I am making this statement with regards to the ongoing street drinking problem in the Oakington Manor Drive area of Wembley. I am the Dedicated Ward Officer for Tokyngton Ward, in which Oakington Manor Drive is located. Over the past two years the residential area of Oakington Manor Drive and the surrounding roads has experienced a large number of incidents of street-drinking, particularly involving people from the Polish community. There are two main locations where the street-drinkers can usually be found, the first is the service road behind Monks Park Gardens and the second is the junction of Oakington Manor Drive and Harrow Road and behind Neeld Parade. At this second location is a public toilet block. The entrance to this block is littered with empty beer cans and glass bottles. This junction is the main entrance into the residential area and is regularly used by pedestrians. Tokyngton Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) has received numerous complaints from residents over the course of the two years about these street-drinkers. They leave a lot of litter behind, they have been alleged to be verbally aggressive to passers-by who ask them to take the litter with them and they have been seen to urinate and

Tokyngton SNT has taken several steps to stop this behaviour including requesting help from Brent Council in order to clear the litter. In May 2014, as part of the Tokyngton Week of Action the council completely cleared the rubbish from both Neeld Parade and the junction. Unfortunately in the space of a week the area was again littered with cans and bottles. I must point out that the rubbish is almost exclusively drinks containers, not general domestic or industrial waste. Tokyngton SNT has also issued warnings to anyone seen drinking alcohol in public in these locations as well as confiscated all alcohol found on these persons. On some occasions, when particular street-drinkers have refused to surrender their alcohol fines have been issued.
