On Saturday 5th March 2016 I was on duty in plain clothes in company with PC782QK Whitcomb we were on mobile patrol in an unmarked police vehicle conducting Licensing visits at licenced premises, at about midnight we were travelling along Harlesden High street in to Craven Park Road when my attention was drawn to a group of males standing outside METRO supermarket and were being very noisy we parked our vehicle on the opposite side of the road and observed the group of males for a few minutes, I noticed that both METRO Supermarket 72 Craven Park Road NW10, was open and people were coming and going from the shop, and also SUPERSAVE EXPRESS, 68 Craven Park Road was open, its shutters were up and people were entering and leaving the shop, I am aware that SUPERSAVE EXPRESS have a condition on it's licence, namely that it should be closed to the public between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following morning and all sales during these hours shall be via the window only. This was an obvious breach of this condition, I then became aware of another group of males standing near the Ladbrokes bookmakers on the opposites side of the road from the convenience stores and nearest to where we were parked, the males were drinking alcohol and all appeared to be drunk, one in particular seemed very drunk and aggressive, I would describe him as an IC3 male, approximately F6'0 tall dark complexion, and aged between 50 and 60 years of age, he was wearing a long dark coat and a dark woollen hat, he had a unkempt beard which had a large amount of white hair on it, (I will describe this male as Male 1) this male was considerably drunk he was drinking from an open can of alcohol, the beer was a brand called Debowe, this male was swaying around and shouting incoherently he was falling into the shutters of the shop and started arguing with the other males in his group, on finishing the can of beer he threw the empty can towards our vehicle and started shouting, he then spat on the floor, I was unable to make out what he was saying, HE WAS DRUNK,

another member of the group then started to urinate up against the wall of the shop, they all appeared very hostile and agitated, Male 1 then started to walk across the road he was staggering around and walking into the road without even looking, I got out of our vehicle and followed the male, who walked directly into SUPERSAVE EXPRESS, this is a 24 hour convenience store that sells alcohol, food and drinks, I walked in behind him and observed him select a can of Perla Mochna alcohol from the fridge and stand in the queue at the counter, he was unsteady on his feet and talking in a loud voice to himself the shop was busy with other customers and there was two members of staff serving behind the counter, one of the members of staff a male I now know to be Mr Mohammad Mahshooq NAZ date of birth 27/09/1959 of [REDACTED] Maz called over Male 1 who handed him a pound before staggering out of the store with his can of beer, I was about one meter from the counter and my view was not obstructed, my attention was then drawn to two white males who were at the far end of the counter and being served by the other member of staff, a male I now know to be Mr Jamil Khan, date of birth 11/12/1975 of [REDACTED] I could see that the males were drunk and the shorter of the two males was very drunk and was using the counter to keep himself upright he was slurring his words and in a drunken confused state, I could see by this point they had a quantity of beers on the counter, and the small very drunk male was asking Mr Khan for spirits from behind the counter, Mr Khan then placed this on the counter with the beers, the second drunk male then went back to the fridge and selected six more beers and placed them with the other beers, the short drunk male then took out a fifty pound note and handed this to Mr Khan who took the money and gave him his change before putting the alcohol into black bags for the males to take away, again I was less than one meter from the counter and could clearly see the transaction take place, my view was not obstructed, both males speech was slurred and both were unsteady on their feet the shorter male who paid for the alcohol was very drunk and was finding it difficult to speak. Both males were Dunk, they then left the shop, I then identified myself to both Mr NAZ and KHAN by showing them my warrant card, PC Whitcomb then entered the shop, I asked Mr NAZ why he had just sold alcohol to the tall black male who was drunk, he said he's always like that if I don't serve him he becomes angry, I then informed PC Whitcomb about what I had just witnessed, I then asked them to close the shop as they were breaching the licence, and informed Mr NAZ that I needed to speak with him about what had just happened.

The shop was still allowing customers in, but eventually after several requests closed the front door, I then informed Mr NAZ that I would be asking him questions under caution about the sale of alcohol to a drunk person,

I informed him that he was not under arrest and that he had the right to free independent legal advice, which he declined, I then cautioned him and explained the caution, I then conducted a PACE compliant interview, asked him several questions about the offence which I recorded in an EAB, at the end of the interview I read what I had written down to him and asked him if he agreed with what had been said and written down, he said it was correct and signed to say it was correct. I was aware that PC Whitcomb was speaking with Mr Khan and was conducting an interview under caution.

