SUPERSAVE, 68 Craven Park Road, London, NW10 4AE currently has a licence to supply alcohol from 00:00 to 00:00 Monday to Sunday.

The Premises Licence Holder (PLH) is Mr Farooq Khan and Mr Mahsooq Naz, the Designated Premises Supervisor is Mr Farooq Khan.

Police have no faith in Mr Farooq Khan and Mr Mahsooq Naz to operate the Premises responsibly and therefore wish to bring the matter before the Sub-Committee for consideration.

Information suggests that the shop is attracting a lot of Anti-Social Behaviour, and crime late at night into the early hours of the morning, the premises licence allows the shop to open until 23.00 hours daily then to operate from a hatch after this time.

The shop has been opening past their licensing times, allowing people into the shop, they are selling to drunks who regularly congregate outside the shop to drink their beers.

Police have witnessed and had to deal with Anti-Social Behaviour and crimes linked to this venue, the shop being open 24 hours a day, selling high strength beers, to street drinkers is a magnet for every undesirable to congregate and cause a nuisance.

On the 09/02/2016 at 04.15 hours police were called to the shop by a drunk male who stated that he was going to harm himself, on police arrival they spoke to a male who is well known to police for drink and drug issues, it became apparent to the officers that the male was very drunk and he made his way to the front of the shop (Supersave) and became aggressive towards another street drinker and a member of the shops staff, officers advised the shop that they should not sell him anymore alcohol as he was already very drunk. Police then went inside the shop to speak to staff and determine what their licence conditions are, as they left the shop the drunk male they had been dealing with was seen with a carrier bag full of beer which he had just purchased from the shop through the hatch, officers then tipped away an open can of beer that he had in his hand. The shop was again warned about selling to drunks.

The officer goes on to say in his statement that he has worked on the Borough of Brent since 2003 and has seen the problems that this shop generates in this area, with street drinkers, Drug dealing and users along with prostitution.

11/02/2016 police received reports of a male with stab wounds after a fight outside the shop, on arrival police were met by a hostile crowd, and a male lying on the floor with numerous stab wounds, the victim stated that he had been at a party nearby and went to the shop with a group of people to buy more alcohol where he was approached by the suspect and attacked, officers that attended the scene described the group as being intoxicated and hostile to police, this incident happened at approximately 04.50 hours.

On the 05/03/2016 two officers from Brent Licensing team were out conducting licensing visits in the Harlesden area, at about midnight their attention was drawn two large groups of people, the first standing between Metro Supermarket and Supersave, and a second group standing on the opposite side of the road.

Police stopped and observed the groups who appeared to be in a party mood, there was music being played from a parked vehicle, most appeared to be drinking alcohol both groups were very noisy and several were very drunk.

One of the males in particular was drinking from a can of beer and was having to stand with his back to the shops shutters to keep himself upright, he was shouting incoherently, and on finishing his beer he threw it into the road just missing the unmarked police car officers were sat in, he then staggered into the road narrowly being missed by passing cars before walking into Supersave, followed by officers that witnessed the male stagger to the fridge select a single can of beer and then hand over one pound to a male behind the counter, there was a brief conversation between the pair before the male staggered out of the shop, whilst observing that sale officers became aware of two other drunk males at the counter with a substantial amount of beers and spirits on the counter paying, both males were very drunk one in particular was unable to stand without holding on to the counter and was barely able to speak due to being so intoxicated, again another member of staff served these two drunk males, when it was clear that they were drunk.

Police then identified themselves to the staff and asked why the shop was still open and allowing members of the public onto the premises when they have a condition to close the doors at 23:00 hours and serve through the hatch, a member of staff stated that the shop is busy and they have been told by the owner to stay open late to deal with customers.

The two males that were observed selling to the very intoxicated males were interviewed under caution and admitted the offence; both were later issued with £90 fines.

Both males expressed their concerns to police that they felt unsafe working at the shop in the evenings, saying that the people that came to the shop were always drunk threatening to staff and intimidating, they said that this happened on a nightly basis and that they had concerns for their own safety.

They asked if the police could speak to the owner about closing the shop earlier, as they did not feel confident enough challenging the owner. The males gave their names as Mr

Jamil Khan and Mr Mohammad Mahshooq NAZ, it was not until sometime later that police established that Mr NAZ was one of the people named as being one of the premises licence Holders, he made no reference to having more of an interest in the shop, more than being an employee.

On the 06/02/2016 I called and spoke to Mr Farooq Khan to inform him of what had taken place at the shop the night before, he said that the members of staff involved had told him what had happened and he was fully aware, he was asked why the shop was not abiding by its licence conditions and closing at 23:00 hours, he stated that the shop was very busy between 23:00 hours and midnight as the shop also sold bus passes and they stayed open to deal with the large amount of people that used the shop between these times so that there wasn't a queue outside the shop.

It was explained to him that the shop had a condition on its licence that the shop closes at 23:00 hours and uses the serving hatch; he stated that he is aware of the condition, and will start complying with it.

It was also explained to him that his staff feared for their safety, due to the threats from customers, again this was mainly down to the shops late opening times, and the sale of high strength alcohol.

On the 02/04/2016 Brent licensing police along with Harlesden Safer Neighbourhoods Team conducted a test purchase on the premises. A police cadet who is aged 17 years of age was sent into the shop to see if the shop would sell to the child; the cadet was able to purchase alcohol without being challenged.

The shop assistant was interviewed under caution and admitted to selling to the child without asking for any identification. The male serving the child gave his name as Mr Shahbaz Azam.

CCTV Evidence

Pc Shippey has written a statement outlining the sale of alcohol to a drunk person on the 09/02/2016 at 04.10 hours.

This incident was captured by Brent Council CCTV, the camera is situated on the opposite side of the road, and was focused on the front of the premises, Supersave 68 Craven Park Road, NW10. This shows a group of people standing outside the shop and using the serving hatch to place their beers on as if it is a bar. Some of the group appear drunk and are staggering around.

Officers arrive and enter the store, the shop continue serving alcohol to the males standing around outside drinking.

The male that called police can be seen drinking alcohol and purchasing more beer from the shop at 04.16 hours, whilst officers are inside talking to staff. Officers then leave the location after speaking with the male caller

At 04.30 officers return and again speak to the caller before removing an open can of beer from his pocket and throwing it away. They then leave only to return a short time later and escort the male away.

The next part of the CCTV footage obtained by police is dated the 17/02/2016, again it is a Brent council CCTV camera and is focused on the front of the premises, Supersave 68 Craven Park Road, NW10, the time is 00.40 hours and shows the shop is still open for business and has customers entering the shop, even though the shop has a condition on its licence that reads, *The premises shall be closed to the public between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following morning and all sales during these hours shall be via the window only.*

At 04:41 hours a large black female enters the shop, and after a few seconds the female can be seen being ejected from the shop, and she appears to spit at the male before running off, being chased by the shopkeeper. She returns shortly after and bangs on the window, before again running off.

The next part of the CCTV footage obtained by police is dated the 18/02/2016, again it is a Brent council CCTV camera and is focused on the front of the premises, Supersave 68 Craven Park Road, NW10, it starts at 00.37 hours and again the shop is open and customers are entering and exiting the shop, there is a group of people outside drinking.

At 00.54 hours the group start dancing, and it becomes apparent that a parked car is playing music as they congregate around it, the group go back and forth to the serving hatch buying items.

At 01:24 hours two females from the group are at the hatch and start dancing, one of them then starts pole dancing on a nearby post.

The next part of the CCTV footage obtained by police is dated the 19/02/2016, again it is a Brent council CCTV camera and is focused on the front of the premises, Supersave 68 Craven Park Road, NW10, it starts at 00.40 hours the shop is open and people are still entering and exiting.

On the 1st April 2016 at about midnight officers from Brent Licensing team were conducting licensing visits in Craven Park Road, when their attention was drawn to a large group of people standing in the street drinking alcohol and singing, one male was playing the Bongos and there was a party atmosphere, people were seen entering Supersave, and other local shops and coming out and opening cans of alcohol before rejoining the party.

A police serial was requested to disperse the group; however the group returned a short time later and continued partying

The above is just a snapshot of what the area is like on a nightly basis, people partying drinking and causing a nuisance.

The shops current setup is a large contributor to the problems associated with the area, as they are staying open beyond their allowed times, they are selling high strength alcohol to street drinkers and people with mental health problems, it appears that this location has become the meeting point for these people.

Numerous street beggars patrol the stretch of road waiting to pounce on people using the shop, either whilst at the shop or as they get in or out of their vehicles.

There is also a serious drugs problem in the vicinity which is being addressed by the local Safer Neighbourhoods team.

A meeting was held at the Civic Centre on the 07/04/2016, with the Premises Licence Holder, and DPS Mr Farooq Khan, shop assistant Mr Shahbaz Azam and Licensing agent Miss Debra Sylvester.

The meeting was held to deal with recent problems at the venue, namely the sale of alcohol to a 17 year old Cadet, on the 02/04/2016 as part of a test Purchase operation.

Mr Azam was informed that on this occasion he was going to be given words of advice for the sale to the Cadet.

Officers then discussed the issue in and around the shop, police outlined the problems identified, namely groups of street drinkers buying high strength alcohol and standing outside the shop drinking, also the shop staying open beyond its licensable hours

And the shop fact that two members of staff had recently been issued with £90 PND's

Mr Khan denied his shop sold to drunks and blamed other local shops, he stated that one of the males that police witnessed buying alcohol buys about 12 cans of beer a day from the shop, he went on to say 'he comes in when he gets money from begging and buys a can he's not drunk, he then stands outside the shop drinking'.

It was explained that the recent anti-social behaviour in and around the shop had become unacceptable and that Licensing team had come to the conclusion that a review of the shops licence was now inevitable.

Mrs Sylvester stated that the shop would be prepared to put in a minor Variation and accept some of the conditions that the police would be seeking to ask for at a hearing.

The shop and their agent Mrs Sylvester proposed numerous conditions; however some would have breached the current conditions that are already on the licence and would have allowed

the shop to open its doors longer into the night allowing customers into the shop.

Below are the conditions proposed by the shop and it's agent?

1. No beers, ciders or lagers above 6% ABV will be sold or available for sale at the premises
2. Challenge 25 will be operated and anyone appearing to be under the age of 25 will be asked to provide ID in the form of passport, driving licence or proof of age ID card with the PASS logo before being allowed to buy alcohol. Any refusals of alcohol will be entered in a refusals log.
3. Posters will be on display at the premises advising customers that Challenge 25 is in operation and that ID will be asked for.
4. All staff will be given training in the sale of alcohol with particular emphasis on the sale to street drinkers, drunken people and those suspected of buying for drunk people, and Challenge 25 . Test papers will be given to staff and refresher training will be given every six months, and all training material will be kept in a training folder.
5. A sign will be put up outside the shop asking customers not to loiter outside and to keep any noise to a minimum when entering and leaving the premises to avoid disturbance to local residents.
6. Members of staff will go outside the shop on a regular basis during the evening to ask anyone congregating immediately outside the shop to move away during the hours that the premises are open to the public.
7. No known street drinkers or obviously drunk people will be served alcohol at any time and neither will alcohol be sold to persons who appear to be buying for drunk people, or anyone under the age of
8. No sales of alcohol will be made after midnight Sunday to Thursday or 2am Friday and Saturday until 7am the following day.
9. There will be window service only from midnight weekdays and 2am Friday and Saturday and no customers will be allowed to enter the shop after that time.

Although police welcome most of the conditions, some are not workable.

Condition 6 reads *that a member of staff will go outside the shop on a regular basis during the evening and move away people congregating*, this would only bring staff into confrontational situations and put their safety at risk, staff have confided in police that they already feel unsafe and are reluctant to challenge people that appear drunk as they fear being attacked.

Condition 8 reads, *No sales of alcohol will be made after midnight Sunday to Thursday or 2am Friday and Saturday until 7am the following day*. It is clear that the problems start late evening and crowds seem to start to gather from just before midnight, allowing the shop to open until 2am would not be promoting the licensing objectives.

Condition 9 reads, *There will be window service only from midnight weekdays and 2am Friday and Saturday and no customers will be allowed to enter the shop after that time*. The shop already has conditions on its license restricting the time it can open to the public and states, *The premises shall be closed to the public between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following morning and all sales during these hours shall be via the window only*.

Police feel that the current management of the shop is non-existent and recommend that conditions be added to the licence, and some of the current conditions amended to bring the shop in line, and meet the licensing objectives.

The shop currently has 6 conditions. (Listed below)

1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition

Police would ask that this condition remains

2. All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.

Police would ask that this condition remains

3. The premises shall be closed to the public between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following morning and all sales during these hours shall be via the window only.

Police would ask for this condition to be removed.

4. A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

Police would ask that this condition remains

5. Suitable and sufficient fire fighting equipment shall be installed and properly maintained.

Police would ask that this condition remains

6. The Portman Group proof of age scheme or similar such scheme shall be adopted.

Police would ask for this condition to be removed.

Police would ask for the following conditions to be added to the licence

- a. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

This condition is necessary to promote the licensing objective, The Protection of Children from Harm.

- b. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked.

The shop has clearly demonstrated that it shows no regard to selling high strength alcohol to drunk street drinkers who use the shop as a meeting place to socialise, where they party into the early hours of the morning.

- c. The opening hours will be 07:00 hours to 23:00 hours Monday to Sunday

- d. The sale of alcohol will be between 09:00 hours to 23:00 hours Monday to Sunday.

- e. Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.

The shop currently has a 24 hour licence, which as highlighted above attracts street drinkers, people partying until the early hours of the morning, the culture appears to be that groups

come out just before the early hours of the morning start drinking and socialising, this shop having a licence that allows them to open 24/7 and sell cheap high strength alcohol on a busy high road is a cocktail for crime and disorder, and Anti-Social Behaviour.

It appears that this shop and the surrounding area is being used as an open air night club which appears to be becoming more popular with undesirables that make life a misery for people that would have the unfortunate experience of either living, or visiting the area.

Adding conditions c, d, and e, would considerably reduce large groups of drunk people partying into the early hours of the morning, and having access to high strength beers.

No Single Sales of cans or bottles of Beers, Cider or Lagers

During a meeting with Mr Farooq Khan, he stated that one particular customer comes into the shop about 12 times a day and buys a can of alcohol then goes outside and drinks it, he begs and when he gets money he comes back in for another can, this shows the current attitude of the shops management which appears to be make money at any cost to the health and wellbeing of the local community, and I feel this condition would reduce the opportunity for street drinkers to purchase alcohol from this premises where there is clearly no consideration given to who they sell to.

f. The following crime prevention measures shall be implemented:

(1) A time delay safe with deposit slot and anti fishing mechanisms must be used at the Counter till area

(2) Regular robbery awareness and cash minimization training shall be given to all staff.

