An officer of the Metropolitan Police, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a 'Responsible Authority' under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to vary the premises licence under section 34 of the act.

The Police representations are concerned with crime and disorder and public nuisance.

This premise is currently open to the public until 0200 hours daily. The application is to increase these hours to 0400 hours daily.

Police object to this variation. 0200 hours is a suitable time for a premise in a residential area to close, this was discussed with the applicant when he first applied for the late licence.

Complaints have been received by Police in relation to noise nuisance from the venue in the early hours.

Police and local authority licensing officers have visited the premises and witnessed breaches of the premises licence conditions, namely conducting licensable activities after the authorised time, no entry after 2330 hours, premises licence not displayed and alcohol in the smoking area after 2300 hours.

The hours requested are excessive and not appropriate for this area.
