

Objections received on 11/07/2016 from Suchdev, Mr Sanjay

Hi,

I would like to make a number of objections against this. This is also on behalf of Mr Prakash Suchdev (my father), Mrs Rama Suchdev (my mother).

Since the functions outside of the school hours have started (without alcohol) we have had to call the police a numerous amount of times.

We have had issues with local parking in the area due to the lack of parking in the school. The noise from the functions can be heard inside the house.

Furthermore, during school hours we have been victim to threatening behaviour from parents and major issues with people blocking driveways.

This application would be totally unfair for the local residence on the street as we currently have to deal with the school Mon-Fri causing disruption on the streets and noise pollution coming directly into our house (from a speaker which is facing from the school), we have a number of residence on the street that would like to appeal this and feel that all complaints made so far have fallen on deaf ears.

If this application were to pass, we as the residence of the street believe this will cause the following:

- 1) Noise pollution coming from these events
- 2) Drunk people wandering the streets causing more threatening and violent behaviour (currently without alcohol we have had to call the police due to event go'ers blocking driveways and making noise, and causing issues for local residence)
- 3) further issues to parking

This school is also on a residential road, so I do not understand how this can be permitted, there is a housing estate opposite with small children and a small play area for children opposite the school, I strongly disagree that this would be safe to let drunk people walk around where children are playing.

I can supply plenty of evidence supporting the abuse we have received from people using the schools facilities, ranging from police cases to photographic evidence of dangerous parking.

The scale of the application is wholly inappropriate. The school is surrounded by residential properties, and the residents could be very inconvenienced by activities which potentially could take place every day until very late hours. While my house is not adjacent to the school, it is near enough for us to be affected by noise and street activities.

I do not object to the occasional function being held at the school, but would suggest that any outdoor music or other organised activities should not be permitted after 10pm, and indoor activities should end by 11pm on any night.

It is hard to believe that there would be more than a few genuinely school-related functions per year, so it would seem reasonable to limit the number permitted to perhaps 2 per calendar month.

We would be most concerned if the school were to create a substitute public house or night club on its premises, which it appears would be possible if the application is allowed.

I am very concerned about the proposed license of Sudbury Primary School for a number of reasons. I live with my family in a house which borders the school, yet we have received no correspondence with regards to this license from the school. We do experience a great deal of noise during the daytime already, and can hear the children during breaktimes and the tannoy announcements through double glazing. If this noise were to continue into the evenings, it would disturb the quiet of the area and make our lives intolerable. Furthermore, the school suffers during the daytime with traffic problems, in particular illegal parking on Perrin Road. These problems would continue on into the evening if the license was to go ahead, and I can only imagine further illegal parking, possibly spilling onto the surrounding roads. This makes the area dangerous, especially to me as a cyclist, but may also prevent access to emergency vehicles. I often see Perrin Road become impassable in the mornings due to inconsiderate drivers, even though I have heard the school has put in place a number of measures to avoid traffic problems.

I am also worried that the nighttime wildlife of our area will be affected. We have bats and foxes visiting our garden every night, for many years, and I know the foxes come from the wildlife area within the school grounds. With the added lights and noise, these animals will surely be displaced.

Additionally, I worry about the behaviour of the prospective patrons after consuming too much alcohol. There are a few parks and playgrounds nearby where children play throughout the day, which may become gathering points for drunken revellers. I believe this could also cause a great friction in our community, with a large Muslim population.

I can only imagine taking your child to school, to be overwhelmed by the smell of alcohol from the bins, perhaps litter or worse in the streets. Who will be doing the cleaning up?

This is a residential area and the proposed licensing times and conditions are ludicrous.