Staff have commented to officer about how unsafe they feel working in the shop due to the many aggressive people that frequent the premise, they have mentioned being threatened by people if they challenge them.

Finally the police would request that Mr Khan be removed as the DPS for the shop.

Mr Khan appears to have no regard for the licensing objectives, staff feel unable to approach him and voice their concerns, he seems unaware, or unconcerned of the problems that are occurring in and around the shop, police feel that him being removed and a new DPS being put in place will go a long way to improving the running of the shop.

Summary

This shop has had the privilege of having a licence to sell alcohol 24 hours a day seven days a week, but has decided to abuse this by keeping the shop open later than allowed, selling to drunks and young people, they appear to have no regard for the licensing objectives and the management appear to put profit before anything else, during a meeting with the Premise Licence holder Mr Farooq Khan he was reluctant to accept the shop was being run poorly and was more interested in what the other local shops were doing than sorting out his own. Police would ask that all the above conditions be implemented and ask that Mr Khan be removed as the DPS and a new person be put in place to oversee the new conditions are complied with.

I am a Police Constable of nearly 12 years experience, all of which I have worked on the London Borough of Brent, I am currently attached to the licensing unit for the Borough, I have been authorised via a delegated authority to represent the Borough Commander of the London Borough of Brent and for the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Service to act on Licensing matters.

Supersave 68 Craven Park Road, Harlesden NW10 4AE is a convenience store which currently has a 24 hour licence to sell alcohol, on the 9th February 2016 PC Shippey completed a statement outlining the issues he had witnessed whilst dealing with a call to outside the shop, during the call PC Shippey told staff to stop selling alcohol to drunk street drinkers, only for them to carry on selling to them.

CCTV from a Brent Council camera has been obtained the camera was focused on the shop at the time PC Shippey attended and dealt with the male and told staff in the shop to stop selling to drunks.

Further footage dated 17/02/2016 shows the shop still open at 00:40 hours in the morning and a black female having an altercation with a member of staff from the shop, it appears that she is ejected from the shop before spitting at him and running off.

The next part of CCTV is dated 18/02/2016 and starts at approx 00:37 hours again it shows that the shop is still open and people are seen entering and exiting the shop, this footage is just under an hour long.

It shows a group of people outside the shop and they appear to be having a party, they can be seen drinking and dancing and at one point one of the females can be seen pole dancing around a post outside the shop, people from the group can also be seen purchasing and drinking what looks like cans of beer from the shop.

It also appears that there is a parked car outside the shop playing music as the group congregate around the vehicle and can be seen dancing, although this can not be verified as there is no audio.

There is further footage dated the 19/02/2016 which again shows the show still open and shows customers

entering at 00:40 hours, when the shop should be closed. All this CCTV has been placed on to a CD, and I exhibit this as MJS/01

On the 05/03/2016 officers witnessed two members of staff selling to drunks and both were issued with £90 Fixed Penalty Notices.

On the 01/04/2016 Licensing Police Officers were on patrol conducting Licensing visits when they witnessed a group of drunk people standing opposite Supersave, most were drinking alcohol and one male was playing a set on Bongos, whilst a woman was singing, members of this party were seen walking across the road and entering Supersave before returning with cans of alcohol.

Some of this incident was captured on my mobile phone, and I have transferred this on to a CD, which I exhibit as MJS/02

On the 02/04/2016 a test purchase was conducted, where a 17 year old Police Cadet when in to the shop and purchased alcohol, he was not challenged by staff.

I have held a meeting with the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor Mr Farooq Khan, also present was his agent Mrs Sylvester, I explained to them that I was of the opinion that the shop was being run poorly and that the main focus was on making money and not adhering to the licensing objectives, Mr Khan wanted to blame other local shops rather than take responsibility for his own business but eventually accepted that his shop had issues that needed addressing.

Looking at all the evidence gathered I am of the opinion that the shop is facilitating the violence and Anti-Social Behaviour that is associated with the area.

I am of the belief that if this shop had a reduction in the high strength beers it sells, and its opening hours reduced, along with the other conditions being asked for, the area would become a better and safer place to work and live.

The shop is currently breaching all four of the licensing objectives and without enforcement will continue to do so as they have no regard for other people's welfare and see profit as their main goal.

Staff have raised concerns to officers that they feel unsafe whilst at work but do not have the confidence to tell the owner how they feel as they fear losing their jobs.

The conditions asked for in the review will go a long way to bringing the shop back under control and working within the licensing objectives.

On TUESDAY the 9th FEBRUARY 2016 at 0415 hours I was on duty in uniform posted as driver of a police response vehicle call sign Q1 Nights in the company of PC204QK Charlotte PATEMAN when I had cause to attend CRAVEN PARK NW10 in relation to a 999 call made by a male by the name of ~~██████████~~ date of birth ~~██/██/19██~~ of ~~██████████~~ ROAD NW10 a regular caller who is often drunk and abusive when spoken to, this morning he had called making claims he would harm himself. (CAD 630 at 0321 hours and CAD 663 at 0336 hours), on arrival officers from EALING had been assigned to assist and found speaking with Mr ~~██████████~~ in ST MARYS RD NW10 off CRAVEN PARK. *SP*

Mr ~~██████████~~ was seen drinking from a opened can of beer labeled "STELLIO ARTOIS", he was standing in the road swaying from side to side and speech was slurred, his eyes were glazed and watery in appearance. Officers from EALING spoke to Mr ~~██████████~~ who informed them that he was fine and going home, he was telling officers to leave. *SP*

PC PATEMAN and I have had previous dealings with Mr ~~██████████~~ who is known to be violent towards female officers. we observed Mr ~~██████████~~ for a few minutes and told him not to do so.

Mr [redacted] ignored several requests and walked into CRAVEN PK NW10 saying he was going to buy more alcohol and disappeared from view for a few minutes before being seen again this time standing outside SUPERSAVE Convenience store at 68 CRAVEN PARK NW10 along with several others who are regular street drinkers. _____ SP

Mr [redacted] was observed speaking with a BLACK FEMALE wearing a light blue rain jacket who also appeared to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs, Mr [redacted] was observed becoming threatening in his manner as well as verbally to another male and shop staff who were serving customers via a window hatch. _____ SP

Mr [redacted] was approached and advised to go home, he refused several times often posturing as if for show to others standing around. I have approached the front of SUPERSAVE told staff that this male was drunk and should not be served anymore alcohol, a member of staff appeared to understand my requests continuing to sell non alcoholic items to customers outside via the serving hatch. _____ SP

I asked to see their alcohol licence in relation to hours they could sell as I believed they had restrictions on times. Staff opened the main shutters and allowed myself and PC PATEMAN to enter where I spoke to a member of staff who gave his details as Mr Mubarik ALI date of birth 22/07/1983 ,on display was a licence it was dated 2005 ,licence number 178182 stating it was allowed to sell alcohol from 0000 hours to 0000 hours Monday to Sunday (7 days), the person who obtained the licence was a Mr Tariq NAZ, who was not present in the shop. _____ SP

I informed Mr ALI that the male I know as Mr [redacted] was very drunk and should not be served anymore alcohol as he was very drunk and causing anti social problems and that others who were standing outside were alsos drunk and that the premises was a honeypot for them as they can buy alcohol anytime when drunk this caused ongoing problem resulting on occasions in violence to persons, criminal damage and anti social problems throughout the nights especially at weekends .

While speaking with Mr ALI another member of staff was serving via the hatch, I saw Mr [redacted] through the glass and noticed he had a black carrier bag, the same type the shop has. _____ SP

After explaining the issues , Mr ALI agreed and highlighted he has ongoing issues with beggers harassing customers a point I made was this was due to serving alcohol to the street drinkers when they are drunk and loiter outside his shop, and if he stopped this practice problems would ease.

On leaving the shop, Mr [redacted] was very open about the fact that he had just bought cans of beer from the shop while I was inside, I have told the staff that they have served alcohol to Mr [redacted] when he was drunk and that the matter would be passed onto the Licensing office. JS

Mr [redacted] was engaged several times leading to an open can being poured away and being moved away from the area eventually with the assistance of a female friend. JS

Mr [redacted] is a White Male, Medium to heavy build at the time was wearing a grey hooded top under a Green raincoat. JS

I have been on the Borough of BRENT since 2003 originally based at HARLESDEN Police Station over time with increase of premises selling alcohol, this particular premises has been a focus of street drinkers and others who are involved in drug use / dealing as well as prostitution where they can obtain alcohol when drunk or under the influence of drugs. JS

I believe as a result of these premises having a 24 hour licence it has assisted in being a focus of anti social problems outside the premises and nearby streets. JS

The local Authority CCTV operators have a camera constantly focused on the front of the shop. JS

On Saturday 5th March 2016 I was on duty in plain clothes in company with PC782QK Whitcomb we were on mobile patrol in an unmarked police vehicle conducting Licensing visits at licenced premises, at about midnight we were travelling along Harlesden High street in to Craven Park Road when my attention was drawn to a group of males standing outside METRO supermarket and were being very noisy we parked our vehicle on the opposite side of the road and observed the group of males for a few minutes, I noticed that both METRO Supermarket 72 Craven Park Road NW10, was open and people were coming and going from the shop, and also SUPERSAVE EXPRESS, 68 Craven Park Road was open, its shutters were up and people were entering and leaving the shop, I am aware that SUPERSAVE EXPRESS have a condition on it's licence, namely that it should be closed to the public between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following morning and all sales during these hours shall be via the window only. This was an obvious breach of this condition, I then became aware of another group of males standing near the Ladbrokes bookmakers on the opposites side of the road from the convenience stores and nearest to where we were parked, the males were drinking alcohol and all appeared to be drunk, one in particular seemed very drunk and aggressive, I would describe him as an IC3 male, approximately F6'0 tall dark complexion, and aged between 50 and 60 years of age, he was wearing a long dark coat and a dark woollen hat, he had a unkempt beard which had a large amount of white hair on it, (I will describe this male as Male 1) this male was considerably drunk he was drinking from an open can of alcohol, the beer was a brand called Debowe, this male was swaying around and shouting incoherently he was falling into the shutters of the shop and started arguing with the other males in his group, on finishing the can of beer he threw the empty can towards our vehicle and started shouting, he then spat on the floor, I was unable to make out what he was saying, HE WAS DRUNK,

another member of the group then started to urinate up against the wall of the shop, they all appeared very hostile and agitated, Male 1 then started to walk across the road he was staggering around and walking into the road without even looking, I got out of our vehicle and followed the male, who walked directly into SUPERSAVE EXPRESS, this is a 24 hour convenience store that sells alcohol, food and drinks, I walked in behind him and observed him select a can of Perla Mochna alcohol from the fridge and stand in the queue at the counter, he was unsteady on his feet and talking in a loud voice to himself the shop was busy with other customers and there was two members of staff serving behind the counter, one of the members of staff a male I now know to be Mr Mohammad Mahshooq NAZ date of birth 27/09/1959 of [REDACTED] Maz called over Male 1 who handed him a pound before staggering out of the store with his can of beer, I was about one meter from the counter and my view was not obstructed, my attention was then drawn to two white males who were at the far end of the counter and being served by the other member of staff, a male I now know to be Mr Jamil Khan, date of birth 11/12/1975 of [REDACTED] I could see that the males were drunk and the shorter of the two males was very drunk and was using the counter to keep himself upright he was slurring his words and in a drunken confused state, I could see by this point they had a quantity of beers on the counter, and the small very drunk male was asking Mr Khan for spirits from behind the counter, Mr Khan then placed this on the counter with the beers, the second drunk male then went back to the fridge and selected six more beers and placed them with the other beers, the short drunk male then took out a fifty pound note and handed this to Mr Khan who took the money and gave him his change before putting the alcohol into black bags for the males to take away, again I was less than one meter from the counter and could clearly see the transaction take place, my view was not obstructed, both males speech was slurred and both were unsteady on their feet the shorter male who paid for the alcohol was very drunk and was finding it difficult to speak. Both males were Dunk, they then left the shop, I then identified myself to both Mr NAZ and KHAN by showing them my warrant card, PC Whitcomb then entered the shop, I asked Mr NAZ why he had just sold alcohol to the tall black male who was drunk, he said he's always like that if I don't serve him he becomes angry, I then informed PC Whitcomb about what I had just witnessed, I then asked them to close the shop as they were breaching the licence, and informed Mr NAZ that I needed to speak with him about what had just happened.

The shop was still allowing customers in, but eventually after several requests closed the front door, I then informed Mr NAZ that I would be asking him questions under caution about the sale of alcohol to a drunk person,

I informed him that he was not under arrest and that he had the right to free in independent legal advise, which he declined, I then cautioned him and explained the caution, I then conducted a PACE compliant interview, asked him several questions about the offence which I recorded in an EAB, at the end of the interview I read what I had written down to him and asked him if agreed with what had been said and written down, he said it was correct and signed to say it was correct. I was aware that PC Whitcomb was speaking with Mr Khan and was conducting an interview under caution.

I then in formed him that I would need to speak to him later as I needed to decide how to deal with the offence. Later the same day at 14.00 hours Mr NAZ attended Wembley police station, I was in full uniform and issued him with a £90 Penalty Notice for Disorder (PND) I explained to him that the ticket was being issued for the offence of selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, under section 141 of the licensing act 2003, I informed him that he had three options, the first to pay the ticket in full within 21 days, or ask for a court hearing and if he did neither the fine would increase by fifty percent, he signed his for his copy of the ticket and stated that he was going to pay the fine, he also went on to say that he was scared working at the shop as he is constantly threatened by people and he did not like working there, he asked me to speak with the owner to see if he could make it safer for him. He then left the police station.

