it. Due to being intoxicated he was not making much sense. He said it was his friend Sorin however he could not provide any further information or any description other than a Romanian MALE.

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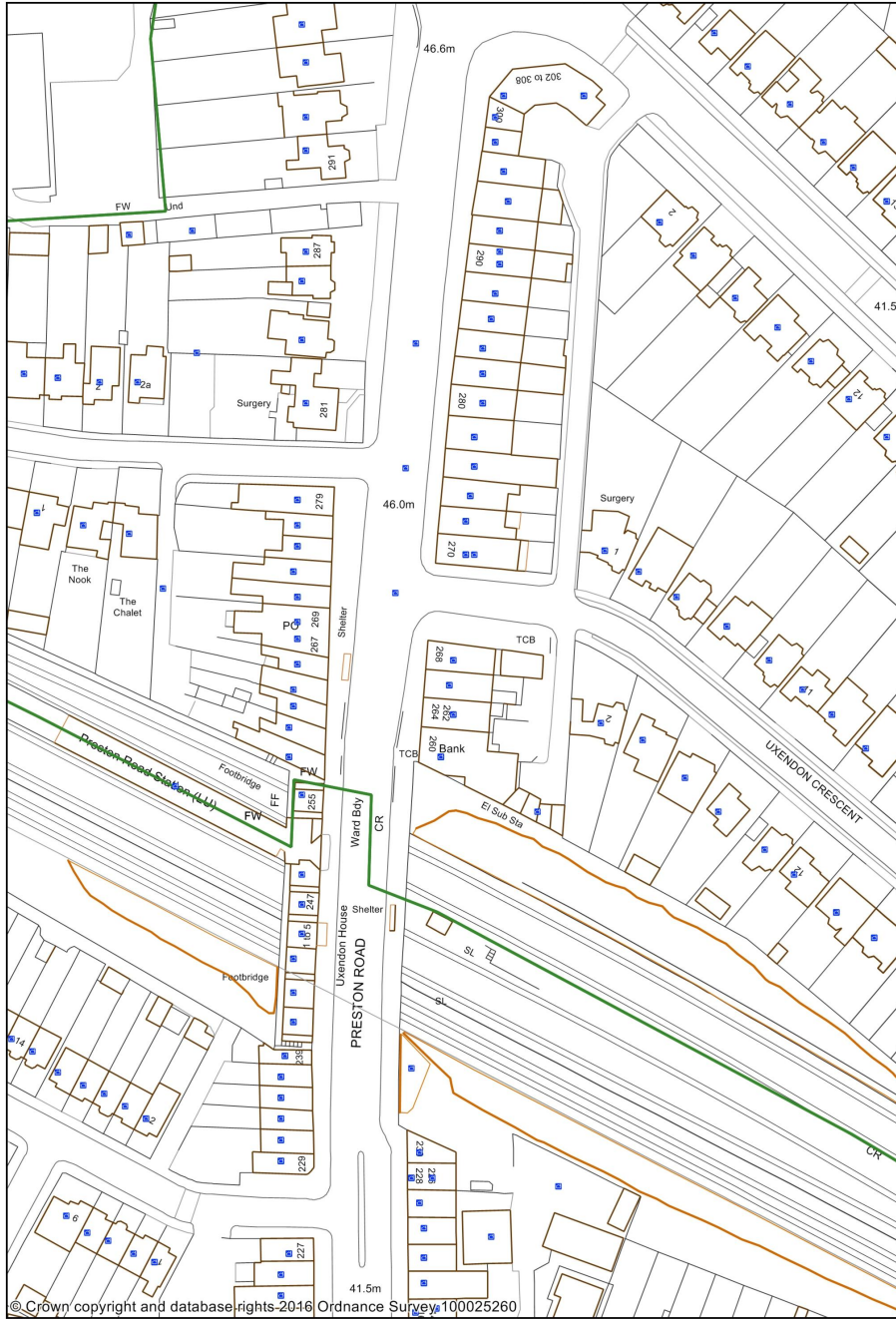
