4. The licensee will ensure that staff are trained regularly as appropriate in respect to the Licensing Act 2003



I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the licensing objectives for the reasons indicated below.

If conditions suggested below were accepted in full I would withdraw my representation.

An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the act. The Police representations are primarily concerned with the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm.

On Wednesday 13th December 2017, I visited the premises and met with Mr Thakkar to discuss this application. He has informed me that his staff have undertaken licensing training and now held a personal licence. I spoke to one member of staff that held a licence, he was unable to explain any of the four licensing objectives to me, I then spoke to his wife on the phone, she is the applicant and the proposed DPS, she was also unable to answer any basic questions about licensing to me, she blamed the phone saying she could not hear me, but the line was clear and she was able to have a long conversation with her husband when I handed him back the phone. I have discussed the training issues with the applicants Agent and he will arrange training for all staff before the shop starts trading.

Mr Thakkar recognises that the premises are located within a challenging locality in respect of general anti social behaviour and street drinking alike. We spoke about conditions to be attached to his premises licence which will ensure that the licensing objectives are upheld at all times despite local issues. The following proposed conditions were discussed:

He went on to say that he wanted to open the shop at 6am, but he did not intend to sell alcohol until later in the day, due to the problems in the location with ASB, and Street Drinkers, I would propose that the **sales of alcohol are from 09.00am daily**, due to the street drinking problem in the area, and the fact that the shop is only a short distance from a local primary school.

Police Request the following conditions be added to the new premises licence:

1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.

2. A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.

3. No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked, sold or supplied.

4. A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

5. Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.

6. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

7. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (f) any faults in the CCTV system
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

8. No single cans, Bottles of beers, cider, or lagers shall be sold.

9. No miniature bottles of spirits 5cl shall be sold

I certify that I have considered the above new application and I wish to make representations.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

Please find below my response to this application.

Sale of Alcohol from 06.00hrs

The sale of alcohol at 06.00hrs encourages persons to purchase and consume alcohol at a very early hour of the morning. Removing such opportunity altogether prevents the licence holder or his staff from having to be in a position to refuse sales and further reduces the chances of alcohol being purchased by customers for consumption at this time.

As I understand the premises opens at 06.00hrs but unfortunately the Licensing Authority cannot use this as a measuring tool for when the supply and display of alcohol for sale should take place. In order to uphold the Licensing objectives, it is necessary that alcohol not be sold at this time of the morning or until as late as 01.00hrs.





As previously explained, there are existing issues surrounding **anti-social behaviour**, **loitering and public drinking** in the immediate area. Permitting an additonal off licence with such timings, I believe would add to the already existing issues and undermine the licensing objectives.

There are also the following two schools in the vicinity of the proposed off licence; Alperton High School and Barham Primary School. In order to avoid children of school age witnessing persons loitering and street drinking, it is proposed that alcohol not be sold before 09.00hrs.

It is therefore proposed that the supply of alcohol be modified from 06.00hrs-01.00hrs to;

09.00hrs-23.00hrs

This would go some way in promoting the licensing objectives. In order to further promote the Licensing objectives the following conditions are suggested;

Conditions to be added to the Licence

- CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.
- A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the entire servery.
- A sign stating 'No proof of age, No sale' shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- A 'Challenge 25' policy shall be adopted and adhered to
- No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold.
- A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) any complaints received
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.
- Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers, staff who provide training including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation. The training shall cover in particular; how to manage issues in relation to underage sales and dealing with intoxicated persons and street drinkers The training shall be documented and signed off by





the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.

- No miniature bottles of wine or spirits in units of less than 35cl shall be sold at the premises.
- No single cans of beers, lagers and ciders shall be stocked or sold at the premises.
- All alcohol stocked and sold shall be labelled with the name 'JALA'.
- The licensee shall ensure that any activity associated with the premises shall be carried out in such a manner so as not to cause a public nuisance to neighbours.
- Customers shall not be permitted to congregate on the forecourt outside the premises.