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

I am the licensing constable for Brent borough police and currently work within the police licensing unit, based at Brent Civic Centre, Wembley. On SATURDAY 5th MARCH 2016, at around 0001 hours, I was on duty in plain clothes, in company with PC 368QK Mike SULLIVAN. We were on patrol in an unmarked police vehicle. At around this time we were driving along CRAVEN PARK ROAD, NW10 in the direction of CRAVEN PARK. I noticed a group of males on my left who appeared to be drinking from open canisters of alcohol. I could see it was alcohol because the cans were of around 500ml sizes. The group on my left were stood outside a closed shop, just up from Ladbrokes bookmakers. I also noticed a group on my right standing outside Metro Supermarket, 72 CRAVEN PARK ROAD, NW10. I pulled over into a parking space on my left so that I could further observe what these two groups were doing. Even with my windows closed it was extremely noisy with all the noise they were making. I was parked approx five metres from the group on my left and approx thirty metres from the group on my right. There were 3-4 black males on my left; they were all very noisy shouting at each other. I witnessed one man walk to outside Ladbrokes and urinate on the floor. These men were all drunk. One male in particular, who was aged around late fifty years old, 6.0" tall, with a black beard and wearing a long black jacket was very unsteady on his feet, shouting and drinking from an open alcohol container. I saw him throw something towards our vehicle. PC SULLIVAN told me that he had just thrown his alcohol can on the ground. I then saw him spit onto the pavement. He was very drunk. Before we could go and speak to him about his behaviour, he quickly walked across CRAVEN PARK ROAD, without even looking out for traffic. As he did, PC Sullivan and I got out of our patrol car and followed him over the road and into SUPERSAVE, 68 CRAVEN PARK ROAD, NW10. Supersave is a small licensed premise selling alcohol, food, confectionary and soft drinks. PC Sullivan followed the male into SUPERSAVE. The shop is relatively small in size and was busy. I decided that it was unnecessary for us both to enter. I waited outside and paced up and down, just keeping my eye on PC Sullivan to ensure he was ok. About one minute later, the same male in the long black coat walked back out of Supersave. I saw him pull out a can of Debowe lager from his right pocket and walk off along CRAVEN PARK ROAD towards

CRAVEN PARK. A short while later I entered the shop and PC SULLIVAN informed me that he witnessed the shop keepers sell alcohol to the drunk black male we first observed and to two drunk white males who were served alcohol afterwards. PC Sullivan pointed out the two men responsible, who were stood behind the counter. I now know these men to be Mr. Mohammad MAHSHOOQ dob 27/09/1959 of ~~WATHAM MORRIS CLOSE, WATHAMSTON, LEICESTER LS15 2LE~~ and Mr. Jamil KHAN dob 11/12/1975 of ~~14 NORTH BRIDGE, ROAD, CRAYFORD, LEICESTER LE11 1AA~~. PC Sullivan asked both men to join us for a chat and for them to ask another member of staff to cover them at the till, which they did. PC SULLIVAN explained that he witnessed Mr. KHAN serving alcohol to two drunken white males and that Mr. MAHSHOOQ served the drunk black male who we first saw. I then carried out a PACE compliant interview with Mr. KHAN. I recorded full details of this interview in my evidence and action book (See page numbers 27-29). After the interview, I showed Mr. KHAN my record of interview and read it out to him, word for word. He agreed it was a correct record of what was said and signed my notes confirming this. After confirming his identification (he provided his UK passport, bank card and latest bank statement) and carrying out a satisfactory police national computer name check, he was suitable to be dealt with by way of penalty notice for disorder (PND). However, as I was in plain clothes, I was unable to issue the ticket at the shop. I invited Mr. KHAN to attend WEMBLEY police station at 1400 hours later that day to receive his ticket, which he agreed to do. I am aware PC SULLIVAN had interviewed Mr. MAHSHOOQ and also decided upon issue of a PND later that day, as he too was in plain clothes. We then gave words of advice on serving drunken customers and left the store.

At 1400 hours today, 5th March 2016, Mr. Khan attended WEMBLEY police station where I issued him a penalty notice for disorder (number 001803 65131673) for offence code DA16 (sells or attempts to sell alcohol to a person who is drunk, contrary to s.141 Licensing Act 2003.

I am a Police Constable of nearly 12 years experience, all of which I have worked on the London Borough of Brent, I am currently attached to the licensing unit for the Borough, I have been authorised via a delegated authority to represent the Borough Commander of the London Borough of Brent and for the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Service to act on Licensing matters.

On Friday 22nd April 2016 at about 13.00 hours I attended Supersave 68 Craven Park Road NW10 4AE to serve review papers on the Premises Licence Holder, and Designated Premise Supervisor Mr Farooq Khan, on entering the shop I spoke to two males that work at the shop, and that I have met before, I asked them if Mr Khan was at the shop, they replied that he would be coming to the shop later, I explained to them that I had spoken to him on the phone earlier and informed him that I would be delivering a copy of the review for him at the shop.

I then handed the envelope containing the review to one of the males, a male I know to be Mr Mohammad Yasir, and asked him to give it to Mr Khan when he came to the shop, he said he would.

I then asked Mr Yasir and the other male, a male I know to be Mr Shahbaz Azam if either of them held a personal Licence, both said no they didn't, I explained to them that there was a condition on the licence that required a personal Licence to be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol, Mr Yasir then pointed to a sign hanging up which stated that Mr Khan had given him and Mr Azam written authority to sell alcohol, I explained to him that this was not sufficient to satisfy the condition, and that they would need to stop selling alcohol, Mr Yasir then said that there was another member of staff that held a Personal Licence and that he had just gone to the chemist across the road and would be back any minute, shortly after another male walked in and said that he worked in the shop I asked him if he held a personal licence to which he replied No. he gave his name as Mr Amir Butt.

The previous day I spoke to Miss Esther Chan who is a Licensing officer for Brent Council, she informed me that

she had conducted a licensing visit at Supersave 68 Craven Park Road NW10 4AE, at the beginning of the week and had found several breaches to it's licence, one being that there was no Personal Licence holder present and that she had forced them to stop selling alcohol due to this breach.

I asked Mr Yasir and Mr Azam if they had been present when Miss Chan conducted her visit, both replied yes they had been and confirmed that she stopped them from selling alcohol as there was no personal Licence holder present, Mr Yasir then went on to say that he was now applying to get a Personal Licence, and seemed to think that he now had authority to sell alcohol because of this.

I informed them that they were to stop selling alcohol immediately, and needed to either cover all the alcohol up or remove it from the shelves, they said neither was possible due to the amount in the shop, so it was suggested they close the front door and only serve through the serving hatch which they decided to do.

It was explained to them that as soon as someone with a personal licence arrived at the shop to work they could resume selling alcohol. Whilst talking to the staff two people entered the shop and attempted to buy alcohol, both became angry when told they couldn't.

I then contacted Mr Khan on the phone and explained to him that I had visited the shop earlier today, and found that he was breaching one of his licence condition, by not having a personal Licence holder in the shop, and I also asked him if he was aware of the council licensing officers visit at the beginning of the week where the same breach was pointed out, he said he was aware of the officers visit, but went on to say that another council officer many years ago told him that a personal licence holder did not need to be in the shop if he left a written authority, I asked him who had told him that, he said I can't remember. I explained that he had a condition on his licence which states that there must be someone with a personal licence in the shop to supervise the sales of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for sale of alcohol, and within the space of a week he had continued to disregard the condition even after being told by Miss Chan.

He then said 'oh we are going around in circles, I will make sure there is someone in the shop with a licence' This again goes to show the total disregard Mr Khan has for the licensing objectives and the conditions on his licence.

PRIMARY INVESTIGATION DETAILS : 1 Immediate action

1. CAD 905-11FEB16 Q2 - 281QK AND 387QK, 23QK - 734QK AND 240QK, 83QK - 283QK AND 119QK

2. Officers attended the Location following reports of a Male said to have been Stabbed in the Face. Officers arrived on scene to a group of IC3 Males and Females stood at the Bus Stop, the Officers were ignored when they made efforts to identify a Viw even being told to Fuck off. However a Shopkeeper stood closeby directed the officers across the road to a male who was leaving the scene stating that he was the male with the knife.

PC 240QK ran after a male wearing a dark puffa jacket and lost sight of him on NICHOLL ROAD NW10.

As further units arrived on scene at CRAVEN PARK a loud commotion amongst the intial group at the Bus stop appeared to escalate. Upon investigation, One male was located seated on the BusStop and was bleeding from his arm, neck and abdomen. The wounds looked to be Superficial and LAS were immediately on scene to treat the male, following which he was soon placed in an ambulance and conveyed to ST MARYS HOSPITAL with PC 119QK.

Enquiries were carried out t the Scene and QK 3 attended.

Whilst at the Hospital an account from the Victim was taken and is as follows;

The Viw had been out at a friends house drinking, though he claims he didnt touch alcohol and had stuck to water throughout. At approximately 0430 hours they left the house as a group and made their way to the shops on CRAVEN PARK to buy more alcohol and drinks. Having been inside the shop to purchase a bottle of water, the male was 'confronted' by Suspect who proceeded in Punching him at least 5 times to the shoulder, neck

and head before making off in the direction of NICHOLL ROAD NW10. The Viw believes that 7 minutes later, the same Susp returned this time in possession of a knife which he used to stab the Viw 3 times to the arm, neck and abdomen. Again making off in the direction of NICHOLL ROAD NW10.

PRIMARY INVESTIGATION DETAILS : 2 Scene
There was a lot of confusion from those on scene as to where the incident took place on the Street. A crime scene was instigated by officers intially but closed shortly afterward by QK3 as it offered no evidential purpose and we could not be sure it actually took place where the scene was placed.

PRIMARY INVESTIGATION DETAILS : 3 Forensics
The Victims clothing has since been seized and exhibited by PC 119QK and will be booked into 66 with Ref to follow at a later date.

PRIMARY INVESTIGATION DETAILS : 4 Victims/Witnesses
Whilst there were plenty of People on Scene when Police arrived, all appeared intoxicated or anti Police and refused to offer their account or Pars. One Male by the name of Omar as per the Viw Page is said to have got inbetween the two males when the knife was brandished bu this account was only given by the victim and not by Omar himself when spoken to at length by Police.

PRIMARY INVESTIGATION DETAILS : 5 Suspects
The Suspect was described by both the Victim and witnesses on scene.
An IC3 African Male wearing a Blue Puffa Jacket. He was described as being unusually Short for an adult Male possibly F502-F504. He is said to have a Shaved head and has a Gold Tooth. Upon circulation, Officers offered up local knowledge alledging that the description was similar to that of a male by the name of [REDACTED].
Having viewed Custody imaging myself I was Satisfied that the male did match the description and has previous for carrying a knife.
Officers attened the Last known address for the Suspect at approxiamtely 0610 this morning but it was an unsuccessful attempt.

The Victim is sure that the [REDACTED] NW10 and this would indeed tie in with the Officers footchase and the presumed Knife retrieval during the fight.

Each Safer Neighbourhoods Team hold regular Ward Panel Meetings, which are made up of local residents, who discuss local issues, and set the ward priorities for their local police teams to tackle based on the most recent crime figures and issues raised by concerned residents.

Page 35 shows the most recent ward priorities which have been set for police to tackle.

The Ward panel have asked that Violence with Injury, Anti-Social Behaviour and Vagrants are the ward priorities.

The above highlights as serious issue in this area around Anti-Social Behaviour and Violence and Sexual Offences,

It would be unfair to say that all these offences are linked with the Supersave shop, but shows that the area suffers from a large amount of serious crimes and ASB.

There is also a large prostitution, and drug problem in this part of Harlesden, and it appears that most of the people involved in these activities use the shop as a meeting and socialising spot and a place to buy high strength alcohol.

The area also suffers from several very aggressive street beggars that patrol outside the shop waiting for people to approach the open hatch before aggressively begging for change, these beggars all suffer with mental health problems and drink and drugs issues.

The shop has proved that it has little to no concern about selling to street drinkers, and from CCTV footage obtained they can be seen allowing people to congregate outside the front of the shop openly drinking alcohol that they have just purchased from the store, and more worryingly can they can be seen supplying plastic cups and opening bottles for them.

The premise licence holder has recently stated that there has been a drug dealing problem in the area for years, and believes that is why so many people gather into the early hours in the morning.

The area is a magnet for drug dealers, street drinkers, prostitutes, beggars and people that want to socialise with their friends, the shop having a 24 hour licence to sell alcohol is attracting these people to the location as it allows them to have easy access to alcohol in the early hours of the morning. As previously highlighted Anti-Social Behaviour and Violent crimes peak between the hours of midnight and 05:00 hours, causing a detrimental affect to the area, which in turn highlights theses venues that currently opens late.

Reducing the hours that the shop can sell alcohol will lower the levels of Anti-Social Behaviour and Violent crimes that are currently associated with this area.