Events already taking place at the school are causing immense parking noise disruption to residents. We find it impossible to find parking. There will be huge numbers of people parking, leaving, chatting, laughing, creating huge noise disruption till 3am in this residential neighbourhood. This will be a disaster for this area. On top of that, there is huge potential for all types of crime to escalate as well. The quality of life in this neighbourhood will be severely diminished by the activities taking place till 3am in the morning. It is a human right to be entitled to a peaceful night. Brent council introduced the controlled parking zone for Wembley Stadium event days to protect residents in Brent from the same form of noise and disruption that would be caused from these activities permitted under this proposed license. In fact, the effects will be ten times worse compared to what the effects would be if there was no controlled parking zone for event days as the disruption will be concentrated in the residential area around the school rather than the whole area around Wembley stadium. Also, the events in Wembley only affect residents on certain days and if there wasn't a controlled parking zone, this license proposal will affect local residents on a daily basis until early morning. Common sense and quality of human life over money must prevail for the residents

surrounding the school who already have to cope with the disruption caused by this ever expanding school and therefore, this license application must be rejected.

Objections received on 17/07/2016 from Fabusuyi, Miss Sade

This is an anti social plan which does not add any value to the local community. I live opposite the school and even with the current licence until 12pm, noise from activities at the function room can be heard very distinctly. Prior to the school having an official function facility, we experienced problems with anti social behaviour from social functions at the school during the weekend, which included loud music, drunken and anti social behaviour, police being called to public disorder incidents and litter.

I am very concerned that should permission be granted to the school for functions beyond midnight, residents may experience the same or similar disruption during the weekend. As well as weekdays. Please be aware that this area is a residential one . I note that during my 18 years of residence on this road, the school has made no attempts to make any links with or to the local community, and this includes managing the disruption caused by inconsiderate parking by parents during the school day - mornings and afternoons In particular. There appears to be no assurances provided with this plan or by the school to ensure there no disruption to residents including management of increased traffic/ parking, litter and noise. I oppose this plan.

- Prevention of crime and disorder

-Public Safety

-Prevention of Public Nuisance

Allowing the business to run any event they choose up until late at night whenever they want, up until midnight on weekdays, 3am on weekends and 2am on Sundays, is contrary to all three of these points. Since there will be no meaningful control over what events are run and when the events are run, the area is likely to become a hotbed for drunk and disorderly behaviour and public nuisance, thereby endangering public safety in the area.

- Protection of children from harm

The application for all of the other activities from 8am on schooldays may significantly increase traffic in the area at exactly the time when children are walking to school (and again in the afternoon), potentially endangering the children on their way to and from the school. I suggest that if accepted the license should specifically exclude peak times for children travelling.

More importantly, and of particular concern in the license application, is the application to supply alcohol on a school premises during school opening times! How can it be acceptable to supply alcohol on school premises from mid-day during the school day? This is explicitly a danger to children.

Dear Ms Downs

I have tried but failed to find the relevant papers about this on the Brent Council Website. I am therefore writing to you and request that you pass on my comments to the relevant officers.

I oppose the application by Sudbury Primary School for extended alcohol license up to 3am in the morning.

Sudbury Primary School is an educational institution and not a Pub.

Public money has been spent to provide the school with a new Hall intended for the benefit of primarily for the benefit of the pupils and the school. While suitable ancillary uses by the local school and surrounding community are acceptable - uses which extend until 3am in the morning in the middle of a residential area are not.

As a past Councillor for the area I am aware of past problems created by late lettings and the fact that the relationship between the school and the residents has not been good. This is mainly caused by the failure of the school to engage properly. This has become worse since the school became an Academy without positive influence from the local Education Authority.

As your officers will be aware the school has expanded over the past few years. It has always been in the middle of a residential area. There is a block of Sheltered Accommodation flats for around 50 residents nearby and many residents' homes either back into or are directly opposite the school just a few metres away.

The residents already endure the usual problems of inconsiderate driving and parking by parents during the day. They are however entitled to peace and quiet during the evening and nighttime.

Opening the large school hall to early morning events and private parties where alcohol is served is not conducive to ensure that local residents' quiet enjoyment of their homes would be achieved.

In this case the interests of local residents should be paramount and for this reason I strongly oppose this application and urge the Council representatives to REFUSE it.