To grant any more licenses is not only making the situation far worse, but with limited amount of resources of the Police and the Council it is not manageable, we have had, as the council and the Police know very well the assurances by the sellers to take some form of responsibility have not been met and cannot be met.

It is obvious that a licencee application will according to regulations state that they will meet their responsibilities but the evidence proves this to the contrary.

The objection is based on the following grounds

1.Gangs are gathering around these shops and intimidating the public albeit women and children. Violence outside these shops is escalating (I encountered one this evening).

2.Drunken men are in general intimidating children as they come back from school 3.The exposure of genitally is now a common occurrence in full view of the public especially children by these drunks is very shocking

4. The local park is now littered with human excrement, beer cans and bottles and the once pleasant space has become a obstacle course to avoid these people.

5. The streets and alley ways are littered with alcoholic bottles and cans.

6. The Police are inundated with 101 calls or 999 calls for not only drinking but the anti social action of the drunks.

7. The old women, children and for that matter all local residents are in fear of what is going on and although they want something done about it they also fear being targeted should they report the activity.

There are many other reasons and the Police in a recent case highlighted with great articulation the reality that we live under.

I would urge you reject the application and help us make Ealing Rd a potential tourist destination with its magic atmosphere in previous years to be brought back and a safe neighborhood for all to enjoy. I would respectfully object to granting this license based on the below reasons:

There had recently been a 6 month PSPO being put in place from the 28th of April 2017 up until September the 27th 2017. Unfortunately, even with a PSPO in place, we still experienced what we have in the past, such as problems with street drinkers with regards to being a public nuisance, crimes taking place as well as a fear of public safety. One Tree Hill Park is the nearest park where a lot of drinkers have been hanging out continuously for quite awhile now (5-6 years), and thus may increase further with yet another off license selling alcohol. As a result of this, the good reputation that we once had of not only One Tree Hill Park but our area, has suffered.

I feel that there will also be greater competition with the existing off-licence in price of alcohol, as it may even be even cheaper which will increase in consumption of alcohol and increase in existing problems.

Also, I have been leading a free walking and running group since mid May and had noticed attendances were low, due to feedback from a few people who have come running with me, had noticed street drinkers at One Tree Hill Park sleeping, urinating on the side fences and hanging around in groups and treating the park as a 'drinkers hangout'. Children on our road have felt threatened to go and play on our park side entrance (Braemar Avenue) due to drinkers hanging around in big groups, and not only drink 1 or 2 bottles or cans they drink plenty more and hang around and stay at One Tree Hill for long hours up until late at night and i had even spotted them sleeping there in the early hours of the morning.

We have already had enough issues happening and constantly occurring and re-occurring on our street and area for quite some time now, with seemingly little or not much being done about it. If a premises license is granted for Jalaram supermarket, I feel as I am sure other residents would feel that our problems will double, not only for our road and area, but especially One Tree Hill, as it will turn into a `drinkers paradise`. We appreciate the Local police`s efforts in our area, but also recognise that they can not be there at all times. I have been spending a considerable amount of time trying to help rebuild and promote One Tree Hill as a great park to train at, as it has a lot of space available, has a nice outdoor gym, and used to be a quiet and pleasant park.

We do not want to see a fatality on our road or any other severe incidents happening in our area being linked to alcoholism, disorder and crime due to potentially cheaper alcohol being promoted or sold at a nearby shop as competition would be increased.



I would respectfully object to granting this license based on the below reasons:

There had recently been a 6 month PSPO being put in place from the 28th of April 2017 up until September the 27th 2017. Unfortunately, even with a PSPO in place, we still experienced what we have in the past, such as problems with street drinkers with regards to being a public nuisance, crimes taking place as well as a fear of public safety. One Tree Hill Park is the nearest park where a lot of drinkers have been hanging out continuously for quite awhile now (5-6 years), and thus may increase further with yet another off license selling alcohol. As a result of this, the good reputation that we once had of not only One Tree Hill Park but our area, has suffered.