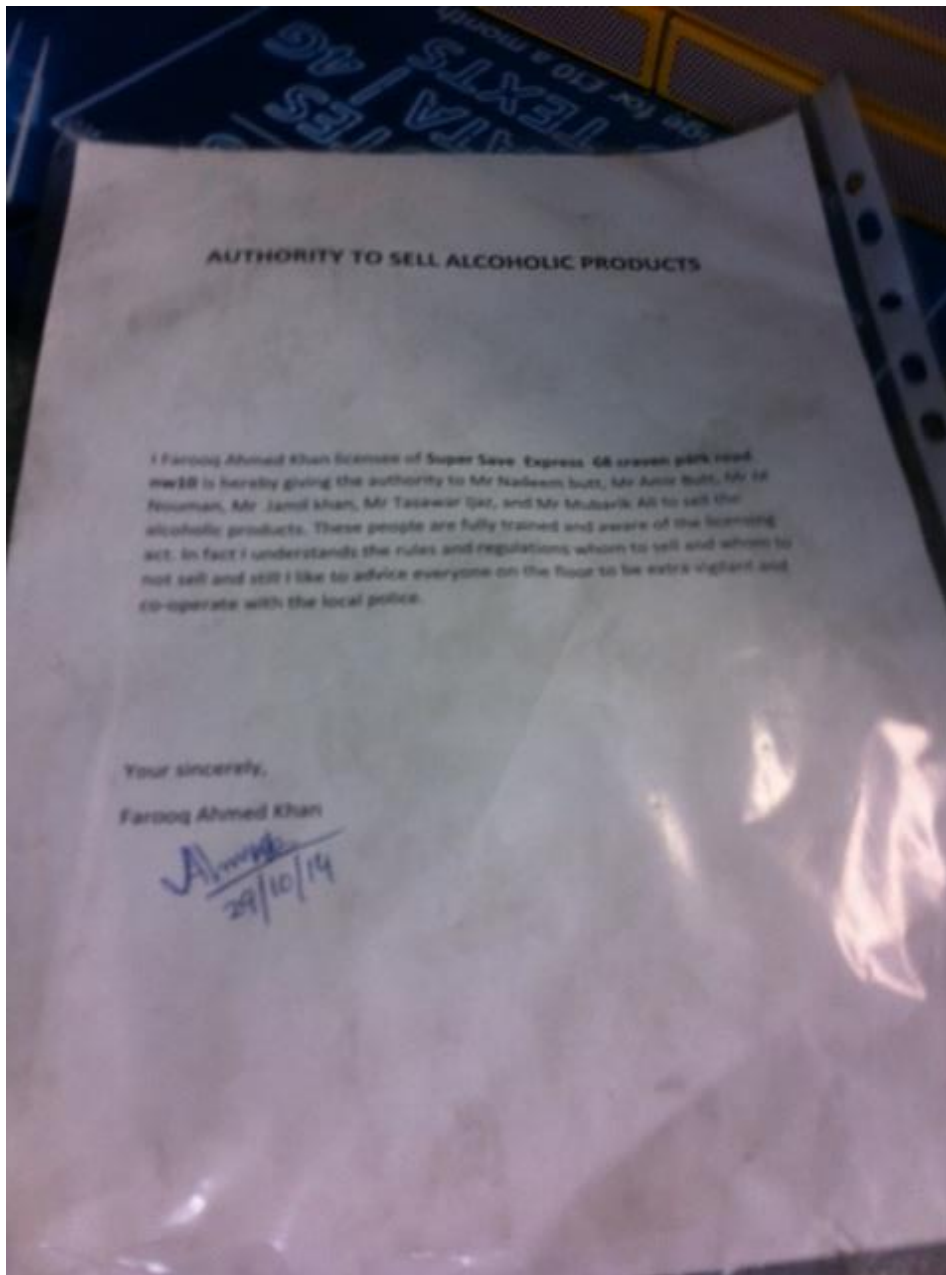

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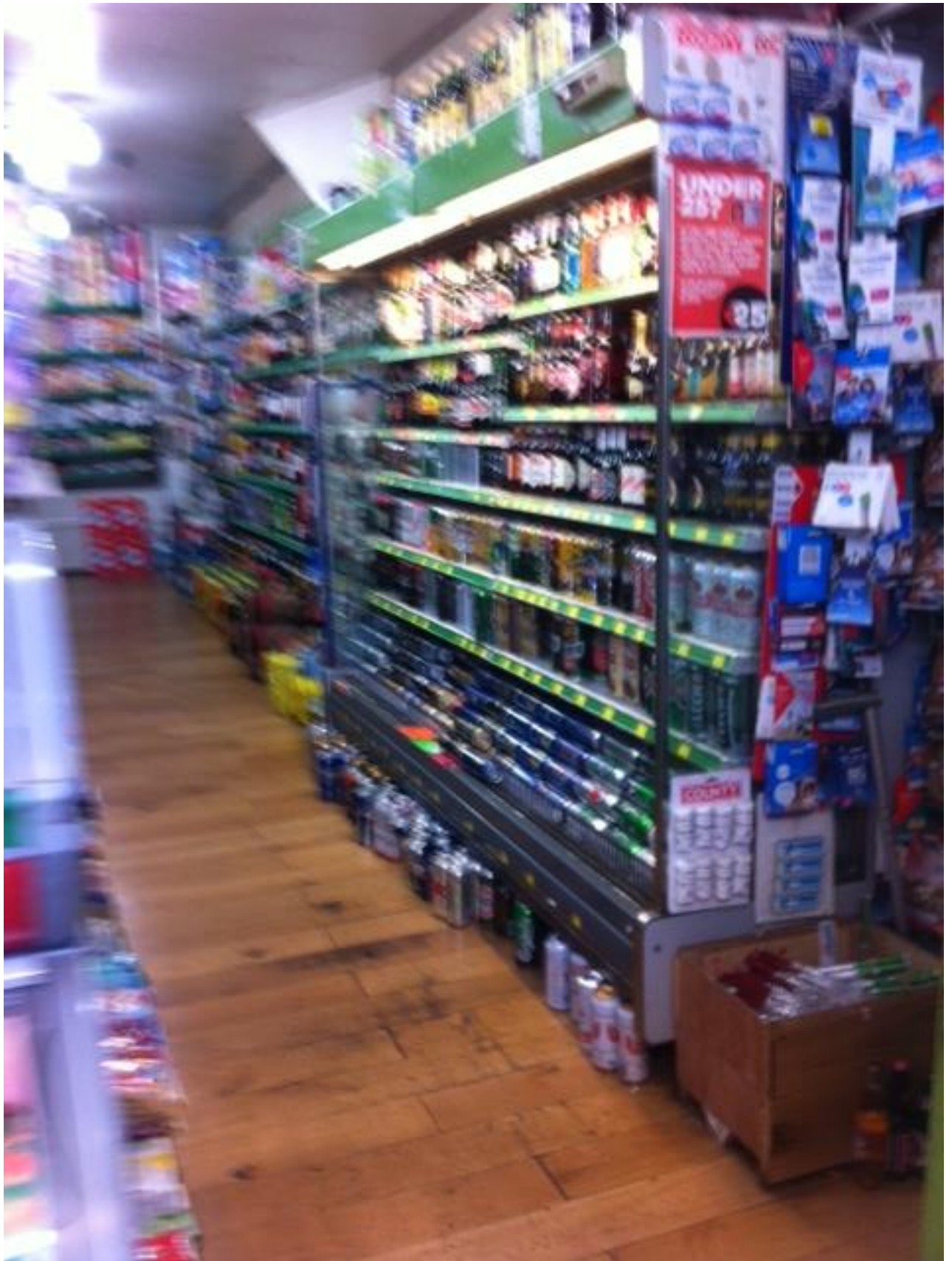

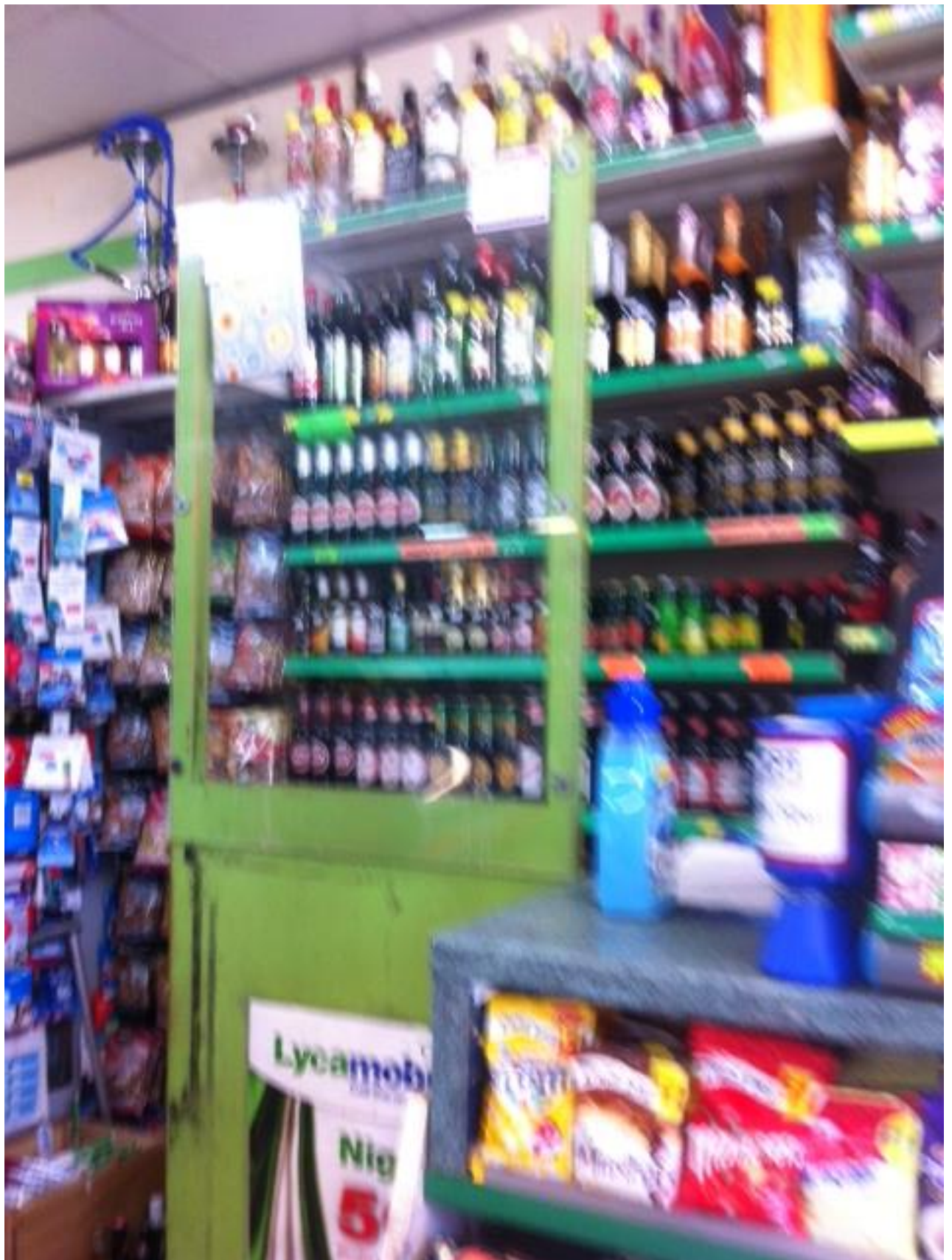

1. I can confirm the amount of calls made to Police about the premises; however I do not have data recording the individuals who have complained about the venue;

**Reports & Police contact within the last 6 months;**

The Local SNT are aware of ongoing ASB issues due to street drinkers and groups of males congregating outside the venue consuming alcohol being abusive and loud. Alcohol purchased from Supersave which is in the vicinity of the ongoing ASB issues.

22/04/2016 - Licence visit by PC Sullivan at 13.00hours - Breach of Licence identified.

05/05/2016 - Licence visit by PC Sullivan at 00.00 hours - Breach of Licence identified.

11/02/2016 - Crime Report - GBH with intent - Outside of the venue

11/02/2016 - CAD 905 - LAS called for Police assistance to O/S the venue. Person stabbed

09/02/2016 - Statement provided by PC 993QK -Relates to ongoing problem with beggars outside the address.

PC 993QK advised the staff at 'Supersave' NOT to sell alcohol to a male who was clearly intoxicated.

Issues identified;

The person who obtained the licence for 'Supersave' was not present and staff members were selling via the hatch in the wall.

Staff member Mr Ali complained to PC 933QK about issues with beggars harassing customers PC 933QK pointed out it was as a result of staff selling alcohol to the street drinkers, if the store stopped selling alcohol to them then the ASB problem would ease. PC 933QK stated that the 24hour licence has clearly contributed to the ASB issues in and around this venue.

Breaches in licence identified;

- Shop opening past their agreed times
- Allowing people into the shop when they should only be serving via the hatch in the wall
- Staff selling to intoxicated individuals who regularly congregate outside the store to purchase alcohol.
- Police have witnessed and required to deal with ASB issues and crimes linked to the venue
- Store has become a magnet for street drinkers who know they can obtain alcohol 24 hours a day; they congregate around the venue and cause nuisance to members of the public and residents.

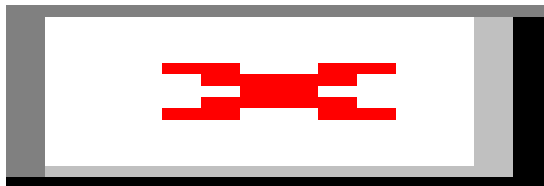

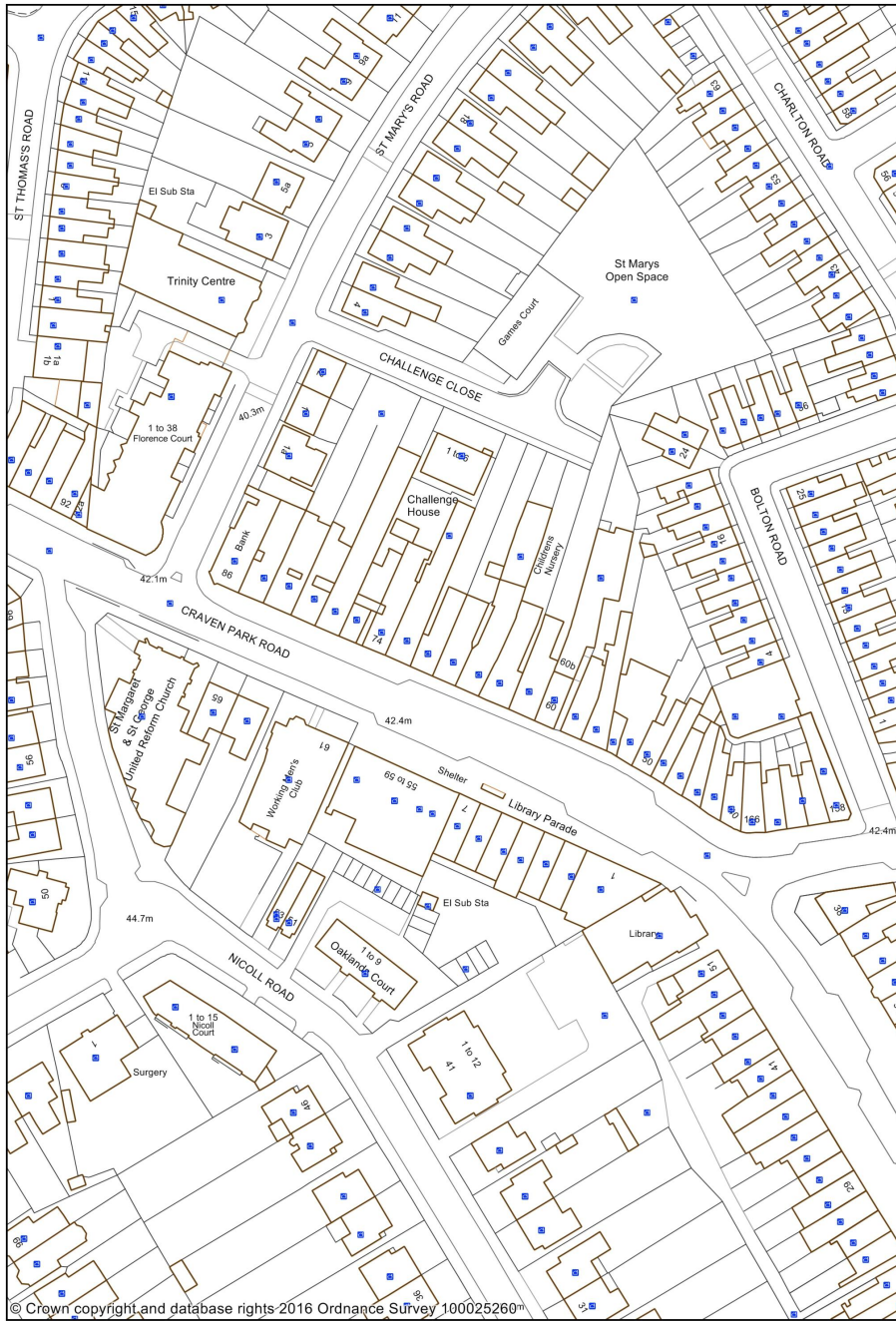

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# FACTSHEET

## A stepped approach to achieving compliance



### *Purpose:*

*To advise businesses and regulators of a stepped approach to achieving compliance in licensed premises*

