2007	Consultation Pilot	consultation software in early 2004 as part of a WLA e.govt project. More recently we have developed 'Consultation Tracker' our on-line consultation database. We have also, (this year), recruited another Citizens' Panel.  Although we have completed ten on-line consultations, we recognise that SNAP has a number of inherent problems that we have been unable to resolve.  Many local authorities have gone for an overall IT solution and we have been looking at a number of suppliers. We were awarded some money from the CE's Performance Fund and we are likely to purchase an external software solution called Citizen Space Local. This service would enable us to link:  • More effective on-line consultations • A more interactive database of consultation • Continuous on-line recruitment for the Citizens' Panel • The creation of a separate e-consultation panel for Brent.
