

Police representation to the Premises Licence application for 'Stadium Supermarket, 129 Wembley Park Drive, Wembley, HA9 8HQ

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

I am of the opinion that the risk to the Licensing objectives can be mitigated by removing the requested variations or attaching conditions to the Licence as shown below.

Officer: Michael Sullivan Licensing Constable

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary a Premise licence under section 34 of the act.

The Police representations are primarily concerned with **crime and disorder**, **prevention of public nuisance**, **and the Protection of Children from Harm**.

An application to vary the Premise Licence of Stadium Super market, 129 Wembley Park Drive HA9 8HQ, asking for an extension of its licensable hours has been submitted. It asks that their hours be extended from 09.00 - 00.00 daily until 08.00 - 02.00 hours daily. On the 28/07/2017 I conducted a visit at the premises, there was one male working in the premises Mr. Srinivasa Gubbala, on checking the licnce he is currently shown as the Designated Premises Supervisor for the shop. Mr. Gubbala stated that the owner Mr Liakath was not available, he then asked if he should call the regular guy who works at the shop, I asked him if he worked regularly at the shop and if he was still the DPS as stated on the

licence, he stated that he did work at the shop on a regular basis and that he was the current DPS for the shop, I told him that I was happy for him to assist me as he should be able to answer any questions I had.

He stated he was aware of the application to extend the shops hours, I then informed him that I would be going through the shops current licence conditions.

**Condition 1** reads CCTV shall be installed to Home Office guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested

I asked Mr. Gubbala, if the CCTV was working and if he could show me that it is recording Correctly, I looked at the moniror in the shop and noticed that the times was not correct, I asked him why this was, he stated that it hadn't been changed, he then said that he was unable to work the CCTV.

**Condition 4** reads 'A sign stating 'No proof of age - No sale' shall be displayed at the point of Sale.

I looked around the counter area but could not see any sign, I asked Mr. Gubbala, if their was any such sign, he pointed to a sign relating to the sale of cigarettes, I informed him that this was not correct.

**Condition 6** reads 'An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to unauthorized officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following;

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any faults in the CCTV system
- (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (f) any visit by relevant authority or emergency service

I asked Mr. Gubbala for the shops Incident log, he had a look for it and said 'shall I call the regular guy' I said ' no you are the DPS you should know where it is' he then conceded that the shop did not have an Incident log book.

Condition 7 reads the following crime prevention measures shall be implemented

A time delay safe with deposit slot and anti-fishing mechanisms must be used at the counter till area.

Regular robbery awareness and cash minimization training shall be given to all staff

I asked Mr Gubbala if the shop had a safe, he stated 'yes' and started to pull up some shelving that was on the floor behind the counter, I asked if the safe was on the floor he then said no its been moved and walked to the rear of the shop and into a store room, he then attempted to open another door but did not know the code, he turned to me and said 'its in here' I asked if it was a time delay safe, he replied 'no'.

**Condition 10** reads regular documented staff training on licensing legislation and operating procedures shall be given.

I asked Mr. Gubbala, if I could look at the training documents, he again said 'shall I call the regular guy' I asked him when the last time staff had been trained, he informed me that he had trained the staff a month ago, I asked him what he had trained them in, to which he could not answer.

It is clear from this visit that the shop is poorly managed with numerous breaches to its Current licence conditions, Mr Gubbala, is shown as the DPS for the shop but has very little to no knowledge of the shops licence conditions or the licensing objectives.

I have concerns about the current running of the shop, and would ask that the application to extend its licensable hours be **refused**,

#### Dear Mr Miah

I write to summarise a recent licensing visit made to your premises on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> May 2017. On this day it was a designated Wembley Event Day.

There was a football match at Wembley Stadium, namely the Vanarama League Final game between Tranmere and Forest Green Rovers.

Your shop was open to the public and alcohol was being sold.

During the visit glass bottles of alcohol were being sold and on display for sale. This breaches condition 8 of your premises licence 'on major event days at Wembley Stadium the following should apply: No alcohol or "alcopop" type drinks shall be displayed or sold in glass containers with the exception of wines and spirits.

It is just as important to maintain this condition on games with lower capacitates where sporadic violence is just as common. It is crucial that glass bottles are not accessible and able to be used as weapons

Police insist that the glass bottles are totally covered or removed from display to assist you and your staff from football fans who may persevere in their attempts to purchase them. Glass bottles can cause serious injuries if used as a missile or weapon during disorder.

#### **Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

#### Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either?
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Price of Alcohol

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 12.
- (a) —dutyll is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) —permitted pricell is the price found by applying the formula.

 $P = D + (D \times V)$ 

where;

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence ¿
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) —relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) —valued added taxll means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first dayll) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second dayll) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax. (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Embedded Conditions**

Mandatory cont:

Requirement for a DPS

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (Only if required)

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

- a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films
- b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

## **Annexe 3 - Conditions Attached After a Hearing by the Licensing Authority**

- 1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
- 2 A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises
- 3 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked.
- 4 A sign stating ¿No proof of age ¿ No sale; shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- 5 A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
- 6 An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any faults in the CCTV system
- (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 7 The following crime prevention measures shall be implemented:
- ¿ A time delay safe with deposit slot and anti-fishing mechanisms must be used at the counter till area
- ¿ Regular robbery awareness and cash minimisation training shall be given to all staff
- 8 On major event days at Wembley Stadium the following shall apply:
- ¿ No alcohol or ¿alcopop¿ type drinks shall be displayed or sold in glass containers with the exception of wines and spirits.
- ¿ No more than 4 cans of alcohol shall be sold to an individual.
- ¿ All persons buying alcohol to be advised of the street drinking ban.
- 9 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 10 Regular documented staff training on licensing legislation and operating procedures shall be given.
