Subject: Re: Gambling Premises Licence Variation - Willesden Green - 30528

I am objecting to the proposed changes to conditions for Casino Slots, 9a Walm Lane.

Safety of staff and customers is important and removing these conditions will increase the risk to staff and customers.

The existing layout already has blind spots and obscuring sight lines further by installing obscured glazing on the door and adjacent windows will reduce sight lines into the premises. Visibility of the far left corner is already blocked by a row of machines. Obscured glass on the door and adjacent window will also block views int the far right corner of the premises. Note that the repeated blocking of the door and windows has shown this to be the case.

With the door and windows obscured staff using the desk/office in the far left corner will not have clear sight lines of the door or the footway outside. So they will not be able to check the age or intoxication levels of a customer until the customer has walked well into the premises and become visible. Also sight lines to the pavement are blocked by the row of machines which are parallel to the pavement.

Lone working is an acknowledged risk. Reducing the number of staff to one will increase this risk. And reducing the number of staff and obscuring sight lines further increases the risk to safety of staff.

I certify that I have considered the above application and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

Officer: Esther Chan – Licensing Inspector

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authroised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Gambling Act 2005

The Licensing Authority representations are primarily concerned with the three licensing objectives;

- Preventing gambling from being a source of crime and disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime
- Ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way
- Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.

Following our recent communication, I have considered your client's proposal to vary the existing conditions attached to the premises licence and propose the following:

Removal of:

- There will be a minimum of 2 staff members present at all times when the premises are open.
- A clear and unobstructed view into the premises is to be maintained. This is to be achieved
 by having clear, non-tinted glass in the entrance door and front windows, no signage or
 visual obstructions on the entrance door, and one of the two window displays as shown on
 the plans submitted and approved with the application.

Replaced with the following new proposed conditions:

- 1) There will be a minimum of 2 staff members present at all times between 12pm to 6am.
- 2) Lone working staff will be provided and required to carry on their person a personal fob alarm which will activate the alarm if pressed by the member of staff or that staff member is lying horizontal for a pre-determined period of time.
- 3) An attack alarm shall be installed and maintained behind the cashier counter which would alert the police.

For the purpose of proportionality and consistency, the Licensing Authority would ask that the aforementioned conditions be applied to the entire licence and not just the varied elements.

In order for the Licensing Authority to withdraw this representation, it will be necessary for you to confirm in writing that your client is willing to accept the above conditions.

Further to your e mail below please see the answers to the questions you have raised - I hope these are helpful but please let me know if you require further information.

Question 1

The proposed variation is to vary the condition which currently reads "There will be a minimum of 2 staff members present at all times when the premises are open" to read "There will be a minimum of 2 staff members present at all times after 12pm".

Please can you confirm what safety measures are in place when staff are lone working?

- Future Leisure (Premises Licence Holder) is a family owned and operated business which takes the safety of its staff very seriously and it has in place measures to protect staff at all times
- The venue has a 16 way CCTV Camera system
- Most importantly this camera system can be viewed in real time by the staff on site and by the area managers and senior management off site at all times ie Senior management can watch the premises on their phone through the CCTV system in real time.
- There are Maglocks fitted to the front door, rear door, toilet and staff office area which can be activated at any time by staff
- The venue has fixed panic buttons linked to the police around the shop.
- There are also 2 remote panic buttons on site at all times which staff have with them and activate at any time
- There is also a system from Staff Guard in place, which is linked to CCTV and the police (it's a remote monitoring station which can talk through to customers and staff in the shop, and respond to any issues)

Question 2.

To remove the condition which reads "A clear and unobstructed view into the
premises is to be maintained. This is to be achieved by having clear, nontinted glass in the entrance door and front windows, no signage or visual
obstructions on the entrance door, and one of the two window displays as
shown on the plans submitted and approved with the application"

Please provide an explanation why your client would like to remove this condition in light that the licensing sub-committee imposed this condition?

- Our clients would like this condition removing mainly for the safety and security of our staff and business. As an example a clear view into the venue exposes staff when they are opening machines.
- Interestingly we have come across licensing authorities who want the opposite of this
 condition to ensure that children and young people cannot see into the venue and what
 is going on inside. It is argued that the licensing objectives are better promoted with no
 clear view etc.
- It is also right to say that customers like privacy.
- The unobstructed view is not helpful in terms of both customer and staff safety
- Looking at other premises in Brent the following all appear not have a clear and unobstructed view. This is not alleging breach of any conditions as we don't know what they are but we do know that these premises do not have a clear and unobstructed view etc



Hope you are well. I am instructed by Future Leisure Ltd who are the operators of the above premises and I have been forwarded your representation of 4th February 2024.

As I am sure you will be aware Licensing Committee hearing has been fixed for 26 February at 2 PM for this application to be considered. I am not sure if you are aware that your representation is the only representation against the application and consequently the need for a Licensing Committee hearing.

I hope in those circumstances you don't mind me contacting you but I thought it might assist if I set out some more information about the application and I would also like to invite you if appropriate having considered this email to meet me and the operators on sites so that we can discuss the matter further.

I have also been in contact with Esther Chan (Brent Licensing Inspector) with regard to this application. Esther asked me for further information about the application and as a result of that information we have agreed with Esther that the two conditions that we are seeking to be removed will be replaced with the following three conditions.

- 1) There will be a minimum of 2 staff members present at all times between 12pm to 6am.
- 2) Lone working staff will be provided and required to carry on their person a personal fob alarm which will activate the alarm if pressed by the member of staff or that staff member is lying horizontal for a pre-determined period of time.
- 3) An attack alarm shall be installed and maintained behind the cashier counter which would alert the police

As a result of this agreement Esther has withdrawn any representation against this application and there is no representation from the police.

I am attaching my email to Esther of 1 February which sets out more information about the family-owned business, security and safety measures on site in particular for the staff and an explanation as to why our client is seeking to remove the conditions.

You will note from the email that my clients is a small family-owned business and I can assure you that safety and security of customers and staff is paramount and that in fact that is the reason for the application.

The open frontage or partially open frontage offers an opportunity both for children and young people to look into the venue which in several cases I have been involved

in has been suggested as not being appropriate but also for those who may want to cause trouble to watch the customers inside the venue. It also creates an opportunity for those outside the venue to notice when staff are emptying the machines which in our view is not beneficial to customers or staff for obvious reasons.

I wonder if you would read my email to Esther which sets out all the safety information and note the above conditions agreed and let me know if there is any further information you require. I can confirm that my client would be more than happy to meet you on site as well.
