PROTECTIVE MARKING

Sudbury A-Z News is currently authorised to supply alcohol for consumption OFF of the premises. The venue has a converted premises licence from 2005 with traditional 'Off' licence permitted hours and no conditions attached. The premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor are one and the same; Mr. Liqat NUTT.

Sudbury A-Z News is failing to promote three of the licensing objectives, namely prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and prevention of public nuisance.

Police have no faith in the ability of the management to operate the premises responsibly under the current authority and therefore wish to bring the matter before the sub-committee for consideration. Police are primarily concerned with disregard of licensing legislation and sales of alcohol to drunks who cause anti social behaviour around the neighbourhood. Police have witnessed this and in addition have received complaints from local residents.

Police seek the addition of conditions to the premises licence to support the DPS who struggles to promote the licensing objectives sufficiently at this present time. The following conditions are requested by Police to be attached to the licence:

CCTV maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.

A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises

This would help provide evidence to Police of troublesome customers who threaten staff in the shop if refused sales.

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked: this type of alcohol is purchased by Street drinkers and rough sleepers in the area who are responsible for causing crime and disorder.

Outside the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff: this supports the DPS and prevents him from breaching licensing legislation by selling or display alcohol outside the licensable hours, but the shop can open for sales of other groceries.

Anti-robbery time delay safe: a viable crime prevention measure for commercial premises that are open late at night or early in the morning when small shops are susceptible to robbery.

A clear and unobstructed view in to the shop: this provides reassurance to staff and also prevents criminal activity on the premises.

A sign stating "No proof of age – No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale. A "Challenge 21" policy shall be adopted and adhered to: these helps the DPS and staff comply with licensing legislation.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Written staff training to be given regularly and signed records for inspection by local authority enforcement officers and Police.

Police feel these requests are in keeping with the Licence holders human rights and promote the running of his business and livelihood. These conditions are wholly reasonable, proportionate and appropriate measure to be put in place to promote the licensing objectives.

PROTECTIVE MARKING

For several years the Sudbury Town Residents Association have been working closely with relevant authorities to try and make Sudbury a safer, cleaner commercial area. This has led to joint working weeks of action including out reach workers to deal with rough sleepers and street drinkers.

On WEDNESDAY 6th August 2014 at 1625 hours uniformed patrolling Police officers noticed several males as well as females outside SUDBURY A-Z NEWSAGENTS surrounded on the grass area by discarded alcohol cans and bottles. The shop was open to the public and Police entered the shop. They spoke to Mr Liaqat Ali NUTT. Whilst in the shop Police witnessed those drunks, entering the premises buying alcohol contrary to Section 141 of the Licensing Act 2003. See attached statement from PC Shippey.

On 15th August 2014 Mr NUTT attended Brent Civic Centre for a meeting with Brent Police Licensing team and Esther Chan Brent Council Licensing enforcement Officer. We spoke about the incident on 6th August and he explained the difficulties of operating an off licence in that area. It would appear he is under pressure and sometime threatened by persons wanting to buy alcohol when the shop is open but outside authorised licensable hours (I.E. first thing in the morning). The grass area outside the front of the shop becomes a gathering area, and he is the nearest off licence to purchase alcohol.

Because of what Mr NUTT explained and his desperation, Police regard this review to be the most efficient method to promote the licensing objectives and support MR NUTT's business.
