# 2. **Declarations of Interests**

## 3. **Proposed Revisions to Brent's Constitution**

The Borough Solicitor introduced her report which set out proposed changes to the Constitution following consideration by the Constitutional Working Group (CWG). It was pointed out that some changes were required to be made as a result of legislative change.

**RESOLVED**:

- that the financial limits in the property delegations set for the Head of Property and Asset Management be increased to the amounts shown: Rental £100,000 Acquisition/disposal £ 300,000;
- (ii) that authority to set the fees for applications under the Gambling Act 2005 be delegated to the Alcohol and Entertainment Licensing Committee and to note the other changes required to be made to the Constitution by the Gambling Act 2005;
- (iii) that the name of the Disability and Mental Health Forum be changed to Brent Disabled User Forum;
- (iv) that all other changes to the Constitution recommended in the report from the Borough Solicitor and/or shown in the appendix to the report be agreed;
- (v) that it be noted that Members' allowances are dealt with in a separate report to Council;
- (vi) that it be noted that a further report on neighbourhood working may be brought before Members in due course;
- (vii) that it be noted that a further report on the recent changes to the Model Code of Conduct will be brought before Members in due course.

# 4. The Members' Allowance Scheme

The Borough Solicitor introduced her report which set out recommended changes to the Brent Members' Allowances Scheme, following consideration by the Constitution Working Group (CWG).

**RESOLVED**:

- (i) that the following changes to the Brent Members' Allowances Scheme be made to take effect from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2007:
  - a. increase the Basic Allowances by 3.5% from £7,245 to £7,498;
  - reduce the allowances for the members of the Alcohol and Entertainment Licensing Sub-Committees from £3,500 to £1,987;
  - c. abolish the allowance for the Chair of the General Purposes Licensing Sub-Committee;
  - d. award an allowance of £2,981 to members of the Planning Committee;
  - e. award an allowance of £2,981 to members of the Adoption and Permanency Panel;
  - f. award an allowance of £2,981 to members of the Fostering Panel;
  - g. award an allowance of £1,987 to the Chair of the Audit Committee;
  - h. reduce the allowance for the chairs of the Service User Consultative Fora from £4,492 to £1,987;
- (ii) that it be noted that the Youth Matters 2 and the Children Forum were abolished and the Youth Parliament was created by Full Council in November 2006 and that an allowance of £1,987 be awarded to the co-chair of the Youth Parliament;
- (iii) that the indexation provisions by reference to the LGPS be retained for a further 4 years;
- (iv) that it be noted that a further report on Members' allowances will be submitted to the next meeting of the Council to deal with further changes to the scheme currently being considered by the CWG.
