It is perceived that there will be a moderate impact on traffic as Play Streets would not be acceptable on traffic sensitive streets, i.e. bus routes, Principal classified (A) roads or non-Principal Classified (B and C) roads.

What did you find out from consultation or data analysis?

Play Streets is a community led initiative with local residents in collaboration with London Play which is a grant funded organisation (established in 1998) to be a catalyst for the cohesive, strategic and rational development of play provision across London.

A meeting was held on 18th May 2015 with London Play to learn from their experiences and those of other Local Authorities that they have worked with, on how Play Streets can be successfully introduced in Brent. London Play initially contacted the Council in support of a request from residents of Kempe Road to operate a Play Street. It was agreed that a trial Play Street in Kempe Road would be beneficial in developing the process/initiative. Guidance Notes and an application form was produced and through completing the application form, residents have to prove that they have the support of the local community and provide a list of supporters for the closure of a road.

- 7. Could any of the impacts you have identified be unlawful under the Equality Act 2010?
 - No

This is a community led initiative with local residents arranging for stewards to be provided at each end of the closure and whereby access for traffic will be maintained at all times.

8. What actions will you take to enhance any potential positive impacts that you have identified?

The Play Streets initiative has the aim of bringing together communities of all ages and races to promote and encourage children to play in a safe environment. The initiative will built an effective partnership between Brent and the local residents/community of all ages, race, backgrounds and encourage a strong consensus amongst organisers about the perceived benefits of the initiative for people of all ages and races getting together.

9. What actions will you take to remove or reduce any potential negative impacts that you have identified?

Play Streets will be a community led initiative where traffic for the purpose of access will be maintained at all times. The closure of the highway does take note of the special requirements of various disabilities. Organisers will have to adhere to strict guidance notes and residents will need to make arrangements to provide stewards at each end of the closure which would allow people to access their disabled persons parking place at all times or for people with a disability to have access as usual.
