Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Price of Alcohol

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- **2.** For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) —duty∥ is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) —permitted price is the price found by applying the formula—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the

alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to

the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) —relevant personll means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) —relevant personl means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) —valued added taxll means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first dayll) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second dayll) as a result of a change to the rat e of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Requirement for a DPS

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated

Embedded Conditions

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

Alcohol shall only be sold between the times specified:

On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, between 08:00 and 23:00 hours

On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, between 10:00 and 22:30 hours

On Christmas Day, from 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30 hours

On Good Friday, between 08:00 and 22:30 hours

Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

- 1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers if requested.
- 2 A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.
- 3 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked.
- Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff
- 5 Anti-robbery time delay safe shall be installed and used.
- 6 A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times
- 7 A sign stating "No proof of age No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- 9 A "Challenge 21" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue

- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- Written staff training shall be given regularly and signed records for inspection by local authority enforcement officers and Police shall be made available on demand.
- 12 There shall be no sale of single cans of alcohol at any time.
- All high strength beers, lagers and ciders above 6.0% ABV currently stocked on the premises to be removed by midnight on 8 December 2014.
