Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

(a) No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when no designated premises supervisor has been specified in the licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his or her licence has been suspended.

(b) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

(c) All persons present on the premises who are required to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Admission of children must be restricted according to film classification.

(d) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(e) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

(f) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

(g) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(h) The responsible person shall ensure that-

(i) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- beer or cider: half pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(ii) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Embedded Conditions

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

- 1 CCTV shall be installed and maintained in a working condition and every possible and practicable step shall be taken to ensure the system is fully operational when the premises are open to the public.
- 2 All CCTV recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998).
- 3 Staff will be instructed that persons who look under 21 years must be asked for identification before they will be sold alcohol.
- 4 Promotions that promote irresponsible drinking shall not be permitted.
- 5 Every possible and practicable step shall be taken to prevent customers bringing open or sealed bottles on to the premises.
- 6 Every possible and practicable step shall be taken to prevent customers taking open containers of alcohol off the premises.
- 7 The consumption of alcohol shall be restricted to those parts of the premises identified on the plan submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
- 8 A minimum of two door staff shall be employed from 21:00 hours in a ratio of at least 1 to every 50 customers on any day when an event is held.
- 9 A register/log containing the names, badge number, dates & times of duty of security staff and any incidents that occur shall be kept and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.

- 10 The total number of people permitted on the premises including staff and performers shall not exceed 200, this figure will not be exceeded without the express permission of the Licensing Authority.
- 11 A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.
- 12 Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages (including free drinking water) shall be available during the whole of licensed hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
- 13 Notices shall be placed at each public entrance which clearly states the premises policy on admission and searching.
- 14 Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 7 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority:
 - Dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - Smoke machines and fog generators
 - Pyrotechnics including fireworks
 - Motor vehicles
 - Lasers
 - Explosives and highly flammable substances
- 15 Notices asking customers to leave quietly shall be conspicuously displayed at all exits.
- 16 Noise and vibration shall not be allowed to emanate from the premises so as to cause nuisance to near by properties.
- 17 Under 18's shall not be permitted on the premises if the style of entertainment offered or operation is not conducive.
- 18 No entry or re-entry shall be permitted after 02:00 hours any smokers leaving for that purpose shall be checked out and back by door supervisors.
- 19 The Licensee shall undertake a risk assessment of any significant promotion or event, using the Metropolitan Police Service Promotion/Event Risk Assessment Form (Form 696) or an equivalent and provide a copy to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit not less than 14 days before the event is due to take place.
- 20 Where an event has taken place the licensee shall complete a Debrief Risk Assessment Form (Form 696A) and submit this to the Metropolitan Police and Brent Council's Licensing Unit within 3 days of the conclusion of the event.
- 21 The locks and flush latches on the exit doors and gates shall be unlocked and kept free from fastenings other than push bars and pads whilst the public are on the premises.

- 22 The socket outlets (or other power supplies used for DJ equipment, band equipment and other portable equipment) that are accessible to performers, staff or the public shall be suitably protected by a residual current device (RCD having a rated residual operating current not exceeding 30 milliamps).
- 23 A fire shutter shall be fitted where the kitchen serving hatch is within the exit route. The fire shutter will automatically close when the fire alarm is activated
- 24 No shisha to be served after 0000 hrs. Mon-Sun
- 25 A maximum of 20 people will be allowed to smoke cigarettes without drink in the beer garden up to 0000 hrs. Mon-Sun
