Good Morning

Further to our telephone conversation and your suggestion to put in a variation on your clients Licence, if you are still minded to take this course of action, then the conditions below are what I would be looking for.
I have considered the request for certain beers above 6% to be sold and after further research of the area would be against this being added.
Please discuss the below with your client and advise me as to what your decision is within the next 5 days, otherwise I will have to consider other options of dealing with your clients premises.

CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.

A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises and further cameras installed to cover the (*name area*).

A sign stating "No proof of age – No sale" shall be displayed at the point of sale.

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be adopted and adhered to.

A refusal book detailing date and time of the refused sale and the name of the person refusing the sale shall be kept and maintained and made available for inspection.

No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.0% ABV shall be stocked.

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder

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- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

A copy of the premises licence summary including the hours which licensable activities are permitted shall be visible from the outside of each entrance to the premises.

A personal licence holder shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

No single cans or bottles of beer or cider shall be sold

No miniature bottles of spirits to be sold

A clear and unobstructed view into the premises shall be maintained at all times.