- ➔ A stepped approach to enforcement is used to secure business compliance and bring about (where necessary) a change of behaviour towards licensing law, regulations and conditions.
- ➔ Regulators should adopt the principles of better regulation and take a stepped approach to securing compliance in a way which is:
  - *Proportionate*
  - *Accountable*
  - *Consistent; and*
  - *Transparent*
- ➔ **Transparent:**
  - *Advise licensed premises operators that inspections will be carried out. This does not mean informing them when you will be inspecting their premises.*
  - *Ensure that licence holders know what you expect from them, and what you will be looking for when inspecting the premises, and the results of your inspections.*
- ➔ **Consistent:**
  - *Be clear about the outcomes you are working towards, and how your activities will contribute to those outcomes.*
  - *Ensure that inspections are undertaken in a consistent manner, and that breaches or problems are addressed consistently from premises to premises depending on the nature and severity of the problem.*
  - *Work collaboratively with other agencies undertaking inspections to ensure greater consistency in your approaches.*
- ➔ **Accountable:**
  - *Consider risk rating premises to determine the need and frequency of premises inspections, and make your risk rating methodology publically available, while reserving the right to inspect premises in response to information or intelligence which gives sufficient cause for concern to warrant reactive action.*
  - *A risk rating of premises should show that premises which are well run and low risk will be self regulated unless issues arise.*

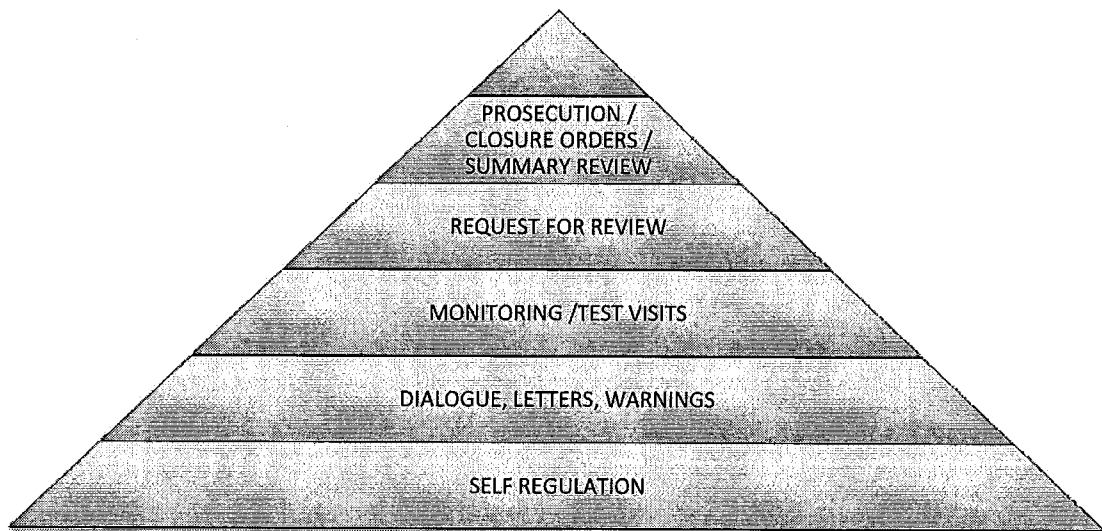


# FACTSHEET

## A stepped approach to achieving compliance



- ➔ In many cases, licensing authorities and responsible authorities initially become aware of a potential issue through a complaint by a member of the public, or a concern raised by other regulators about possible breaches of the licence conditions.
- ➔ The authority should make a judgement based on the seriousness of the situation and respond accordingly using the minimum interference necessary to address the problem. For example, this might include dialogue with the licence holder, mediation between applicants / licence holders and residents, or a warning about future conduct of the premises.



- ➔ In more serious cases, an investigation will be necessary and this may include inspections or test purchase operations.
- ➔ In some cases the circumstances will be more serious and mediation or dialogue will not be sufficient or appropriate. In such cases, a responsible authority can request a review of the premises licence. In some cases the police can consider the use of closure powers or expedited reviews, and environmental health (under delegation from the local authority chief executive where the problem concerns noise nuisance) and trading standards have closure powers in certain circumstances. Relevant authorities can also prosecute the licence holder for offences under the Act.
- ➔ In all cases where possible the responsible authority or the licensing authority should seek to achieve compliance or resolution through mediation and informal agreement before embarking on the more formal enforcement routes.

I, Alan Aylott of Crescent House, 51 High Street, Billericay, Essex, CM12 9AX, will say as follows:

1. I am employed as a Trainee Solicitor at Dadds LLP Licensing Solicitors.
2. I am a retired Police Officer with over 20 years' experience; some of this time as Operations Manager in an East London police station with particular responsibility for Licensing. I was also regularly involved with Pubwatch and engaged in teaching licensing law; accredited with the British Institute of Innkeepers. I have been actively engaged in licensing matters since 1997.
3. Around 10.30am on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> May 2016, I went to Supersave, 68 Craven Park Road, NW10 4AE in order to conduct a site visit, ensure suitable training measures were in place for the staff and to meet with PC Mike Sullivan from Brent Licensing police.
4. I was met by Mr Farooq Khan, one of the Premises Licence holders. He is also the designated premises supervisor (DPS).
5. I was shown to an office at the rear of the shop where I met some more persons who were introduced to me as staff. These men were Mohammad

Yasir; Muqarrab Khan; Mubarik Ali and Shahbaz Azam. I produced a folder for Mr Khan and his staff which included a training manual and training record sheets together with a number of posters. A copy of the documents contained in the folder is exhibited as **exhibit ARA/1**.

6. I then went through the training manual with all those present ensuring they were conversant with the contents and fully aware of their obligations and responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. I completed their personal training records and they signed to confirm that training had taken place. I also ensured they signed to acknowledge their understanding of the '10 golden rules'.
7. I saw their details were entered upon a form, signed by them and by Mr Khan, to authorise them to carry out licensable activities on Mr Khan's behalf; a DPS authority.
8. I explained what minor points to look for in respect of identifying possible counterfeit alcohol (e.g. quality of the labelling, appearance, quantity in the bottle) and then showed them how the UK duty stamp on a spirit bottle would fluoresce under a UV (black) light.
9. During this time, Esther Chan from Brent Licensing attended to deliver a letter in respect of the upcoming review. She left the letter and signed the Visitors' Register.
10. Around 12.10pm, PC Sullivan attended the shop and I had a discussion with him.
11. I left the store around 2.30pm.
12. I believe that the facts stated in this witness statement are true.

## IMPORTANT INSTRUCTION

### THE TEN GOLDEN RULES

1. (a) Young persons under the age of 18 must not be permitted to buy alcoholic drinks. (Our Company Policy is that anyone appearing to be under 25 must prove that they are 18 or over, by providing acceptable proof of age ID)  
(b) Young persons under 18 must not be permitted to sell alcohol without direct supervision by a senior member of staff, who must be over 18.
2. Persons who are under the influence of drink must not be sold alcoholic drinks.
3. A Police Officer in uniform must not be sold alcoholic drinks.
4. You must not allow people to drink on or outside the premises.
5. You must ensure that the “Challenge 25” prohibitive sign and the Trading Hours are prominently displayed.
6. Be very aware of persons over 18 who try to buy for under 18’s. Refuse the sale and record in the refusal book.
7. Be vigilant, constant supervision of the drinks area is not only necessary to deter pilferage, but to prevent under 18’s trying to select alcohol.
8. Before each transaction identify the customer. If in doubt ask for proof of age.  
For this you can accept:-
  - a) a Recognised proof of age card with the PASS logo which include the Bite, Portman Group, Citizen, Connexions, Validate, Young Scot etc. identity cards, showing photo, date of birth and signature.
  - c) a Current Passport
  - d) the new style Driving Licence with photo

### THE OLD STYLE DRIVING LICENCE WITHOUT A PHOTO IS NOT ACCEPTABLE

#### **THE MAXIM YOU MUST FOLLOW IS:-**

9. If in doubt do not make the sale. You have the right of refusal which will be backed up by the Manager and the Company. If a refusal is actioned, record the details in the refusal book e.g. male/female, date, time, reason – underage, drunk abusive.
10. Be aware of the licensing hours and ensure that the blinds are down or tensor barriers in place to prevent access to alcohol displays outside of permitted alcohol trading hours and that no sale takes place outside these hours.

# Unit 1:

## Unlawful Sales

### 1.1 Authorising alcohol sales

#### 1.1.1 Licences

The retail sale of alcohol is only lawful if it is licensed. In England and Wales we have a dual licensing system. A building from which alcohol is sold must have a *premises licence* that states that the retail sale of alcohol is a licensable activity to be conducted on those premises. It makes no difference whether the premises are for 'on-sales' or 'off-sales'. Sales of alcohol from a building with a premises licence are lawful only if they are authorised by the holder of a *personal licence*.

#### 1.1.2 Authorising bar and counter staff to make alcohol sales

Under the Licensing Act 2003 all sales of alcohol from a building with a premises licence must either be made or be authorised by a personal licence holder. There may be any number of personal licence holders working in a premises but only one Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). The DPS will be the person in day-to-day control of the premises and all other personal licence holders working on the premises will be working under his or her control.

- As bar or counter staff, if the premises in which you work sells alcohol, even if alcohol sales are a very small part of the sales mix, you must have the authorisation of a personal licence holder for any alcohol sales you make to be lawful.
- You must therefore make sure you personally are authorised by a personal licence holder to make sales of alcohol – particularly in circumstances where a personal licence holder may not be on the premises all the time it is open for the sale of alcohol.
- A member of staff under the age of 18 may sell or supply alcohol only if each sale or supply is specially approved by the premises licence holder, the DPS or another person over the age of 18 authorised to give such approval by the premises licence holder or DPS.
- Staff members under 18 are not committing an offence if they sell or deliver alcohol for consumption with a table meal. Typically this would include someone working as a waiter or waitress.

## **1.2 The four licensing objectives**

The licensing Act 2003 is underpinned by some basic principles known as the 'licensing objectives'. There are four of these and they are:

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder**
- 2. Public safety**
- 3. The prevention of public nuisance**
- 4. The protection of children from harm**

The licensing objectives are all of equal importance and the promotion of these objectives is the main purpose of the licensing Act 2003. In addition, if licensed premises are operated in such a way as to undermine any of these objectives, then the police or trading standards officers could apply to the licensing authority to review the premises licence. Making underage sales of alcohol, or selling alcohol to drunks, could certainly undermine the protection of children from harm objective and possibly any or all of the other three objectives – because drunkenness and underage drinking fuel crime and disorder.

It is therefore very important that sales staff refuse service to underage drinkers and to drunks.

## **1.3 The law relating to underage sales and servicing drunks**

### **1.3.1 Sale of alcohol to children**

It is illegal for:

- Sales staff to sell or supply alcohol to anyone under 18. It is also an offence to knowingly allow the sale of alcohol to someone under 18. This applies not just to premises or personal licence holders but to bar and counter staff as well – because they have the capacity to prevent the sale.
- Anyone under 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol
- Anyone over 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol on behalf of someone under the age of 18

- Children under 18 to consume alcohol in licensed premises, or for a member of staff to allow them to do so
- Unaccompanied children, under the age of 16, to enter licensed premises where alcohol is sold for consumption on the premises, e.g. pubs, clubs and bars
- Unaccompanied children under 16 to be on premises licensed to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises between midnight and 5.00 a.m., when those premises are open, e.g. nightclubs and late-night bars

If a member of the sales staff sells alcohol to someone under the age of 18 they commit an offence. If a member of staff, or anyone else in a position to prevent such sales, knowingly allows the sale, delivery or consumption of alcohol to under – 18s, or to someone over 18 attempting to purchase alcohol for them, then likewise, they are committing an offence and can be prosecuted.

### **1.3.2 Exceptions to laws in relation to selling alcohol to underage children**

It is *not* illegal for:

- A 16 or 17 year old to consume beer, wine or cider with a table meal, provide that an adult buys it for them and accompanies them at the meal
- A child under 18 to carry out a test purchase of alcohol when supervised by police or trading standards officers for the purposes of enforcing the laws on underage drinking.

### **1.3.3 Sale of alcohol and drunks**

It is illegal for sales staff to:

- Sell alcohol to a person who is drunk
- Sell alcohol to someone in the company of a drunk who is buying the alcohol for consumption by the drunken person
- Knowingly allow alcohol to be sold to someone who is drunk

## **1.4 The law relating to other age-restricted products**

### **1.4.1 Supply (sale or hire) of specific products to person under certain ages**

In addition to restricting the sale of alcohol, the law prohibits the supply (sale or hire) of a range of other products to persons under certain ages. Some of these products may be sold in premises that also sell alcohol, some may not.

### **1.4.2 Products that may be supplied only to persons aged 18 and over**

1. Tobacco products
2. 'Adult' fireworks
2. DVDs, videos, video games: classification 18
3. Volatile substances and solvent-based products – if it is believed that they may be inhaled for the purposes of becoming intoxicated
4. Lighter fuel containing butane
5. Crossbows
6. Airguns and pellets
7. Petrol
8. Offensive weapons / knives
9. Caps, cracker snaps, novelty matches, party poppers, serpents and throw downs
10. Aerosol paint

### **1.4.3 Products that may be supplied only to persons aged 16 and over** Lottery tickets and the instant win cards

### **1.4.4 Products that may be supplied only to persons aged 15 and over**

1. DVDs, videos, video and computer games: classification 15

### **1.4.5 Products that may be supplied only to persons aged 12 and over**

1. DVDs, videos, video and computer games: classification 12

#### 1.4.6 Further information on selling offensive weapons and knives

‘Offensive weapons and knives’ include:

- Any knife, knife blade or razor blade
- Any axe
- Any other article that has a blade or sharp point, and that is made or adapted for the purpose of causing personal injury

Examples of knives that it would be an offence for sales staff to sell to persons under the age of 16 would include:

- Combat knives, such as sheath knives or bladed martial arts weapons
- Kitchen knives
- Craft knives

**NB: the minimum age for buying knives is 18 years.**

It is *not* an offence to sell the following products to persons under 16:

- Folding pocket knives if the cutting edge of the knife is less than 3 inches or 7.62cm
- Replacement cartridges for the safety razors provided less than 2mm of the blade is exposed.

