### Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

#### Age Verification Policy

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

#### Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) —dutyll is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) —permitted price is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) —relevant personll means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) —relevant personll means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the

premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) —value added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (—the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (—the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### **Requirement for a DPS**

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Door Supervisors and Security Staff to be Licensed by the SIA (Only if required)**

Where the licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001

## **Annexe 2 - Conditions Consistent With the Operating Schedule**

1 CCTV shall be installed to Home Office Guidance standards and maintained in a good working condition and recordings shall be kept for 31 days and shall be made available to police and authorised Officers from Brent Council.

2 The CCTV shall operate internally to cover all internal areas where licensable activities take place.

3 Access to the system shall be allowed immediately to the Police, authorised officers from in accordance with the Data Protection Act where it is necessary to do so for the prevention of crime and disorder.

4 A competent trained person in the use and operation of the CCTV shall be in attendance at the premises at all times licensable activities take place and be able to

fully operate the CCTV system to be able to download in a recognised format any information requested by the Police.

- 5 A facility shall be available for the Police to remove the CCTV system a copy of any material relevant to any on-going Police investigation.
- 6 The CCTV system clock shall be set correctly and maintained.
- 7 A CCTV camera shall be installed to cover the entrance of the premises
- 8 A sign stating “No proof of age – No sale” shall be displayed at the point of sale.
- 9 No high strength beers, lagers, and ciders above 6.5% ABV shall be stocked.
- 10 A refusal book detailing date and time of the refused sale and the name of the person refusing the sale shall be kept and maintained and made available for inspection at the premises.
- 11 A suitable intruder alarm complete with panic button shall be fitted and maintained.
- 12 An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available for inspection on request to an authorised officer of Brent Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received
  - (d) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
  - (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.**
- 13 The following crime prevention measures shall be implemented:
  - A time delay safe with deposit slot and anti fishing mechanisms must be used at the counter till area
  - Regular robbery awareness and cash minimisation training shall be given to all staff
- 14 A “Challenge 25” policy shall be adopted and adhered to at all times.
- 15 Challenge ‘25’ signage shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises and at the cash till payment area.
- 16 A personal licence holder fluent in English shall be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.
- 17 Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by customers or staff.
- 18 Written staff training shall be given regularly and signed records for inspection by local authority enforcement officers and Police shall be made available on demand.
