Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule

1 A CCTV which is fit for purpose will be in operation at the site and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and licensing officers upon reasonable request.

2 A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises.

3 A 'Challenge 21' policy shall be adopted and adhered to with appropriate signage displayed at the point of sale.

4 A refusal book shall be kept and maintained.

5 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 5.5% ABV shall be stocked with the exception of premium beers.

6 A suitable intruder alarm complete with panic button shall be fitted and maintained.

7 The window adjacent to the cashier will be kept clear and unobstructed at all times the business is open for trade.


8 Customers shall be served through the night hatch and not allowed entry into the premises (save in exceptional circumstances) between 23:00 hours and 06:00 hours daily. For the avoidance of doubt, management, staff members and associates shall be permitted access to the premises.