I feel that there will also be greater competition with the existing off-licence in price of alcohol, as it may even be even cheaper which will increase in consumption of alcohol and increase in existing problems.

Also, I have been leading a free walking and running group since mid May and had noticed attendances were low, due to feedback from a few people who have come running with me, had noticed street drinkers at One Tree Hill Park sleeping, urinating on the side fences and hanging around in groups and treating the park as a `drinkers hangout`. Children on our road have felt threatened to go and play on our park side entrance (Braemar Avenue) due to drinkers hanging around in big groups, and not only drink 1 or 2 bottles or cans they drink plenty more and hang around and stay at One Tree Hill for long hours up until late at night and i had even spotted them sleeping there in the early hours of the morning.

We have already had enough issues happening and constantly occurring and re-occurring on our street and area for quite some time now, with seemingly little or not much being done about it. If a premises license is granted for Diu Portugal Ltd, I feel as I am sure other residents would feel that our problems will double, not only for our road and area, but especially One Tree Hill, as it will turn into a `drinkers paradise`. We appreciate the Local police`s efforts in our area, but also recognise that they can not be there at all times. Closed Circuit Television (CCTV)

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated, especially as the premises is open daily into the early hours of the morning.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Sale of Alcohol

I note in the operating schedule that you wish to supply alcohol from:-

• <u>06:30-23:00 hours</u> Monday-Sunday.

Police ask that this be modified to:-

• <u>09:00am</u> -23:00 hours Monday-Sunday.

Reasons:- There are 2 local schools near the premise Alperton High School & Barham primary school. Children of school age should not witness people loitering around and drinking alcohol in the streets whilst on their way to school. There is also existing ASB in the immediate area such as loitering, littering and street drinking which early opening times may exasperate.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

Please find below my response to this application.

Sale of Alcohol from 06.30hrs

The sale of alcohol at 06.30hrs encourages persons to purchase and consume alcohol at a very early hour of the morning. Removing such opportunity altogether prevents the licence holder or his staff from having to be in a position to refuse sales and further reduces the chances of alcohol being purchased by customers for consumption at this time.

As I understand the premises opens at 06.30hrs but unfortunately the Licensing Authority cannot use this as a measuring tool for when the supply and display of alcohol for sale should take place. In order to uphold the Licensing objectives, it is necessary that alcohol not be sold at this time of the morning.





There are existing issues surrounding **anti-social behaviour**, **loitering and public drinking** in the immediate area. Permitting an additonal off licence with such timings, I believe would add to the already existing issues and undermine the licensing objectives.

There are also the following two schools in the vicinity of the proposed off licence; Alperton High School and Barham Primary School. In order to avoid children of school age witnessing persons loitering and street drinking, it is proposed that alcohol not be sold before 09.00hrs.

It is therefore proposed that the supply of alcohol be modified from 06.30hrs-23.00hrs to;

09.00hrs-23.00hrs

This would go some way in promoting the licensing objectives. In order to further promote the Licensing objectives the following conditions are suggested;

Conditions to be added to the Licence

- CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.
- A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the entire servery.
- A sign stating 'No proof of age, No sale' shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- A 'Challenge 25' policy shall be adopted and adhered to
- No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold.
- A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) any complaints received
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.
- Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers, staff who provide training including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation. The training shall cover in particular; how to manage issues in relation to underage sales and dealing with intoxicated persons and street drinkers The training shall be documented and signed off by





the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.

- No miniature bottles of wine or spirits in units of less than 35cl shall be sold at the premises.
- No single cans of beers, lagers and ciders shall be stocked or sold at the premises.
- All alcohol stocked and sold shall be labelled with the name 'DIU'.
- The licensee shall ensure that any activity associated with the premises shall be carried out in such a manner so as not to cause a public nuisance to neighbours.
- Customers shall not be permitted to congregate on the forecourt outside the premises.

I certify that I have considered the above new application and I wish to make representations.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

Please find below my response to this application.

