## **Licensing Representation to the Application to the Review of the Premises Licence for Green Man, 125 Sough Lane, London, NW9 8YG**

I certify that I have considered the application shown above and I wish to make representations that the likely effect of the grant of the application is detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the reasons indicated below.

An officer of the Licensing Authority, in whose area the premises are situated, who is authorised for the purposes of exercising its statutory function as a ‘Responsible Authority’ under the Licensing Act 2003.

The application has been made to review the premises licence under section 51 of the Act.

The Licensing Authority may make representations concerning any of the four licensing objectives below;

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- the prevention of public nuisance; and
- the protection of children from harm.

### **Observations**

A visit took place on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> July at 21.00hrs. The following issue was found at the premises during my visit.

---

On arrival at the premise whilst checking the plans, it was noted that approximately half of the building was missing as this had been knocked down. In order to have the correct permission to operate a Premises Licence, you are required to submit the correct plan of the premise. As I understand the Premises Licence was transferred to yourselves on 21<sup>st</sup> July 2015 and as the new Premises Licence Holder, I would now ask that you submit a MINOR VARIATION APPLICATION in order to be able to submit the amended plans of the changed premise. This will need to be submitted immediately.
