The DPS will keep an up to date DPS Authorisation sheet which will show the list of staff members who have been given the authority to sell alcohol on the premises.







An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence under section 34 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

As a result of the variation application, a visit was carried out on Tuesday 21st March 2017 in the presence of Mr Brahmbhatt. During the visit Mr Brahmbhatt and I discussed some of the policies that he currently has in place voluntarily. I have advised that although he has applied these voluntarily I would add them to the conditions to make them enforceable if he wishes to have his hours varied.

The Licensing Authority wish to propose the following conditions:

1. Door supervisors shall wear high visibility clothing that can be clearly and easily identified on CCTV.





- 2. Door supervisors of a suitable gender mix, shall be employed from 22:00 hours on any day when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol past 00:00 hours.
- 3. A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.
- 4. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council. This must comply with the Data Protection Act including signage.
- 5. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.
- 6. A refusal book detailing date and time of the refused sale and the name of the person refusing the sale shall be kept and maintained and made available for inspection at the premises.
- 7. No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 02:00 hours.
- 8. Regular documented staff training on licensing legislation and operating procedures shall be given. The training shall be signed and dated and a copy of these training records available for inspection by Police and local authority enforcement officers.

In order for the Licensing Team to withdraw this representation, it will be necceasing for you to confirm in writing that you are willing to accept the above conditions.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a variation of premises licence under section 34 of the act. The Police representations are primarily concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

The applicant has applied for the extension of licensable hours in relation to regulated entertainment and the supply of alcohol from 1000-0400 on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

In relation to this variation police ask for the following condition to be **removed:**

Condition 20. Where fighting occurs the aggressive offender shall be evicted immediately and the passive offender evicted when safe to do so. The management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.

Condition 21. Where drugs or weapons are found the offender shall be restrained if safe to do so and the police called immediately and the matter recorded in the incident book.

Condition 22. Where there has been damage to property the management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.

Condition 23 Where there is aggression shown by customers to staff the management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.

Condition 24 Where there have been cases of drunk, disorderly or abusive behaviour the management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.

Rational: I do not believe that these conditions are enforceable.

Police request that the following condition in relation to an incident book be **added** to replace the removed conditions:

An incident book shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Police request that the following condition is also **removed**:

Condition 10 A Challenge 21 policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

This condition is to be **replaced** with:

A challenge 25 policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.

Police request the following condition be **removed**:

Condition 17 No children under 14 shall be admitted unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

This condition is to be **replaced** with:

'On Thursday, Friday and Saturday children shall not be permitted to the lower basement floor from 00:00 hours. Children shall not be permitted to remain in

the premise or access to the premise after 0200 hours. All Children must be accompanied by a responsible adult.'

Rational: This is to allow the licence holder the flexibility to run his family restaurant business.

Police request that <u>all</u> conditions currently attached to the premises licence (Conditions 1-9, Conditions 11-16 & Conditions 18-19) remain in force and also apply to the new extended hours.

Police Request the following conditions be added:

- 1. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 2200 hours there shall be a suitable number of door supervisors on duty. They must remain on duty until the premises are closed and all customers have left.
- 2. A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority upon request.
- 3. Door supervisors shall wear high visibility jackets, tabards or armbands, so that they can be clearly and easily identified on CCTV.
- 4. No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 0200 hours, save for those patrons who are returning from a smoking area.
- 5. The premises must have a comprehensive written dispersal policy in place. This document shall be produced to the police or an officer from Brent Council upon request.
- 6. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to the police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.
- 7. After 2200 hours smoking areas shall be limited to 10 persons and each area shall be suitably supervised.

Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Water

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures to be Available

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Minimum Price of Alcohol

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) —duty is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) —permitted price is the price found by applying the formula—

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

where--

(i) P is the permitted price,

- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) —relevant personl means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) —valued added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second dayll) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (when required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises

certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

Embedded Conditions

Entertainment

The noise level of Music shall be arranged so as not to cause nuisance to local residents.

The total number of persons accommodated at any one time, shall not exceed 240 persons at the proposed Basement level and 110 at the proposed Lower Basement level.

Alcohol shall be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment and shall only be sold during the hours specified below:

On weekdays, between 10:00 and 02:00 hours (or 03.00 on the morning of which summer time begins). Alcohol shall not be sold after midnight, on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight. On any day that music and dancing ends between 00:00 and 02:00 hours (or 03:00 on the morning of which summer time begins), alcohol shall not be sold after the music and dancing ends.

On Sundays, other than immediately before bank holidays, between 12:00 and 00:30 hours. Alcohol shall not be sold after midnight when music and dancing is not provided after 00:00 hours. Where music and dancing ends between 12:00 on a Sunday and 00:30 hours the following morning, alcohol shall not be sold after the music and dancing has ended.

On Sundays immediately before bank holidays, between 12:00 and 02:00 hours the following morning. Alcohol shall not be sold after midnight when music and dancing is not provided after 00:00 hours. Where music and dancing ends between 00:00 on a Sunday and 02:00 hours the following morning, alcohol shall not be sold after the music and dancing has ended.

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

- 1 Customers shall not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
- 2 Notices clearly explaining the licensee's drugs and weapons policy shall be displayed at the entrance and at suitable places throughout the premises.
- 3 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 4 The licensee or his/her deputy shall be a member of, and actively participate in the local pubwatch scheme.

- 5 Promotions that promote irresponsible drinking shall not be permitted.
- 6 The licensee shall keep an incident book which shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.
- 7 Signs alerting customers to theft shall be displayed.
- 8 A suitable intruder alarm complete with panic button shall be fitted and maintained.
- 9 Toilets shall be checked every (number) hour(s) for the use of drugs and other illegal activities.
- 10 A 'Challenge 21' policy shall be adopted and adhered to.
- 11 The Licensee shall undertake a risk assessment agreed by the Police and Licensing Authority of any significant promotion or event, using the Metropolitan Police Service Promotion/Event Risk Assessment Form (Form 696) or an equivalent and provide a copy to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit not less than 14 days before the event is due to take place.
- 12 Where an event has taken place the licensee shall complete a Debrief Risk Assessment Form (Form 696A) and submit this to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit within 3 days of the conclusion of the event.
- 13 A free supply of drinking water shall be made available to customers.
- 14 All deliveries shall take place during the normal working day (i.e. 09:0 to 18:00 daily).
- 15 Nudity, striptease and other entertainment of an adult nature shall not be permitted on the premises.
- 16 Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits
- 17 No children under 14 shall be admitted unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
- 18 The total number of people permitted on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 240 at the basement level and 110 at the lower basement level.
- 19 The level of music shall be arranged so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- 20 Where fighting occurs the aggressive offender shall be evicted immediately and the passive offender evicted when safe to do so. The management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.
- 21 Where drugs or weapons are found the offender shall be restrained if safe to do so and the police called immediately and the matter recorded in the incident book.
- 22 Where there has been damage to property the management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.
- 23 Where there is aggression shown by customers to staff the management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.
- 24 Where there have been cases of drunk, disorderly or abusive behaviour the

management shall be informed and the matter recorded in the incident book.
