Police arrived and saw a male who was very drunk and so the police advised staff not to sell him any alcohol. When the police arrived, there was a group there who were intoxicated and hostile to police <b>(No CCTV capture by Council Camera)</b></p>	37-75  77-87	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Police do not know where the stabbing took place-just in the street (p43)</li> <li>• Police looked at the CCTV from the supermarket; CCTV later supplied (p61);</li> <li>• Other nearby shops not able to provide CCTV even though they were open;</li> <li>• The suspect was pointed out to police by a customer (p55)</li> <li>• Suspect arrested and interviewed (p64)</li> <li>• No further Action (NFA)-(p74)</li> <li>• Not gang-related (p83)</li> </ul>

3	05/3/2016	Midnight-onwards	<p><b><u>Sale to drunken person</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 2 officers in an unmarked police vehicle say they witnessed two groups outside the shop in a party mood;</li> <li>• Two workers sell alcohol to drunks (later issued with fixed penalty notices £90)</li> </ul> <p><b><u>PC Sullivan speaks to Farooq Khan by telephone</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mr Khan had already been told;</li> <li>• When asked why the shop stayed open, Mr Khan explained it was very busy during that time and it was to avoid a queue at the window;</li> <li>• Mr Khan knew there was a condition about the window use only after 11pm. Mr Khan said he'd do it from now;</li> <li>• Mr Khan was also told that his staff feared for their safety because of the late hours and the sale of high strength alcohol.</li> </ul>		
4	6/3/2016		<p><b><u>Party atmosphere</u></b></p> <p>People having a 'party' in the street. One was playing the Bongos; there was singing and people were going in and out of shops, opening alcohol and re-joining the party-police serial deployed</p> <p><b><u>Under-age sale</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Test purchase by a 17-year old police cadet</li> <li>• Sold alcohol without challenge</li> <li>• Shop assistant (Shahbaz Azam) interviewed under caution – admitted offence</li> </ul>