I then informed him that I would need to speak to him later as I needed to decide how to deal with the offence. Later the same day at 14.00 hours Mr NAZ attended Wembley police station, I was in full uniform and issued him with a £90 Penalty Notice for Disorder (PND) I explained to him that the ticket was being issued for the offence of selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, under section 141 of the licensing act 2003, I informed him that he had three options, the first to pay the ticket in full within 21 days, or ask for a court hearing and if he did neither the fine would increase by fifty percent, he signed his copy of the ticket and stated that he was going to pay the fine, he also went on to say that he was scared working at the shop as he is constantly threatened by people and he did not like working there, he asked me to speak with the owner to see if he could make it safer for him. He then left the police station.

I am the licensing constable for Brent borough police and currently work within the police licensing unit, based at Brent Civic Centre, Wembley. On SATURDAY 5th MARCH 2016, at around 0001 hours, I was on duty in plain clothes, in company with PC 368QK Mike SULLIVAN. We were on patrol in an unmarked police vehicle. At around this time we were driving along CRAVEN PARK ROAD, NW10 in the direction of CRAVEN PARK. I noticed a group of males on my left who appeared to be drinking from open canisters of alcohol. I could see it was alcohol because the cans were of around 500ml sizes. The group on my left were stood outside a closed shop, just up from Ladbrokes bookmakers. I also noticed a group on my right standing outside Metro Supermarket, 72 CRAVEN PARK ROAD, NW10. I pulled over into a parking space on my left so that I could further observe what these two groups were doing. Even with my windows closed it was extremely noisy with all the noise they were making. I was parked aprox five metres from the group on my left and approx thirty metres from the group on my right. There were 3-4 black males on my left; they were all very noisy shouting at each other. I witnessed one man walk to outside Ladbrokes and urinate on the floor. These men were all drunk. One male in particular, who was aged around late fifty years old, 6.0" tall, with a black beard and wearing a long black jacket was very unsteady on his feet, shouting and drinking from an open alcohol container. I saw him throw something towards our vehicle. PC SULLIVAN told me that he had just thrown his alcohol can on the ground. I then saw him spit onto the pavement. He was very drunk. Before we could go and speak to him about his behaviour, he quickly walked across CRAVEN PARK ROAD, without even looking out for traffic. As he did, PC Sullivan and I got out of our patrol car and followed him over the road and into SUPERSAVE, 68 CRAVEN PARK ROAD, NW10. Supersave is a small licensed premise selling alcohol, food, confectionary and soft drinks. PC Sullivan followed the male into SUPERSAVE. The shop is relatively small in size and was busy. I decided that it was unnecessary for us both to enter. I waited outside and paced up and down, just keeping my eye on PC Sullivan to ensure he was ok. About one minute later, the same male in the long black coat walked back out of Supersave. I saw him pull out a can of Debowe lager from his right pocket and walk off along CRAVEN PARK ROAD towards



CRAVEN PARK. A short while later I entered the shop and PC SULLIVAN informed me that he witnessed the shop keepers sell alcohol to the drunk black male we first observed and to two drunk white males who were served alcohol afterwards. PC Sullivan pointed out the two men responsible, who were stood behind the counter. I now know these men to be Mr. Mohammad MAHSHOOQ dob 27/09/1959 of [REDACTED] and Mr. Jamil KHAN dob 11/12/1975 of [REDACTED]. PC Sullivan asked both men to join us for a chat and for them to ask another member of staff to cover them at the till, which they did. PC SULLIVAN explained that he witnessed Mr. KHAN serving alcohol to two drunken white males and that Mr. MAHSHOOQ served the drunk black male who we first saw. I then carried out a PACE compliant interview with Mr. KHAN. I recorded full details of this interview in my evidence and action book (See page numbers 27-29). After the interview, I showed Mr. KHAN my record of interview and read it out to him, word for word. He agreed it was a correct record of what was said and signed my notes confirming this. After confirming his identification (he provided his UK passport, bank card and latest bank statement) and carrying out a satisfactory police national computer name check, he was suitable to be dealt with by way of penalty notice for disorder (PND). However, as I was in plain clothes, I was unable to issue the ticket at the shop. I invited Mr. KHAN to attend WEMBLEY police station at 1400 hours later that day to receive his ticket, which he agreed to do. I am aware PC SULLIVAN had interviewed Mr. MAHSHOOQ and also decided upon issue of a PND later that day, as he too was in plain clothes. We then gave words of advice on serving drunken customers and left the store.

At 1400 hours today, 5th March 2016, Mr. Khan attended WEMBLEY police station where I issued him a penalty notice for disorder (number 001803 65131673) for offence code DA16 (sells or attempts to sell alcohol to a person who is drunk, contrary to s.141 Licensing Act 2003.

