This scheme has been developed to provide social housing and replacement residential facilities for people with learning disabilities with the aid of a government grant of £26.6m. Following an exhaustive tendering process, the Executive agreed on 9th October 2006 to appoint Brent Co-efficient (BCE), a consortium consisting of Hyde Housing Group, Bouygues UK (builder) and the Bank of Scotland, as preferred bidder for the PFI scheme. There have been intensive further negotiations over the past 12 months to agree the detailed arrangements for delivery of the scheme, finalise the legal agreement, and ensure that the scheme is affordable to the council. These negotiations are now virtually complete and this report is seeking the agreement of the Executive to delegate authority to the Director of Housing and Community Care, in consultation with the Director of Finance and Corporate Resources and the Borough Solicitor, to finalise negotiations and to finalise all necessary agreements and documents, hopefully by 30th November 2007.
