3. Announcements

The Council agreed to waive Standing Orders to the extent necessary to allow the Mayor and Councillor Van Colle to address the meeting.

The Mayor reported with regret the recent passing away of Martin Cheeseman's (Director of Housing) mother. He had sent a letter of condolence.

The Mayor thanked all those involved in the launch of the Citizenship Ceremony held on 26th February 2004, particularly Mark Rimmer, the Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages, and his staff.

The Mayor reported on the launch of the Brent Fair Trade initiative to take place at Willesden Green Library Centre, which he hoped members would support.

Councillor Van Colle addressed the Council on a personal matter, updating members on his action concerning the murder of his son over 3 years ago and thanking members for the messages of support he had received.

4. Procedural Motion

Councillor Moloney moved a procedural motion relating to the conduct of business which was put to the vote and CARRIED.

Councillor Lorber moved that each Group Leader be permitted 15 minutes speaking time during which they should move any motions or amendments and that other members should be permitted 3 minutes speaking time at the discretion of the Mayor. This was put to the vote and declared LOST.

 - (g) there will then follow a general debate during which the usual rules for debate will apply as set out in Standing Orders 47 and 48 save as set out in this procedural motion:

- (h) at the end of the General debate the Deputy Leader may speak for up to 10 minutes to wind up the debate before moving to the vote;
- (i) voting on each of the Group budget proposals shall be taken *en bloc*;
- (j) all votes on each of the Group budget proposals shall be recorded.

(At this point in the meeting those Liberal Democrat Councillors present left the meeting).

5. 2004/2005 Budget and Council Tax

The Council had before them a report from the Director of Finance regarding the 2004/2005 Budget. The minutes of the Performance and Finance Select Committee held on 18th February 2004 and the Schools Forum held on 23rd February 2004 had been circulated under separate cover to all Members on 24th February 2004.

The Leader of the Council addressed the Council and moved her budget motion.

 - (b) £384,045,000 being the aggregate of the amounts that the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 32(3) (a) to (c) of the Act,

- (c) £347,415,000 being the amount by which the aggregate at (a) above exceeds the aggregate at (b) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 32(4) of the Act, as its budget requirements for the year,
- (d) £264,052,000 being the aggregate of the sums which the Council estimates will be payable for the year into its general fund in respect of redistributed non-domestic rates and revenue support grant reduced by the amount of the sums which the Council estimates will be transferred in the year from its general fund to its collection fund in accordance with Section 97(4) of the Local Government Finance Act 1988,
- (e) £899.83 being the amount at (c) above less the amount at (d) above, all divided by the amount for the taxbase specified above calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 33(1) of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year,
- (f) Valuation Bands
