Local ward work:

As a long serving (2002 -) Fryent Councillor, I worked closely with my colleagues, Cllr George Crane and Cllr Ruth Moher and have built up a network of community and resident contacts whose issues we take up regularly we attend and support most event involving residents, working with Resident's Association Officers throughout the year.

Surgeries held:

Third Saturday every month at Kingsbury Library, we also do 'walkabout' as part of the Neighbourhood Working Council Scheme along with PCSO, and other agencies, meeting and discussing issues with residents and traders.

Council meetings attended:

I attended most meeting on the Council Cal ender and in addition all Executive and Lead Members' (Highways Briefings at Brent House).

Community meetings attended:

I regularly attend the AGM or other meeting of Valley Drive Residents Association and Springfield Estate Residents Association. Also meetings of informal groups of residents where issues arise.

Work in respect of which a special responsibility allowance is paid:

As Lead Member for Highways and Transportation, I work closely with the Lead Officer as well as the overall Environment Department Directors. I have a lot of Dealings with managers on StreetCare, Parking and Chair of Highways Committee as well as the Public Transport Liaison Committee.

Participation in outside and governing bodies:

As a governor at Oliver Goldsmith Primary & Wembley High Technology College, I play an active role in the affairs of the school.

Training events attended:

17 sessions.

Other achievements throughout the period:

In my role as Lead Member, we introduced a number of important but controversial initiatives (e.g. an emission – based increase in CPZ parking permit fees/car club); a 'Don't Block the Box' campaign against vehicles blocking road traffic junction hatches; and a consultation on School Crossing Patrols. All these need significant public communications and presentation to Council.