#### 1.4.7 Further information on selling or hiring recordings

Below is a table showing the age classification in respect of the sale or supply of recordings:

## **Exemptions**

Works in categories that are solely designed to inform, educate or instruct or other works that concern only sport, religion or music and comprise only video game are exempt from classification – provided they do not contain scenes of a violent or sexual nature. Some producers of videos and DVDs label exempt products with an ‘E’, but this is not a legal requirement.

## **Unit 2: Preventing Unlawful Sales**

### **2.1 Refusing service to persons intoxicated by alcohol**

#### **2.1.1 Recognising the signs of drunkenness**

Sales staff have a duty not to serve alcohol to drunks. The early signs of intoxication may be difficult to spot (Level 1 and 2), but the later stages of intoxication can be obvious (Level 3 and 4), and the staff members need to be able to recognise the signs that drinkers may have reached these levels of intoxication.

Signs of drunkenness include:

- Slurred speech
- Speaking too loud
- Speaking too fast
- Loss of physical co-ordination
- Knocking things over / bumping into furniture
- Staggering, weaving or falling over
- Glazed eyes and / or small pupils
- Heavy sweating
- Vomiting
- Slow or irregular breathing
- Sleepiness or unconsciousness



## 2.2 Refusing service of alcohol to underage persons

### 2.2.1 Proof of age

Acceptable identification and proof of age include:

- Passport
- Photo driving licence
- Recognised proof age card incorporating the PASS logo
- 

Cards incorporating the PASS (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) logo include:

- Citizen Card 16/17



- Connexions card



- Portman Group card



- Validate UK card



- Young Scot card



Any card incorporating the PASS logo should be accepted as a valid photo- ID and proof of age.

Any card incorporating the PASS logo should be accepted as a valid photo- ID and proof of age.

## 2.3 Refusing service of other age-restricted products

### 2.3.1 Knowing the product range and further information

**Alcohol** is the most well known age-restricted product and virtually everyone knows that a customer must be at least 18 years old to buy it. Many people do not know the full range of other products that are age-restricted, or, if they do, what the minimum age for purchasing a product might be. It may well be that underage customers for age-restricted products other than alcohol are attempting to buy without any deliberate intention of breaking the law.

**Volatile substance and solvent-based products** - These products are age-restricted because of the danger of solvent abuse. Solvent abuse is the inhaling of fumes given off by a wide range of solvent based products. The supply of such products is controlled by two pieces of legislation:

- **The Cigarette Lighter Refill (Safety) Regulation 1999** – makes it an offence to supply or offer to supply any cigarette lighter refill canister containing butane or a substance containing butane as a constituent to any person under 18.
- **The Intoxicating Substances (Supply) Act 1985** - makes it an offence to supply or offer to supply an intoxicating substance to a person you know, or have reasonable cause to believe is under 18, if you know or have reasonable cause to believe that person is going to use the substance in order to get intoxicated. An offence is also committed if you supply or offer to supply an intoxicating substance to someone you know or have reasonable cause to believe is purchasing the substance on behalf of someone who will use it to get intoxicated. This is sometimes called a ‘proxy purchase’.

‘Intoxicating substances’ that are sometimes abused include:

- Solvent based glue
- Dry cleaning fluid
- Correction fluid and thinner
- Marker pens
- Aerosols (e.g. air freshener, hair spray, deodorant)
- ‘Cold Start’ and Antifreeze
- Nail varnish and varnish remover

### **How sales staff can recognise an abuser:**

If you think someone is a solvent abuser you should not serve them.

Signs of abuse include:

- Slurred speech and behaviour
- Spots and sores around the mouth
- The smell of glue or solvents on the person's clothes

### **Your suspicions should be aroused if someone:**

- Is a frequent buyer of solvents
- Buys large quantities
- Purchases solvents and plastic bags at the same time

### **Petrol sales**

The minimum age that must have been reached to manage a petrol station is 18 years. To dispense petrol, as an employee of a petrol station, the minimum age is 16 years. A person under 16 who is not an employee of a petrol station may purchase petrol and it is not illegal for them to dispense it. However, the Health and Safety Executive guidance is that they must be closely supervised by an adult if they do. Allowing an employee under 16 to dispense petrol carries a maximum fine of £5000.



**IMPORTANT INSTRUCTION - THE LAWS AND REGULATIONS COVERING  
THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC DRINKS**

**THE TEN GOLDEN RULES**

- 1(a) Any person who you believe looks under the age of 25 **must** produce identification to prove that they are over 18 years of age. See Rule 8.
- 1(b) Young persons under 18 must not be permitted to sell alcohol without direct supervision by a senior member of staff who must be over 18.
2. Persons who are under the influence of drink **must not** be sold alcoholic drinks.
3. A Police Officer in uniform **must not** be sold alcoholic drinks.
4. You **must not** allow people to drink on or outside the premises.
5. You must ensure that the 25 year old prohibitive sign and the trading hours are prominently displayed.
6. Be very aware of persons over 18 who try to buy for under 18's (proxy sales) and refuse such sales. Record such incidents in the refusal book.
7. Be vigilant: constant supervision of the drinks area is not only necessary to deter pilferage, but to prevent under 18's trying to select alcohol.
8. **Before each transaction identify the customer. If in doubt, ask for proof of age.**  
**For this you can accept:-**
  - a) a Recognised proof of age card with the PASS logo which include the Bite, Portman Group, Citizen, Connexions, Validate, Young Scot etc. identity cards, showing photo, date of birth and signature;
  - c) a Current Passport; or
  - d) the new style Driving Licence with photo.

**THE OLD STYLE DRIVING LICENCE WITHOUT A PHOTO IS NOT ACCEPTABLE**

**THE MAXIM YOU MUST FOLLOW IS:-**

- 9. **If in doubt do not make the sale.** You have the right of refusal which will be backed up by the Manager and the Company. If a refusal is actioned, record the details in the refusal book e.g. male/female, date, time, reason – underage, drunk, abusive etc.
- 10. Be aware of the licensing hours and ensure that the blinds are down or tensor barriers in place to prevent access to alcohol displays outside of permitted alcohol trading hours and that no sale takes place outside these hours.

## PROPOSED Schedule of conditions for Supersave

1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the areas outside the premises are monitored regularly to ensure that any persons loitering outside the premises disperse quickly and do not congregate.
2. The premises licence holder shall ensure that no alcohol purchased from the premises is consumed in the near vicinity.
3. The premises licence holder shall ensure that reasonable and adequate staff training shall be carried out and properly documented in relation to:
  - (i) dealing with incidents and the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - (ii) the premises duty of care;
  - (iii) the responsible sale of alcohol (i.e. how to refuse a sale, preventing sales to underage persons or persons over 18 purchasing for underage persons, recognising signs of drunkenness) prior to being allowed to sell alcohol; and
  - (iv) that within six weeks of any appointment of a member of staff, as a salesperson, they receive adequate training to Responsible Alcohol Retailing standards or equivalent.
  - (v) Hours and conditions of the premises licence.
4. The premises licence holder shall ensure that refresher training shall be completed every six months for all relevant staff.
5. The premises licence holder shall ensure that documented records of training completed shall be kept for each member of staff so trained and records shall be retained for no less than 12 months and made available for inspection to police and authorised officers of Brent Council upon request.
6. The premises licence holder shall operate a 'Challenge 25' scheme at the premises whereby anyone who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide proof of age that he or she is over 18. Proof of age shall only comprise of a passport, a photo-card driving licence or an industry approved proof of age identity card.
7. The premises licence holder shall ensure that notices shall be displayed in the premises, advising;
  - CCTV is in operation
  - a 'Challenge 25' scheme operates in the premises
  - 'No proof of age – no Sale'
  - Patrons should respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly
  - The hours' licensable activities may take place
8. The premises licence holder shall ensure that high strength beers/lagers/ciders (over 6.5%) will not be displayed on the shop floor. An agreed list of premium beers/lagers/ciders over 6.5% will be kept behind the servery/counter. Spirits, champagne and high value alcoholic goods will also be displayed behind the counter.



9. The premises licence holder shall ensure that miniature bottles of spirits, 5cl or less, will not be sold.
10. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any persons highlighted by the police as a 'street drinker' and any person who is known as or appears to be a 'street drinker', shall not be sold alcohol.
11. The premises licence holder shall ensure that a 'drop-top' safe or other security product is installed in a covert position in order that excess cash is removed periodically from the till.
12. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any refusals of sale of age-related products are recorded in a refusals log. The log should show:
  - (i) the date and time of the refusal;
  - (ii) the product(s) attempted to be purchased;
  - (iii) a description of the customer; and
  - (iv) the name and signature of the staff member who made the refusal.
13. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the refusals log shall be checked and signed monthly by the designated premises supervisor or premises licence holder. The refusals log shall be made available for inspection upon reasonable request to police or a local authority officer.

**Additional conditions from Esther Chan** (Licensing Inspector, Planning, Transportation & Licensing-Brent Council)

14. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the designated premises supervisor (DPS) shall attend a formal training course on - avoiding under-age sales/responsible alcohol sales, such as the National Certificate for DPS or the BIIAB Award for Responsible Retailing; to provide evidence of attendance if requested.
15. The premises licence holder shall ensure that an incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received
  - (d) any incidents of disorder
  - (e) any faults in the CCTV system
  - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

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# FACTSHEET

## A stepped approach to achieving compliance



### *Purpose:*

*To advise businesses and regulators of a stepped approach to achieving compliance in licensed premises*

- ➔ A stepped approach to enforcement is used to secure business compliance and bring about (where necessary) a change of behaviour towards licensing law, regulations and conditions.
- ➔ Regulators should adopt the principles of better regulation and take a stepped approach to securing compliance in a way which is:
  - *Proportionate*
  - *Accountable*
  - *Consistent; and*
  - *Transparent*
- ➔ **Transparent:**
  - *Advise licensed premises operators that inspections will be carried out. This does not mean informing them when you will be inspecting their premises.*
  - *Ensure that licence holders know what you expect from them, and what you will be looking for when inspecting the premises, and the results of your inspections.*
- ➔ **Consistent:**
  - *Be clear about the outcomes you are working towards, and how your activities will contribute to those outcomes.*
  - *Ensure that inspections are undertaken in a consistent manner, and that breaches or problems are addressed consistently from premises to premises depending on the nature and severity of the problem.*
  - *Work collaboratively with other agencies undertaking inspections to ensure greater consistency in your approaches.*
- ➔ **Accountable:**
  - *Consider risk rating premises to determine the need and frequency of premises inspections, and make your risk rating methodology publically available, while reserving the right to inspect premises in response to information or intelligence which gives sufficient cause for concern to warrant reactive action.*
  - *A risk rating of premises should show that premises which are well run and low risk will be self regulated unless issues arise.*

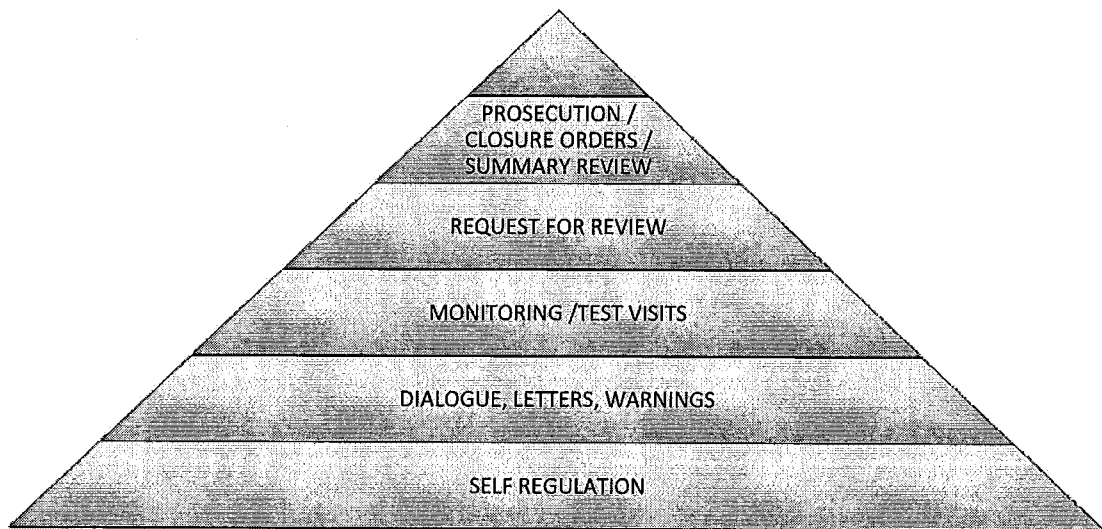


# FACTSHEET

## A stepped approach to achieving compliance



- ➔ In many cases, licensing authorities and responsible authorities initially become aware of a potential issue through a complaint by a member of the public, or a concern raised by other regulators about possible breaches of the licence conditions.
- ➔ The authority should make a judgement based on the seriousness of the situation and respond accordingly using the minimum interference necessary to address the problem. For example, this might include dialogue with the licence holder, mediation between applicants / licence holders and residents, or a warning about future conduct of the premises.



- ➔ In more serious cases, an investigation will be necessary and this may include inspections or test purchase operations.
- ➔ In some cases the circumstances will be more serious and mediation or dialogue will not be sufficient or appropriate. In such cases, a responsible authority can request a review of the premises licence. In some cases the police can consider the use of closure powers or expedited reviews, and environmental health (under delegation from the local authority chief executive where the problem concerns noise nuisance) and trading standards have closure powers in certain circumstances. Relevant authorities can also prosecute the licence holder for offences under the Act.
- ➔ In all cases where possible the responsible authority or the licensing authority should seek to achieve compliance or resolution through mediation and informal agreement before embarking on the more formal enforcement routes.

## PARTNERSHIPS

Licensees and Managers have responsibility for the effective and safe management of their premises. However, you are not expected to deal with all the problems alone. Licensees, management, door supervisors, police and local authorities all have a collective responsibility to work together to address these issues. Police and local authorities can provide expert advice and guidance on licence regulations, as well as giving training to staff on subjects such as drugs awareness and legal responsibilities. Industry groups such as the British Institute of Innkeepers (BI) and the Portman Group can provide training and assistance. There is a full list in appendix D.

It is vital that all parties have the confidence to communicate openly and honestly with each other. It is only by doing this that we will achieve our shared aim of providing a safe environment for everyone who visits London's licensed venues. The policy of the Metropolitan Police is to work for compliance. Only when this has failed, or due to the circumstances is bound to fail, that we resort to legal action. Proper management of the door, such as effective search policies will lead to drug and weapon seizures. Licensees should be reassured that this will be viewed by the police as apposite statement by the club of their commitment to run their club safely. They will not be stigmatised or penalised by regularly handing in confiscated drugs.

