Please note that this application is made following the lapsing of the previous Licence. The intention is to exactly reproduce the conditions on the previous Licence. The previous condition number is given to assist in this regard.

Snacks shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided. (7)

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to Police and authorised officers from Brent Council upon request. This must comply with the Data Protection Act including signage.(1)

A copy of the Premises Licence Summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance of the premises.(2) Customers shall not be permitted to take open glass containers outside the premises as defined on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.(3)

A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol when the premises are holding a private function.(4)

The total number of people permitted on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 150.(5)

No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 23:00 hours Sunday to Thursday and 23:30 hours Friday and Saturday and on Mondays where seasonal variations apply.(8) An incident log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police which will record the following:

- All crimes reported to the venue
- All ejections of patrons
- Any complaints received
- Any incidents of disorder
- All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service (19)

Any staff directly involved in selling alcohol for retail to consumers, staff who provide training including managers shall undergo regular training of the Licensing Act 2003 legislation. The training shall be documented and signed off by the DPS and the member of staff receiving the training. This training log shall be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by the Police and relevant authorities upon request.(20) On the days when door supervisors are required a door supervisor shall be located at the entrance of the beer garden to supervise the area. (25)

c) Public safety

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A noise limiting device set at a level agreed by Environmental Health shall be installed and shall be operated at all times when the premises are open to the public and when regulated entertainment is taking place.(11)

Both sets of entrance/exit doors to the back room shall be lobbied doors.(12) No music shall be audible at or within the site boundary or any residential property.(13) No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification shall be sited on or near the exterior of the premises or in any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises.(14)

Signs shall be placed in the beer garden/on the frontage instructing patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The

management shall reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it felt that they could be disturbing neighbours.(15)

There shall be no queuing outside the premises.(16)

When door supervisors are employed they shall ensure patrons leave the premises in a prompt and courteous manner. (17)

When door supervisors are employed they shall patrol the curtilage of the premises to prevent patrons urinating in public areas.(18)

No regulated entertainment or television shall be permitted in the beer garden.(26) No alcohol shall be consumed in the beer garden after 23:00 hours.(27)

No smoking shall be permitted at the front of the premises.(28)

e) The protection of children from harm

A Challenge 25 policy shall be adopted and adhered to.(6) No children shall be permitted on the premises after 22:00 hours.(10) No children shall be admitted unless accompanied by a responsible adult. (9)

 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
