I am employed by the London Borough of Brent as a Licensing Officer. My duties include enforcing the Licensing Act 2003. On 31 <sup>st</sup> January 2012 I visited 203 Kilburn High London NW6 7HY. Mr Ali was not present. Gulnaz Hayat was present with another male who claimed to be a friend. I noted that the premises licence was not displayed. I advised Gulnaz Hayat that it was an offence not to display the licence and Mr Ali should display it as soon as possible. On March 16 <sup>th</sup> 2012 another visit was carried out.
