On Sunday 26th JUNE 2016 I was on duty in uniform. I was in a marked police carrier, call sign Serial 101, in company with PC 153QK BROWN and PC 151QK CAMBEIRO. We were on patrol when we accepted a call to THE COCK TAVERN, KILBURN HIGH ROAD, NW6 to a male who had been stabbed (CAD 7428/26JUN16 refers)

We arrived on scene and I could see PC 834QK D'ARCY-COLLINS giving first aid to a male on the floor. I now know this male to be Mr [REDACTED] I asked PC 834QK what he needed and he needed witnesses speaking to as the suspect may be in the pub. Another male was pointed out who was wearing a black T-Shirt and had a bit of blood on his nose. I now know this male to be Mr [REDACTED] PC 153QK BROWNE spoke to this male while I tried to find the manager of the pub.

I approached a male who identified himself as the manger. I now know this male to be Mr [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] There was also another male who identified himself as the licensee. I now know this male to be Mr [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] They were both gave a similar account that two males had been causing a problem and then some people from the pub attacked them. After a bit of questioning their stories started becoming a bit vague and they were making allegations of various so I asked to see the CCTV.

They took me up to the office and I viewed the following on their CCTV system;

These are the people involved that I can identify from CCTV.

- [REDACTED] - Customer inside pub who was with his wife (wearing yellow top) and victim who received stab wound. He was wearing a black vest.
- [REDACTED] - Customer inside pub. He was wearing a black T-Shirt.

- Unknown customer in pub that has helped bar staff. He was wearing a light short sleeve shirt, jean shorts, flip flops and a light hat, trilby summer style.
- Mr [REDACTED] -Licensee of the pub. He was wearing a light shirt and cream trousers
- Mrs [REDACTED] - Wife of [REDACTED] She was wearing a white top.
- Mr [REDACTED] - Manager of pub. Believe he was wearing a light coloured long sleeve shirt.
- Mr [REDACTED] - Bar staff and son of [REDACTED] He was wearing a dark hooded zip up jacket and

dark T-Shirt underneath.

Mr [REDACTED] - Bar staff. He was wearing all dark clothing.

Customer in the pub wearing a green football top involved in the first disturbance.

[REDACTED] is wearing a black T-shirt and appears to be causing a disturbance in the pub (there is no audio but his actions would suggest it). It would appear he is being asked to leave by [REDACTED] but is refusing and has to be led out. [REDACTED] then appears to become violent, clenching his fists as if he is about to fight.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have to physically remove him as he is being violent. Once outside [REDACTED] is still coming back as if he wants to fight. At this point other customers have come to the front of the pub and [REDACTED] has also come to the front of the pub and appears to be trying to take [REDACTED] away.

[REDACTED] keeps going back and has a go at some people and throws a punch at the man in the green football shirt which looks like it connects. This has then started the first disturbance where the man in the green top has punched [REDACTED] a number of times till he fell to the floor. I believe [REDACTED] was also throwing punches at people.

[REDACTED] has then attacked the man in the green football shirt but fallen to the floor while doing this. He may have been hit by someone else.

There are some verbals but then the man in the green football has left them both once they have stopped attacking him. I believe he went back into the pub.

[REDACTED] has then kept going back to the door of the pub and looking like he wants a fight. After a while he confronts [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] wife is also stood there.

[REDACTED] throws a punch at [REDACTED] which grazes his wife's - [REDACTED] - nose and looks like it hits [REDACTED] in the face.

This is when the main fight kicks off. [REDACTED] pushes and kicks [REDACTED] back and is joined by a number of other people, [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and the unknown male.

[REDACTED] has been the main attacker at the start, throwing a sign board at [REDACTED] and then the rest appear to join in. This is when the fight has gone round the side of the pub and out of CCTV view for a short time.

During this time [REDACTED] has taken a chair from outside the front of the pub and taken it round the corner. It is unknown what she has done with this chair but seconds later the fight comes back into camera view and [REDACTED] has the chair. He smashes it over [REDACTED] and there is more fighting.

The unknown male then throws a punch at [REDACTED] which hits him in his chest. This would be the area where [REDACTED] has suffered the stab wound. He is also hit by [REDACTED] it appears in the chest area as well where the injury is. It is not clear enough on the CCTV but this could be when [REDACTED] has been stabbed. After these hits the fight dies down and [REDACTED] is holding his chest and keeps lifting up his vest.

The unknown male looks IC2, shortish, probably around 5'8 but it is hard to tell from CCTV. Medium build with dark hair and a bald spot at the back. He was wearing a light short sleeve top, looked like denim shorts and white flip flops. He also had a light summer style trilby hat.

After this everyone goes back inside the pub.

I copied the CCTV onto a USB stick.
