**We strongly object to Premise Licence at Sudbury Primary School and advise the authorities not to approve licence for below purposes**

Regulated Entertainment (plays, films, live music, recorded music, performance of dance, anything of similar description)

Monday to Thursday – 8am to 12am  
Friday to Saturday - 8am to 3am  
Sunday - 8am to 2am

#### **Late Night Refreshments**

Monday to Thursday – 11pm to 12am  
Friday to Saturday - 11pm to 3am  
Sunday - 11pm to 2am

#### **Supply of Alcohol**

Monday to Thursday – 12pm to 12am  
Friday to Saturday - 12pm to 3am  
Sunday - 12pm to 2am

**We live exactly opposite Sudbury Primary School and anticipate following issues if above proposal is approved:**

1. Due to loud music the residents in nearby buildings will not be able to sleep at night including the elderly council tenants in our block i.e. Elmstrees House and from Bishops court apartments where most of the people are elderly and vulnerable. Few years ago a group had organised Navratri Festival (Indian Dance and Music festival for 9 days) at Vale Farm . Few elderly people could not tolerate loud music for late night even for 1 day and the organisers were compelled to close the session latest by 9.30 pm for rest of the 8 days for health and safety reasons.
2. Giving permission for alcohol will put the nearby residents at risk with possible increase in the antisocial behaviour including vandalism, burglary and mugging. Residents of Elmtrees house have already reported to Brent council and BHP regarding the antisocial behaviour where boys and girls come and smoking and drugs and talk loudly and cases of mugging have happened and residents are scared to go out even to the bus stop at night because of these incidents. This might increase the frequency of similar incidents with people getting drunk on lot of occasions. The attendees of the proposed entertainment are more likely to be getting fully drunk and misbehave which would increase crimes related to drinking.
3. Also If the permission is granted for above purpose, Elmtrees House will become more insecure and unsafe place to live, and risk to residents will increase,being right opposite to school. The Council has failed to safeguard the residents during unsocial hours due to lack of staff.
4. Residents of Elmtrees House have also reported the parking issues faced during the school times when parents come to drop off and pick up their children and block the entrance of the building by using the entrance space as parking or drop off/pick up point. If any residents wants to go out or come in during these times they have to wait on Perrin road for these people to vacate the entrance. It is very likely that after the approval of above proposal lot of people will use the building for parking and

residents will face a similar problem at night also which they are facing during the day.

5. The school MUST be used for educating children and organising school functions rather than using it for activities similar to those of Night Club activities.

We strongly object to above proposition and advise the authorities not to approve licence for above purposes.