Licensees should also look to share information with others within the industry. Regular meetings, local radio networks and schemes such as pub and club watch are often available to pass on information about trouble makers and common problems locally.

## PROMOTIONS

Music promotions / events can sometimes cause particular problems for a venue. A larger than usual crowd or the followers of a particular promotion or two rival gangs may require a venue to make special arrangements. For example by providing a more robust door team, ensuring stringent searching policy, the use of search arches and wands, electronic identification document scanning equipment. It is important that venues thoroughly research any new promotion or event to ensure both the venue and their security measures are adequate.

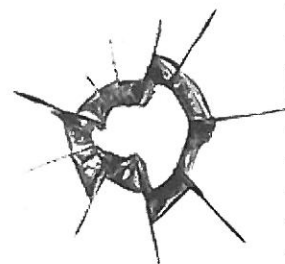

## RISK ASSESSMENTS

The Health & Safety at Work Regulations 1999 require all activity that will affect staff or customers to be subject of a risk assessment by the premises owners or management. The Metropolitan Police have designed specific risk assessments for music promotions and events within licensed premises. These risk assessment forms are being used by nightclubs and other licensed premises across the MPS. There are two risk assessment forms, Form 696 which should be completed by the DPS prior to any event and Form 686A, which is a reflective document and should be completed after any event. This reflective document allows both the venue and the police to learn from the experience and find ways to be even better for the next event. These comprehensive forms asked for full details of promoters, venue hirers, artists playing / performing, past events and security measures for the event allowing police to accurately assess the event. Both forms once complete should be sent to your local Police Licensing Unit. The prevent risk assessment should be completed and with police a minimum of 14 days in advance of any promotion or event. This initiative has made a substantial impact in reducing violent crime within licensed premises since its launch MPS wide in October 2005.

For the first time Police working together with the licensing industry are able to be fully sighted on licensed premises events on their Borough's. In turn Police are able to share open source information with licensees on promotions and events allowing licensees to make fully informed decisions about events at their premises.

This initiative is an excellent example of partnership working to make your venue safer.

I am a Police Constable of nearly 12 years experience, all of which I have worked on the London Borough of Brent, I am currently attached to the licensing unit for the Borough, I have been authorised via a delegated authority to represent the Borough Commander of the London Borough of Brent and for the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police Service to act on Licensing matters. Supersave 68 Craven Park Road, Harlesden NW10 4AE is a convenience store which has a 24 hour licence to sell alcohol.

On the 22nd April 2016 a review application made by the Metropolitan Police was submitted to Brent Council in relation to this premise after numerous breaches were found to its current licence conditions. Prior to the review being submitted a stepped approach with the premise took place in line with the Home Office Guidance.

On the 09/02/2016 PC Shippey is called to the area after calls to police from a vulnerable male, PC Shippey identifies that the male is drunk and is still being sold alcohol; PC Shippey speaks to members of staff and advises them of the offences of selling to drunks.

11/02/2016 police are called to a stabbing of a male outside the shop, on the 12/02/2016 I attended the shop and spoke to the staff on duty, advise was given to staff regarding the sale of alcohol to drunk people and with regards to the CCTV working correctly, as none were able to work, I asked to speak with the Premises Licence holder and Designated Premise Supervisor, staff attempted to call them on the phone but they were unable to contact either , I left a message for them to contact me regarding the issues found.

05/03/2016 two members of staff were witnessed by police selling alcohol to drunken males; both males admitted the offence of selling alcohol to drunks and were later issued with a £90 Fixed Penalty Notice. Both stated to police that they feared for their safety whilst working in the shop and did not feel confident to speak with the owner about their fears as they were worried about losing their jobs. It later became apparent that one of these males is actually named, as one of the Premises Licence Holders.

I contacted the owner, who is shown on the licence as one of the Premises Licence Holders, and as the Designated Premise Supervisor Mr Farooq Khan, and explained to him that there were a number of issues being highlighted within his shop, it was explained to him that officers had witnessed staff selling to a drunk male on the 09/02/2016 after being warned not to sell to the male, and that again another two members of staff had sold to several drunk males and had been issued with £90 PND's

He stated that he was aware of these issues and was dealing with the training issues, it was also brought to his attention that the shop was staying open past 23;00 hours when the premise should be closed to the public, he again said that he was aware of this but stayed open past 23:00 hours as it was a busy time for the shop, it was explained to him that this was unacceptable and a breach of his licence conditions. He seemed unfazed by this and again repeated his earlier comment of this is a busy time for the shop, he eventually agreed that the shop would start to close at 23:00 hours. We also discussed the problem with people standing outside the front of the shop drinking alcohol, and he was advised to ask staff to be proactive in moving them on.

02/04/2016 police conducted a test purchase on the shop with a 17 year old cadet, the shop failed and sold alcohol to the child.

A meeting was arranged for the 07/04/2016 between police Mr Khan and his agent Mrs Sylvester, during the meeting police outlined there concerns around street drinkers, the failed test purchase, late night opening of the shop, the sale of alcohol to drunks and staff fears, Mr Khan denied the shop sold to drunks and tried to blame other local shops for causing the problems.

Police suggested numerous conditions be adopted that would assist the shop in running better and within line with the Licensing objectives, Mr Khan and his agent said they would go away and discuss the conditions and consider putting in a minor variation for the conditions to be added.

I later received an e-mail from the agent outlining the conditions her client was prepared to accept, this fell short of what I believed would be acceptable for the shop to meet the licensing objectives.

The above shows that there were numerous telephone conversations where police have raised concerns and asked Mr Khan to address the issues, and a meeting to discuss and try and reach an agreement with him and his agent to deal with the breaches identified.

Unfortunately no actions were made by the shop to the recommend improvements suggested by police, and it was decided that a review of the shops Premise Licence was necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

This decision was further justified when the shop was found on two occasions to be breaching one of its licence conditions by not having a personal Licence holder present on the premises to supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

The first breach was discovered by 19/04/2016 Miss Esther Chan conducted a visit at the premises and found that none of the staff in the shop held a personal Licence.

Again on the 22/04/2016 only a few days later I visit the shop only to find that yet again there is no Personal Licence holder present, I spoke to Mr Farooq Khan on the phone and he said that he was aware of the earlier visit by Miss Chan, but disputed that the shop had breached its licence condition on either occasion.


On the 11/06/2016 I viewed Brent Council CCTV cameras to observe anti social behaviour in Craven Park Road. I randomly reviewed footage from Camera number 2 on the 29/05/2016, which also covers the front of Supersave 68 Craven Park Road NW10.

From the footage I viewed on this date I have copied six files from different times during the night, where I identified breaches and Anti-Social Behaviour, all 6 files are from camera number 2. file 6 is dated 4/6/16.

File one starts at 04:25 Hours the camera is looking down Craven Park Road and the front of Supersave can be seen from a distance, during the footage which last approximately 22 minutes a group of people can be seen congregating outside the front of the premises, it is unclear to see if they are drinking as the camera is too far away and not zoomed in, but it clearly shows a group standing directly outside the shop near the night hatch, people are seen coming and going from the group.

The second file starts at 05:00 hours and again shows a group of people congregating outside of the front of the shop, this file last for approximately 4 minutes.

File number 3 starts at 05:36 hours, at 05:36:51 the camera zooms onto the front of the shop, there is a lot of empty alcohol cans and rubbish outside the front of the shop, at 05:39 hours a red BMW pulls up

outside the shop and a black male wearing a grey top gets out of the passengers side of the car and goes to the shops hatch, a small group are then seen approaching the hatch waiting to be served, the black male is part of this group.

At 05:43 hours a light skinned black male with long frizzy hair crosses the road and join the people outside the shop, he appears agitated and mingles within the group and appears to be unhappy, he then starts talking to the black male in the grey top and gets up in his face, he is waving his arms around and seems hostile, he then starts pulling and pushing the male, a second large black male gets out of the car and starts arguing with the male this leads to both males squaring up to each other and grabbing at each other people get involved and tried separating them, this continues for some time and numerous people get involved and there is a lot of pushing and shoving between the males, at one point the males are fighting and the light skinned males head is pushed into the shutter of the Supersave shop his head goes through the second hatch which has been cut out of the metal shutter, this disturbance continues and people are being pushed into the road where vehicles can be seen passing very nearby, the black male in the grey top then throws what looks like a handful of money (notes) into the air and people scramble to pick them up, the arguing continues before the males get back in their vehicle and drive off, the light skinned male then buys items from the hatch.

During this incident males inside the shop can be seen looking out watching the disturbance outside the shop but make no attempt to call police, I have checked the police CAD system and there are no calls to this incident.

File number 4 again shows the front of the shop the time is 06:22 hours at 06:23 hours the shutters at to the shop are raised and people start to enter the shop, the shop has a condition on its licence that reads 'The premises shall be closed to the public between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following morning and all sales during these times shall be via the window only' this clearly breaches this condition, and is only a short time after the above disturbance, the shop has previously ben warned about opening outside of the operating schedule condition, this was made clear to them by their solicitor Mr Aylott on a training day at the shop, he also advised them against having and using the second hatch which is not on the shops plans which have been submitted to the council and form part of the licence, they have clearly disregarded this advise about the hatch, and his and my warning about the opening times.

File number 5 starts at 07:09 hours and shows two black males getting out of a vehicle and one of the males goes into the shop at 07:15 hours, he come out shortly after and opens what appears to be can of beer and starts drinking it outside the shop, the pair hang around for a while drinking before getting back in the car and driving off.

File number 6 is dated the 04/06/2016 and again is camera number 2 it is focused on Craven Park Road and the front of Supersave is in the picture the footage starts at 04:13 hours, a car pulls up outside the shop and a group of black males get out and can be seen going to the serving hatch and purchasing items, the car door is open and the group start dancing to what I assume is music being played from the vehicle, this goes on for nearly 6 minutes before the car drives off.

I exhibit this CCTV as MJS/6

All the above is a clear indication that there has been little to no change in the running of the shop, it has been put forward by shops solicitor that certain operating methods can be implemented to discourage this type of Anti-Social Behaviour at the front of the premises, however this is clearly not having a successful result.

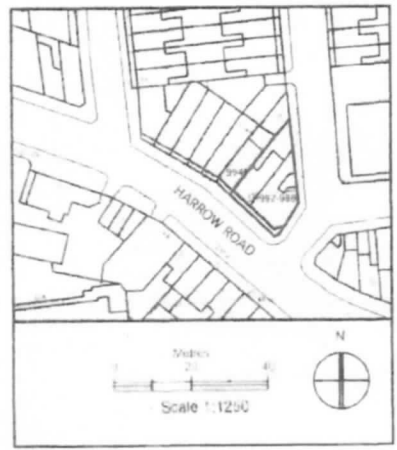
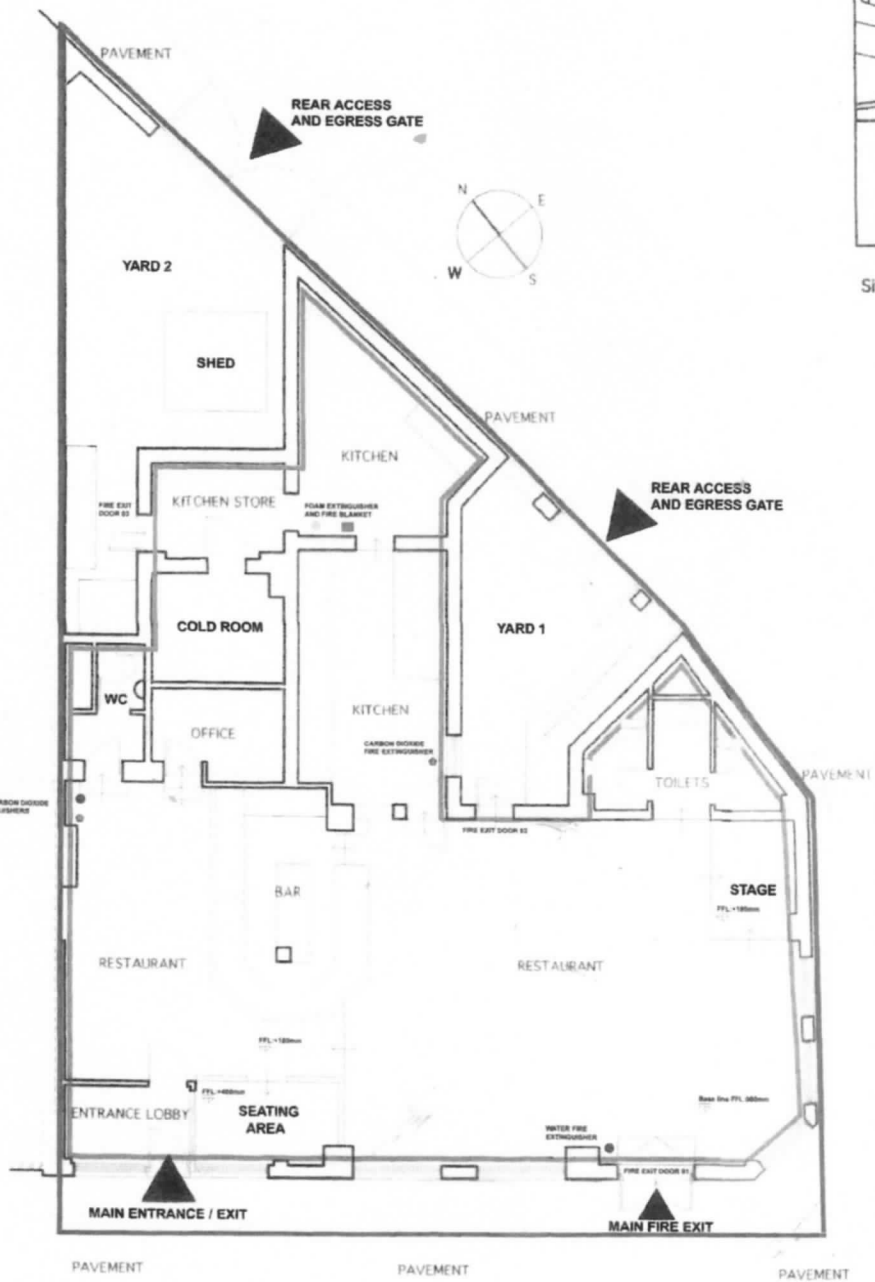

**I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Act 2003 Objectives for the reasons indicated below.**

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with crime and disorder, and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Police require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence.

### **Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)**

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated. Closed circuit television cameras and recorders of an agreed image standard will be installed at locations on the premises and in accordance with advice from the Police. All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public. Notices shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises, and in prominent positions throughout the premises, advising that CCTV is in operation.