My name is Pc Gary Weedon 705qk I am a serving Police officer in the Metropolitan Police Force where I am currently attached to the partnership unit in Harlesden and my current role is safer Schools officer .

This statement refers to the on going Street drinkers who congregate along Craven Park and Craven Park Road in Harlesden nw10.

Prior to my role as a Safer Schools officer I was a Police constable in the Harlesden safer neighbourhood unit where one of my roles was to gather and disseminate intelligence in relation to street drinkers linked or potentially linked to crime or ASB within Harlesden which throughout my time on Snt was one my most challenging roles.

During the five years as a safer Neighbourhood officer I regularly came into contact with the street drinkers who would regularly congregate at numerous venues / street corners around Harlesden. The most frequent areas that the community would comment on were Craven park and Craven park road and in particular outside the Asian Womens refuge centre on the junction with Fortunegate road where on a normal day / evening this area will attract between 7/8 street drinkers which inevitably attracts Anti social behaviour which then leads to fights / assaults / begging / urinating in the street / drug use and general littering on a daily basis.

Over the years our priorities have changed but the street drinkers still remain and are still considered by the community to be a main source of complaint. One of the males that has been a regular throughout my time on Brent is Mr [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] who resides at [REDACTED]. Mr [REDACTED] is part of a small group of males who will regularly buy Alcohol from the surrounding off licences were they will then

consume these super strength lagers whilst standing on the junctions of roads which is intimidating and impacts the quality of life for those residents who live in the area which also has a major effect on the economic , cultural and social make up throughout.

My name is Richard PERRETT and I work as a POLICE COMMUNITY SUPPORT OFFICER out of HARLESDEN POLICE STATION and have been employed in this position for about twelve (12) years.

I have been asked to write this statement by Police Office Michael SULLIVAN. In the period of time I have worked in Harlesden NW10, I been informed on numerous occasions by residents and shop owners about the anti social behaviour that regularly take place out side the ASIAM WOMANS refuge centre CRAVEN PARK junction of FORTUNGATE ROAD HARLESDEN NW10. This entails drink fuelled fights, members of the public urinating on the street and using threatening behaviour towards members of the public as they go about there business. Residents of the centre and members of the public have complained to the council many times but nothing is ever done to rectify this problem. One of the main culprits involved in the Anti Social Behaviour is, an IC3 male who I know to be [REDACTED] who I have know for about (10) ten years. He regularly stands on the junction with a group of males and females drinking cans of beer and plastic cups of rum and gets very intoxicated and they a behave in an intimating manner to members of the public as they walk past.



5 On Tuesday 11th October 2016, at the request of P.C. Michael Sullivan, from Brent Police Licensing Team I undertook a test purchase exercise at Supersave Food & Wine, located at 68 Craven Park Road, Harlesden, London NW10 4AE.

10 P.C. Sullivan had informed me that he wished to check the business for compliance with the Licensing Act 2003 and in particular licensing conditions relating to the sale of alcohol at the premise.

15 At 13.35 hrs. I entered the premise and observed an Asian male behind the till counter who was serving customers waiting in a queue by the entrance to the shop. I walked past the till to the open fronted refrigerated display cabinet. The display cabinet contained mainly alcoholic beverages with most being cans of beer and lager.

I picked up a can of SVYTURYS 1784 TRADICINIS SVIESUSIS beer and took it to the counter. The Asian male was still behind the counter and there was one customer waiting to be served before me. I would describe the Asian male as being around 50 years of age,
20 he was wearing a baseball cap and was dressed in greenish grey top and was wearing casual style trousers.

I placed the can of beer on the counter and he placed it in a blue carrier bag. The can had a Supersave label applied to it that indicated a price of £1.20. I gave the gentleman £1.20
25 in coins and he then handed me the plastic bag containing the beer. The time of the sale by my watch was 13.39 hrs.

I returned to the Trading Standards Service vehicle where I exhibited the can of beer as PDL/SUPERSAVE/1 and placed it together with the blue carrier bag in an evidence bag that
30 I sealed with evidence seal 006114.

I returned to Brent Civic centre later the same day where I handed sealed bag 006114 to P.C. Sullivan.



I am employed by the London Boroughs of Brent & Harrow Trading Standards Service as an Assistant Enforcement Officer as such I am authorised to assist warranted officers in their investigations.

- 5 On 12 October 2016, I was asked to carry out a test purchase of a single can of beer from a shop called Supersave at 68 Craven Park Road, Harlesden by Police Licencing Officer Mike Sullivan.
