a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The DPS fully understands her roles and responsibilities concerning the four licensing objectives obtained within the 2003 Licensing Act, a comprehensive breakdown of these objectives and how to ensure they are met are detailed below.

The DPS attended the level 2 training programme and her personal licence will be issued by

The DPS will take full responsibility of ensuring all staff are trained and have full knowledge of all licensing issues concerning them under the 2003 Licensing Act including the Challenge 25 rule.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The applicant will have installed to the premises a CCTV recording system with a 31 day recording capability to ensure the prevention of crime & disorder.

The CCTV will be in accordance with Police recommendations.

The CCTV system covers all key internal and external areas.

All CCTV recordings shall be available to local Police immediately upon request.

One member of staff shall be trained to keep the CCTV in full working order at all times.

c) Public safety

The installed and approved CCTV recording system of the premises with 31 days recording capability will monitor all public safety issues.

The DPS will be responsible for conducting a Fire Risk Assessment and also a Health & Safety Risk Assessment for the licensed premises.

All notices in relation to public health & safety will be displayed at the premises. The DPS will also ensure the premises will be operated in line with the Health & Safety Act and any environmental health issues will be the responsibility of both the licence holder for the premises and the DPS.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The DPS/Premises licence holder fully understands that it is their duty to prevent their business causing any nuisance to any local residents or businesses.

They will monitor the external premises area in relation to any anti-social behaviour or public nuisance.

The premises will only accept trade deliveries or rubbish collections during normal working hours.

The DPS will also monitor the exterior of the premises to ensure litter is kept to a minimum.

In the event of any anti-social behaviour both inside and outside of the premises, the DPS will make any CCTV recordings available to the local Police immediately.

e) The protection of children from harm

The DPS will be responsible for ensuring all staff working within the premises will be fully trained and aware of the Challenge 25 Rule.

The premises will only accept valid forms of identification such as photo driving licence, passport and home office approved ID cards displaying the national proof of age standard scheme (PASS hologram).

All customers who look under the age of 25 shall be challenged to prove their identity when purchasing alcohol.

The premises will also have a refusals register, which will be kept at the premises at all times and all refusals by any member of staff shall be recorded.

The register will be made available to Responsible Authorities on request.

Re: Application for New Premise Licence - Food 4 You - 280 Kingsbury Road

I refer to the above application and wish to object. The above shop is a food store specialising in Eastern European produce, there is a table and chairs outside the shop where people sit and drink coffee and alcohol. There are no toilet facilities on the premises so the people use the alleyway beside the shop as a toilet, it is disgusting, they even, on occasions bring their own toilet paper. It is a health risk, I use this alleyway daily as this is where my car is parked.

There is a large green box outside or our door - one of Utility Company ones - this is where the empty cans are disposed of, of in the old mans garden next door, they just throw them over the fence, or in the above stated alleyway.

I also do not see the need to have a licence to sell alcohol from 08.00 in the morning. I feel that if they are allowed a licence, it will be people sitting outside the shop all day drinking. I feel it will lead to groups hanging around outside the shop, and I am sure that some people, especially the elderly would find this intimidating.

In the past I have had to contact the council about the delivery men to the shop blocking our drive whilst making deliveries, in fact one of them threatened my partner, who had to phone the police. The council are now looking in to placing double yellow lines in this area, so the delivery will also be a problem.

There are two shops in the parade that already sell alcohol, and several supermarkets nearby, this should surely be enough outlets selling alcohol in the area without adding to the number.

As per our telephone conversation, I'm writing this email to alleviate the concerns bought up in the representation.

The first paragraph talks about table & chairs outside the shop, the applicant has said this has happened in the past but after discussions with the Police it will not any more. This can be written into the licence if needed?

The disposing of empty cans and bottles in the area may be an issue, the applicant will keep an eye on the area directly outside his shop to keep that area tidy, however any alcoholic litter is not down to the applicant as he currently sells no alcohol.

In regards to the deliveries, again there are other shops nearby that use the same strip of road to unload the goods. The applicant states that he generally only has one or two deliveries a week. The lorry parks on a single yellow lined part of the road outside his shop as this is only place to do so?

Neither myself or the applicant can promise no congregations of people but the applicant can assure you that any future occurrences won't be as a result of him/staff, his customers will also be asked to leave the area quietly and quickly by way of a sign in his premises.

I hope this clears any concerns you have regarding the application, if not please feel free to ask myself any questions and I will do my best to come up with a solution that works for all parties.

Police representation for a new Premises Licence at Food 4 You, 280 Kingsbury Road, Kingsbury London NW9 0BY.

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Act 2003 licensing objectives for the reasons indicated below.

If the conditions proposed were accepted in full I would withdraw my representation.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance objectives.

High strength beer, lager and cider

During my consultation visit to the premises today, it was quite clear that street drinking in the immediate vicinity of this premise is a current issue. In an alleyway behind shops on Kingsbury Road, at the junction with Uphill Drive, I noted numerous discarded alcoholic cans on the floor, including high strength cans of 9% ABV. It is these high strength beers, lagers and cider which I am most concerned with in relation to street drinking and associated anti social behaviour which impacts on crime and disorder in the area. I also visited Roe Green, directly in front of the premise and found numerous discarded alcoholic tin cans scattered around a bench. The premise is also located within a controlled drinking zone (CDZ). There was also a discarded can of Kestrel Super behind the telephone control box, directly outside the premise. I have expressed my concerns in relation to street drinking, especially those consuming high strength beer, lager and cider in the immediate area, to the applicant. The applicant allayed my fears and stated that the beers they wish to sell are all around 4.5% ABV.

I have further information from Brent Council's Anti Social Behaviour analyst who has concluded there are a range of ASB issues including street drinking in surrounding areas which may have a further negative impact on the area in question. My concerns surround the premises opening time of 6am and the gap between which the supply of alcohol commences at 8am and how the alcohol will be contained. The Licensing Act 2003 already requires that alcohol not be displayed when there is no authorisation to do so but have not been given any information by the premises in the application as to how this will be met.



I therefore propose the following condtion in order to reinforce the need for alcohol to be covered up outside of licensed hours, namely 6am-8am;





• Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.

In order for the Licensing Authority to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you to confirm you agree to the above conditions being added.

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

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make a representation that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

The Licensing Authority require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence:

1) CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council on reasonable request to protect data protection rules.





2) A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

3) Members of the general public must not be allowed access to the premises in order to buy, collect browse or be supplied directly with alcohol at any time.

4) Challenge 25 – if the driver considers the recipient of alcohol appears under 25, recognised photographic identification to be requested before any alcohol is given to the recipient.

5) Alcohol shall only be delivered to a residential or business address and not to a public place.

6) An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) any complaints received
- (b) any incidents
- (c) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (d) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

In order for the Licensing Authority to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you to confirm in writing that you are willing to accept the above.


