Therefore I also object to the alterations of the Premises License for both the increase in the number of people allowed in the premises and the later opening hours.

This establishment is in the vicinity of one of the worse crime hotspots in Brent. Previously when this establishment was allowed later licensing hours the anti social behaviour was so bad that the licence was altered to the current conditions. We can expect a worsening of the ASB situation if this proposal is allowed to go ahead.

I therefore object to both the increase in the number of people allowed to be on the premises and the latter opening hours in respect of;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance
