Thank you for this. I would, however, say the following:

1. The statutory period for dealing with a variation application does not have flexibility for delay. If there are outstanding representations, there will need to be a sub-committee hearing within 20 working days of the end of the consultation period.
2. On that basis, the variation will need to be heard prior to the review. You have requested that your evidence bundle be referred to as a representation in respect of this variation. We have explained in our application, however, that the condition in question we believe is unlawful as it attempts to condition something that is not licensable activity under this or any other act. We believe that to do so breaches various legislation at domestic and EU level. For these reasons, I don't think it's sufficient to just refer to crime and disorder evidence from a review application and read this over to an application that is unconnected to the review, on different subject matter and refers to activity that is not licensable. I should be grateful therefore if you and Marie could reconsider this.

I am also looking forward to discussing with you impact of the voluntary measures my client is currently implementing, which as you know are quite closely aligned with the interim steps arising from the Summary Review hearing on 9 December last year. When we proposed some quite minor (and we would say, reasonable) revisions to these conditions, the response from the police was simply that operating under these were our clients' risk. Whilst this is of course the case, I would welcome your input on which of these you felt did not adequately promote the licensing objectives, and which might be something we could look to implement going forwards. You may of course wish to leave this all to the review hearing, but I think there is benefit to at least have a discussion about these measures beforehand which is why I am keen to do so.