### **Operating Hours to be displayed on Premises**

A notice displaying the opening hours, the type of licensing activity and licence conditions should be clearly displayed and visible to anyone outside the premises. This may be incorporated in the summary of the licence, which must be displayed, or take the form of a separate item. Likewise the name of the Designated Premises Supervisor (D.P.S.) should be similarly displayed. This will allow the Police and other responsible authorities to readily identify the licence details. Clearly displayed opening hours will also reduce any confusion for customers prior to entering the premises and possible conflict when the premises close/stop selling alcohol.

### **Door Supervisors**

Mr. Ferreira has informed me that the venue will be open until 1.30am on Friday and Saturday. Last orders for food will be at 11pm and then they are open for passing trade to come inside and purchase alcohol from the bar. My concern is that this passing trade will have already been drinking in other nearby licensed premises or some where else. I am concerned that if some of these already intoxicated people attempt to enter the premises drunk, there will be little in place to prevent late night disorder should sales be subsequently refused. Door supervisors will assist in upholding the licensing objectives and assist the licence holder in preventing late night drunks taking advantage of his intended operation of late night alcohol only sales. As a 'best practice' guide, police use a ratio of one door supervisor per fifty customers and I would expect the applicant to adopt this approach, or similar. Having spoken to the applicant at length, he tells me that he already employs door supervisors on Friday and Saturday.

### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

Having visited the premises I note that the premise is heavily surrounded by residential housing. Opposite the premise, on Harrow Road, there are a row of terraced houses. To the side and rear, on Greyhound Road, NW10 there is also residential properties. The applicant has applied to play live music until 12.00am Sunday - Thursday and until 1.00am Friday and Saturday. I am not an expert in noise, however, from professional experience of similar licensed operations, complaints generated are generally in relation to late night noise. I am very concerned, given the close proximity to residential properties and the applicants intention of playing late night live music, that this is likely to be a potential issue in the future. As such, I would advise the applicant to contact Brent councils environmental health officer for advice (if they have not already done so). Further, to help uphold the noise prevention objectives, I would suggest that all windows and doors are closed from 8.00pm and that the two yard areas marked on the plan are not used after 8pm Sunday-Thursday and 11pm Friday and Saturday.

**The conditions that Police require to be added to the Premises Licence are listed below:**

1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council upon request.
2. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.
3. A sufficient number and gender mix of door supervisors shall be employed from 8.00pm on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past 12am.
4. A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.
5. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which Licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
6. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received
  - (d) any incidents of disorder
  - (e) any faults in the CCTV system
  - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
7. Notices requesting customers to leave quietly shall be displayed at each exit.
8. Customers/staff shall not be allowed access/use of the outside area marked 'Yard 1' and 'Yard 2' on the plan submitted to the local authority, from 20:00hrs Sunday - Thursday and 23:00hrs Friday-Saturday so as to prevent nuisance to local residents.
9. All doors and windows must be closed after 2000 hours Sunday to Thursday and after 2300 hours Friday and Saturday so as to prevent nuisance to local residents.

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance. On behalf of the Environmental Health (Nuisance Control Team) I would like to make a representation against the application on the following grounds:

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- Airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment

**Supporting Information**

This venue is well known to the Nuisance Control Team (NCT) through numerous complaints made by neighbours alleging loud amplified music emanating from the premises. NCT's opinion is that this building is not designed to contain loud amplified music and such entertainment will cause a public nuisance to the occupants of the nearest noise sensitive residential premises. Historically, NCT have sent advisory letters and made advisory visits aimed at preventing such complaints. We have also obtained evidence of loud amplified music playing at such a level as to constitute a noise nuisance within the meaning of the law. We have also taken formal enforcement action to prohibit such nuisance in the form of a Noise Nuisance Abatement Notice. This action was against the previous business owner. We acknowledge this is a New Application and we acknowledge the business owner has changed. However, we do not believe the premises has received any acoustic treatment works designed to contain loud amplified music. On 22 May 2016, following evidence of statutory noise nuisance from loud amplified music, a Noise Nuisance Abatement Notice was served upon O Castelo Limited, prohibiting the recurrence of nuisance and requiring the recipient to: *Cease or cause to cease the playing of loud amplified music and speech by yourself or others on the premises known as O Castelo 988 -992 Harrow Road, London,*



**NW10 5NT** *at such a level so that noise nuisance is not caused in any residential or noise sensitive premises.*

**Informative**

I would therefore recommend the following condition to the operating schedule:

Regulated entertainment in the form of Live Music and Recorded Music shall not be permitted or endorsed upon the licence until such time as the applicant has provided (in report form) and undertaken (to a certified standard) a scheme of acoustic treatment/s commensurate with protecting the occupants of the nearest noise sensitive premises from noise and vibration associated with such forms of entertainment. Such works must be undertaken to the satisfaction of Environmental Health.

RE: Objection to the granting of a New Premises Licence for: "O Castelo LTD" Trading at: O Castelo  
988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT.

I am writing to you in order to present my objection to granting of a licence for live music in relation to the above premises. On the "Notice of Application for Licences" (dated 03/05/2016) it is stated that the above premises wishes to be granted a roster, which would allow for live music events between the following hours and days of the week:

Monday through to Thursday to play live music from 11am until Midnight.

Friday & Saturday to play live music from 11am until 1am.

Sunday to play live music from 11am until Midnight.

It is for the following reasons that I am objecting that the above premises cannot be granted a licence for live music:

1. Under the previous lease holders and company (Benfica Restaurant) trading at the above premises. Many complaints were made by various neighbours to Brent Council's Enforcement Officers (Environment & protection) in relation to live music being played brazenly too loud. The complaint Reference Number for this process is: SR/0380/06. Case officer Mr Ketan Joshi.
2. With regard to complaint Reference Number: SR/0380/06. The previous company (Benfica Restaurant) trading at the above premises, only sound insulated the ceiling between the Restaurants seating area and the apartment above (1D Greyhound Road). The previous company (Benfica Restaurant) trading at the above premises, did not sound insulate the ceilings in relation to the other two apartments above "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT". In relation to the apartment above the kitchen of "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT", NO SOUND INSULATION was installed (There is no sound insulation). These building works carried out by the previous company (Benfica Restaurant), and were carried out during the early part of 2015.
3. After the building works being carried out by the previous company (Benfica Restaurant), noise levels remained too loud due to their live music. Sometimes even louder than before these building works were carried out. After the building works many complaints were still being made by various neighbours to Brent Council's Enforcement Officers.

4. Due to the process in relation to complaint Reference Number: SR/0380/06. The previous company's owner Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral (Benfica restaurants owner), contracted a private company (Uk Building Compliance) to carry out non-destructive sound tests within "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" and the neighbour's apartments (1D; 1E Front and 1E Back Greyhound Road NW10 5QH).

This was due to Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral dismissing virtually all of Brent Council's Enforcement Officers (Environment & protection) advice as to what Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral should be doing to resolve the impact of sound on Benfica Restaurant's adjoining neighbours.

As well as prove that Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral was right in what he had done and that all other parties were wrong. The non-destructive sound tests were carried out on the 24<sup>th</sup> of June 2015, in the premises of "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" and those of "1D Greyhound Road NW10 5QH". The results of which showed that the insulation between these two properties did not meet Building Regulations minimum requirements and as such failed to pass Building Regulations.

As the boundary between "1D Greyhound Road NW10 5QH" and "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" was the only area in which sound insulation had been installed and had failed to pass Building Regulations minimum requirements through these tests then the remaining non-destructive sound tests within "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" and the neighbour's apartments "1E Front and 1E Back Greyhound Road NW10 5QH" was decided to be a waste of time and therefore the remaining sound tests were cancelled upon Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral verdict that he hadn't even insulated the boundary between "1E Front and Back Greyhound Road NW10 5QH" and "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT".

To this present day no further sound insulation has been installed between "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" and the neighbour's apartments (1D; 1E Front and 1E Back Greyhound Road NW10 5QH) and therefore still failing to meet Building Regulations minimum requirements (nothing to this present day has been done about this infringement of Building Regulations).

5. Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral was to issue to all parties the finding of non-destructive sound tests within "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" and the neighbour's apartments (1D; 1E Front and 1E Back Greyhound Road NW10 5QH), as part of being given access to the neighbour's apartments. But to this date nothing has been issued by Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral to the other parties involved. The company which carried out the tests have credited qualifications to carry out such testing and are called "Uk Building Compliance" (contact details- Tel:01455634855 , [www.ukbuildingcompliance.co.uk](http://www.ukbuildingcompliance.co.uk)).

Uk Building Compliance's lead consultant in relation to these tests is called "Luke". But they would not issue the test results due to Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral having paid for the test and no one else. However the two sound technicians who carried out the test and "Luke" have confirmed that Building Regulations minimum requirements have not been meet in relation to "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT".

6. Since the non-destructive sound tests were carried out there has been a long a continued history of noise objections in relation to "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT", due to live music. Mr Martin Wood (Environmental Health Officer Regulatory Services) and Brent Council were going to take serious legal action against Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral in relation to the noise emanating from "988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT". But this legal process which Brent Council wished to put through the judicial system did not happen, as Mr Nuno Miguel Cabral sold the business to the current owner. (This happened at the early stages of 2016 and we are now practically half way through the year 2016).
7. To this present day the live music from what is now "O Castelo LTD" Trading at: "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT", is played too loud. To the point where no one can sleep. I have a daughter who is 15 years old, who needs to study and rest so that she may go to school with a fresh and sharp mind and I have to work over the weekend periods. Many times I go to work without having slept at all overnight due to the noise emanated from "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT". Due to the noise emanated from "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" I go to work with an accumulated sense of tiredness and stress.
8. My bedroom is [REDACTED] "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" Kitchen. Due to there not being any type of insulation between "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" and "1E Back Greyhound Road NW10 5QH", I hear pots and pans clinking and clunking, as well the conversations between people in the kitchen [REDACTED] as if they are in the bedroom with me. This cruel torment starts from early morning and only finishes in the late hours of the following morning.
9. There is also a door in "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" kitchen which grants access to a rear courtyard, that is causing the grout of kitchen tiles to fall of the wall as that door is continually slammed shut (the apartment shudders every time that door is closed).

It is for these reasons that I oppose the granting of a New Premises Licence for: "O Castelo LTD" Trading at: O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT. This objection is so that I and my family may have peace within my own home.

I wish this objection to be taken seriously, principally because we are talking not only of a couple, but also about a minor, who is my daughter and she needs to be well.

For the reasons of the proximity of ourselves and the staff; owner; clients of "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" we need to have our personal details removed, so that we may remain anonymous. We do not wish there to be reprisals from interested parties on behalf of "O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT" towards us, because of our objection to the granting of a licence for live music.

I would like to be kept informed throughout the entire process of the application of a New Premises Licence for: "O Castelo LTD" Trading at: O Castelo 988-992 Harrow Road London NW10 5NT. By Brent Council. I look forward to hearing back from you.

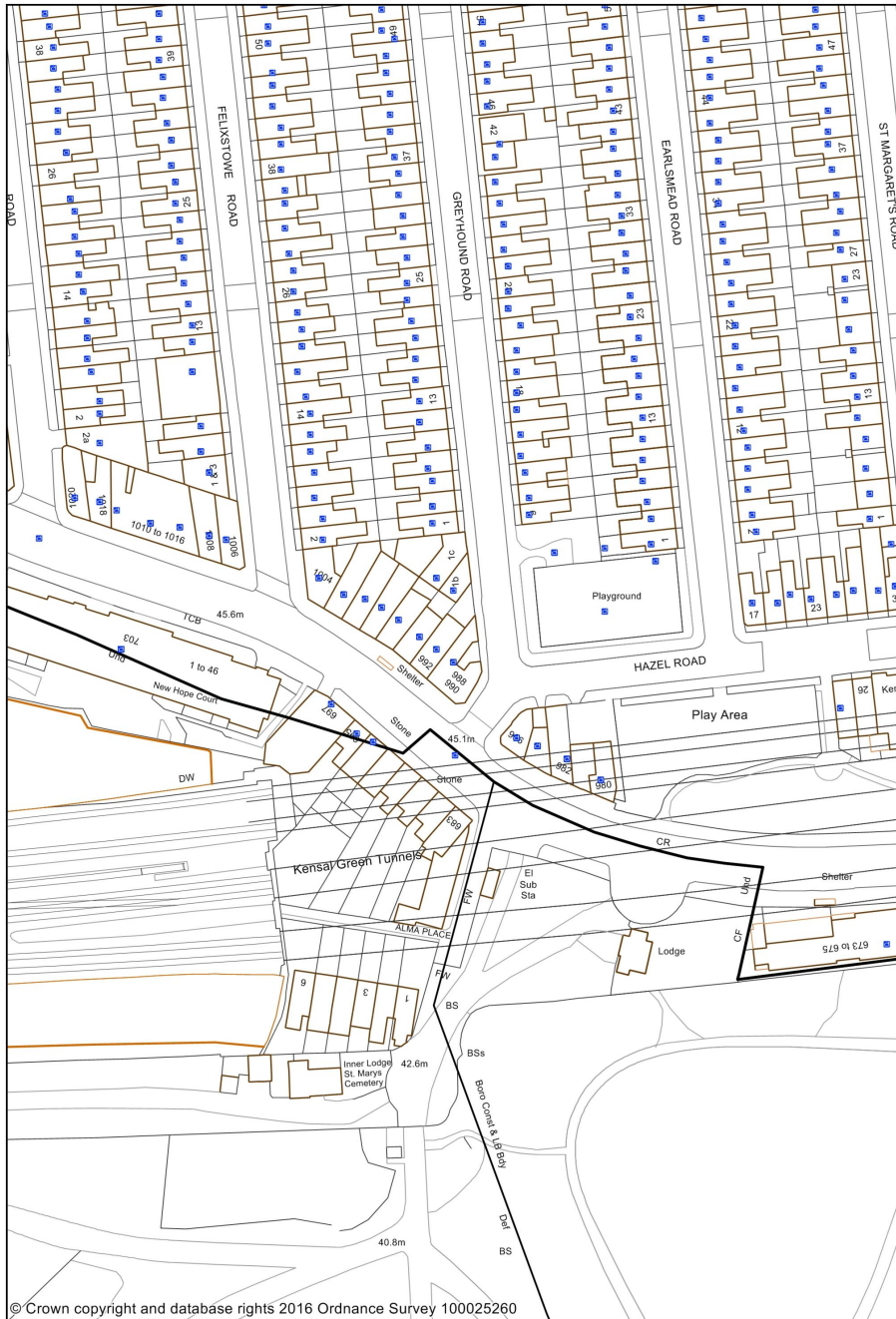
