
Appendix 1: S106 Contributions 2006/7

Set out below are the S106 funds secured in the last financial year. Remember these will be the old style S106 agreements and there is of course less flexibility over how these may be spent.



The above chart shows that the significant majority of the monetary contributions have been secured for Education (47%) of the total. This is a reduction on last year's proportion. Transportation gained a third, with Landscaping / Open Space and Public Art measures all sharing the remaining, all of which increased their share.

In total 20 agreements were signed in 2006/07 with over £1,200,000 being secured, this is considerable less than last year in both number of agreement and value. This in part reflects the fact many agreements were signed close to the 2006/07 cut off dates, either just before or just after (March 2006 and April 2007). We have already exceeded this level for this year, as a large number of schemes have come in and the standard change is being more widely used. We expect there to be around 40 agreements completed with a value of around £4million in the current financial year.

Where Transportation is concerned 13 car free developments and 5 travel plans were granted showing that the Council is giving serious consideration to encouraging alternative modes of transport, this a proportionally large increasing in both. Another indication of the importance the Council is placing on access to developments is the proportion of funds secured for Non-Car

Access, nearly £400,000, in addition to nearly £200,000 for Open Space and £40,000 for Air Quality Management.

Non financial obligations

An increasing level of non-financial obligations has been secured, ranging from on-site training measures, to the provision of community facilities and other on site requirements. Sustainability obligations, which included monitoring, BREEM ratings and the demolition protocol has been successfully secured on all larger applications.

The Council received just under £10,000,000 in contributions, including over £5,000,000 relating to Wembley Stadium infrastructure improvements at Wembley Park Underground station, local roads and parking. Nearly £9,000,000 was spent with over £7,000,000 going to improvements at Wembley Park and Wembley Stadium stations. Other large improvement schemes include school expansion projects at John Kelly, Claremont and Preston Park.
