He states that he purchased the wine from "Champers" 247 High Road, Kilburn NW6 and that he has receipts for all the goods but he could not produce them at the time. He states that Champers also have an alcohol warehouse in Park Royal.

Mr Ali has an office at the left rear of the shop.

At the right rear of the shop is a hallway leading to three small rooms and a further two rooms on the first floor at a flight of stairs at the rear. Theses rooms are being rented out to two people in each room, one occupant stated that she was paying £380 a month to rent the room between the pair of them. They all share a toilet and shower and the kitchen sink and cooker, situated in the hall. The space is very cramped and unsuitable in my opinion for lodgings and a fire hazard. I could not see any fire extinguishers or alarms but did not expressly look for them at the time. There is an exit which was obstructed by bicycles which led to a small enclosed yard filled with household rubbish. Some steps led from this yard to a basement area under the shop next door (201) but due to the rubbish these could not be accessed.

Visit 14/11/12 by Ms Miller-Johnson Licensing enforcement officer Brent in response to the above calls to Police, a dispute between landowners and leaseholder. Spoken with Ram (landowners), he states that Mr Ali isn't paying any rent and owes him between £85,000- £134,000. The landowners say that Mr Ali should not be using the front of the premise as this is not within his lease. I have asked Mr Ali to submit documents and evidence of payment to staff to prove he is not subletting the forecourt. If he can prove this to me then this is a civil matter for the courts. (court is to take place on Monday 26th November 2012). Mr Ali sometimes goes by the name Jahvid Hussain.

The evidence I have provided for this review shows that Mr Ali is not a fit and proper person to be running a licence premise. This was proved at the previous premise he operated in Brent where the licence was revoked. Mr Ali has not made any improvements in his approach to promoting the licensing objectives since then. If Mr Ali was consistent with the names he uses Brent Police would have objected to him holding a premises licence in Brent for second time. Unfortunately there is not a national data base for personal licence holders and to become a DPS for premises there is no legal requirement to produce your date of birth. Mr Ali committed offences under section 128 of the licensing act by failing to inform the court he was the holder of a personal licence when he was