Sale of Alcohol from 06.30hrs

The sale of alcohol at 06.30hrs encourages persons to purchase and consume alcohol at a very early hour of the morning. Removing such opportunity altogether prevents the licence holder or his staff from having to be in a position to refuse sales and further reduces the chances of alcohol being purchased by customers for consumption at this time.

As I understand the premises opens at 06.30hrs but unfortunately the Licensing Authority cannot use this as a measuring tool for when the supply and display of alcohol for sale should take place. In order to uphold the Licensing objectives, it is necessary that alcohol not be sold at this time of the morning.





There are existing issues surrounding **anti-social behaviour**, **loitering and public drinking** in the immediate area. Permitting an additonal off licence with such timings, I believe would add to the already existing issues and undermine the licensing objectives.

There are also the following two schools in the vicinity of the proposed off licence; Alperton High School and Barham Primary School. In order to avoid children of school age witnessing persons loitering and street drinking, it is proposed that alcohol not be sold before 09.00hrs.

It is therefore proposed that the supply of alcohol be modified from 06.30hrs-23.00hrs to;

09.00hrs-23.00hrs - WE ACCEPT TO SALE AFTER 9am. Although we have also agreed to sale after 10am as this was agreed upon Public Health department representation.

This would go some way in promoting the licensing objectives. In order to further promote the Licensing objectives the following conditions are suggested;

Conditions to be added to the Licence

- CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.- ACCEPTED and AGREED
- A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the entire servery.- ACCEPTED and AGREED
- A sign stating 'No proof of age, No sale' shall be displayed at the point of sale.- ACCEPTED and AGREED
- A 'Challenge 25' policy shall be adopted and adhered to ACCEPTED and AGREED
- No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked or sold.-ACCEPTED and AGREED
- A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.- ACCEPTED and AGREED
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) any complaints received
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
 - -ACCEPTED and AGREED
- A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.-ACCEPTED and AGREED
- Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.-ACCEPTED and AGREED
- Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers, staff who provide training including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation. The training shall cover in particular; how to manage issues in relation to underage sales and dealing with intoxicated persons and street drinkers The training shall be documented and signed off by





the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by police and relevant authorities upon request.-ACCEPTED and AGREED

- No miniature bottles of wine or spirits in units of less than 35cl shall be sold at the premises.-ACCEPTED and AGREED
- No single cans of beers, lagers and ciders shall be stocked or sold at the premises.-ACCEPTED and AGREED
- All alcohol stocked and sold shall be labelled with the name 'DIU'.ACCEPTED and AGREED
- The licensee shall ensure that any activity associated with the premises shall be carried out in such a manner so as not to cause a public nuisance to neighbours.-ACCEPTED and AGREED
- Customers shall not be permitted to congregate on the forecourt outside the premises.-ACCEPTED and AGREED





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

Good quality CCTV is essential as a deterrent for the prevention of crime and the detection of offenders. It allows for both covert and overt monitoring of the premises. With proper signage, this reassures both staff and clientele, that this is a safe environment where illegal activities are not tolerated, especially as the premises is open daily into the early hours of the morning.

All cameras and recording equipment will be installed and maintained in accordance with Home Office Guidance and the manufacturers instructions and will be fully operational when the premises are open to the public.

Police require the following points should be added as conditions on the premises licence as below.

1. CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council upon request.

2. A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance to the premises.

3. A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.

4. A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

5. Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.

6. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the four licensing objectives;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

The Licensing Authority require the following points to be included in the operating schedule or added as conditions on the premises licence:

 - a. all ejections of patrons
 - b. any complaints received
 - c. any incidents of disorder
 - d. any faults in the CCTV system
 - e. all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons

f any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or

scanning equipment

g any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

- 5) A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 6) Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at the exit.
- 7) The licensee shall ensure that any activity associated with the premises shall be carried out in such a manner so as not to cause a public nuisance to neighbour.
- 8) All deliveries shall take place during the normal working day (i.e. 09:00 to 18:00 daily).
