
#### Themed Grant Funding Stream 2012 - 2015



### Data

- Data is predicted based on proxy of people presently benefiting from similar projects or an assessment of cohort of people targeted in project
- For some protected characteristics there was no reasonable data on which to base a proxy and as such organisations sought to open the project to all and these projects were not included in the graph for that particular protected characteristic
- Data is provided by the organisations bidding for funding
- Brent Statistics are drawn from Brent's Evidence Base and JSNA
- Actual data provided through monitoring will enable analysis of those benefiting once projects are underway and any identified issues arising from this data will be picked up through the performance management of projects.


# Age Profile – Brent Population

# **Disability Profile – Brent Population**

- In 2010-11 there were 765 people with learning disabilities known to Brent council.
- The majority of people with learning disabilities known to the council are aged between 20 and 59.
- The breakdown by gender is: Male 58% female 42%.
- The age breakdown of clients with learning disabilities is as follows:




15.6% of the population state that they have a limiting long-term illness, health problem or disability which limits the amount of daily activity or work that they can do.




# **Race Profile – Brent Population**

#### Race Profile – Non Themed Model Grant Projects






## **Sex Profile – Brent Population**
